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Board of Regents, Murray State Normal School, "1937-03-30" (1937). *Board of Regents Meeting Minutes*. 147.
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The Board of Regents of Murray State Teachers College reconvened at 2:00 P. M. Tuesday, March 30, 1937, at the Irvin Cobb Hotel, Paducah, Kentucky, to complete the purchase of furnishings and equipment for the Physical Education Building and the Home Economics Building. Dr. C. E. Crume, Judge Charles Ferguson and Mr. Joe Rogers were present. President James H. Richmond was represented by Mr. R. E. Broach, Business Manager.

Judge Ferguson Selected Chairman Pro Tem

In the absence of Chairman H. W. Peters and Vice Chairman T. O. Turner, Dr. C. E. Crume nominated Judge Charles Ferguson as Chairman Pro Tem. The nomination was seconded by Mr. Joe Rogers, and Judge Charles Ferguson was elected Chairman Pro Tem of this session.

Contracts Awarded for Furnishing and Equipping Physical Education Building and Home Economics Building

Mr. R. E. Broach, Business Manager, reported that he had presented, personally, to the office of Mr. Geo. H. Sager, Jr., for consideration and approval, the tabulated bids for furnishing and equipping the Physical Education Building and the Home Economics Building, as listed above, together with the action of the Board of Regents approving what was considered the lowest and best bids. Mr. Broach stated that Mr. Sager's office did not concur in the recommendations of the Board; however, in some instances; then, he submitted a tabulation of the proposed award of contracts which Mr. Sager stated in his letter of March 27, 1937, his office could approve.
