<u>Minutes of the Quarterly Board of Regents Meeting held on February 12, 1999, and the Special Meeting held on April 16, 1999, approved</u>

Mrs. Burr moved that the Minutes of the quarterly meeting of the Board of Regents held on February 12, 1999, and the special meeting held on April 16, 1999, be approved as presented. Mr. Earwood seconded and the motion carried.

Report of the President

President Alexander informed the Board that the main issue for discussion at this meeting is the Budget. The budget is dependent upon growth of the University and continuing funding at the state level that would be at a relatively high level. The University is entering a new era with the state and will be delegated responsibility to set our own tuition and fees in the future. Between now and the September meeting we are going to need to do a lot of work to determine what is the proper balance for our tuition and our fees against our scholarships and what should be the balance for in-state tuition versus out-of-state tuition. This is a new experience for Murray State. While we are secure for this coming year, we are going to have to make some heavy decisions later this summer and September and November with regard to next year's budget and continuing under this new regime of delegation that we are going to certainly receive from the state.

In the past, institutions have not had the prerogative to set their own tuitions. In the future, we will be able to set in-state and out-of-state tuitions and we will be able to set a different tuition from Morehead, Eastern or Western or UK, so we need to carefully calibrate what that does to our fiscal future. What is the elasticity of demand for students in Illinois and Tennessee for out-of-state tuition, our incentive grant districts We have gone to core city areas and urban areas with incentive grants throughout the country in the past to bring in good students. All of that plays into this important decision that we are going to have to make with regard to tuition and fees. Keeping in mind that we are an access institution and as a public university we want to keep our tuitions and fees as low as possible so that students will have access to this University.

Report of the Chair

Chair Easley congratulated Regent Wells Lovett on receiving an award at the State Bar meeting for having practiced law for 50 years.

He expressed appreciation to all individuals who helped to establish the MSU Hopkinsville Center. A number of people were involved in the project.

Mr. Easley also expressed appreciation to all individuals who have worked so hard with regard to the Hester Fire, including Mike Ward of the Commonwealth Attorney's Office.

Treasurer Tom Denton presented and reviewed the financial and investment reports for the period of July 1, 1998, through March 31, 1999. Following a brief discussion, Mrs. McCoy moved, seconded by Mrs. Buchanon, that the Treasurer's Report be accepted. Motion carried.

F. Faculty/Staff Affairs - Mr. Lanier.

Mr. Lanier submitted a written report on behalf of the Faculty/Staff Affairs Committee for inclusion in the Minutes of the meeting. (See Attachment #4) The Committee heard from Dr. William Call, accompanied by Dr. Frank Elwell and Dr. Ann Landini. The Committee concluded that the Faculty Handbook lacks a desirable degree of clarity, that there is some ambiguity in the manner in which it is put together, and thinks that attention should be given to this. Illustrations were given of the ambiguities and lack of clarity. We recommend that the Board act to remedy this situation. Mrs. Dial, the Staff Regent, expressed a desire from Staff Congress that there be a Staff Handbook. The Committee approved that suggestion. Submitted with this report is a draft of a resolution. Mr. Lanier read the last paragraph of the report as follows:

The letter from the Faculty Senate also asked that if the Board concludes that the Faculty Handbook is official policy of the University, it direct President Alexander to abide by the official policy of the Board of Regents. The proposed resolution, if adopted by the Board, should remove concerns in that respect. However, the Committee wishes to state to the Board that it has absolutely no doubt that the President has heretofore abided by official policies of the Board of Regents and that he will continue to do so.

On behalf of the Faculty/Staff Affairs Committee, Mr. Lanier presented the following resolution.

The Board received and considered a report from the Faculty/Staff Affairs Committee of action taken by it in response to a request from the Faculty Senate that the Board of Regents state whether the Faculty Handbook is official policy. Upon motion of Mr. Lanier, duly seconded, and following discussion, it was

RESOLVED, that--

1. The Board of Regents states that the provisions of the Faculty Handbook adopted by it represent University policies and procedures.

2. The Faculty Senate is invited to proceed, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1.8 of the Faculty Handbook, with a review of the Handbook for the purpose of making a clear separation within the Handbook of "policies" and "procedures" and material of other kinds presently in the Handbook, and of stating the significance, distinctions and implications of the separation into those categories, all with a view to increased clarity of those present statements in the Handbook.

3. At the request of the Staff Regent, the Staff Congress is invited to consider the question of there being created a Staff handbook, of nature similar to that of the Faculty Handbook and, if it concludes that such a handbook should be created, to proceed, in company with the Office of Human Resources, to prepare such a Handbook and to submit it to the Vice President for Administrative Affairs who, following his examination, will submit it to the President, with his recommendations, for the President's consideration and determination concerning submission of the Handbook to the Board of Regents for action.

Mr. Lovett seconded and discussion followed.

Mr. Easley suggested that the word represent in No. 1 be changed to contains. Mr. Lanier and Committee agreed to the change.

President Alexander requested that the Student Handbook be included in the resolution with the same wording for Student Government

Mr. Lanier and committee agreed to the change and requested that No. 4 be written and added to the Resolution.

Mr. Lanier moved for question and the motion read as follows with the amendments included.

RESOLVED, that --

1. The Board of Regents states that the provisions of the Faculty Handbook adopted by it contains University policies and procedures.

2. The Faculty Senate is invited to proceed, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1.8 of the Faculty Handbook, with a review of the Handbook for the purpose of making a clear separation within the Handbook of "policies" and "procedures" and material of other kinds presently in the Handbook, and of stating the significance, distinctions and implications of the separation into those categories, all with a view to increased clarity of those present statements in the Handbook.

3. At the request of the Staff Regent, the Staff Congress is invited to consider the question of there being created a Staff Handbook, of nature similar to that of the Faculty Handbook and, if it concludes that such a Handbook should be created, to proceed, in company with the Office of Human resources, to prepare such a handbook and to submit it to the Vice President for Administrative Affairs who, following his examination, will submit it to the President, with his recommendations, for the President's consideration and determination concerning submission of the Handbook to the Board of Regents for action.

4. President Alexander requested that the Student Handbook be included in the Resolution with the same wording for Student Government.

Upon call for the motion as amended, the motion carried.

Regent Lanier requested to read a paper representing his personal comments and that the paper be placed with the minutes of the Board of Regents on June 18, 1999.

Student Faculty Evaluations

Mr. Earwood moved that the student faculty evaluations, using the present norm referenced evaluation instrument, continue to be made utilizing the current student evaluation process for each class taught at the University and that those evaluations be made available to all students annually.

Mr. Lovett seconded and discussion followed.

Mr. Earwood stated that he wanted to affirm that only the norm referenced portion of the instrument will be made available to all students. The motion does not contemplate that anonymous handwritten comments will be made available. Mr. Lanier moved to table the motion until a date not earlier than the next regular meeting of the Board of Regents.

Mr. Burich seconded and discussion followed.

Chair Easley clarified that Todd's motion is nothing new, all he is saying is that the university will continue to do what we are doing and regarding the question about whether it is policy, it becomes policy with the motion.

Mr. Earwood confirmed that the intention of his motion was to continue with the current procedure and, since the meeting is his last meeting before going off the Board, he wanted the policy to be in place before he left the Board. He further pointed out that any outside source as a nonmember of the University could submit an open records request and publish it privately and sell it.

<u>Recess</u>

The Board recessed at 3:15 p.m. and reconvened at 3:35 p.m.

Discussion continued regarding student faculty evaluations.

Question was called for on the motion to table the motion regarding student faculty evaluations indicating that yes means the motion is tabled and no means the original motion will stand as presented.

The roll was called with the following voting: Mrs. Buchanon, no; Mr. Burich, I want the faculty and my fellow Faculty Regent to know that because of the jeopardy of doing a fair evaluation for faculty, I must say no; Mrs. Burr, no; Mrs. Dial, no; Mr. Earwood, no; Mrs. Ford, no; Mr. Lanier, yes; Mr. Lovett, no; Mrs. McCoy, no; Dr. Rudolph, yes; and Mr. Easley, no. Motion to table failed.

Mr. Earwood was asked to restate his motion for the purpose of clarity and voting. He restated as follows:

Mr. Earwood moved that the student faculty evaluations, using the present norm referenced evaluation instrument, continue to be made utilizing the current student evaluation process for each class taught at the University and that those evaluations be made available to all students annually.

The roll was called for the original motion on student faculty evaluations with the following voting: Mrs. Buchanon, yes; Mr. Burich, yes; Mrs. Burr, yes; Mrs. Dial, yes; Mr. Earwood, yes; Mrs. Ford, yes; Mr. Lanier, no, may I explain my vote, not only do I object to signing of the motion as proposed and the action that has been taken, but I am looking straight at the Handbook which I believe a prior Board of Regents adopted and I am satisfied that this procedure violates the procedure that we established and set forth in section 1.8 of the Handbook and I don't think we need to do it like that; Mr. Lovett, yes; Mrs. McCoy, yes; Dr. Rudolph, no, I would also like to say that I'm not voting against evaluations, but I am voting against the present procedure that has been done in accordance with the Handbook; and Mr. Easley, yes. Motion carried.

G. Finance/Audit - Mr. Easley.

Authorization to Dispose Surplus Bunk House

Exception to Salary Distribution Policy

Mr. Easley stated that the next recommendation was that the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of the President of the University, authorize an exception to the Salary Policy for the 1999-2000 budget.

Chair Easley asked for a motion.

Mr. Lovett moved to eliminate in any Handbook or any other official publication of the University any reference to percentages of allocating salaries, specifically, that we eliminate the current reference, which he understands to be in a Handbook, that 75 percent of the money go across the board and that 25 percent of the money be allocated to merit considerations. That and any other reference which is contrary to that should be eliminated.

Mrs. Buchanon seconded and discussion followed.

Upon call for the vote on the motion, the motion carried.

1999-2000 Budget

The floor was opened for discussion on the 1999-2000 Budget.

Mr. Burich stated that he was going to recommend a salary increase for the President of the University, effective immediately. He stated the reasons as follows. This Board must take a stance and put a support mechanism behind the President so that he can continue to go out there and fight those battles to let the community, the Legislature, the Governor, and the people out in the state know that he has got 100 percent support from everybody in this community. There can be nothing more important than when this man goes to the Legislature and fights our battles. He further pointed out that we cannot have a President doing so well being paid the least of all the universities in the state. We must show some credibility to the rest of this state.

The second reason Mr. Burich stated that it is absolutely vital that the Board take action today is because it is deserved. Progress made at Murray State University in the last five years is unprecedented--things that are going on, the problems we have had, I know we've had our issues with family, we will continue to have them, but I think that a reward and an achievement such as has been accomplished in the last five years should be rewarded.

The third reason Mr. Burich stated was that the Board needed to set a precedent at this university; we need to let the community know we are not going to keep this man forever or his family who I think are a huge vital clog of this community, the credibility that whole family brings to us all is phenomenal, but I do believe that we want to make sure when that sad day comes that the next president is going to be at that standard, that we are going to set a new standard for hiring a leader.

The fourth reason given was that it is imperative that all universities such as Murray State set a standard of comfort that we are going to do what it takes to put the presidency at a level where it must perform. A pressure point for any leader is one where he is being paid equitably for his performance. A non-pressure point for any leader is one that is being underpaid and has no reason to have to outperform anybody. But I would like to see a man of this caliber or anybody in a position of this caliber to be equitable so that that pressure point continues to satisfy the needs of our faculty, of our employees, and better this University. We need to pyramid this so that pressure point continues to grow.

Mr. Burich moved that the 1999-2000 budget be amended to read that President Kern Alexander's salary rise to \$160,000. Mrs. Buchanon seconded and discussion followed.

Upon call for the vote, the roll was called with the following voting: Mrs. Buchanon, yes; Mr. Burich, yes; Mrs. Burr, yes; Mrs. Dial, pass; Mr. Earwood, yes; Mrs. Ford, yes; Mr. Lanier, I'm the only one who knows how difficult it is to vote this way, no; Mr. Lovett, yes; Mrs. McCoy, yes; Dr. Rudolph, it's very difficult for me too, but no; and Mr. Easley, yes. Motion carried. Mr. Lanier prepared the following statement after the meeting and asked the chairman to include in the minutes:

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"It is apparent that Dr. Alexander's salary is at the low end of the salary range of the presidents of the public universities in the state, and I believe that by that measure and by the standard of performance -- which, in my opinion, is of high order in the case of Dr. Alexander -- Murray State is not properly compensating Dr. Alexander. Nonetheless, at a time of only minimal percentage increases in salaries of staff and faculty, most of whom, I believe, are similarly undercompensated, I believe that a proposal of this nature should be preceded by a careful and detailed study and assembly of facts justifying the proposal. The case is there to be made, in my opinion, but it has not been made today. I would hope that at the next evaluation process the available facts would be assembled and presented to the Board for action. For the reasons, stated, I must vote no."

Mr. Easley moved that the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of the President of the University, approve the 1999-2000 budget as amended.

