DORMITORY PROPOSAL

Whereas, the dormitory policies now in effect at Murray State University are considered discriminatory as they now exist, and do not mirror the wants and needs of the students, the following proposals have been drafted to try to rectify this situation:

1. Elimination of mandatory hours. Specific policy will be decided by a majority democratic vote within each dormitory.

2. Creation of visitation rights. Specific policy will be decided by a democratic majority vote within each dormitory.

Mr. Callahan reported that a proposal of the Student Government was modified by the Administrative Council and had been agreed to by both the Student Government and the Administrative Council and further recommended that it be adopted by the Board of Regents.

The Board heard from the group presenting the Student Government-Administrative Council proposal comprised of Randy Hutchinson and Johanna Comisak, representing the Student Government, and Terry Yates, representing the Student Coalition.

The group was excused.

The Board heard from members of the steering committee of the New Student Front. The representatives were Steve Dombroski, Cindy Rinehart, and Jeannie Salisbury.

The group was excused.

Mr. Waterfield stated that in order to accelerate action, he would move that the Board table the recommendations and that no consideration be given to the matter for the remainder of this school year.

Mrs. Hart seconded and the roll was called on the adoption of the motion with the following voting: Mr. Adams, no; Mr. Doran, no; Mrs. Hart, no; Dr. Howard, no; Mr. Waterfield, aye; and Mr. Whittle, no. Motion failed.

Mr. Callahan moved that the Board adopt the following amendment to the Administrative Council Committee proposal:

5) that students who are on academic or social probation cannot live in self-regulated dormitories.

and further moved that this be implemented on a trial basis during the Fall Semester 1971. Mrs. Hart seconded. Discussion was called for and Dr. Sparks stated that he would recommend the proposal as amended be adopted as policy on a trial basis for the Fall Semester 1971. The Chairman called for the vote and all voted aye. Motion carried.

The Board noted that this proposal was submitted through due course.

- 4) that occupants of these residence hall (s) shall assume equally the expense involved in providing for the additional personnel;
- 5) that students who are on academic or social probation cannot live in self-regulated dormitories.

Dr. Howard seconded and the roll was called on the adoption of the motion with the following voting: Mr. Adams, aye; Mr. Doran, aye; Mrs. Hart, aye; Dr. Howard, aye; Mr. Waterfield, no; and Mr. Whittle, aye. Motion carried.

The Board denied the proposal of the New Student Front.

Mr. Adams moved that the Board consider no change in the present visitation policy and further that the Board instruct the Faculty Disciplinary Committee to immediately suspend students--male and female--guilty of unauthorized visitation in dormitory rooms.
