This motion was seconded by Mr. Franklin and was carried unanimously.

Leaves of Absence for Mrs. Ann Herron Cohron and Miss Rezina Senter Approved

Motion was made by Mr. Franklin that a leave of absence be granted Mrs. Ann Herron Cohron, as requested, with the understanding that she is to return to her job in the Library, beginning in September, and that a leave be granted Miss Rezina Senter from June 1 to August 1, 1953 in order that she may complete her graduate work at George Peabody College. This motion was seconded by Mr. Price and was unanimously carried.

Leave of Absence Extended for Mr. C. V. Holmes

President Woods called attention to the fact that Mr. C. V. Holmes, who secured a leave of absence to do graduate work has, now, asked that his leave be continued for the academic year 1953-54; and he suggested that this extended leave should be conditioned on the need for his services at its end.

Motion was made by Mr. Price that an extended leave be granted C. V. Holmes with the understanding that he will be given an opportunity to return to the college if he is needed. This motion was seconded by Mr. Franklin and was carried unanimously.

Employment of Faculty and Staff Approved

Bid for the Publication of the College News

It was called to the attention of the Board that requests for bids for the publishing of the College News were mailed on April 14, 1953 with the specifications. In this request for bids, it was stated that the deadline would be 2:00 P. M. May 25, 1953. At 4:10 P. M., the President was handed to open bids for the publication of the College News.

Motion was made by Mr. Franklin that the bid of the Murray Democrat, Murray, Kentucky, being the lowest and best bid for the publication of the College News, and said bid being as follows:

- 6 Page Paper, per specifications, 2700 copies \$241.90 \$2.50 per 100 above or below 2700 copies
- 8 Page Paper, per specifications, 2700 copies \$321.70 \$3.00 per 100 above or below 2700 copies,

be hereby accepted. This motion was seconded by Mr. Price; and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Franklin, aye; Mr. Springer, aye.

Varsity Gymnasium Enlargement, John W. Carr Health and Physical Education Building

President Woods reported to the Board the present status of the enlargement of the varsity gymnasium, and read the letter which he wrote to Honorable Lawrence Wetherby, Governor of the State of Kentucky.

Motion was made by Mr. Franklin that the Board approve the plans for the construction of the addition to the John W. Carr Health Building and that we respectfully urge the State Property and Buildings Commission to grant us

authority to proceed under force account with the construction of this building, and that the Building Commission advertise at the earliest possible moment for bids and award the contract for the construction of this structure. This motion was seconded by Mr. Price; and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Franklin, aye; Mr. Springer, aye.

5-25-53 \$50,000.00 Additional Bonds for Construction of Addition to Varsity Gymnasium

Motion was made by Mr. Price that if the bids on the completed structure, the addition to the varsity gymnasium in the John W. Carr Health and Physical Education Building, exceed the estimate of \$250,000.00, \$150,000.00 of which was to be financed out of Building Revenue Bonds, we herewith pledge ourselves to authorize the sale of an additional sum of \$50,000.00 of bonds provided the Kentucky State Building Commission provide a like sum for the construction of this addition to the said building. This motion was seconded by Mr. Franklin; and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Franklin, aye; Mr. Springer, aye.

Murray College School Company Purchased Baptist Picnic Grounds, Desires To Rent Said Property to Murray State College

President Woods reported to the Board that the Murray College School Company had purchased the 5.6 acres of land adjacent to the campus, east of the stadium wall, which is well known as the Baptist Picnic Grounds, for the sum of \$5,500.00; and he stated further that the Murray College School Company desires to rent this property to the college to be used as the college sees fit.

Motion was made by Mr. Price that the college rent the tract of land known as the Baptist Picnic Grounds, 5.6 acres, from the Murray College School Company, Murray, Kentucky, for the sum of \$816.00 to be paid on or before May 1, 1954. This motion was seconded by Mr. Franklin; and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Franklin, aye; Mr. Springer, aye.

Sale of White Houses Authorized Advertised To Clear Location for Addition to John W. Carr Health and Physical Education Building, Varsity Gymnasium

The attention of the Board was called to the fact that, in order to locate the enlarged varsity gymnasium, the proposed addition to the John W. Carr Health and Physical Education Building, according to the approved plans, it will be necessary to move or to sell either eight of ll of the white houses (individual family dwelling units).

Motion was made by Mr. Price that by virtue of the fact that it appears necessary to move either eight or 11 of the white houses from the area where the proposed addition to the John W. Carr Health and Physical Education Building is to be constructed, the Board of Regents hereby authorizes the President to proceed to advertise and sell the aforementioned houses if it is definite that the addition to the said building will be constructed. This motion was seconded by Mr. Franklin; and the roll was called on its adoption with the following result: Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Franklin, aye; Mr. Springer, aye.

Adjournment
