Approval of Minutes

Motion was made by Mr. Price that the Minutes of the Board of Regents for the meeting held on January 19, 1948, copies of which were mailed to the individual members of the Board by the Secretary, be approved and signed. This motion was seconded by Mr. Franklin and was carried unanimously.

Mr. Fred Faurot Employed as Head Football Coach and Assistant Professor in Department of Health and Physical Education

Mr. Roy Stewart, Head of the Department of Health and Physical Education, appeared before the Board and presented Coach Fred Faurot.

Upon the recommendation of President Woods, motion was made by Mr. Price that Mr. Fred Faurot be employed as Head Football Coach and Assistant Professor in the Department of Health and Physical Education, at a salary of \$3,800.00 per annum, with the understanding that he will be used in supervising the boys at Swann Dormitory, beginning July 1, 1948, and continuing through June 30, 1949; and that he also be employed for the month of April, 1948, with salary at the same rate per calendar month to carry on spring football practice. This motion was seconded by

General Meredith and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Franklin, aye; General Meredith, aye; Mr. Winslow, aye.

Resignations Accepted by the President Approved

Negotiated Contract N7sp-8508, Naval Aviation College Program Approved

Motion was made by Mr. Price that the Board approve the action of the President in signing Negotiated Contract N7sp-8508, Naval Aviation College Program, which was entered into as of September 25, 1947. This motion was seconded by General Meredith and was carried unanimously.

Leave of Absence Granted President Ralph H. Woods to Go to Greece on Educational Mission for the U. S. Department of State

In view of the fact that the President of the college has been requested by the Department of State of the United States Government to participate in an American mission to Greece extending over a period of from three to three and a half months, and in the light of the critical world situation, and in order to cooperate with our government's efforts, motion was made by General Meredith that President Ralph H. Woods be granted a leave of absence from his duties at the college covering said period and beginning April 1, 1948, with the understanding that he is to return to his duties on or about July 1, 1948. This motion was seconded by Mr. Price and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Franklin, aye; General Meredith, aye; Mr. Winslow, aye.

Mr. M. O. Wrather Designated As Assistant to the President and Authorized to Discharge Necessary Duties for the President During his Absence

Motion was made by Mr. Price that, during the absence of the President of the college, Mr. M. O. Wrather, Director of Public Relations, be designated as Assistant to the President, and be authorized to discharge the necessary duties and responsibilities and sign all necessary papers for the President during his absence. 
Efforts of Alumni Association in Planning Fund-Raising Campaign to Assist in Construction of Student Union Building Approved
