The Board of Regents of Murray State University met April 25, 1987, in the Board Room, Wells Hall, on the campus of the University. The meeting was called to order at 10:40 a.m., C.D.T., by Chairman William E. Beasley. Ms. Carol Simon, President of the Baptist Student Union, gave the invocation.

#### Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Regents held February 7, 1987, Approved

Mr. Nichols moved that the Minutes of the Board meeting held February 7, 1987, be approved as received. Mrs. Strohecker seconded and the motion carried.

#### Report of the President

President Stroup thanked the Yearbook Staff for the excellent 1987 SHIELD. She called attention to the new MSU brochure in the information packet.

President Stroup presented the attached report to the Regents and briefly highlighted the following items.

On Monday, April 20, the Centers of Excellence Review Panel recommended funding for our Ecosystems Center of Excellence and for an Endowed Chair to serve this Center. Other recommended Centers were two each at the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville, and also recommended for Endowed chairs were the University of Kentucky, the University of Louisville, and Kentucky State University. The Council on Higher Education will vote on the Panel's recommendations on May 7.

The Murray State University Foundation Board of Trustees, meeting in session April 24, pledged \$500,000 of unrestricted private funds to match the State funds for an Endowed Chair in Applied Ecosystems Ecology. The designation as a Center will move the University into a different league with respect to research and teaching in science.

- 2. Junior Jam Day is today. About 500 high school juniors and their parents are expected on campus for tours and academic sessions. This is sponsored by the School Relations Staff.
- The American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business 3. notifed the University on April 13, that our College of Business and Public Affairs has not met faculty research and publication standards of the reaccreditation process and has been placed on a one-year trial period. The accrediting board requires the College to submit during spring 1988 an updated report reflecting improvements. The College will continue to be fully accredited at both the graduate and undergraduate levels during the trial period, and we are committed to do everything possible to make the necessary improvements to meet the standards.
- 4. A National Science Foundation Grant of approximately \$200,000 for a regional summer workshop for high school chemistry and physical science teachers has been awarded to the Department of Chemistry.

- 5. Dorothea Jolly Leitch provided for the remainder of her estate to go to MSU in memory of her husband, Donald J. Leitch. The six-figure endowment for the Leitch Scholarship and Leitch Memorial Fund will wholly or partially fund a chair professorship solely in the Accounting Department.
- 6. I joined Governor Collins and Secretary Knicely in London, England, April 4-9, for the opening of the Office for Industrial Development in Kentucky, toured facilities of Kings College in Kensington, and promoted Kentucky and its products.
- 7. The Pre-College Bridge Program for underprepared students has been developed to "bridge" the gap between high school and college and will be offered for the first time this summer on the MSU campus.
- 8. Murray State and Henderson Community College has reopened a cooperative venture to offer graduate-level courses on the Henderson campus.

#### Committee Reports/Recommendations

#### A. Academic Affairs - Mr. Taylor

For the Academic Affairs Committee, Mr. Taylor moved that the Board approve the name of the Department of Office Administration and Business Education be changed to the Department of Office Systems and Business Education effective July 1, 1987. Mr. Nichols seconded and the motion carried.

Mr. Taylor stated that with our efforts to establish distinguished chairs and eminent scholars, an early tenure option is crucial to our success. This policy, while providing reasonable assurance of security to potential faculty, also provides the University with a sufficient amount of time to evaluate the candidate and in no way obligates the University to award tenure. The Early Tenure Policy was developed and approved by the Faculty Senate and has the endorsement of the deans and the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Mr. Taylor moved that the Board approve the following policy:

#### EARLY TENURE POLICY

A faculty member joining Murray State University following distinguished service at another institution may, after one academic year of probation, be appointed with tenure. Such an appointment will be made only upon the recommendation of an absolute majority of the tenured members of the department to which the faculty member will be assigned. This consideration for recommendation for tenure by the tenure members will be concluded no later than March 15 of the probationary academic year. This recommendation will be forwarded directly to the vice president for academic affairs and from there to the president and the Board of Regents for approval. Such an appointment will be made only if the appointee holds tenure at an institution comparable to Murray State University.