Mrs. McCoy seconded and the roll was called with the following voting: Mrs. Buchanon, yes; Mr. Burich, yes; Mrs. Burr, yes; Mrs. Dial, yes; Mr. Earwood, yes; Mrs. Ford, yes; Mr. Lanier, no; Mr. Lovett, yes; Mrs. McCoy, yes; Dr. Rudolph, no; and Mr. Easley, yes. Motion carried.

Institutional Control of MSU Racer Foundation

On behalf of the Finance/Audit Committee, Mr. Easley moved that the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of the President of the University, approve the following guidelines as a point of departure for the University's further development of its relationship with the non-affiliated, private non-profit, Racer Foundation in order to provide additional institutional control as required by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

- 1. An annual budget of expenditures to be funded by the Racer Foundation must be prepared by the Director of Athletics and approved by the President of the University prior to any funds from the Racer Foundation being expended, requested, or obligated by or on behalf of the University: To the extent practicable, the budget shall delineate all specific expenditures known or expected as of the time the budget is so approved. The budget as planned and approved for the benefit of the University shall reflect spending priorities of the University only. Except as otherwise provided, any expenditure of funding from the Racer Foundation must be in accordance with the approved budget.
- 2. Any emergency or unexpected expenditure of funds, not included in the budget, by the Racer Foundation for the benefit of the University must be approved in advance by the President or his designee, the Vice President for Administrative Services. Any expenditure of this type in an amount less than \$500 will require no prior approval from these officials unless otherwise required by NCAA policy. Upon receipt of any necessary approval, all requests for the funding of emergency or unexpected expenditures by the Racer Foundation for the benefit of the University will be presented to the University Director of Athletics, who is the only athletic staff member authorized to forward requests for funding to the Racer Foundation.
- 3. Once a budgeted or emergency or unexpected request for funds has been approved by the designated University official and by the Racer Foundation, the appropriate funds will be transferred from the Racer Foundation to Murray State University and placed in an appropriate athletics account.

- 4. Financial statements, including a balance sheet and statements of income and expenditures as well as a detailed transactions list, from the Racer Foundation will be sent monthly to the President and Vice President for Administrative Services to keep them apprised of the financial condition of, and all income received and disbursements processed through, the Racer Foundation.
- 5. All expenditures by the Racer Foundation for or on behalf of the University shall be subject to an annual financial audit, in addition to any regular financial audit policies and procedures of the University, conducted for the University by a qualified auditor who is not a staff member of the University and who is selected either by the University President or the Vice President for Administrative Services. (NCAA Policy 6.2.3.1.)
- 6. All expenditures, of whatever nature or kind and regardless of origination, must be in conformity with applicable NCAA policy. It is the intent of the Board of Regents to comply with all NCAA policies relating to institutional control while preserving the Racer Foundation's non-affiliated status.

Mrs. McCoy seconded and the motion carried.

Audit Contract, revised

On behalf of the Finance/Audit Committee, Mr. Easley moved that the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of the President of the University, authorize an increase in cost from \$49,634 to \$54,634 for the contract with Deloitte & Touche to perform the University's financial and compliance audits for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1999, for the addition of the audit of the Murray State Athletic Foundation.

MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY NOTES TO FINANCIAL REPORT For the Period July 1, 1998 through March 31, 1999

Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Accounting Basis

The annual financial statements of Murray State University are prepared on an accrual basis of accounting except for depreciation on physical plant and equipment.

Tuition and fee revenues for a semester are recognized upon recording the receivable, normally before or shortly after the semester begins. Revenues of summer school academic terms are reported in the fiscal year in which the programs predominately fall. Therefore, deferred tuition revenues are recorded for terms which have not begun at year-end. State appropriations revenues are recognized upon receipt.

Expenditures are generally recognized, for interim reporting, in the period expended rather than the period incurred. Some liability accounts on the Balance Sheet are not adjusted until yearend, at which time all expenditures are accrued.

Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the use of the resources available to the University, the accounts of the University are maintained in accordance with the principles of "fund accounting". This is the procedure by which resources for various activities are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds that are in accordance with activities or objectives specified.

Current funds are used primarily to account for the transactions affecting the general operation of the University. These resources are expendable for performing the primary and support objectives of the University. Restricted gifts, grants, appropriations, and other restricted resources are accounted for in the appropriate restricted funds.

All gains and losses arising from the sale, collection or other disposition of investments and other non-cash assets are accounted for in the funds which owned such assets. Ordinary income derived from investments, receivables, and the like is accounted for in the fund owning such assets.

Note 2. Deposits and Investments

The University currently uses commercial banks and the Commonwealth of Kentucky for its depositories. Deposits with commercial banks are covered by Federal depository insurance or collateral held by the bank in the University's name. At the state, the University's accounts are pooled with other agencies of the state. These state pooled deposits are substantially covered by Federal depository insurance or by collateral held by the state in the state's name. The investments of the University not held in the state investment pool are insured or registered, or are held by the University or by an agent in the University's name. Effective for the quarter ending September 30, 1997, bond sinking fund investments, held by the trustee, will be stated at market value.

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Note 3. Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost, using first-in-first-out valuation, or market.

Note 4. **Murray State University Foundation, Inc.**

> Murray State University Foundation, Inc. (the Foundation) is a Kentucky not-for-profit corporation formed to receive, invest, and expend funds for the enhancement and improvement of the University.

The Foundation prepares and issues its own financial statements.

Note 5. **Prior Year Carryovers and Encumbrances**

Budget Revisions for Prior Year Carryovers and Prior Year Encumbrance Carryovers are based on actual balances brought forward to date from fiscal year 1997/98.

Note 6. **Tuition and Fees and Scholarships**

Incentive Grants of \$1,315,097 have been included as both tuition and as scholarship expenditures. The amounts are \$696,300 for Fall 1998 and \$618,797 for Spring 1999.

Note 7. **Unrestricted Expenditures**

In addition to expenditures, outstanding encumbrances as of March 31, 1999 are \$1,264,745 for Educational and General and \$19,625 for Auxiliary Enterprises.

MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY NOTES TO INVESTMENT REPORT For the Period July 1, 1998 through March 31, 1999

Note 1. BASIS OF REVENUE RECOGNITION

Accrual basis accounting is used to recognize interest earnings on the Investment Report.

Note 2. INVESTMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

POLICIES

<u>Scope</u>: This investment policy applies to activities of the University with regard to investing the financial assets of all funds, including those maintained by:

- I. the Commonwealth of Kentucky's treasury,
- 11. local depositories, and
- III. external trustees and investment managers.

Written procedures will indicate which funds are covered under each of the previously mentioned investment structures.

<u>Goals</u>: Consistent with state statutes and administrative regulations, the goals of the University's investment program are:

- * preservation and maintenance of the real purchasing power of the principal in the portfolios,
- * maintenance of sufficient liquidity to meet normal and foreseeable expenditures, and
- * attainment of the greatest possible dollar return to the University while observing statutory and policy constraints.

Investment Objective: The investment objective is to produce a yield that when compared to the current marketplace, would be described as competitive by investment managers.

Strategy: The University's investment strategy is designed to match the life of the assets with the date liability occurs.

Delegation of Authority:

<u>General</u>: The treasurer is responsible for investment decisions and activities, under the direction of the Board of Regents. The Treasurer shall develop and maintain written administrative procedures for the operation of the investment program, consistent with these policies. Such procedures shall include explicit delegation of authority to persons responsible for investment transactions. No person shall engage in an investment transaction except as provided under the terms of this policy and the procedures established by the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be responsible for all transactions undertaken and shall establish a system of controls to regulate the activities of subordinate investment personnel.

<u>Bond Funds</u>: With regard to bond funds, the investment/reinvestment (on instruments authorized by the bond indenture and resolutions) by the trustee(s) shall be directed from time to time by the Treasurer.

<u>Minimal Non-Cash Investment Transactions</u>: In order to correct stock transfer errors or dispose of small noncash investments, the Treasurer is authorized to sell or otherwise dispose of items less that \$10,000 without specific resolution from the Board of Regents.

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Note 2. INVESTMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES (cont.)

<u>Reporting</u>: The Treasurer and the Vice President for Administrative Services shall submit quarterly investment reports to the President and Board of Regents. These reports will include investment data for investment securities held at the end of the reporting period.

PROCEDURES

Specific investment procedures are contained within the full "Investment Policies and Procedures" as approved by the Board of Regents on May 14, 1994.

Note 3. DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

The University currently uses commercial banks and the Commonwealth of Kentucky for its depositories. Deposits with commercial banks are covered by Federal depository insurance or collateral held by the bank in the University's name. University funds deposited with the State Treasurer are pooled with funds from other state agencies. These state Pooled deposits are substantially covered by federal depository insurance or by the collateral held by the bank in the state's name. The investments of the University not held by the state investment pool are insured, registered, or held by the University or by an agent of the University.

Note 4. CURRENT FUNDS - LOCAL BANK ACCOUNT

1

Effective June 1, 1997, the University entered into a new banking contract with Peoples First of Calloway County (Union Planters Bank), interest earnings are based on 127% of the overnight federal funds rate.

Interest earnings may be expended in Current Fund.

Note 5. CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDING AND REVENUE BOND FUND (CEBRB)

This fund was created, as result of the trust indenture established when the first Consolidated Educational Building Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's, as a depository of tuition and fees in order to provide funds to service the principal and interest debt requirements of each series of aforementioned bonds. The fund also supports the Educational and General Funds operations.



Note 5. CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDING AND REVENUE BOND FUND (CEBRB) (cont.)

The Commonwealth of Kentucky Office of Financial Management and Economic Analysis invests available funds of the CEBRB in the State's university investment pool.

All interest earnings are transferred to Consolidated Educational Renewal and Replacement (CERR) at the end of each quarter according to the Board's approval for renewal and replacement projects.

Note 6. AUXILIARY FUNDS - HOUSING AND DINING REVENUE FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the trust indenture established when the first Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's as a depository of all auxiliary income in order to provide funds to service the principal and interest debt requirement of each series of aforementioned bonds. The fund also supports the Auxiliary Fund operations.

Note 7. ENDOWMENT FUND INVESTMENTS

ENDOWED CHAIR

During 1987, the University was awarded \$500,000 by the Commonwealth of Kentucky for an Endowed Chair for Eco-Systems Studies. University discretion, within the Board Policy, is used to invest these funds. Ten percent of the total earnings are returned to the Endowment investment pool. Ninety percent of the earnings are transferred to the Restricted Fund (Endowed Chair Grant) for program expenditures.

SMITH ENDOWMENT

During the fourth quarter of fiscal year 1991-92 and the first three quarters of fiscal year 1992-93, the University received proceeds, in excess of \$750,000, from the Laura Smith estate for the Smith Endowment. The majority of the proceeds were deposited with the Murray State University Foundation for investment in the investment pool.

Note 8. CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL RENEWAL AND REPLACEMENT (CERR)

As established by the Board of Regents in March 1982, CERR provides a plant fund sub-group so that funds transferred from CEBRB could be accumulated for future projects of repair and renovation.

The University invests the proceeds in the same manner as CEBRB in Note 5.

Interest earnings remain within the fund for future projects.

Note 9. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES G REVENUE BOND

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series G bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$14,785,000 in Series G revenue bonds dated December 1, 1987. The proceeds are to be used to pay costs of repair, renovation, construction or addition to buildings on the campus of Murray State University that are and shall be a part of the Consolidated Educational Building Project. This project was established and created by the Board of Regents on April 20, 1961.

The University invests the proceeds in the same manner as CEBRB in Note 5.

Interest earnings on Series G can be spent on the Industry and Technology Building project or any other Educational and General project the Board and State approves.

Note 10. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES H REVENUE BOND

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series H bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$4,625,000 in Series H revenue bonds dated March 1, 1992. The proceeds are to be used to pay costs of repair, renovation, construction of addition to buildings on the campus of Murray State University that are and shall be a part of the Consolidated Educational Building Project. This project was established and created by the Board of Regents on April 20, 1961.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky invests the proceeds in a pooled account with other state agency bond proceeds.

Interest earnings on Series H can be spent on the renovation of the Old Fine Arts Building and the Underground Steam and Condensate Lines as approved by the Board and State.

Note 11. RETIREMENT OF INDEBTEDNESS - CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL SINKING FUND (CESF)

This fund was created, as a result of the first trust indenture established when the Consolidated Educational Building and Revenue bonds were sold in the 1960's, to provide a sinking fund to pay debt principal and interest expense on all related CEBRB bonds. The amount of interest earned is part of the formula for annual funding of CERR projects. (See Note 5)

Interest earnings are used to reduce the amount of semi-annual debt service transferred from University Unrestricted Educational and General Fund to this sinking fund. Bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$3,543,480.

Note 12. RETIREMENT OF INDEBTEDNESS - HOUSING AND DINING SINKING FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the trust indenture established when the first Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's, to provide a sinking fund to pay debt principal and interest expense on related Housing and Dining Revenue Bonds.

Interest earnings are retained in the fund for future use. Bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$720,154.

