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MINUTES OF BOARD OF REGENTS

MURRAY STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

June 3, 1937

The Board of Regents of Murray State Teachers College met in the office of the President, as per call, at 9:40 A. M. Thursday, June 3, 1937. Hon. Harry W. Peters, Mr. Joe Rogers, Senator T. O. Turner and Judge Charles Ferguson were present. Chairman Harry W. Peters presided.

Report of Committee on Entrance, Credits, Certification and Graduation

Dr. Richmond presented to the Board the report of the Committee on Entrance, Credits, Certification and Graduation, which included recommendations for the conferring of degrees on our college graduates and the granting of high school diplomas to the graduates of our training school, as follows.

Home Economics Building, Physical Education Building, President's Home

Dr. Richmond reported to the Board that the Home Economics Building had been occupied and, according to the Resident Engineer, Mr. Leo F. Whalen, is satisfactory. He added that the Health Building needed additional work done on certain walls, and possibly screws installed, as per specifications, instead of nails in the window and door framings, and one or two other minor items need attention. The main weakness, however, is the floors, he said. Those, he suggested, should be considered at a subsequent meeting of the Board, at which time the acceptance of the building will be considered.

Dr. Richmond also called the attention of the Board to the fact that the decoration of the President's Home had been completed, the work had been accepted by the state government and that he and his family had moved into this home, where they would try to exemplify true Kentucky hospitality. He added that the members of the Board of Regents would have an opportunity to inspect this home today, since they are invited there to lunch.

Vacancies in Faculty

Dr. Richmond stated that there are two or three vacancies of a minor nature, which he thought he had authority to fill, and that he would discuss them at the next meeting of the Board.

Library and Laboratory Fees

Dr. Richmond recommended that a Library and Laboratory fee be fixed at \$2.50 per semester for each student. He explained that we are making this general charge which will replace certain special fees in various subjects.

Motion was made by Senator Turner that a Library and Laboratory fee be fixed at \$2.50 per semester for each student. This motion was seconded by Judge Ferguson, and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Judge Ferguson, aye; Mr. Rogers, aye; Senator Turner, aye; Mr. Peters, aye.

Adjournment

Since the Commencement Exercises were scheduled to start at 10:00 A. M. and it was time for the members of the Board of Regents to take their places in the procession, motion was made by Senator Turner that the Board adjourn. This motion was seconded by Mr. Rogers and carried unanimously, then the members of the Board retired to the Auditorium to participate in the Commencement program.