Mr. Carter seconded and the motion carried.

Mr. Taylor stated that Murray State University has had unique recognition in that we are the only regional university to be recommended for a Center of Excellence and an Endowed Chair. He read the following resolution, moved that it be adopted, and requested distribution be made to the Governor, the area State Senators and Representatives, and the Council on Higher Education.

RESOLUTION of the Murray State University Board of Regents April 25, 1987

WHEREAS, Murray State University has been recommended as recipient of a Center of Excellence for Ecosystems Studies and an Endowed Chair in Applied Ecosystems Ecology, and

WHEREAS, the proposals for the Center of Excellence and Endowed Chair represent the creative, diligent, and cooperative efforts of faculty in the College of Science and the administration of the University, and a strong commitment to active research programs, innovative teaching, and public service to the region and state, and

WHEREAS, the selection of Murray State University for a Center of Excellence and an Endowed Chair recognizes the unique facilities of the University and the region, the strength of the faculty, and the quality of the institution's academic programs, and

WHEREAS, the Center of Excellence will make a significant contribution to economic development of the community, region, and state, and will have a national impact on the management of natural ecosystems, and

WHEREAS, the Center and Endowed Chair are consistent with the mission of the University and the Strategic Plan of the Council on Higher Education, and will move the University toward national and international prominence, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Murray State University Foundation has committed \$500,000 in unrestricted private funds to secure the match for the Endowed Chair, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Regents recognizes the critical roles of the Council on Higher Education, the State Legislature, and the Governor in establishing the Centers of Excellence and Endowed Chairs for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the faculty, administration, and staff of Murray State University are to be commended for the quality and vision of their efforts; and that Murray State University Board of Regents on April 25, 1987, does pledge its unconditional commitment to the necessary programmatic support and fiscal resources to maintain and enhance the Center for Ecosystems with its companion Endowed Chair.

#### Janice Weaver granted Tenure

President Stroup stated that she is recommending Dean Janice Weaver for tenure under the provisions of the Early Tenure Policy. She added that Dean Weaver was recommended for tenure by the appropriate departmental committee, departmental chair, collegiate committee, and the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Mrs. LaFollette moved that the Board upon the recommendation of the President grant tenure to Dr. Janice Weaver, Dean of the College of Education, effective July 1, 1987. Mr. Nichols seconded and the motion carried.

Dr. Hammack stated a meeting of the Buildings and Grounds Committee will be held following the Board meeting and discussion of capital construction priorities will continue.

#### G. Student Life - Mr. Zimmerman

For the Student Life Committee, Mr. Zimmerman reported that the recommendation on the Murray State Plan is postponed in order to provide the Faculty Senate further opportunity to review the Plan.

Mr. Zimmerman presented the following recommendation and moved that the Board approve the following changes in the Student Development area: the responsibilities of Jim Baurer. currently Director of Campus Recreation, be redefined to include those functions which involve the co-curricular life of

campus and his position be retitled Director of Co-Curricular Education, and further that the TRIO programs (Upward Bound, Special Services, and Talent Search) be placed under the supervision of Dr. William Allbritten, Director of the Counseling and Testing Center and the Learning Center.

Mr. Nichols seconded and the motion carried.

Mr. Zimmerman reviewed the background material pertaining to health insurance needs of international students and outlined the three options available to international students.

Mr. Zimmerman moved that the Board adopt the policy that international students be required to purchase health insurance for themselves and any accompanying dependents prior to completing their enrollment.

Mrs. Strohecker seconded and the motion carried.