Note 13. HOUSING AND DINING REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE RESERVE FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the establishment of the trust indenture in Note 5, to provide a fund to pay for extraordinary repairs, not paid from the Auxiliary Fund, to the Housing and Dining System buildings.

Interest earnings are retained in the fund for future use. The use is determined by Board of Regents resolution and the indentures. Bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$550,000.

A PROPOSED RESOLUTION FROM THE FACULTY AND STAFF AFFAIRS COMMITTEE OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS

The Board received and considered a report from the Faculty and Staff Affairs Committee of action taken by it in response to a request from the Faculty Senate that the Board of Regents state whether the Faculty Handbook is official policy. Upon motion of Mr. Lanier, duly seconded, and following discussion, it was

RESOLVED, that-

1. The Board of Regents states that the provisions of the Faculty Handbook adopted by it represent University policies and procedures.

2. The Faculty Senate is invited to proceed, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1.8 of the Faculty Handbook, with a review of the Handbook for the purpose of making a clear separation within the Handbook of "policies" and "procedures" and material of other kinds presently in the Handbook, and of stating the significance, distinctions and implications of the separation into those categories, all with a view to increased clarity of those present statements in the Handbook.

3. At the request of the Staff Regent, the Staff Congress is invited to consider the question of there being created a Staff Handbook, of nature similar to that of the Faculty Handbook and, if it concludes that such a Handbook should be created, to proceed, in company with the Office of Human Resources, to prepare such a Handbook and to submit it to the Vice-President for Administrative Affairs who, following his examination, will submit it to the President, with his recommendations, for the President's consideration and determination concerning submission of the Handbook to the Board of Regents for action.

A COMMENT FROM PHILIP M. LANIER, REGENT, TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS

This memorandum is directed to the recent controversy over Dr. Alexander's decision to release for public view the so-called "student evaluations of faculty".

I have reviewed the Attorney General opinions and Open Record opinions cited by the Faculty Senate from time to time, a few cases, and the statutes. It is my view that Dr. Alexander exercised a discretion placed by the law in him in deciding to release the material; that whether one agrees with his decision or not he acted responsibly and consistently with the law in deciding to make a decision; and that neither provisions of the Faculty Handbook nor the statutes were violated.

The provisions of the Handbook relating to this subject do not in my opinion rise to the level of University policy, for reasons discussed in the report submitted to the Board today by the Faculty/Staff Affairs Committee. The provisions of the Open Records law do apply. Their interpretation on disclosure/non-disclosure involves, as the courts and the Attorney General have said, a discretionary balancing of public and private interests. When discretion's territory is entered, one finds oneself in a land of far horizons, where the charts are sometimes few in number, not always clear and certainly not always interpreted in the same way by all observers. Allowances must be made to the navigator, and an attitude of censure is seldom the appropriate one.

In my opinion, Dr. Alexander's actions were consistent with the law. Perhaps, as some have suggested, Dr. Alexander could have sought an opinion from the Attorney General, but he was certainly not required to do so, and an experienced administrator could well decide to make his own judgment in an uncertain world. (I would add that there is no assurance that the Attorney General would have been prepared to render what would have been an advisory opinion only.)

The published opinions of the Attorney General (including the Open Record opinions) are really not of much help. Each one of them depends upon the particular circumstances of the case being passed upon, and the opinions do not always state all of the facts. It is a case-by-case matter, and so the Kentucky Supreme Court has said. Dr. Alexander obtained an opinion from the University General Counsel in advance of his decision to release the document, and Mr. Rall saw essentially what I saw and have just referred to. Opinions of the Attorney General may be of some general guidance, but the specific case must stand upon its own facts.

Offense has been taken because of a belief that Dr. Alexander should have conferred with faculty before authorizing release. There is no clear answer; again, it is a matter of discretion.

Page -1-

The problem facing Dr. Alexander was to deal with the public's generally-acknowledged "right to know" and the statute's exemption from public disclosure of "information of a personal nature where the public disclosure thereof would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." An examination of the released material does not persuade me that the disclosure constituted such an invasion. Such was the problem before the President.

I have heard it said that Dr. Alexander was asked about the Faculty Handbook as a statement of policies, and that he commented that the University policies are to be found in the minutes of the Board of Regents. This comment, if made, has been taken by some to mean that Dr. Alexander does not regard the Handbook as containing policy. I know from him that that is not his position. I think that if he spoke as reported, he was being precise – perhaps overly so for his interrogator. Dr. Alexander could have had in mind such words as are contained in an opinion of the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit: "A public body such as the Board of Regents may make official pronouncements only through its minutes." Edinger v. Board of Regents of Morehead State University, 906 Fed. 2d. 1136, decided in 1990. Such a statement as attributed to the President in no way means that the Handbook does not contain statements of policy; it simply says that the source of policy is in the minutes of the Board. Dr. Alexander would have said one thing, his interrogator would have been thinking of another. So it too often is with "communicating".

I request that this paper be placed with the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Regents on June 18, 1999.

NAMING OF CAMPUS FACILITIES, PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES Date Adopted: May 12, 1979 May 12, 1990 June 18, 1999 Date Amended: Minute Book: 22 Page: 311 Page 12-11 Minute Book: 45-71

At the Board of Regents meeting on May 12, 1990, June 18, 1999, the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of the Acting President, adopted the following policy on naming of campus facilities and programs:

When naming buildings and other facilities, Murray State University seeks to honor those people who have made exceptional contributions to the University, the Commonwealth and the Nation. The naming of buildings and other facilities, as well as programs and activities at Murray State University, is a manner in which the University can: honor individuals important to the institution; such as deceased faculty, administrators and public officials; give prominent recognition for eminence in intellectual, artistic and other endeavors associated with the mission of the University; or show its appreciation for a substantial gift benefiting the University. Any recommendation for the naming of buildings, parts of buildings or outdoor areas, programs or activites shall be based on what is in the best interest of the University. Each naming proposal should take into account established criteria and other guidelines. The naming of buildings and other facilities, programs and activities will be done by the University's Board of Regents on the recommendation of the President, who shall be advised by the University Committee on Naming of Facilities, and Programs and Activities, following the guidelines listed below:

Persons so honored will have made major contributions to the University in one or more of the following ways:

- 1. By providing distinguished scholarly efforts and service to the University;
- 2. By giving substantial support to the University's building program, such as gifts covering the major portion of the cost of a given construction; or
- 3. By bringing honor to the University through outstanding service to the community, state and nation.

To give recognition to those who have made significant contributions to the University, but on a scale of less magnitude than indicated above, spaces and physical features, such as auditoriums, reading rooms, laboratories, observatories, theatres, conference rooms, gardens, plazas, and similar distinguishable interior and exterior spaces may be named for the **honoree(s)**.

THE COMMITTEE:

The University Committee on Naming of Facilities, and Programs and Activities shall receive nominations for naming university buildings, rooms, sites, programs or other facilities or areas.

The Committee shall be comprised of one representative **each**, recommended by the Faculty Senate, the Staff Congress, the Student Government Association and the MSU Alumni Association. These members shall be nominated by their respective organizations and appointed by the President of the University for a term of one year.

One or more of the following, as deemed appropriate by the President:

- The Vice President for Academic Affairs (or designated representative)
- The Vice President for Student Development Affairs (or designated representative)
- The Vice President for University Relations and Development Institutional Advancement (or designated representative)
- The Director of Development (or designated representative)
- The Executive Director of the MSU Foundation (or designated representative)
- The Executive Director of the RACER Foundation (or designated representative)
- The Vice President for Finance and Administration (or designated representative) who will serve ex officio as chairman of the Committee.

The Chair of the Committee will be responsible for forwarding the recommendation of the Committee to the President.

CATEGORIES OF DESIGNATION:

The Committee on Naming of Facilities, and Programs and Activities will consider nominations for naming several different categories of academic or university-related activities, facilities, or holdings. These include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Geographical sites or centers such as Hancock Biological Station, the Wickliffe Mounds Research Center, Murphy's Pond, etc.
- 2. Exterior facilities such as buildings, ways, special-use land areas, or sites outside buildings, such as Sparks Hall, Stewart Stadium, Gilbert Graves Drive and other such currently designated and undesignated facilities.
- 3. Internal facilities such as lecture halls, lounges, laboratories, seminar rooms, or special areas within buildings, such as Johnson Theatre, Lovett Auditorium, and Farrell Recital Hall.
- 4. Awards, prizes, endowed scholarships or fellowships, such as the Breazeale Fellowships, the Stallings Scholarships, the Hutson Scholarship and the Max Carmen Award for Excellence in Teaching.

5. Academic programs, institutes, centers, colleges, endowed or special chairs. or professorships or programs.

PROCEDURES

Nominations may be submitted by anyone from the University, community or from the community at large. Nominations should contain an explanation of the significance of the proposed designation, and should be addressed to the chair of the Committee on Naming of Facilities, and Programs and Activities.

When nominations are received by the committee, the expressed desires of those most closely related to the specific category or item shall be taken into consideration. This shall include the personnel of the unit, as well as other considerations which may come to the attention of the committee.

Nominations approved by the committee shall be forwarded to the University President for consideration and possible recommendation to the Board of Regents, who will make the final determination of the matter.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. The designation shall include a functional description such as Eagle Gallery, Waterfield Governmental Studies Program, etc.
- 2. The naming of major campus sites, academic units, or external facilities should be limited to persons of national, state, local, or institutional significance.
- 3. The more intimate facilities, awards, prizes, special collections and endowed scholarships etc., should be reserved for memorializing those persons most closely related the University community (such as individual regents, administrators, faculty, staff, students, alumni, benefactors, and friends).
- 2. To facilitate exterior lettering, listing in directories, mailing addresses, class schedules, etc., the naming of a building in honor of any individual should use the surname only, such as "Wells Hall," "Stewart Stadium," and "Waterfield Library." A suitable plaque should be located in the lobby or other appropriate inside location, giving the full name and brief biography of the person honored. To the extent feasible, a uniform system of marking facilities should be adopted.
- 3. University programs and facilities or parts thereof should not be named for persons active as MSU faculty members or administrators, current members of the MSU Board of Regents, or persons active in positions relating to current university operations, such as legislators and members of the Council of Higher Education. The naming of facilities, programs and activities in honor of campus administrative officials, faculty, staff or elected or appointed public officials shall normally occur only after the campus employment or public service has concluded.

- 4. The credentials, character and reputation of each individual for whom the naming of a program or facility is being considered shall be carefully evaluated. In the interest of all concerned, discretion of the highest magnitude should be exercised in such deliberations. Recommendations submitted from the committee for consideration and action must be accompanied by appropriate supportive documentation.
- 5. The name should advance the reputation of the University as well as increase the understanding and public support for its programs.
- 6. The name should not confuse the public about location or function of the designated building or facility, but rather should enhance a visitor's ability to identify, locate and use it.
- 7. Sub-units of a new or existing facility may be named separately to recognize an outstanding individual or donor wishing to contribute the cost of a portion of a building, a room in a building, a major equipment item, a major area feature etc. In these instances, an appropriate plaque may be installed to acknowledge such recognition the contribution. The committee will ensure involvement by personnel at the college or departmental level and still assure university-wide standards are met in terms of aesthetics, qualitative standards and optimum donor support.
- 8. Donors wishing to furnish a lounge, office, conference room, etc., will be honored by an appropriate plaque on the door or some other appropriate inside location.
- 9. Chairs and professorships, academic departments and university programs, centers and colleges are examples of programs which may be named in honor of a donor. Endowed scholarship programs Awards, prizes, lecture series, endowed funds, scholarships or fellowships, such as the Breazeale Fellowships, the Hutson Scholarship and the Max Carmen Award for Excellence in Teaching are routinely named in honor of donors, and need not be considered by the committee.
- 10. In some unique situations, it will be deemed necessary to change the name of an alreadydesignated facility. It must be realized that such a process is apt to be a matter requiring diplomacy and delicacy; such actions will be the domain of the Committee on Naming of Facilities, and Programs and Activities, which must act with discretion and a due sense of consideration for the parties involved.
- 11. There will be occasions on which a previously designated facility will cease to exist; this may come as the result of new construction, natural phenomena or changes in the physical composition of the university. When this occurs, it shall be the responsibility of the Committee on Naming of Facilities, and Programs and Activities to:
 - a. give the name of the previous facility to another appropriate facility, OR
 - b. establish some other permanent memorial on the site of the former facility, OR
 - c. establish a permanent display to memorialize the former facility through the Wrather West Kentucky Museum OR
 - d. take other appropriate measures.

- 12. In all such cases, the committee should act with discretion and a due sense of consideration for the parties involved.
- 13. The University Committee on Naming of Facilities, and Programs and Activities will not be charged with planning or coordinating dedication ceremonies.
- 14. In all instances where the word "person," "individual," or "donor" is used in this policy, the same shall be deemed to include corporations, **foundations** or other appropriate legal entities.
- 15. In unique circumstances, Exceptions to this policy must be approved by the MSU Board of Regents.

OPERATIONAL CONSIDERATIONS:

(To be updated periodically, as the need arises.)

