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MINUTES OF BOARD OF REGENTS  
MURRAY STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

August 27, 1931

The Board of Regents of the Murray State Teachers College met in the office of the President at 9:30 A. M., Thursday, August 27, 1931 with Mrs. William H. Mason, Mr. S. J. Snook and Mr. Claude T. Winslow present. Vice Chairman S. J. Snook presided.

Reading of the Minutes

Report of Entrance, Credits, Certification and Graduation Committee

Mr. Winslow introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption as follows:


RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Regents of the Murray State Teachers College that Dr. Rainey T. Wells be and is hereby authorized to negotiate a loan, or loans, not to exceed the sum of \$100,000.00 for the purpose of supplementing the State Millage Tax to meet the expenses incident to the maintenance and operation of the Murray State Teachers College, and that said sums be paid as funds are received from the State Treasurer sufficient to meet said expenses and a surplus excess for that purpose.
