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# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY September 15, 1973

The Board of Regents of Murray State University met in special session on call of Chairman H. Glenn Doran on September 15, 1973, at 2:00 p.m., C.D.T., in the Board Room of the Administration Building on the campus of Murray State University, Murray, Kentucky, for the purpose of meeting the new president and any other matters that needed to come before the Board. The following members were present: Mr. H. Glenn Doran, Mr. Dave Curtis, Mr. James A. Davis, Dr. M. D. Hassell, Dr. Charles E. Howard, Mr. Bob T. Long, Mr. A. B. Mitchell, Mr. Graves (Skip) Neale, Mr. O. B. Springer, and Mr. Harry Lee Waterfield. None were absent.

Present also for the meeting were Dr. Harry M. Sparks, President Emeritus; Dr. Constantine W. Curris, President; Mrs. Patsy R. Dyer, Secretary of the Board; Dr. Thomas B. Hogancamp, Vice President for Administrative Affairs and Treasurer of the Board; and Dr. William G. Read, Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Judge Earl T. Osborne administered the Oath of Office to President Constantine W. Curris and to Mr. James A. Davis, Board Member. Mr. Davis was appointed to the Board of Regents by Governor Ford on August 31, 1973, for a term of four years ending March 31, 1977.

## Election of Officers

Mr. Waterfield moved that H. Glenn Doran be elected temporary chairman and Patsy R. Dyer be elected temporary secretary. Motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

Mr. Waterfield stated that today we are beginning the second half-century of Murray State University with a new president. He expressed appreciation to Dr. Harry M. Sparks, the retiring president.

Mr. Waterfield further expressed appreciation to Mr. Doran, who chaired the Steering Committee for selecting the new president, for coordinating the work of the Steering Committee and the Board in that 216 applications were diligently and carefully studied. He further stated that since the new president would need the Board's advice and since Mr. Doran lives in Murray, has been on the Board for a number of years, has served effectively, and has background knowledge of the University, there is no better selection for Chairman of the Board of Regents than Mr. Doran. Mr. Waterfield nominated H. Glenn Doran as permanent Chairman of the Board of Regents of Murray State University and further moved if there were no other nominations that H. Glenn Doran be elected Chairman of the Board of Regents by acclamation with the Secretary casting one vote for Mr. Doran. Mr. Springer seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Neale nominated Charles E. Howard for Vice Chairman of the Board of Regents and moved that if there were no other nominations Dr. Howard be elected Vice Chairman by acclamation. Mr. Long seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Howard moved that Patsy R. Dyer be elected Secretary of the Board of Regents by acclamation. Mr. Springer seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Waterfield placed in nomination the name of Dr. Thomas B. Hogancamp, who has been serving as Treasurer of the Board, for Treasurer of the Board of Regents. Mr. Long seconded and moved that the nominations cease and that Dr. Hogancamp be elected Treasurer by acclamation. Motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

Chairman Doran declared a quorum present for the transaction of business and asked Dr. Hogancamp to open the meeting with prayer.

## Resolution regarding Surplus Property, Adopted

Mr. Mitchell presented the following resolution and moved that it be adopted:

WHEREAS, certain real property owned by the United States, consisting of two metal, one-story, buildings located in the County of Livingston, State of Kentucky, and County of Trigg, State of Kentucky, have been declared surplus and are subject to assignment for disposal for educational or public health purposes by the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare under the provisions of Section 203(k) (1) of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949, (63 Stat. 377), as amended, and rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto; and

WHEREAS, Murray State University has a current need for said property and will promptly utilize the same for educational purposes as set forth in its application and in accordance with the requirements of said Act and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Murray State University shall make application to the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare for and secure the transfer to it the above mentioned property for said use upon and subject to such exceptions, reservations, terms, covenants, agreements, conditions, and restrictions as the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare, or his authorized representatives, may require in connection with the disposal of said property under said Act and rules and regulations issued pursuant thereto; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Murray State University has legal authority, is willing and is administratively and financially able to assume immediate care and maintenance of the property, and that Drane Shelley, Director of Purchasing and General Services, be and he is hereby authorized to do and perform any and all acts and things which may be necessary to carry out the foregoing resolution, including the preparing, making and filing of plans, applications, reports, and other documents, the execution, acceptance of, delivery and recording, if necessary, of agreements and other instruments pertaining to the transfer of said property, and the payment of any and all sums necessary on account of the purchase price thereof or on account of fees (including the service charge, if any, assessed by the State Agency for Surplus Property) or other costs incurred in connection with the transfer of said property for appraisals, recording of instruments, dismantling and removal, and site clearance, guarantee deposits or bonds, transporting and delivery and re-erection.

Resolution placing our Security Department under the Provisions of KRS 164.955, which permits the exercise of authority of the safety and security officers on campus and streets adjacent to the campus, Adopted

Mr. Springer presented the following resolution and moved that it be adopted:

RESOLVED, that Murray State University does hereby, pursuant to KRS 164.955, et. seq. establish its own Safety and Security Department; that Ira Kemp, Hollis Roberts, Joseph E. Green, Joseph Beard, Eugene Rogers, Hardy Kelso; Lindo Riley, Charles Kemp, Rupert Maynard, and Orman Price-Director of Security, are hereby appointed as Safety and Security Officers at Murray State University with all the powers and jurisdiction under KRS 164.955, et. seq. to serve at the pleasure of this Board; that Murray State University shall prescribe distinct uniforms for the Safety and Security Officers and shall designate and operate emergency vehicles; the Security Officers shall have the powers and jurisdiction granted them under KRS 164.955; however, said jurisdiction shall not be extended or broadened by formal or informal agreement without the express prior approval of this Board; except that Security Officers may render assistance in emergency situations upon request from the Murray City Police, the Calloway County Sheriff, or the Kentucky State Police. The Murray State University Director of Security or any of his superiors shall have the exclusive right to determine whether such an emergency exists and whether emergency aid shall be rendered.

Mr. Mitchell seconded and the motion carried unanimously.