Mr. Zimmerman stated that in May 1986, the Board adopted a resolution expressing appreciation to Jerry Don Crutchfield for his composition of the song, "Murray State Will Always Be Home To Me," and that this resolution further stated that the song be designated as an official song for use on appropriate occasions. He added that Mr. Crutchfield, a Distinguished Alumnus of Murray State, is Senior Vice President of MCA Music in Nashville, that Mr. Crutchfield has agreed to donate his rights to the song and has provided funding for production of a videotape for exclusive distribution by Murray State Unviersity, and that proceeds from the sale of tapes are to be designated for the Jerry Don Crutchfield Scholarship Fund.

In keeping with the recommendation of the Student Senate, Mr. Zimmerman moved that the Board of Regents adopt the composition, "Murray State Will Always Be Home To Me," by Jerry Don Crutchfield as the official Murray State University Senior Song. Mr. Nichols seconded and the motion carried.

#### I. CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE/ENDOWED CHAIRS

Following our last Board meeting, proposals for the Centers of Excellence were redrafted and refined. We submitted five proposals for Centers and Endowed Chairs: A) Center of Excellence for Ecosystems Studies, B) Endowed Chair: Eminent Scholar in Applied Ecosystem Ecology, C) Center for the Integration of Management and Advanced Technology, D) Endowed Chair: Chair of Information Systems, and E) Center of Excellence for International Education.

On Monday, April 20, the Centers of Excellence Review Panel recommended funding for our Ecosystems Center of Excellence and for an Endowed Chair to serve this Center. Other recommended Centers were two each at the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville, and also recommended for Endowed Chairs were the University of Kentucky, the University of Louisville, and Kentucky State University. The Council on Higher Education will vote on the Panel's recommendations on May 7.

#### II. REPORT FROM AMERICAN ASSEMBLY OF COLLEGIATE SCHOOLS OF BUSINESS

The AACSB notified the University on April 13, that our College of Business & Public Affairs has not met faculty research and publication standards of the reaccreditation process and has been placed on a one-year trial period. The accrediting board requires the College to submit during spring 1988 an updated report reflecting improvements. The College will continue to be fully accredited at both the graduate and undergraduate levels during the trial period, and we are committed to do everything possible to make the necessary improvements to meet the standards.

#### III. DEVELOPMENT AS A UNIVERSITY

- A. National Science Foundation Grant \$199,030 for "Regional Summer Workshop for High School Chemistry and Physical Science Teachers."
- B. President Stroup joined Governor Martha Layne Collins and Commerce Secretary Carroll Knicely in London, England, April 4-9 for the opening of the Office for Industrial Development in Kentucky.
- C. The Pre-College Bridge Program has been developed to "bridge" the gap between high school and college and will be offered for the first time this summer on the Murray State campus.

2.\_.:

This is a five-week program, directed by Dr. Richard Hazler, for 1987 high school graduates, 1987-88 seniors, and non-traditional students with an interest in college and the need to develop selected academic skills. Students will enroll in Developmental English, Developmental Math, Reading & Study Skills Improvement, and Academic Development Seminar.

- D. Murray State and Henderson Community College have joined in a cooperative venture to begin offering graduate-level courses again on the Henderson campus.
- E. Dorothea Jolly Leitch of Murray provided for the remainder of her estate to go to Murray State University in memory of her husband, Donald J. Leitch who was an accountant. The six-figure endowments for the Leitch Scholarship and Leitch Memorial Fund will wholly or partially fund a chair professorship solely in the Accounting Department.
- F. MSU hosted Information Exchange Day for superintendents, principals, and counselors to describe data for their graduates and receive suggestions for ways MSU can better serve high schools.
- G. The Senior Pledge Program was initiated this spring, under the direction of the Development Office. The Program provides seniors with the opportunity to make a positive contribution to their university as a class. To date the Program has received approximately \$8,000 in pledges from the senior class.
- H. The search process and interviewing are continuing for the position of Director of Development, but development activities are on-going. The Office of Development held MSU's second Annual Fund Phonothon in February. More than 300 student volunteers from various organizations on campus contacted the reunion year classes from 1927 to 1987, in order to seek contributions for the University.
- Junior Jam Day is today, April 25. About 500 high school juniors and their parents are expected on campus for tours and academic sessions.

