# 5. Appointment of Chairman, Department of Industrial Education

I am pleased to recommend the appointment of Dr. Paul Lyons as Chairman of and Associate Professor in the Department of Industrial Education effective August 1, 1978 at an annual salary of \$25,400.

Dr. Lyons served as Chairman of the Department of Vocational-Technical Education for the past year. As part of a reorganization of the College of Industry and Technology previously approved by the Board, the Department of Industrial Arts and Vocational-Technical Education were merged. Dr. Lyons will now serve as Chairman of the newly merged department.

Dr. Lyons, a 1953 alumnus of Murray State, received his doctorate from Southern Illinois University in 1973. He joined the University faculty in 1966 after extensive teaching in the Hopkins County and Murray City School systems.

#### 6. Appointment of Chairman, Department of Mathematics

I am pleased to recommend the appointment of Dr. David Gibbs as Chairman of and Associate Professor in the Department of Mathematics effective July 1, 1978 at an annual salary of \$25,500.

Dr. Gibbs comes to Murray State from Louisiana State University where he served for the past five years. Prior to that experience, he worked at the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory at Berkeley, as an Instructor of Mathematics at John Tyler Community College, and as a guest researcher at the Institute of Mathematics at the University of Bonn.

Dr. Gibbs, a California native, received his baccalaureate and master's degrees from the University of California (Berkeley), and his Ph.D. from the University of Virginia in 1971.

#### 8. Honorary Doctorate

Upon recommendation of the Commencement Committee and with my heartiest endorsement, I am pleased to recommend that a Doctorate of Humanities be conferred upon Clara M. Eagle. Professor Eagle joined the Murray State faculty in 1946 and became Chairwoman of the Department of Art in 1948. She served Murray State for 25 years until her retirement for health reasons in 1971. Her twenty-three years tenure as departmental chairwoman is one of the longest--and most productive in the University's history.

Since her retirement she has received extensive recognition for her silver-smithing work, and has been honored by the Kentucky Arts Education Association and the Kentucky Guild for Artisans and Craftsmen. She presently serves as Trustee of the Murray State University Foundation.

#### 9. Renaming the Lowry Annex

I recommend that the campus building known as the Lowry Annex, be renamed the Lowry Center.

When the annex to our Library was constructed in 1967, it was named in honor of C. S. Lowry, a much-heralded and regarded professor and chairman of social sciences at Murray State University. With the pending completion of the Waterfield Library, and the recent designation of our original library as the Forrest Pogue Special Collections Library, it is now appropriate to change the name of the Lowry Annex to reflect its new role on our campus. The Lowry Center will house several programs on our campus directly related to the teaching and learning functions. Among these programs are:

- A) The Center for the Enhancement of Teaching Effectiveness
- B) A campus-wide audio-visual facility
- C) The Music Listening Center, and
- D) The Learning Center (campus wide tutoring and individualized instruction in reading, mathematics and English).

#### 12. Authorization for Liability Insurance Protection

I recommend that the Board of Regents authorize the President to investigate liability insurance protection afforded the Board of Regents, the faculty and staff of the University, and to seek quotes or bids for such coverage, and to report to the Board with any recommendation.

The 1978 Kentucky General Assembly authorized universities to purchase liability insurance for the protection of individual members of the governing boards, faculty and staff of universities from liability for acts and omissions committed in the course and scope of the individual's employment and service.

Prior to this enactment, public funds could not be expended for liability insurance, and such protection fell under the tort liability protection inherent to local governments or was purchased individually or through private funds. This enactment represents a major breakthrough in the ability of a University to offer adequate liability protection for its regents and employees. The acquisition of liability insurance for all University employees is more than a much appreciated fringe benefit; it is good business for any public agency.

#### 13. Contract for 1979 Shield printing

I recommend the acceptance of the low bid of Josten's/American Yearbook Company, Clarksville, Tennessee, at \$32,863.00 for the printing of the 1979 Shield.

I further recommend that the President be authorized to negotiate such contracts in future years, subject to the proviso that the University accept the lowest and best bid.

#### Supplemental Agenda

#### 1. New Program: Master of Arts in Education: Adult and Community Education

I recommend that the Board of Regents approve a new graduate program under the degree, Master of Arts in Education. This program responds to a growing field in education: the preparation of adult basic education teachers. The Kentucky State Department of Education has asked two universities: Morehead State and Murray State to assume responsibility for graduate coursework in the State. The area west of Elizabethtown has been assigned to Murray State. Most of these offerings will be in our summer session and off-campus during the academic year.

Minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Regents held on April 29, 1978 and May 13, 1978, Approved

Mr. Long moved that the Board approve the Minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Regents held on April 29, 1978 and May 13, 1978, as received. Mr. McCuiston seconded and the motion carried.

#### President's Report

President Curris reported that the summer school enrollment was up approximately 100 over last year with an increase in graduate enrollment; that we are in the process of erecting signs to identify all buildings on the campus; and that Eagle University has been a consortium offering higher education programs at Ft. Campbell. The Army is terminating the consortium and is negotiating directly with one institution. Programs in the future will be more vocational in nature and geared toward specific needs of army personnel. In the coming year we are in the process of negotiating to offer a program in emergency medical training and a Master of Science program emphasizing systems management.

The President introduced Dr. Richard Butwell, Vice-President for Academic Programs; Dr. Rick Stinchfield, Administrative Assistant to the President; and Dr. Tom Wagner, Associate Professor of Guidance and Counseling, who was elected President of the Faculty Senate.

Regarding construction projects, President Curris stated that the Waterfield Library will be completed shortly, and we anticipate using the library at the beginning of the academic year. Rededication ceremonies are scheduled for Saturday, September 2, with a luncheon and the ceremonies in the afternoon, and that Governor Waterfield and his family will be here. He further reported that the renovation of Wells Hall and construction of the University Center are on schedule and that we hope renovation of Wrather Hall will be underway before winter.

Dr. Curris called attention to the Racer Club brochures and stated that the NCAA committee has approved reinstatement of all automatic bids, including the OVC. This recommendation must be approved by the full Association. He stated that the University of Akron has been added to the Conference. He reported that we have merged our two booster clubs into one club and the preliminary report on ticket sales appears to be the best in recent history.

In response to Dr. Matarazzo's question, the President stated that the price of tickets is recommended by the Athletic Department, reviewed by the Vice-President for University Services and approved by the President, and that historically the Board of Regents has approved only mandatory fees (imposed on all). Discretionary fees have been administratively determined.

Dr. Matarazzo expressed concern that in setting the ticket prices no input was obtained from various elements of the University community and townspeople.

Dr. Curris stated he realized that the faculty was concerned with the \$50 donation for chair seats but it is his position that it is much better to use private rather than public funds for athletic programs. He further stated that our procedure is the same as that used at other universities and the charge is less than at other schools.

Mr. Christopher stated he had received calls concerning faculty and staff of the University purchasing tickets at one-half price.

Dr. Curris stated he believed that this is a fringe benefit for faculty and staff and that he strongly supports.

It is noted that mailed to the Board members prior to the meeting was a June 30, 1978 report from the MSU Federal Credit Union which indicated 160 memberships with assets totalling \$37,477. Forty-two loans totalling \$28,117, an average of \$669 per loan, had been made.

Upon question, Dr. Curris explained that JPAHES is the Area Health Education System for Jackson Purchase which is a special program through the Council on Higher Education funded by the State Legislature directly to the Council. The state is divided into several regions, and Murray State acts as fiscal agent for the Jackson Purchase Area Health Education System which has headquarters in Wrather Hall on campus.

Mr. McCuiston moved that the Board approve the staff personnel/payroll items listed in Item 4 A-D of the agenda. Dr. Settle seconded and the following voted: Miss Boles, aye; Mr. Long, aye; Dr. Matarazzo, aye; Mr. McCuiston, aye; Mr. Mitchell, aye; Dr. Settle, aye; and Dr. Howard, aye.

#### Dr. Paul Lyons named Chairman of the Department of Industrial Education

President Curris reviewed his recommendation that Dr. Paul Lyons be appointed Chairman of the Department of Industrial Education and introduced Dr. Lyons to the members.

Dr. Matarazzo moved that the Board designate Dr. Paul Lyons Chairman of and Associate Professor in the Department of Industrial Education effective August 1, 1978 at an annual salary of \$25,400.00. Mr. McCuiston seconded and the following voted: Miss Boles, aye; Mr. Long, aye; Dr. Matarazzo, aye; Mr. McCuiston, aye; Mr. Mitchell, aye; Dr. Settle, aye; and Dr. Howard, aye.

### Dr. David Gibbs named Chairman of the Department of Mathematics

President Curris reviewed his recommendation that Dr. David Gibbs be appointed Chairman of the Department of Mathematics and introduced Dr. Gibbs to the members.