For a new facility or a facility renovation, Capital construction of new facilities or facility renovation requires a "substantial gift," which is subject to negotiation between the donor(s) and university officials; .-but typical Typical guidelines would suggest that it be defined as: at least fifty percent (50%) of the cost of the facility where such cost is determined to be less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000). For new buildings or renovations costing more than one million dollars, the amount of the gift, which should not be less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), is subject to negotiation between the donor(s) and university officials. the donor(s) contribute 50% of the cost up to the first one million dollars (\$1,000,000) and 25% of the cost exceeding one million dollars (\$1,000,000). For example:

- A project costs \$800,000 x 50% = \$400,000 contribution required
- A project costs \$3,000,000 = (\$1,000,000 x 50% = \$500,000) +(\$2,000,000 x 25% = \$500,000) = a total contribution of \$1,000,000

For an existing facility or program, a "substantial gift" is subject to negotiation between the donor(s) and university officials.

For other naming opportunities, see Addendum 1, List of Named, Endowed Donor Opportunities, and Addendum 2, Description of Naming Opportunities.

Chairs and professorships will normally be named in connection with gifts of approximately five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) and two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) respectively. For departments, centers and programs, the gift amount should provide for significant earnings relative to the operation of the department or program.

When the request for naming a facility or program comes from other than a faculty member, suitable donations may be sought from those making the request and other advocating such recognition.

For an existing facility or program, a "substantial gift" is subject to negotiation between the donor(s) and university officials.

A financial gift of the amount mentioned above or in the addenda does not automatically result in the naming of a facility or program for an individual.



SECURITY:

The 1999 Series N Bonds, together with the University's outstanding Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds, being the Series C through M Bonds (Series A and B Bonds having been retired) and any additional parity bonds, which may hereafter be issued and outstanding under the terms of the Indenture and Supplemental Indenture, will be payable from and will constitute a charge upon the gross revenues to be derived by the University from the operation of its Housing and Dining System. The Housing and Dining System may be described generally as all the student housing and dining facilities, student center, and related auxiliary enterprises now existing at the main campus of Murray State University in Murray, Kentucky. The Revenues of the System consist of the gross amount of rentals generated to the University from the use and occupancy of the facilities of the Housing System and the gross amounts generated by a Student Activity Fee and net income from the operation of Dining Facilities. Such revenues are known as the Housing and Dining System Revenues and the University covenants that the same will be fixed (and, if necessary, revised and increased from time to time) at such rates as may be required to pay the interest on and principal of the Housing and Dining System Bonds as they mature, to provide reserves therefor and to pay the operating costs of the Housing and Dining System Project to the extent they are not otherwise provided. All collections of the mentioned Housing and Dining System Revenues are to be set aside and made subject to a first lien and paramount charge for the security and source of payment of all outstanding Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds.

As further security for these Bonds and outstanding parity bonds, there is created and granted by Sections 162.200 and 162.350 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes a statutory lien upon the Housing and Dining System Project of the University on a parity with all bonds outstanding.

By Resolution adopted on August 21, 1964, and ratified and confirmed by Resolution adopted on March 4, 1999, the Kentucky State Property and Buildings Commission has recognized a binding and continuing contractual commitment of the Commonwealth to pay the cost of operation and maintenance of the Housing and Dining System to the extent that Revenues shall be insufficient.

The 1999 Series N Bonds are additionally secured by the Debt Service Reserve established with respect to the Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds.

INTRODUCTORY STATEMENT

This Official Statement, which includes the cover page, is being distributed by Murray State University (the "University") to furnish pertinent information to all who may become owners of its Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds, Series N (the "Bonds") being offered hereby pursuant to the provisions of Section 162.340 to 162.380, inclusive of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, and pursuant to the terms of the Trust Indenture (the "Indenture") dated as of September 1, 1965 as supplemented by a First Supplemental Trust Indenture dated as of September 1, 1968, the Second Supplemental Trust Indenture dated as of September 1, 1968, the Second Supplemental Trust Indenture dated as of May 1, 1997 regarding its Housing and Dining System Project (the "Project"). A Fourth Supplemental Trust Indenture dated as of April 1, 1999 (the "Supplemental Indenture") was adopted by the Board of Regents (the "Board") of the University on February 12, 1999.

MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY

The University which is located in Murray, Calloway County, Kentucky, was established in 1922 as Murray State Normal School by act of the General Assembly of Kentucky. In 1966, the General Assembly of Kentucky established its present name, Murray State University. The University's main campus is on a 232 acre site in Murray, Kentucky. Two agricultural farms totaling 351 acres are within one mile of the campus.

The governing body of the University is the Board of Regents, consisting of eight members appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky; one faculty member, one staff member and one student member. Pursuant to Section 164.350 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, the Board of Regents is a body corporate with the powers usually vested in corporations and, as such, subject to the statutes of the Commonwealth, has control and management of the University, together with the properties and funds thereof.

From an enrollment of 87 students in 1923, the University has grown to more than 8,900 students with a teaching faculty of 355. The University is a comprehensive institution comprised of six colleges: College of Business and Public Affairs; College of Education; College of Fine Arts and Communication; College of Humanistic Studies; College of Industry and Technology; and College of Science.

Pre-professional curricula are provided in medicine, dentistry, forestry, veterinary medicine, optometry, engineering, medical technology, theology, pharmacy, law, architecture and physical therapy. Additionally, the University offers interactive television and web distance learning, extended campus, correspondence and evening classes.

The University confers 24 different degrees. These include three Associate Degrees, 12 Baccalaureate Degrees, 8 Masters Degrees and one Specialist Degree. Degrees offered are the Associate of Arts, Associate of Science and Associate of Science in Vocational-Technical Education; Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Arts in Business, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Independent Studies, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Music Education, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Science in Agriculture, Bachelor of Science in Business, Bachelor of Science in Vocational-Technical Education, Bachelor of Science in Nursing, and Bachelor of Social Work; Master of Arts, Master of Arts in Education, Master of Arts in Teaching, Master of Business Administration, Master of Music Education, Master of Public Administration, Master of Science, and Master of Science in Nursing; and Specialist in Education.

Murray State University was designated by the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education for a Center of Excellence for Reservoir Research and an Endowed Chair for Applied Ecosystem Ecology, as well as funding for a Program of Distinction in telecommunications systems management. The University is the official transfer agent of NASA Lansat technology in Kentucky. The National Scouting Museum is also located on the campus of Murray State University.

THE HOUSING AND DINING SYSTEM

Murray State University's Housing and Dining System ("Housing and Dining System") refers to the housing and dining buildings, student center, appurtenant facilities and related auxiliary enterprises located in Murray, Calloway County, Kentucky, comprising portions of the University, identified as Clark College, Franklin College, Hart College, Regents College, Richmond College, White College, Woods Hall, Elizabeth College, Hester College, College Courts I, College Courts II, Wells Hall, Ordway Hall, College Courts III and Springer College and Winslow Cafeteria, and as the same may be added to in the future by including therein any other housing and dining facilities or related auxiliary enterprises and in accordance with the provisions of the Trust Indenture and the Supplemental Indenture.

THE BONDS

General Provisions

The Bonds will be dated April 1, 1999 and will be issued in the total principal amount of \$6,370,000 in fully registered form and in denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiples thereof, will mature as to principal on September 1, 2000, and thereafter and will bear interest as set forth on the cover page of this Official Statement.

The Bonds maturing on September 1, 2019 are subject to mandatory redemption at 100% of the principal amount redeemed plus accrued interest to the date of redemption on September 1, 2018 in the amount of \$445,000 and at maturity on September 1, 2019 in the amount of \$465,000.

Interest accruing on the Bonds will be payable semiannually on March 1 and September 1 of each year beginning September 1, 1999. The interest installment on the Bonds will be paid to the person who is the Registered Owner thereof as of the close of business on the Record Date for such interest installment, which Record Date will be the 15th day (whether or not a business day) of the calendar month next preceding such interest payment date. Payment of interest will be made by check or draft mailed to the person who is the Registered Owner on the applicable Record Date at the address of such Registered Owner as it appears on the books of the Paying Agent and Paying Agent. Principal will be paid when due upon delivery of the bonds for payment at the principal office of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar.

The Bonds are transferable upon presentation and surrender thereof to the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, duly endorsed for transfer or accompanied by an assignment duly executed by the Registered Owner or his authorized representative.

Optional Redemption

The Bonds maturing on and after September 1, 2010 will be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the University on September 1, 2009 and on any date thereafter for which prerequisite notice is given in whole or from time to time in inverse order of maturity (less than all of a single maturity to be selected by lot by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar), at the redemption prices expressed as percentages of principal amount set forth in the table below plus accrued interest to the redemption date:

DISPOSITION OF BOND PROCEEDS

The Bond proceeds will be applied as follows:

- a) The amount received from the purchaser(s) representing accrued interest from April 1, 1999 to the date of delivery, will immediately be deposited into the Housing and Dining System Bond and Interest Sinking Fund, as defined herein, maintained at Chase Manhattan Bank Company, National Association, Louisville, Kentucky, Inc., the Trustee, Paying Agent and Registrar for the Bonds.
- b) To the System Debt Service Reserve held by the Trustee (the "Debt Service Reserve") an amount shall be deposited which, together with amounts currently held therein coming due, shall be sufficient to meet the maximum principal and interest coming due on all outstanding bonds in any fiscal year thereafter.
- c) The amount necessary to pay the costs of issuance of the Bonds will be deposited to a "Cost of Issuance Fund" to be maintained at the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar to pay all expenses incident to the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds, including the fee of the Financial Advisor, the rating fees and such other appropriate expenses as may be approved by the University.
- d) The balance of the proceeds of the Bonds will be set aside in the Murray State University Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds, Series N Construction Fund of April 1, 1999 (the "1999 Housing and Dining System Series N Construction Fund") to be held by the Kentucky State Treasurer.

SECURITY FOR THE BONDS

The Bonds, together with the University's outstanding Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds, being the Series C through M Bonds (Series A and B Bonds having been retired) and additional parity bonds, which may hereafter be issued and outstanding under the terms of the Indenture and Supplemental Indenture, will be payable from and will constitute a charge upon the gross revenues (as defined in the Indenture) to be derived by the University from the operation of its Housing and Dining System. The Housing and Dining System may be described generally as all the student housing and dining facilities, student center and related auxiliary enterprises now existing at the main campus of Murray State University in Murray, Kentucky. The Revenues of the System consist of the gross amount of rentals generated to the University from the use and occupancy of the facilities of the Housing System and the

gross amounts generated by a Student Activity Fee and net income from the operation of Dining Facilities. Such revenues are known as the Housing and Dining System Revenues and the University covenants that the same will be fixed (and, if necessary, revised and increased from time to time) at such rates as may be required to pay the interest on and principal of the Housing and Dining System Bonds as they respectively mature, to provide reserves therefor and to pay the operating costs of the Housing and Dining System Project to the extent they are not otherwise provided. All collections of the above mentioned Housing and Dining System Revenues are to be set aside, as received into the Housing and Dining System Revenue Fund, as defined herein, and are made subject to a first lien and paramount charge for the security and source of payment of all outstanding Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds.

By Resolution adopted on August 21, 1964, and ratified and confirmed by Resolution adopted on March 4, 1999, the Kentucky State Property and Buildings Commission has recognized a binding and continuing contractual commitment of the Commonwealth to pay the cost of operation and maintenance of the Housing and Dining System to the extent that Revenues shall be insufficient, therefore after providing for the payment of principal and interest on all outstanding Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds heretofore issued or which may hereafter be issued with the approval of the Commission.

As further security for these Bonds and said outstanding parity bonds, there is created and granted by Sections 162.350 and 162.200 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes a statutory lien upon the Housing and Dining System Project of the University on a parity with all bonds outstanding.

The Bonds are additionally secured by the Debt Service Reserve established with respect to the Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds.

THE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

The work consists of providing certain fire safety and maintenance improvements to Elizabeth College, Hester College, Hart College, Regents College, White College, Clark College, Franklin College, Springer College, Richmond College, Winslow Cafeteria, College Courts I, II, and III, and appurtenant facilities.

MUNICIPAL BOND INSURANCE

The following information has been furnished by MBIA Insurance Corporation (the "Insurer") for use in this Official Statement. Reference is made to Appendix F for a specimen of the Insurer's policy.

The insurer's policy unconditionally and irrevocably guarantees the full and complete payment required to be made by or on behalf of the University to the Paying Agent or its successor of an amount equal to (i) the principal of (either at the stated maturity or by an advancement of maturity pursuant to a mandatory sinking fund payment) and interest on, the Bonds as such payments shall become due but shall not be so paid (except that in the event of any acceleration of the due date of such principal by reason of mandatory or optional redemption or acceleration resulting form default or otherwise, other than any advancement of maturity pursuant to a mandatory sinking fund payment, the payments guaranteed by the Insurer's policy shall be made in such amounts and at such times as such payments of principal would have been due had there not been any such acceleration); and (ii) the reimbursement of any such payment which is subsequently recovered by any owner of the Bonds pursuant to a final judgement by a court of competent jurisdiction that such payment constitutes an avoidable preference to such owner within the meaning of any applicable bankruptcy law (a "Preference").

