MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF REGENTSMURRAY STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

August 21, 1930

The Board of Regents of the Murray State Teachers College met in the office of the President at 9:30 A. M., Thursday, August 21, 1930, with the following members present: Mrs. William H. Mason, Mr. G. P. Ordway and Mr. S. J. Snook. Vice Chairman S. J. Snook presided in the absence of Chairman W. C. Bell.

Report of Entrance, Credits, Certification and Graduation Committee

Leave of Absence for Miss Helm

President Wells recommended that Miss Emma J. Helm be granted a leave of absence from June 1, 1930 to July 25, 1930.

Motion was made by Mrs. Mason, and seconded by Mr. Ordway, that Miss Emma J. Helm be granted a leave of absence, as recommended above. This motion was unanimously carried.

Election of Faculty Members

President Wells recommended the election of Miss Grace Post as a member of the faculty at a salary of \$2,500.00 per calendar year, beginning September 18, 1930 and continuing until May 31, 1931.

Motion was made by Mrs. Mason, and seconded by Mr. Ordway, that Miss Grace Post be elected a member of the faculty at a salary of \$2,500.00 per calendar year, beginning September 18, 1930 and continuing until May 31, 1931. The roll was called upon the adoption

of this motion with the following result: Mrs. Mason, aye; Mr. Ordway, aye; Mr. Winslow, aye; Mr. Snook, aye.

Next, the President recommended the election of Mr. Richard Montgomery as a member of the faculty at a salary of \$3,200.00 per calendar year, beginning September 18, 1930 and continuing until May 31, 1931.

Purchase of Stokers for Heating Plant

President Wells presented the results of investigation of the purchase of automatic stokers for the heating plant, and recommended the purchase of two No. 5 Iron Fireman automatic coal burners and one No. 3 Iron Fireman automatic coal burner at a cost of \$4,500.00, the price submitted by the Southern Equipment Company.

Motion was made by Mr. Winslow, and seconded by Mrs. Mason, that the Southern Equipment Company, Hopkinsville, Kentucky, be awarded the contract for furnishing and installing two No. 5 Iron Fireman automatic coal burners and one No. 3 Iron Fireman automatic coal burner at the price of \$4,500.00. The roll was called upon the adoption of this motion with the following result: Mrs. Mason, aye; Mr. Ordway, aye; Mr. Winslow, aye; Mr. Snook, aye.

Change of Plumbing Pipe

The President discussed with the Board the changing of the kind of plumbing pipes in the Library and Men's Dormitory, instead of using the wrought iron, as specified in the specifications.

Motion was made by Mr. Winslow, and seconded by Mrs. Mason, that the Board accept the recommendation of the architect in reference to changing the kind of pipes used in the plumbing of the Library and Men's Dormitory. This motion was carried unanimously.

Furniture and Furnishings for Buildings

Motion was made by Mr. Ordway, and seconded by Mr. Snook, that Mr. Claude T. Winslow and Mrs. William H. Mason be appointed a Committee with power to purchase furniture and furnishings necessary for the plant. This motion was unanimously carried.

Adjournment

Motion was made by Mr. Winslow, and seconded by Mrs. Mason, that the Board adjourn to meet again Thursday, August 28, 1930, at 9:30 A. M.