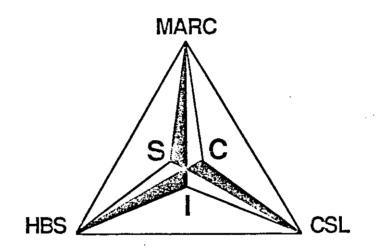

# CENTER OF EXCELLENCE FOR ECOSYSTEMS STUDIES COLLEGE OF SCIENCE MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY

#### Background/Need

Southwestern Kentucky has the largest density of major rivers and reservoirs of any region in the world. Kentucky and Barkley Lakes are the terminal reservoirs in the Tennessee and Cumberland River basins. Both rivers enter the final pool of the Ohio River prior to its confluence with the Mississippi River.

In the last half-century reservoirs have become prominent environmental features. Demand for services from these artificial ecosystems arose from needs for flood control, hydroelectric power, navigation, waste disposal, water supply, and recreation. Reservoirs must now be managed as valuable natural ecosystems and they must continue to provide standard services (such as production of exploitable fish populations) even though the oldest reservoirs are biologically and geologically young. Failure to understand how reservoirs, lakes, and rivers differ in system-level processes and how to cooperatively manage these aquatic resources has occasionally resulted in serious ecological and economic damage. Few long-term scientific studies provide guidance for understanding the functioning of these ecosystems or for managing the many components of the resource.

#### The Charge/CHE Mission Statement

Murray State University shall serve as a residential, regional university offering a broad range of educational programs to the people of western Kentucky. Recognizing the needs of its region, the University should continue to offer programs at the associate and baccalaureate degree levels which emphasize the traditional collegiate and liberal studies.

Subject to demonstrated need, selected master's degree programs should be offered as well as specialist's programs in education. A retrenchment or elimination of duplicative or nonproductive associate degree programs is desirable while development of new programs compatible with this mission is appropriate.

The University shall continue to meet the needs of teacher education in its primary service region and shall provide applied research, service, and continuing education programs directly related to the needs of this primary service region.

Because of the University's proximity to other higher education and postsecondary institutions, it should foster close working relationships and develop articulation agreements with those institutions. The University should develop cooperative applied research and teaching programs utilizing the unique opportunities available at Murphy's Pond and the Kentucky Lake Biological Station.

#### Purpose and Plan

This proposal is a plan for the establishment of a Center of Excellence for Ecosystems Studies within the College of Science at Murray State University. The Center will draw on three components to develop the ecosystem research group: the Hancock Biological Station (HBS), the Mid-America Remote Sensing Center (MARC), and the Chemical Services Laboratory (CSL). HBS will serve as the primary research facility for aquatic biologists/ecosystem scientists. MARC will assist in development of geographic information data bases on land use, erosion, thermal cycles, and other land-water interactions. CSL will provide state-of-the-art chemical analyses for environmental chemistry, ecotoxicological, trace element, and acid deposition studies. The Center's major research focus will be on long-term reservoir studies; however, expertise available in the Center will also be used to analyze environmental problems associated with other ecosystems in the region. Major impediments to the Center's establishment are lack of a formal coordinating body and necessary financial resources for its operation.

The underlying purpose of the proposed project is to continue to provide more excellent undergraduate and graduate educational experiences for Kentucky's bright young scientists. Designation as a Center of Excellence can provide the thrust required to move the operation from a burgeoning, somewhat localized entity to one having national and international prominence — something that all Kentuckians will be proud to claim and support. We are on-our-way and are simply asking for the opportunity

to become a major research unit for the Commonwealth. The natural resources are indiginous to the area, the direction of the program is consistent with the long-term goals of the University (and certainly part of the CHE mission statement), the faculty are capable and dedicated to the pursuit, and the administration is enthusiastically supportive; therefore, the request for support of a Center of Excellence is consistent with the challenge that Kentucky's system of higher education become outstanding with each institution recognized for quality within its specific role and mission.