The Insurer's policy does not insure against loss of any prepayment premium which may at any time be payable with respect to any Bond. The Insurer's policy does not, under any circumstances, insure against loss relating to: (i) optional or mandatory redemptions (other than mandatory sinking fund redemptions); (ii) any payments to be made on an accelerated basis; (iii) payments of the purchase price of Bonds upon tender by an owner thereof; or (iv) any Preference relating to (i) through (iii) above. The Insurer's policy also does not insure against nonpayment of principal of or interest on the Bonds resulting from the insolvency, negligence or any other act or omission of the Paying Agent or any other paying agent for the Bonds.

Upon receipt of telephonic or telegraphic notice, such notice subsequently confirmed in writing by registered or certified mail, or upon receipt of written notice by registered or certified mail, by the Insurer from the Paying Agent or any owner of a Bond the payment of an insured amount for which is then due, that such required payment has not been made, the Insurer on the due date of such payment or within one business day after receipt of notice of such nonpayment, whichever is later, will make a deposit of funds, in an account with State Street Bank and Trust Company, N.A., in New York, New York, or its successor, sufficient for the payment of any such insured amounts which are then due. Upon presentment and surrender of such Bonds or presentment of such other proof of ownership of the Bonds, together with any appropriate instruments of assignment to evidence the assignment of the insured amounts due on the Bonds as are paid by the Insurer, and appropriate instruments to effect the appointment of the Insurer as agent for such owners of the Bonds in any legal proceeding related to payment of insured amounts on the Bonds, such instruments being in a form satisfactory to State Street Bank and Trust Company, N.A., State Street Bank and Trust Company, N.A. shall disburse to such owners or the Paying Agent payment of the insured amounts due on such Bonds, less any amount held by the Paying Agent for the payment of such insured amounts and legally available therefor.

The Insurer is the principal operating subsidiary of MBIA Inc., a New York Stock Exchange listed company (the "Company"). The Company is not obligated to pay the debts of or claims against the Insurer. The Insurer is domiciled in the State of New York and licensed to do business in and subject to regulation under the laws of all 50 states, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Virgin Islands of the United States and the Territory

of Guam. The Insurer has two European branches, one in the Republic of France and the other in the Kingdom of Spain. New York has laws prescribing minimum capital requirements, limiting classes and concentrations of investments and requiring the approval of policy rates and forms. State laws also regulate the amount of both the aggregate and individual risks that may be insured, the payment of dividends by the Insurer, changes in control and transactions among affiliates. Additionally, the Insurer is required to maintain contingency reserves on its liabilities in certain amounts and for certain periods of time.

As of December 31, 1997, the Insurer has admitted assets of \$5.3 billion (audited), total liabilities of \$3.5 billion (audited), and total capital and surplus of \$1.8 billion (audited) determined in accordance with statutory accounting practices prescribed or permitted by insurance regulatory authorities. As of December 31, 1998, the Insurer has admitted assets of \$6.5 billion (audited), total liabilities of \$4.2 billion (audited), and total capital and surplus of \$2.3 billion (audited) determined in accordance with statutory accounting practices prescribed or permitted by insurance regulatory authorities.

Furthermore, copies of the Insurer's year end financial statements prepared in accordance with statutory accounting practices are available without charge from the Insurer. A copy of the Annual Report on Form 10-K of the Company is available from the Insurer or the Securities and Exchange Commission. The address of the Insurer is 113 King Street, Armonk, New York 10504. Year 2000 Readiness Disclosure

MBIA, Inc. is actively managing a high-priority Year 2000 (Y2K) program. The company has established an independent Y2K testing lab in its Armonk headquarters, with a committee of business unit managers overseeing the project. MBIA has a budget of \$1.13 million for its 1998-2000 Y2K efforts. Expenditures are proceeding as anticipated, and we do not expect the project budget to materially exceed this amount. MBIA has initiated a comprehensive Y2K plan that includes assessment, remediation, testing and contingency planning. This plan covers "mission-critical" internally developed systems, vendor software, hardware and certain third-party entities through which we conduct our business. Testing to date indicates that functions critical to the financial guarantee business, both domestic and international, were Y2Kready as of December 31, 1998. Additional testing will continue throughout 1999.

Moody's Investors Service, Inc. rates the financial strength of the Insurer "Aaa".

Standard and Poor's Ratings Services, a division of The McGraw-Hill Companies, Inc., rates the financial strength of the Insurer "AAA".

Fitch IBCA, Inc. (formerly known as Fitch Investors Service, L.P.), rates the financial strength of the Insurer "AAA".

Each rating of the Insurer should be evaluated independently. The ratings reflect the respective rating agency's current assessment of the creditworthiness of the Insurer and its ability to pay claims on its policies of insurance. Any further explanation as to the significance of the above ratings may be obtained only from the applicable rating agency.

The above ratings are not recommendations to buy, sell or hold the Bonds, and such ratings may be subject to revision or withdrawal at any time by the rating agencies. Any downward revision or withdrawal of any of the above ratings may have an adverse effect on the market price of the Bonds. The Insurer does not guaranty the market price of the Bonds nor does it guaranty that the ratings on the Bonds will not be revised or withdrawn.

CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE INDENTURE

The Board has previously adopted the Indenture dated as of September 1, 1965, which authorized the issuance of its Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds. The Housing and Dining System Project consists of all existing housing and dining facilities erected on property owned by the University.

The following statements are intended to provide only brief summaries of selected pertinent provisions of the Indenture. For detailed and complete information, reference is hereby made to the Indenture, copies of which are on file with the University and with the Trustee for outstanding Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds. For purposes of this description, previous bonds issued or any future bonds to be issued under the Indenture will be referred to as "All Bonds."

Murray State University Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds Revenue Fund Account

Under the terms of the Indenture, there is established a special fund known as "Murray State University Housing and Dining System Revenue Fund Account" (the "System Revenue Fund"). Said Fund is held in the custody of the Treasurer of the Board, separate and apart from all other funds of the University. There shall be deposited into the System Revenue Fund all Revenues of the System as defined in the Indenture and as described in summary elsewhere herein under "Security For The Bonds."

Murray State University Housing and Dining System Revenue Bond and Interest Sinking Fund Account

Under the terms of the Indenture, there is also established a separate account designated the "Murray State University Housing and Dining System Revenue Bond and Interest Sinking Fund Account" (the "System Sinking Fund"). So long as any of the Bonds are outstanding, the System Sinking Fund shall be maintained and deposited with the Trustee and shall be used to pay principal and interest on all bonds outstanding and to accumulate a reserve therefor. Upon delivery of any bonds issued under the terms of the Indenture, there shall be deposited into the System Sinking fund the accrued interest, if any, plus an additional sum, if necessary, on capitalized interest received from the purchasers of the Bonds.

Commencing with the September 1 next following the delivery date for the issuance of these Series N Bonds, the University shall transfer from the System Revenue Fund, as the first charge thereon, and deposit to the credit of the System Sinking Fund on or before each succeeding February 1 and August 1 an amount, which together with sums as may then be available in said System Sinking Fund, shall be equal to the next succeeding interest payment to become due on the outstanding bonds and an amount equal to one-half of the principal payment to become due in the next succeeding twelve months. In addition to the principal and interest payments, an amount equal to 25% of the average annual debt service requirement for any new parity issue must be paid annually into the System Sinking Fund until the Debt Service Reserve equals the maximum debt service to become due on all outstanding bonds in any succeeding year.

All moneys held in the System Sinking Fund shall be secured and invested by the Trustee as provided in the Indenture. The System Sinking Fund is pledged irrevocably for the purpose of paying the interest and principal of the Bonds secured by the Indenture and only such amount therein as may be in excess of the Debt Service Reserve may be used for retiring Bonds before maturity.

Murray State University Housing and Dining System Repair and Maintenance Reserve

There is created under the terms of the Indenture an account designated "Murray State University Housing and Dining System Repair and Maintenance Reserve" (the "System Repair and Maintenance Reserve") to be held by the Trustee separate and apart from all other accounts and funds. In accordance with the terms of the Indenture, the University has previously deposited at least the minimum aggregate requirement of \$591,250. Upon the issuance of these Bonds and any additional parity bonds issued in the future, the University has covenanted, after observing the priority of payments to the System Sinking Fund, to increase the annual transfer to the System Repair and Maintenance Reserve, in addition to the annual transfer required by the Indenture by 1/4 of 1% of the original amount of such parity bonds issued until the additional reserve equals 5% of such original principal amount of parity bonds.

Balances held in the System Repair and Maintenance Reserve may be used for unusual or extraordinary costs of maintenance, repair, replacement or operation of the System to the extent that they represent unanticipated deficiencies not previously budgeted. No withdrawal may be made from such Reserve to the extent that the aggregate balance is reduced below the sum of \$909,750 except by resolution of the University determining that an emergency exists requiring such expenditure to preserve the tentability and revenue-producing capacity of the Housing and Dining System. The Trustee may make withdrawals from the Repair and Maintenance Reserve to the extent required to prevent a default in the payment of maturing principal of or interest on the Bonds, in the event moneys available in the Sinking Fund and the Debt Service Reserve shall be insufficient for such purpose.

Investment of Funds

Moneys held in the System Repair and Maintenance Reserve and any amount held in the System Sinking Fund in excess of principal and interest requirements for the ensuing twelve month period shall be invested in direct or fully guaranteed obligations of the United States Government, maturing in not more than ten years. Moneys held in the System Sinking Fund for current principal and interest requirements (as distinguished from deposits for the Debt Service Reserve) may be invested in direct or fully guaranteed obligations of the United States Government maturing or subject to redemption at the option of the holder not later than the time such funds must be disbursed.

Current Expenses

Current expenses of the System shall be payable from the System Revenue Fund but only from such amounts as remain therein after compliance with payments to the System Sinking Fund and System Repair and Maintenance Reserve. If, after making the above payments, the remaining funds in the System Revenue Fund are insufficient to provide full payment of the operating and maintenance expenses of the System, the University will: (a) impose such additional rentals as the University may at its discretion determine to be economically feasible and consistent with the educational duties of the University, or (b) the University will make up such deficiency from other sources in such manner as to constitute a binding contractual commitment of said University and of the Commonwealth of Kentucky over the entire life of these Bonds. A Resolution of the State Property and Buildings Commission, taking cognizance of this commitment on the part of the Commonwealth and authorizing the issuance of these Bonds was adopted on March 4, 1999. It has been held by the highest court of the Commonwealth that such covenant does not create an unconstitutional debt of the Commonwealth. After making the required disbursements above, any moneys remaining at the close of each Fiscal Year in the System Revenue Fund may be used (a) to redeem or prepay principal of outstanding Bonds, (b) to improve or restore any existing housing or dining facilities or to provide additional facilities, or (c) for any other lawful purpose.

Additional Bonds

Additional bonds ranking on a parity with these Bonds may be issued for the purpose of financing housing and dining facilities to be made a part of the Housing and Dining System providing:

- a) The University is in full compliance with all covenants and undertakings in connection with its then outstanding Housing and Dining System Bonds.
- b) There has been filed with the Trustee a certificate that an inspection of existing housing and dining buildings has been made and they are represented to be in good and current state of repair.
- c) The average of the audited annual Revenues of said System for the two Fiscal Years immediately preceding the issuance of said additional parity bonds (with adjustments to reflect any increase or decrease in rates charged or service rendered by the Housing and Dining System) and (1) an estimate of revenues to be derived from buildings to be constructed and/or added from the proceeds of such parity bonds and (2) an estimate of annual revenues to be derived from any building currently under construction and (3) an adjustment to reflect annual rents of buildings which have been in operation for less than one year, shall aggregate an amount equal to not less than 1.30 times the maximum amount which will be required in any future Fiscal Year for debt service on the bonds outstanding and parity bonds to be issued. The estimate of annual revenues as used above are subject to certain restrictions as further set out in the Indenture. The University may pledge as an additional source of payment for the Bonds the revenues of any buildings added to the System otherwise than through the issuance of bonds, or any additional student fees.

Defaults and Remedies

The Indenture defines an event of default, which includes failure to pay principal or any installment of interest when same become due on any of the bonds outstanding under the Indenture or any Supplemental Indenture; the University's being rendered incapable of fulfilling its obligations under the Indenture, any building representing a part of the Housing and Dining System Project being destroyed or damaged and not being repaired or replaced and insurance proceeds not being deposited in the Housing and Dining System Bond Fund, an order or decree being entered appointing a Receiver of all or part of the Housing and Dining System Project or Revenues therefrom; and failure under written notice by the Trustee (who is required to give such notice at the written request of the owners of 15% in aggregate amount of the outstanding bonds) to perform any covenant in the Indenture or any Supplemental Indenture, in such case within or for the specified period of grace, if any.

