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# MURRAY STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

December 16, 1942

The Board of Regents of Murray State Teachers College met in the President's office, as per the call of the Chairman, at 10:00 A. M. Wednesday, December 16, 1942, with Dr. C. E. Crume, Mr. Claude Winslow, Judge Charles Ferguson and Mr. George Hart present. In the absence of Chairman J. W. Brooker, Vice Chairman Charles Ferguson presided.

Motion was made by Mr. Winslow that the Board of Regents approve the conference of the degrees to graduates, as reported by the Committee and the President. This motion was seconded by Mr. Hart and the roll call on its adoption resulted as follows: Dr. Crume, aye; Mr. Winslow, aye; Mr. Hart, aye; Judge Ferguson, aye.

Next, Dr. Richmond stated that he should like for the Board of Regents to give him authority, as President, to grant degrees at the proper time to those students completing their courses at times other than regular Commencement.

Motion was made by Mr. Winslow that the Board of Regents authorize the President to confer degrees upon students who complete the requirements for same at other than the regular Commencement time. This motion was seconded by Mr. Hart, and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Dr. Crume, aye; Mr. Winslow, aye; Mr. Hart, aye; Judge Ferguson, aye.

#### Employment of Additional Faculty and Staff Members

Motion was made by Mr. Hart that the Board approve the appointment and election of additional members of the faculty and administrative staff as recommended and reported by the President in his report. This motion was seconded by Mr. Winslow, and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Dr. Crume, aye; Mr. Winslow, aye; Mr. Hart, aye; Judge Ferguson, aye.

# Correction of Error in Number of Acres in Lease of Mrs. Nesbit Property for Airport

At the request of President Richmond, Mr. R. E. Broach, Business Manager, reported to the Board the correction of an error which had been made in the number of acres covered in the leasing of property from Mrs. Ina Nesbit. The correction of this error was approved by common consent, official action not being deemed necessary.

#### Enrollment

Dr. Richmond reported to the Board that the college enrollment at this time is 485 students, which he thought was magnificent under the circumstances. He added that he thought we could depend on having at least 550 students on this campus next quarter, which is most encouraging.

### Possibility of Securing Training Unit of Armed Forces Here at College

Dr. Richmond stated to the Board that Dr. Nash and he felt that the time had come for us to make an effort to secure some unit of training of armed forces for the federal government. After reporting and explaining the situation with reference to the efforts of Dr. Nash, our Senators and Congressman, and himself to secure a unit of pre-preflight Navy cadets for training at our college for the Government, Dr. Richmond suggested that the Board of Regents give him some instructions and authority as to what to do and how to proceed if and when a definite offer for the training of such a unit on this campus is made. In this connection, Dr. Richmond stated that our college had been offered the opportunity to take care of a thousand WAVES, but that he had declined to give an official answer until he could present the matter to the Board for consideration.

Motion was made by Mr. Hart that the President and Dean reject the proposition to train the unit of WAVES on our campus and that they continue their efforts in whatever direction they may see fit to secure the pre-preflight naval unit. This motion was seconded by Dr. Crume and was unanimously carried.

# Report of the Business Manager

At this point Dr. Richmond requested Mr. Broach to make an informal report to the Board concerning the financial condition of the college. Mr. Broach's report was made orally and supported by a brief memorandum, which was received and filed.

# <u>Navy To Establish Pre-preflight Training Unit at Murray State</u> Teachers College

Five minutes before twelve o'clock and time for the Board to adjourn, Dean William G. Nash was called by long distance telephone from Washington and was advised that the Navy Personnel Office had announced that a naval pre-preflight unit would be placed at Murray State Teachers College.

Motion was made by Mr. Winslow that the President be authorized and directed to make any necessary changes in connection with the institution of the training unit of pre-preflight naval cadets on the campus of Murray State Teachers College. This motion was seconded by Dr. Crume and was carried unanimously.

# Dormitory Arrangements To Be Changed Because of Naval Prepreflight Cadet Training Unit

In arranging for the most desirable housing plan possible in caring for the naval pre-preflight cadet training unit, Dr. Richmond recommended that Wells Hall, the girls' dormitory, be taken over and used by this pre-preflight unit, that the girls be transferred to the Boys' Dormitory and that the boys living there be notified that they must relinquish their rooms with the understanding, of course, that we will exert every possible effort to get them properly cared for. Motion was made by Dr. Crume that the Board of Regents approve the President's recommendation and authorize and direct him to proceed with arrangements to have the girls living in Wells Hall to vacate this building for the use of the naval pre-preflight cadet training unit, to have the boys to move out of the Men's Dormitory with the understanding that comfortable housing arrangements will be made for them and to complete the changes necessary for the girls to occupy the building now used as the Men's Dormitory. This motion was seconded by Mr. Hart and was carried unanimously.

#### Adjournment

Motion was made by Dr. Crume that the Board adjourn. This motion was seconded by Mr. Winslow and was carried unanimously.