The Center of Excellence for Ecosystems Studies has enormous potential for becoming an outstanding means by which scientists from various disciplines and institutions can study the region's valuable natural resources. Faculty affiliated with the three components of the Center are among the most productive in the University and have outstanding records of research accomplishments. Two of the physical facilities (Hancock Biological Station and the Mid-America Remote Sensing Center) are unique resources for the state and have also been recognized at the national level. The Department of Biological Sciences has the only formal fisheries/aquatic biology program in the Commonwealth and is closely associated with the Hancock Biological Station. Additionally, the Department of Chemistry and the Chemical Services Laboratory provide the expertise and instrumentation for detailed chemical analyses. With proper support and development, the Center could emerge as a model for quality instruction, economic-development-related service, and applied research, with attendant national prominence for Murray State University and the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

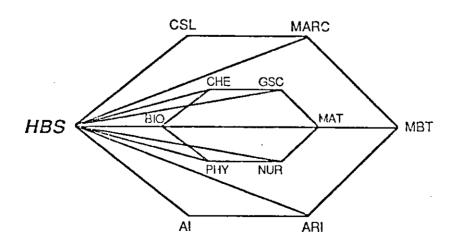
For more than a decade, MSU's College of Science has committed scarce resources to the development of research programs having greater magnitude than normally found at institutions of similar background and mission. The programs have grown out of strong faculty commitment to active research programs while fulfilling heavy teaching/service responsibilities. Further, administrative support, selective

hiring practices, and college-wide planning have assisted in developing common interest areas and cooperative research units. Specifically, there are three potentially-strong, discipline-based cooperatives established and functioning within the College. The sum of these three parts (HBS, MARC, CSL) should literally be greater than the whole in support of the proposed Center of Excellence for Ecosystems Studies.

  - B. PROFESSOR A. L. HOUGH AGREES:
- 1. To work for MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY in a teaching capacity in the Department of English on a half-time basis for the academic years 1987-88, 1988-89, 1989-90, and 1990-91.
- 2. To make himself available for related professional responsibilities in the area of research, service, counseling, and community activities consistent with his part-time status.

#### C. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED:

- 1. That the UNIVERSITY shall have the right to determine the manner in which PROFESSOR A. L. HOUGH'S workload is to be apportioned throughout each academic year.

Any employment benefits awarded must be consistent with full retirement status, the contractual obligation to teach on a one-half time basis, and with University policies pertaining thereto.

- 7. That if this contract is inconsistent with Kentucky law, then, and in such event, the Kentucky law shall supercede this contract and to that extent only.
- 8. That the tenured status of PROFESSOR

  A. L. HOUGH will terminate with the effective date of this

  Contract.
- 9. That PROFESSOR A. L. HOUGH can be removed by the Board of Regents for cause, viz., immorality, inefficiency, incompetency, or failure to cooperate with the plans and policies of the University, failure to perform satisfactorily the duties assigned to him, for conduct that has destroyed his usefulness to the institution, or if there is no longer a position available within the University for which he is qualified.

- 8. That the tenured status of PROFESSOR SUE BROWN will terminate with the effective date of this Contract.
- 9. That PROFESSOR SUE BROWN can be removed by the Board of Regents for cause, viz., immorality, inefficiency, incompetency, or failure to cooperate with the plans and policies of the University, failure to perform satisfactorily the duties assigned to her, for conduct that has destroyed her usefulness to the institution, or if there is no longer a position available within the University for which she is qualified.
- 10. This contract is not to be construed as creating a policy on early retirement. This contract is designed to meet the needs of a particular factual situation and is made pursuant to the powers of the Board of Regents as set forth in KRS 164.360(1) and KRS 164.365.