Upon the happening and continuance of any event of default, then and in every such case the Trustee may, and upon the written request of the owners of not less than twenty-five (25%) in principal amount of the all Bonds outstanding, will give notice in writing to the University, declaring the principal of all Bonds then outstanding to be due and payable, anything contained in the Indenture or any Supplemental Indenture to the contrary, notwithstanding; provided, however, that if at any time after the principal of the



bonds will have been so declared to be due and payable, and before the entry of final judgment or decree in any suit, action or proceeding instituted on account of such default, or before the completion of the enforcement of any other remedy under the Indenture, moneys will have been accumulated in the Housing and Dining Bond Fund sufficient to pay all arrears of interest, if any, upon All Bonds then outstanding (except the interest accrued on such bonds since the last interest payment date), and the charges, compensation, expenses, distributes, advances and liabilities of the Trustee and all other amount then payable by the University under the Indenture will have been paid or a sum sufficient to pay the same will have been deposited with the Trustee, and every other default known to the Trustee in the observance or performance of any covenant, condition or agreement contained in the bonds or in the Indenture or any Supplemental Indenture (other than a default in the payment of the principal of such bonds then due only because of a declaration under the Indenture) will have been remedied to the satisfaction of the Trustee, then and in every such case the Trustee may, and upon the written request of the owners of not less than twenty-five percent (25%) in principal amount of All Bonds then outstanding will, by written notice to the University, rescind and annul such declaration and its consequences, but no such recession or annulment will extend to or affect any subsequent default or impair any consequent thereon.

Upon the happening and continuance of any event of default, then and in every such case the Trustee may proceed, and upon the written request of the owners of not less than fifteen percent (15%) in principal amount of all Bonds then outstanding under the Indenture will proceed to protect and enforce its rights and the rights of the bondowners under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky or under the Indenture or any Supplemental Indenture by such suits, actions, or special proceedings in equity or at law, either for the specific performance of any covenant or agreement contained in the Indenture or in aid or execution of any power herein granted or for the enforcement of any proper legal or equitable remedy, as the Trustee, being advised by counsel, will deem most effectual to protect and enforce such rights.

In the enforcement of any remedy under the Indenture, the Trustee will be entitled to sue for, enforce payment of and receive any and all amount then or during any default becoming, and at any time remaining, due from the University for principal, interest, or otherwise under any of the provisions of the Indenture or any Supplemental Indenture of the bonds and unpaid together with any and all costs and expenses of collection and of all proceedings under the Indenture and under such bonds, without prejudice to any other right or remedy of the Trustee or of the bondowners, and to recover and enforce judgment or decree against the University, but solely as provided in the Indenture and in such bonds, for any portion of such amount remaining unpaid, with interest, costs and expenses, and to collect (solely from moneys from the Housing and Dining System Bond Fund and the Revenues of the Housing and Dining System Project pledged to the payment of the bonds by the Indenture) in any manner provided by law, the moneys adjudged or decreed to be payable.

Other Covenants of the University

The Board covenants, among other things, the following:

- a) That it will at all times maintain, preserve, and keep the System in good condition, repair and working order and will make all needful repairs, replacements, additions, betterments and improvements so that the operations and business of the System and every part thereof shall at all times be conducted properly and advantageously.
- b) That it will procure and maintain so long as any of the Bonds are outstanding, fire and extended coverage insurance on the System in amounts sufficient to provide full recovery when the loss does not exceed 80% of the full insurable value of the property, and also a minimum amount of \$50,000 of boiler explosion insurance.

- c) That it will procure public liability insurance (including vehicular liability insurance) with limits of not less than \$100,000 for one person, and \$300,000 for more than one person involved in one accident, providing provision is not otherwise made by law for disposition of such claim of such character as would be covered thereby.
- d) That the University will not undertake to exact or guarantee additional education buildings for housing and dining purposes except in the case of buildings which may be leased to fraternities or sororities, otherwise than as currently a part of the Housing and Dining System.
- e) That it will keep accurate financial records and proper books relating to the System, and such records and books shall be open to inspection by the Bondowners and their agents and representatives, and that not later than 120 days after the close of each Fiscal Year it will furnish to any Bondowner who shall request same in writing, an audit report prepared by an independent public accountant or by the state auditing official.
- f) That it will establish such parietal rules, rental rates and charges as may be necessary to (1) assure maximum occupancy and use of the facilities of the System and (2) provide, together with other funds herein pledged to payment of the Bonds, (i) the debt service on the Bonds, (ii) the required reserve therefor, (iii) the System Repair and Maintenance Reserve for which provision is made herein, and (iv) the operating and maintenance expenses of said facilities not provided from other sources.

UNIVERSITY AND ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS

Governing Board

The governing body of the University is the Board, consisting of eleven members, eight of whom are appointed by the Governor, one of whom is a member of the Student Body, one member of the University teaching faculty and one member of the University staff. Pursuant to Section 164.350 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, the Board is a body corporate with the powers usually vested in corporations and as such, subject to the statutes of the Commonwealth, has control and management of the University, together with the properties and funds thereof. The current membership of the Board of Regents is as follows:

Administrative Officers

The President of the University is Dr. Kern Alexander; Dr. Gary Brockway is Interim Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs; Mr. Thomas W. Denton is Vice President for Administrative Services; and Dr. Don Robertson is Vice President for Student Affairs. Their biographies are as follows:

Dr. Kern Alexander, President

Dr. Kern Alexander became the ninth president of Murray State University on July 1, 1994. Dr. Alexander received his baccalaureate degree in English and history at Centre College and earned a master's degree in education at Western Kentucky University. He went on to earn the doctorate degree in educational administration from Indiana University and received a Graduate Diploma in Educational Administration "with distinction" from Oxford University. Dr. Alexander began his teaching career in 1962. In 1964, he joined the Kentucky Department of Education and later became director of the division of statistical services and legislative liaison. As his career advanced, Alexander worked with the U.S. Office of Education, served on the faculty of the University of Florida and became director of the Institute for Educational Finance at the University of Florida. From 1982 to 1985, he served as education policy coordinator for Florida Governor Robert Graham. In 1985, he became president of Western Kentucky University until 1988. He served as University Distinguished Professor at Virginia Tech prior to coming to Murray State University. Dr. Alexander is a prolific writer and editor, with more than 30 books, numerous journal articles and chapters of books to his credit.

Dr. Gary Brockway, Interim Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs and Professor of Marketing

Dr. Brockway received his A.A.S. in Retail Management and his B.S. in Business Administration-Marketing from Rochester Institute of Technology and his M.B.A. in Marketing and his Ph.D. in Business Administration from the University of Arkansas. Dr. Brockway joined the faculty in 1976 and served as Chairman of the Department of Management and Marketing from July 1, 1994 until July 1, 1998. In addition, Dr. Brockway was the 1988 recipient of the Max G. Carman Outstanding Teacher Award and the 1995 recipient of the J.C. Penney Professor Internship Program. Dr. Brockway has been very active in the international business seminars as faculty leader and MSU program coordinator since 1984. Dr. Brockway has authored numerous publications and served on various university committees.

Mr. Thomas W. Denton, Vice President for Administrative Services

Mr. Denton received his B.S. in Accounting from Arkansas State University and his M.B.A. from Murray State University; and is a Certified Public Accountant. He previously served as Comptroller of Mississippi County Community College in Arkansas. He also served in managerial and accounting positions in industry and public accounting. Mr. Denton was employed as Director of Accounting and Finance in 1989 and was appointed Director of Financial Management and Planning in 1992. He serves as treasurer to the Murray State University Board of Regents. Effective July 1996, Mr. Denton assumed the position of Associate Vice President for Administrative Services and since October 1997 has served as Vice President for Administrative Services.

Dr. Don Robertson, Vice President for Student Affairs

Dr. Robertson received his B.S. in Business Administration from the University of North Carolina; his M.S. in Counseling from the University of Tennessee; and his Ed.D. in Higher Education Administration from West Virginia University. He has served at Murray State University since 1992 as the chief student affairs officer and Assistant Professor of Business Administration. Effective July 1996, Dr. Robertson assumed the position of Vice President for Student Affairs.



FUTURE DEBT

Murray State University has received authorization for \$10,184,000 in Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds to be issued by the Kentucky State Property and Building Commission in the 1998-2000 biennium. The debt service payments are to be appropriated from the Commonwealth. The construction costs will be allocated as follows:

1.	College of Education construction	\$7,184,000
2.	Carr Health Building Renovation	\$2,000,000
3	Business Building Renovation	\$1.000.000

Further, the University has received Housing and Dining bonding authorization for 1998-2000 biennium in the amount of \$13,000,000 for replacement of two student housing facilities. The authorization is outlined as follows:

1.	Replacement of Richmond Hall	\$6,500,000
2	Boule company of Clark/Eronklin Halls	\$6 500 000

2. Replacement of Clark/Franklin Halls \$6,500,000

Although the University has received the bonding authorization for this project, it is unlikely that the bonds will be issued for this project within this biennium.

In addition, bonding authorization has been granted to the Kentucky Community and Technical College System for the construction of five regional postsecondary education centers. Murray State will receive one of these centers, which will be located in Hopkinsville, Kentucky. The bonding authorization for this center is \$6,650,000. The bonds will be issued by the Kentucky State Property and Buildings Commission and debt service payments will be handled through the budget of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

It should be noted that the state bonding authorizations for the 2000-2002 biennium have not been finalized at this point.

TAX TREATMENT

In the opinion of Bond Counsel for the Bonds, based upon an analysis of existing laws, regulations, rulings and court decisions, interest on the Bonds is excludable from gross income for Federal income tax purposes. Bond Counsel for the Bonds is also of the opinion that interest on the Bonds is not a specific item of tax preference under §57 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code") for purposes of the Federal individual or corporate alternative minimum taxes. Furthermore, Bond Counsel for the Bonds is of the opinion that interest on the Bonds is exempt from income taxation and the Bonds are exempt from ad valorem taxation by the Commonwealth of Kentucky and any of its political subdivisions.

The Code imposes various restrictions, conditions and requirements relating to the exclusion from gross income for Federal income tax purposes of interest on obligations such as the Bonds. The University has covenanted to comply with certain restrictions designed to ensure that interest on the Bonds will not be includable in gross income for Federal income tax purposes. Failure to comply with these covenants could result in interest on the Bonds being includable in income for Federal income tax purposes and such inclusion could be required retroactively to the date of issuance of the Bonds. The opinion of Bond Counsel assumes compliance with these covenants. However, Bond Counsel has not undertaken to determine (or to inform any person) whether any actions taken (or not taken) or events occurring (or not occurring) after the date of issuance of the Bonds may adversely affect the tax status of the interest on the Bonds.

Certain requirements and procedures contained or referred to in the Trust Indenture and other relevant documents may be changed and certain actions (including, without limitation, defeasance of the Bonds) may be taken or omitted under the circumstances and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in such documents. Bond Counsel expresses no opinion as to any Bonds or the interest thereon if any such change occurs or action is taken or omitted upon the advice or approval of bond counsel other than Peck, Shaffer & Williams LLP.

Although Bond Counsel for the Bonds has rendered an opinion that interest on the Bonds is excludable from gross income for Federal income tax purposes and the above-described opinion with respect to Kentucky taxation of the Bonds, the ownership or disposition of, or the accrual or receipt of interest on, the Bonds may otherwise affect a Bondholder's Federal, state or local tax liabilities. The nature and extent of these other tax consequences may depend upon the particular tax status of the Bondholder or the Bondholder's other items of income or deduction. Bond Counsel expresses no opinions regarding any tax consequences other than what is set forth in its opinion and each Bondholder or potential Bondholder is urged to consult with tax counsel with respect to the effects of purchasing, holding or disposing the Bonds on the tax liabilities of the individual or entity.

For example, although Bond Counsel for the Bonds is of the opinion that interest on the Bonds will not be a specific item of tax preference for the alternative minimum tax, corporations are required to include all tax-exempt interest in determining "adjusted current earnings" under Section 56(c) of the Code, which may increase the amount of any alternative minimum tax owed. Receipt of tax-exempt interest, ownership or disposition of the Bonds may result in other collateral Federal, state or local tax consequence for certain taxpayers including, without limitation, increasing the federal tax liability of certain foreign corporations subject to the branch profits tax imposed by Section 884 of the code, increasing the federal tax liability of certain insurance companies, under Section 832 of the Code, increasing the federal tax liability and affecting the status of certain S Corporations subject to Sections 1362 and 1375 of the Code, increasing the federal tax liability of certain individual recipients of Social Security or Railroad Retirement benefits, under Section 86 of the Code, and limiting the use of the Earned Income Credit under Section 32 of the Code that might otherwise be available. Ownership of any Bonds may also result in the limitation of interest and certain other deductions for financial institutions and certain other taxpayers, pursuant to Section 265 of the Code. Finally, residence of the holder of Bonds in a state other than Kentucky or being subject to tax in a state other than Kentucky, may result in income or other tax liabilities being imposed by such states or their political subdivisions based on the interest or other income from the Bonds.

