June 4, 1931

The President reported to the Board that the insurance on the Liberal Arts Building would soon expire and requested the Board to give consideration to the re-writing of this insurance.

Motion was made by Mr. Winslow, and seconded by Mr. Ordway, that Mr. Snook and Mr. Ordway be appointed a committee to direct the renewal of this insurance. This motion was unanimously carried.

Certificate for Roy McNeil


President Wells advised the Board of Regents of the facts in the case of Roy McNeil, who was granted a college certificate by the Board of Regents in 1927, before he reached the age of eighteen years. Dr. Wells read to the Board a letter which he had written Attorney General J. W. Cammack in reference to this unusual case also the recommendation of the Committee on Entrance, Credits, Certification and Graduation.


It appeared to the Board of Regents that Roy McNeil had completed the requirements for a college certificate and that the college certificate which was attempted to be issued to him in 1927 was illegally issued, consequently void, because he had not at that time reached the age of eighteen years as required by law for the issuance of any certificate to teach.

Motion was made by Mr. Winslow, and seconded by Mr. Ordway, that Roy McNeil be issued a college certificate since he has met the requirements for same. The roll was called upon the adoption of this motion with the following result: Mrs. Mason, aye; Mr. Ordway, aye; Mr. Winslow, aye; Mr. Snook, aye.
