MINUTES OF BOARD OF REGENTS

MURRAY STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

May 28, 1940

The Board of Regents of Murray State Teachers College met in the President's office at 10:00 A. M. on Tuesday, May 28, 1940, as per the call of the Chairman. Dr. C. E. Crume, Judge Charles Ferguson and Mr. George Hart were present. In the absence of Chairman J. W. Brooker, Vice Chairman Charles Ferguson presided.

President's Report

Dr. Richmond presented and read his report as President, as follows:

I. <u>Approval of the Minutes of the Board of Regents</u> for the meeting held on May 7, 1940

Before approving the Minutes of the Board of Regents for the meeting held on May 7, 1940, it is necessary to correct an error in the salaries of two members of the faculty, and I recommend that the Board authorize these corrections, as follows:

- a. <u>Dr. W. D. Lewis</u> salary for June, 1940 should have been listed as \$145.00 instead of \$100.00.
- b. <u>Mr. Vernon Anderson's</u> salary for next year should have been listed as \$1,524.00 instead of \$1,500.00.

III. Classification of the Faculty

Motion was made by Judge Ferguson that the Board of Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee and the President and authorize the conferring of the degrees, the awarding of the high school diplomas and the renewal of the certificate as indicated therein. This motion was seconded by Mr. Hart, and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Dr. Crume, aye; Mr. Hart, aye; Judge Ferguson, aye.

President Authorized To Employ Additional Music Teachers

Dr. Richmond reported to the Board that it would be necessary to make two changes in the Music faculty, and he recommended that the President be given authority to employ two people, one to replace Miss Daisy Hinkle, who recently married, and one person for a nine-months' period. Dr. Richmond stated that this was advisable because he should contact and employ these people as soon as possible but he did not think it necessary to call a special meeting of the Board to pass upon their election when he could handle the matter satisfactorily and then report his action to the Board at its next meeting.

Motion was made by Mr. Hart that the President be given authority to employ the two faculty members needed in the Music Department. This motion was seconded by Dr. Crume, and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Dr. Crume, aye; Mr. Hart, aye; Judge Ferguson, aye.

Letters to and from Dr. J. W. Carr, President Emeritus

At this point Dr. Richmond read to the Board the letter which he had written to Dr. J. W. Carr informing him of the action of the Board of Regents in electing him President Emeritus of this college. Dr. Richmond then read Dr. Carr's letter of acceptance and recommended that these two letters be incorporated in the Minutes of the Board of Regents.

Motion was made by Mr. Hart that the recommendation of the President be approved and his letter to Dr. J. W. Carr and Dr. Carr's reply be incorporated in the Minutes of this meeting of the Board of Regents. This motion was seconded by Judge Ferguson and was carried unanimously, and the letters follow:

May 18, 1940

Dr. J. W. Carr, Dean Murray State Teachers College Murray, Kentucky

My dear Dr. Carr:

I am enclosing your contract for the coming year. The Board and I regret that acute budgetary requirements make it impossible for us to pay you more. It is not necessary to go into details concerning this matter as you are fully acquainted with the situation.

The Board has directed me to express to you their sincere appreciation of the fine work that you have done throughout the history of the college, and, of course, every friend of our institution shares their sentiments. When one thinks of Murray State, the name of John W. Carr is embodied in the thought.

Upon my recommendation and the unanimous action of our Board, you have been elected President Emeritus of this institution, such title to go into effect July 1, 1940, at which time, you will be relieved of the exacting duties of the Dean. On and after this date, you may work and play as you see fit. 79

The Board left to my discretion the selection of any specific duties which you might be asked to render. The first assignment which I would like to give you, with your approval, is to ask you to prepare a history of the college. Do this in your own way and in your own time. This history needs to be written and you are better qualified than anyone else to do this work.

Our new Dean, Mr. Nash, will not report for duty until the first of September, and until that time, I suggest that you continue to use the office of Dean. Later in the year, you and I will counsel together and select a suitable place for your headquarters.

In closing, may I express my sincere appreciation for your fine cooperation, your loyalty and counsel. I am deeply grateful to you for your helpfulness. In the years that are ahead, and I hope there are many, may you enjoy the leisure which you have earned, and may all of us enjoy our further association with you. You must consider your connection with Murray as real and definite as it has always been. Faculty meetings, assemblies, and every other activity of the college must have your presence and profit by your counsel.

May I find a way to serve the college as effectively as President Emeritus as I have been able to serve it as President and Dean.

May the college continue to prosper under your administration, and may the new Dean, Dr. Nash, enjoy serving with you and the faculty as I have enjoyed my work here.

Insurance on Depositories' Securities Paid from W. P. A. Funds