TAX TREATMENT OF ORIGINAL ISSUE DISCOUNT

The Bonds maturing on September 1 of the years 2012 through 2017 and September 1, 2019 (the "Discount Bonds") are being offered and sold to the public at an original issue discount ("OID") from the amounts payable at maturity thereon. OID is the excess of the stated redemption price of a bond at maturity (the face amount) over the "Issue price" of such bond. The issue price is the initial offering price to the public (other than to bond houses, brokers or similar persons acting in the capacity of underwriters or wholesalers) at which a substantial amount of bonds of the same maturity are sold pursuant to that initial offering. For federal income tax purposes, OID on each bond will accrue over the term of the bond, and for the Discount Bonds, the amount of accretion will be based on a single rate of interest, compounded semiannually (the "yield to maturity"). The amount of OID that accrues during each semi-annual period will do so ratably over that period on a daily basis. With respect to an initial purchaser of a Discount Bond at its issue price, the portion of OID that accrues during the period that such purchaser

owns the Discount Bond is added to such purchaser's tax basis for purposes of determining gain or loss at the maturity, redemption, sale or other disposition of that Discount Bond and thus, in practical effect, is treated as stated interest, which is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes.

Holders of Discount Bonds should consult their own tax advisors as to the treatment of OID and the tax consequences of the purpose of such Discount Bonds other than at the issue price during the initial public offering and as to the treatment of OID for state tax purposes.

TAX TREATMENT OF PREMIUM

"Acquisition Premium" is the excess of the cost of a bond over the stated redemption price of such bond at maturity or, for bonds that have one or more earlier call dates, the amount payable at the next earliest call date. The Bonds that mature in the years 2000 through 2010 (the "Premium Bonds") are being initially offered and sold to the public at an Acquisition Premium. The Premium Bonds are not callable prior to their maturity date. For federal income tax purposes, the amount of Acquisition Premium on each bond the interest on which is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes ("tax-exempt bonds") must be amortized and will reduce the bondholder's adjusted basis in that bond. However, no amount of amortized Acquisition Premium on tax-exempt bonds may be deducted in determining bondholder's taxable income for federal income tax purposes. The amount of any Acquisition Premium paid on the Premium Bonds, or on any of the Bonds, that must be amortized during any period will be based on the "constant yield" method, using the original bondholder's basis in such bonds and compounding semiannually. This amount is amortized ratably over that semiannual period on a daily basis.

Holders of any Bonds, including any Premium Bonds, purchased at an Acquisition Premium should consult their own tax advisors as to the actual effect of such Acquisition Premium with respect to their own tax situation and as to the treatment of Acquisition Premium for state tax purposes.

QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the University, by the adoption of the Supplemental Indenture, has designated the Bonds as "qualified taxexempt obligations" within the meaning of the Code and certified that it does not reasonably anticipate that the total principal amount of tax-exempt obligations which will be issued by the University during the calendar year ending December 31, 1999, will exceed \$10,000,000.

YEAR 2000 COMPLIANCE

The Commonwealth of Kentucky has been aware since early 1994 of the technology problems associated with the year 2000. The Commonwealth has assessed the state's mission critical systems, most of which reside on the mainframe computer. These systems have been planned for year 2000 compliance by July 1, 1999. As of July 31, 1998, sixty percent of these systems had been renovated and placed back into production. The General Assembly, during the 1998 Regular Session, appropriated \$6,700,000 to a year 2000 "contingency fund." Portions of this fund will be used to contract for third party validation and verification of selected mission critical systems residing on the mainframe computer. The Commonwealth has obtained a contract for specialized consultants to examine the methodology, procedures, work plans and status of the year 2000 compliance project. The consultants have made recommendations and implemented methodologies to ensure the best practices are in place for compliance. Further information regarding year 2000 compliance by the Commonwealth may be found on the Internet at http://www.state.ky.us/dis/newdishm.

Certain critical financial management systems of Murray State University have already been upgraded or are in the final phase of testing to meet Year 2000 compliance. These systems include the general ledger, accounts receivable, accounts payable, payroll, and financial aid systems. Additionally, the University has undergone a campus-wide assessment of Y2K compliance to include hardware and software systems, embedded processors, and critical contractor or vendor compliance.

An ad hoc committee of the Information Technology Advisory Committee was charged to evaluate the assessment outcomes and to present written recommendations to management on how best to remediate critical systems in order to meet Year 2000 compliance goals.

As part of the University's assessment process:

- Procurement Services contacted vendors whose contracts are critical to Murray State and might be affected by Year 2000 compliance. Any new contracts or renewals will not be issued for those items which process data without the receipt of compliance statements from the vendors.
- The University's Facilities Management Department has provided an assessment of building management systems for each building on campus. This assessment determined that electrical, lighting, plumbing, fire protection, security, and elevator systems were compliant, could be made compliant, or that compliance was not an issue. The HVAC building control and software system upgrades which are planned for this year will bring those systems into compliance. Further, the Facilities Management Department is in the process of obtaining Year 2000 compliance assurances from utility suppliers.
- The campus mainframe computer hardware and operating systems are compliant according to vendors.
- Remediation and testing will be completed on the in-house developed software systems by April 30 with further remediation conducted in problem areas.
- The assessment phase revealed that the majority of the desktop hardware and software components are or can be made compliant.
- The Committee identified a few vendor-supplied systems where upgrades will be necessary, and the necessary upgrades will be implemented during 1999.
- Contingency plans will be developed for certain mission critical systems during the year.

Murray State will continue to work to detect and resolve any Year 2000 compliance issues throughout 1999. However, the University cannot make any assurances as to the effectiveness of systems maintained by third parties or to any matters beyond the University's reasonable control. Through the University's efforts, we anticipate being Year 2000 compliant and that students, employees, vendors, and other related parties will not be adversely affected.

CONTINUING DISCLOSURE

In accordance with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12 (the "Rule"), the University (the "Obligated Person") will agree, pursuant to a Continuing Disclosure Agreement dated as of April 1, 1999. (the "Disclosure Agreement") with Chase Manhattan Trust Company, National Association, to be delivered on the date of delivery of the Bonds, to cause the following information be provided:

- (i) To each nationally recognized municipal securities information repository ("NRMSIR") and, if one is established for the Commonwealth, to its state information depository ("SID"), certain annual financial information and operating data, including audited financial statements prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, generally consistent with the information contained in Appendices A, B, C and D; such information shall be provided on or before 180 days following the fiscal year ending on the preceding June 30, commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30, 1999;
- (ii) in a timely manner, to each NRMSIR or to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board ("MSRB") and to the SID, notice of the occurrence of certain events, if material, with respect to the Bonds, which events are as follows; and
 - (a) Principal and interest payment delinquencies;
 - (b) Non-payment related defaults;
 - (c) Unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
 - (d) Unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
 - (e) Substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
 - (f) Adverse tax opinions or events affecting the tax-exempt status of security;
 - (g) Modifications to rights of security holders;
 - (h) Bond calls, except for mandatory scheduled redemptions not otherwise contingent upon the occurrence of the event;
 - (i) Defeasances;
 - (j) Release, substitution or sale of property securing repayment of the securities;
 - (k) Rating changes; and
 - (1) The cure, in the manner provided under the Indenture, of any payment or nonpayment related default under the Indenture.
- (iii) in a timely manner, to each NRMSIR or to the MSRB and to the SID, notice of a failure of an Obligated Person to provide the required Annual Financial Information and Operating Data on or before the date specified in the Disclosure Agreement.

The Disclosure Agreement provides holders of the Bonds, including beneficial owners of the Bonds, with certain enforcement rights in the event of a failure by the University to comply with the terms thereof; however, a default under the Disclosure Agreement does not constitute an event of default under the Indenture. The Disclosure Agreement may also be amended or terminated under certain circumstances in accordance with the Rule as more fully described therein. Holders of the Bonds are advised that the Disclosure Agreement, the form of which is obtainable from the Financial Advisor, should be read in its entirety for more complete information regarding its contents.

Financial information regarding the University may also be obtained from the Vice President for Administrative Services, Murray State University, Sparks Hall – 3rd Floor, Murray, Kentucky 42701.

ABSENCE OF MATERIAL LITIGATION

There is no controversy or litigation of any nature now pending or threatened restraining or enjoining the issuance, sale, execution or delivery of the Bonds, or in any way contesting or affecting the validity of the Bonds or any proceedings of the University taken with respect to the issuance or sale thereof, or the pledge or application of any moneys or security provided for the payment of the Bonds or the due existence or powers of the University.





APPROVAL OF LEGALITY

Legal matters incident to the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds are subject to the approval of Peck, Shaffer & Williams LLP, Covington, Kentucky, Bond Counsel to the University. The approving legal opinion of Bond Counsel will be printed on the Bonds and will contain a statement of tax exemption as represented herein. Bond Counsel has reviewed the information herein pertaining to the Bonds under the headings, "The Bonds", "Security for the Bonds", "The Construction Project", "Certain Provisions of the Indenture", "Tax Treatment", "Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations" and "Continuing Disclosure" and is of the opinion that such information is a fair summary of the principal provisions of the instruments and information therein described. Said firm has not otherwise participated in the preparation of the Official Statement or the Exhibits attached hereto and has not verified the accuracy or completeness of the information contained under any heading other than those stated above, nor of any financial information, enrollment numbers, projections, or computations relating thereto, and therefore, can make no representation with respect to such information. The matters set forth under "Absence of Material Litigation" will be delivered by the University with the Bonds.

RATING

As noted on the cover page of this Official Statement, Standard & Poor's Rating Services ("S&P") has assigned their municipal bond rating of "AAA" to this issue with the understanding that upon delivery of the Bonds, a policy insuring the payment when due of the principal and interest on the Bonds has been issued by MBIA Insurance Corporation.

S&P has assigned its underlying municipal bond rating of "BBB+" to the Bonds.

Such rating reflects only the opinion of said organization. Any explanation of the significance of such rating may be obtained directly from the rating agency at the following address: Standard & Poor's Corporation, 25 Broadway, New York, New York 10004.

FINANCIAL ADVISOR

Seasongood & Mayer, Cincinnati, Ohio has acted as Financial Advisor to the University and will receive a fee from the proceeds of the Bonds for services rendered.

The Bonds will be sold by the solicitation and receipt of sealed, competitive bids. Seasongood & Mayer, Cincinnati, Ohio, Financial Advisor to the University, has requested, and received, permission and approval of the Board of Regents of the University to bid, either alone or in conjunction with others, on the Bonds. The Financial Advisor has expressed its intent to so bid.

APPROVAL OF ISSUANCE OF BONDS

Pursuant to Chapter 42 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, issuance of the Bonds will be approved by the Kentucky Finance and Administration Cabinet, Office of Financial Management and Economic Analysis.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND INDEPENDENT PUBLIC ACCOUNTANTS

The financial statements of the University as of June 30, 1998 and for the year then ended, which are attached as Appendix D, were reported on by the independent certified public accounting firm.

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CERTIFICATE CONCERNING OFFICIAL STATEMENT

Concurrently with the delivery of the Bonds, the Treasurer of the University will certify that, to the best of his knowledge, this Official Statement did not as of the date of delivery of the Bonds, contain any untrue statements of a material fact or omit to state a material fact which should be included therein for the purpose of which the Official Statement is to be used, or which is necessary in order to make the statements contained therein, in the light of the circumstances which they were made, not misleading in any material respect.

COMPLETENESS OF OFFICIAL STATEMENT

The University has approved and caused this official statement to be executed and delivered by its President.

The financial information supplied by the University and reported herein is represented by the University to be correct. Only accounts required by Federal and State laws, rules and regulations to be audited annually by independent certified public accountants have been so audited and the financial information extracted from their annual audits and presented herein is incomplete to the degree that accounts not required to be so audited have not been included in the annual audits contained in Appendix D.

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MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1998

Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Entity

Murray State University (the University) is a state supported institution of higher education located in Murray, Kentucky and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. The University awards graduate and undergraduate degrees and serves a student population of approximately 8,900. The institution is a component unit of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the State).

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the University have been prepared in accordance with the "AICPA Industry Audit Guide Audits of Colleges and Universities". The statement of current funds revenues, expenditures, and other changes is a statement of financial activities of current funds related to the current reporting period. It does not purport to present the results of operations or the net income or loss for the period as would a statement of income or a statement of revenues and expenses.

To the extent that current funds are used to finance plant assets, the amounts so provided are accounted for as (1) expenditures, in the case of normal replacement of movable equipment and library books; (2) mandatory transfers, in the case of required provisions for debt amortization, interest and equipment renewal and replacement; and (3) transfers of a non-mandatory nature for all other cases.

Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the use of the resources available to the University, the accounts of the University are maintained in accordance with the principles of "fund accounting". This is the procedure by which resources for various activities are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds that are in accordance with activities or objectives specified. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund; however, in the accompanying financial statements, funds that have similar characteristics have been combined and reported as five balanced fund groups: current funds, loan funds, endowment funds, plant funds, and agency funds. Accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund group. Within each group, fund balances restricted by outside sources are so indicated and are distinguished from unrestricted funds allocated to specific purposes by action of the University's Board of Regents. Externally restricted funds may be utilized only in accordance with the purposes established by the source of such funds and are in contrast with unrestricted funds over which the University retains control to use in achieving its institutional purposes.

Current funds are used primarily to account for the transactions affecting the general operation of the University. These resources are expendable for performing the primary and support objectives of the University. Restricted gifts, grants, appropriations, and other restricted resources are accounted for in the appropriate restricted funds.

Restricted current funds are reported as revenues and expenditures when expended for current operating expenses.

The loan funds group is used to account for loan programs available to students and financed primarily by the Federal government.

Endowment funds are those for which donors or other external agencies have stipulated, under the terms of the instrument creating the fund, that the principal is not expendable. That is, it is to be maintained inviolate and in perpetuity, and is to be invested for the purpose of producing current and future income which may be expended or added to principal.



Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (cont.)

Plant fund groups are used to account for the transactions relating to investment in University property. Plant fund subgroups include (1) unexpended plant, (2) renewals and replacements, (3) retirement of indebtedness, and (4) investment in plant. The unexpended plant subgroup consists of funds to be used for the acquisition and/or construction of physical properties for institutional purposes but unexpended at the reporting date. The renewals and replacements subgroup consists of funds to be expended for renewals and replacements of plant fund assets, including some renewals and replacements of a type not ordinarily capitalized in the investment in plant subgroup. The retirement of indebtedness subgroup consists of funds set aside for debt service reserves and charges, and for retirement of indebtedness on institutional properties. The investment in plant subgroup consists of funds expended for and thus invested in institutional properties and the bond indebtedness incurred to finance plant acquisitions and construction. Physical plant and equipment are stated at cost at the date of acquisition or at fair market value at the date of donation for gifts.

Agency funds are used to account for assets held by the University as custodian or fiscal agent for others and used for certain organized activities.

All gains and losses arising from the sale, collection or other disposition of investments and other noncash assets are accounted for in the funds which owned such assets. Ordinary income derived from investments, receivables, and the like is accounted for in the fund owning such assets, except for income derived from investments of endowment funds, which income is accounted for in the fund to which it is restricted.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The University's policy is to treat cash in local checking accounts and cash held by Frankfort as cash and cash equivalents.

Investments

Effective July 1, 1997, the University adopted the provisions of Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 31 "Accounting and Financial Reporting for Certain Investments and External Investment Pools." GASB No. 31 requires, among other things, that equity securities with readily determinable fair values and debt securities be reported at fair value. The impact of adopting GASB No. 31 on the 1998 financial statements was not material.

Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost, (first-in, first-out method) or market.

Assets Held by Murray State University Foundation

Assets held by the Murray State University Foundation (the "Foundation") represent resources neither in the possession nor the control of the University, but are held and administered by the Foundation. The Foundation is governed by an independent board. The University recognizes gifts and donations made to the Foundation for the exclusive use and benefit of the University as assets and revenues of the University. The University recognizes the assets held by the Foundation at the estimated fair value of the assets or the present value of the future cash flows when the University is notified of the existence of the gift or the endowment.

Pledges receivable

The University's policy is to recognize pledges as revenue when the cash is received.



Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (cont.)

Deferred revenue

Revenues of summer school academic terms are reported in the fiscal year in which the programs predominantly fall. Therefore, deferred tuition revenue is recorded for terms which have not begun at fiscal year end.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to use estimates and assumptions. The accompanying financial statements include estimates for items such as allowances for doubtful accounts and loans receivable, self insurance liabilities and other accrued liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Reclassifications

Certain reclassifications have been made to the 1997 amounts to conform to the 1998 presentation.

Note 2. Deposits and Investments

The University currently uses commercial banks and the Commonwealth of Kentucky as depositories. Deposits with commercial banks are covered by Federal depository insurance or collateral held by the banks in the University's name. At the State level, the University's accounts are pooled with other agencies of the State. These State pooled deposits are substantially covered by Federal depository insurance or by collateral held by the bank in the State's name. The investments of the University not held in the State investment pool are insured or registered, or are held by the University or by an agent in the University's name.

Note 5. Assets Held by MSU Foundation

Assets held by the Murray State University Foundation are invested primarily in an investment pool managed by the Foundation and are carried at fair market value. The assets in the pool are invested as follows: securities of the U.S. government and its agencies, 48%; marketable equity securities, 43%; certificates of deposit, 5%; and other 4%.

During the year ended June 30, 1998, the University capitalized interest cost of approximately \$350,000.

Note 7. Employee Benefits

A. Kentucky Teachers Retirement System:

All faculty and exempt employees required to hold a degree and occupying full-time positions, defined as seven-tenths (7/10) of normal full-time service on a daily or weekly basis are required by state law to participate in the Kentucky Teachers Retirement System (KTRS) or an optional retirement plan. KTRS, a cost sharing, multiple-employer, public employee retirement system, provides retirement benefits based

on an employees final average salary and number of years service. Benefits are subject to certain reductions if the employee retires before reaching age sixty, unless the employee has twenty-seven or more years of participation in the plan. The plan also provides for disability, death and survivor benefits and medical insurance.

The Kentucky Teachers Retirement System issues a publicly available financial report that includes financial statements and required supplementary information. That report may be obtained by writing to Kentucky Teachers Retirement System, 479 Versailles Road, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601-3868 or by calling (502)573-5120.

Funding for the plan is provided from eligible employees who contribute 6.16% of their salary through payroll deductions and the Commonwealth of Kentucky, which also indirectly contributes 13.84% of current eligible employees salaries to the KTRS through appropriations to the University. Contribution requirements of the plan members and the University are established by Kentucky Revised Statute and the KTRS Board of Trustees. The University's contributions of KTRS for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1998, 1997, 1996 and 1995 were \$3,428,144, \$3,454,623, \$3,403,658, and \$3,223,192, respectively, equal to the required contributions for each year.

B. Kentucky Employee Retirement System:

Substantially all other full-time University employees are required by law to participate in the Kentucky Employee Retirement System (KERS), a cost sharing multiple-employer, public employee retirement system. KERS provides retirement benefits based on an employee's final average salary and number of years of service. Benefits are subject to certain reductions if the employee retires before reaching age sixty-five or has less than twenty-seven years of service. The plan also provides for disability, death and survivor benefits and medical insurance.

The Kentucky Employee Retirement System issues a publicly available financial report that includes financial statements and required supplementary information. That report may be obtained by writing to Kentucky Employees Retirement System, 1260 Louisville Road, Perimeter Park West, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601 or by calling (502)564-4646.

Funding for the plan is provided from eligible employees who contribute 5.00% of their salary through payroll deductions and the Commonwealth of Kentucky, which also indirectly contributes 7.65% of current eligible employees salaries to the KERS through appropriations to the University. University contribution rates are determined by the Kentucky Revised Statute and the Board of Trustees of the Kentucky Retirement Systems each biennium. The University's contributions to KERS for the years ending June 30, 1998, 1997, 1996, and 1995 were \$882,611, \$853,354, \$804,525, and \$772,003, respectively, equal to the required contributions for each year.

C. University Self-Insurance Program:

The University maintains a self-insurance program for employees health and accident insurance. The University pays substantially all expenses of the plan for permanent full-time employees and their families. Expenses incurred to cover claims paid by the University under the plan for year ending June 30, 1998 totaled \$3,660,141, excluding administrative and stop-loss fees.

Note 8. Notes Payable

During 1997, the University borrowed \$400,000 from the Commonwealth of Kentucky Capital Construction and Equipment Purchase Contingency Account to fund a portion of the Regional Special Events Center. The note bears an effective rate of interest of 6.7% and the University is required to make annual equal payments of principal and interest through June, 2002.

During fiscal year ended June 30, 1998 the University entered into a Master Lease agreement with People's First Bank and Trust of Calloway County to finance \$1,500,000 of expenditures for the campus networking project. Each draw on the agreement is treated as a separate note, each note carrying a term of seven years, all due on February, 2004. The University is required to make monthly payments of principal and interest. The University utilized \$600,000 of this financing during the current fiscal year, with effective interest rate of 4.23%

The required minimum reserves of \$3,543,480 and \$720,154 for the Consolidated Educational Sinking Fund and the Housing and Dining Sinking Fund, respectively, are on deposit with the trustee and are included in the "Cash" and "Investments" amounts in Plant Funds in the accompanying balance sheet.

The University had recorded long term debt obligations to the Commonwealth of Kentucky related to financing life safety improvements to buildings. These assets were originally funded with proceeds of bonds issued by the Commonwealth who subsequently leased the assets to the University.

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Note 9. Bonds Payable (cont.)

Effective June 30, 1998, the Finance and Administration Cabinet of the Commonwealth of Kentucky changed the manner in which it accounts for capital project financing and related debt service. By taking this action all of its capital lease agreements with the University were canceled. Accordingly, the University removed from its balance sheet long-term debt obligations payable to the Commonwealth of Kentucky totaling \$4,120,267 at June 30, 1998.

Note 10. Capitalized Lease Obligations

The University leases certain equipment and facilities, including The Crisp Center, under capital lease agreements. Remaining minimum annual lease payments pursuant to these leases are as follows:

Note 11. Contingencies

The University has been named as defendant in several lawsuits. It is the opinion of management and its legal counsel, based in part on the doctrine of sovereign immunity and other statutory provisions, that the ultimate outcome of litigation will not have a material effect on the future operations or financial position of the University.

On September 18, 1998, a fire damaged one of the University's student housing units and one student resident was fatally injured. University management is in the process of investigating the incident. Management is unable to determine at this time what impact, if any, the incident will have on the University's financial position.

Note 12. Murray State University Foundation, Inc.

Murray State University Foundation, Inc. (the Foundation) is a Kentucky not-for-profit corporation formed to receive and invest funds for the enhancement and improvement of the University. The Foundation also operates the Francis E. Miller Golf Course as a separate enterprise, and manages certain endowments and investments on behalf of the University.

The Foundation has a Board of Trustees separate from that of the University; however, the President and certain other officers of the University are also officers of the Foundation.

The University provides office space and pays certain operating expenses of the Foundation in exchange for investment management services provided by the Foundation. The Foundation prepares and issues its own financial statements.

Note 13. National Scouting Museum

The National Scouting Museum of the Boy Scouts of America, Inc. (the Museum) operates a museum on the campus of the University. Under an agreement that expires on September 30, 2030, the University provides a building on the University's campus to house the Museum at no cost to the Museum and provides \$85,000 of direct support to the Museum annually. The University also provides office space and certain administrative services to the Museum at no charge.

We have acted as bond counsel in connection with the issuance by the Board of Regents of Murray State University, a public body corporate and educational institution and agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the "Issuer") of \$6,370,000 Murray State University Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds, Series N, dated April 1, 1999 (the "Bonds") pursuant to Sections 162.340 to 162.380, inclusive, of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as amended (the "Act") and a Trust Indenture dated as of September 1, 1965 (the "Indenture), as heretofore supplemented and as further supplemented by a Fourth Supplemental Trust Indenture, dated as of April 1, 1999 (the "Series N Supplemental Indenture"), between the Issuer and Chase Manhattan Trust Company, National Association, Louisville, Kentucky, as trustee. We have examined the law and the transcript of proceedings pursuant to which the Bonds have been authorized and issued, and such other matters as we deem necessary to render this opinion.

As to questions of fact material to our opinion, we have relied upon representations of the Issuer contained in the Indenture and the Series N Supplemental Indenture, and in the transcript of proceedings and other certifications of public officials furnished to us, without undertaking to verify the same by independent investigation.

Based on our examination, we are of the opinion, as of the date hereof and under existing law, as follows:

1. The Issuer is a duly created and validly existing public body corporate and educational institution and agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, with full power to execute and deliver the Indenture and the Series N Supplemental Indenture, perform the agreements on its part contained therein and issue the Bonds.

2. The Indenture and the Series N Supplemental Indenture have been duly adopted by the Issuer and constitute valid and binding obligations of the Issuer enforceable upon the Issuer.

3. The Bonds have been duly authorized, executed and delivered by the Issuer and constitute valid and binding special obligations of the Issuer payable solely from the sources provided therefor in the Indenture and the Series N Supplemental Indenture.

4. The Bonds and any additional parity bonds heretofore and hereafter issued and outstanding under the terms of the Indenture are and will be payable from and constitute a paramount charge upon the defined Revenues (gross amount of rentals and other user fees and charges for use and occupancy of the student housing and dining facilities) derived by the Issuer from the operation of its Housing and Dining System, which consists of all the housing and dining facilities of the Issuer now in existence and hereafter acquired. As further security for the Bonds and any parity bonds heretofore or hereafter issued pursuant to the Indenture, there is created and granted by Sections 162.200 and 162.350 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as amended, a statutory mortgage lien upon the Housing and Dining System of the Issuer.

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5. Under the laws, regulations, rulings and judicial decisions in effect as of the date hereof, interest, including original issue discount, on the Bonds is excludible from gross income for Federal income tax purposes, pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). Furthermore, interest on the Bonds will not be treated as a specific item of tax preference, under Section 57(a)(5) of the Code, in computing the alternative minimum tax for individuals and corporations. In rendering the opinions in this paragraph, we have assumed continuing compliance with certain covenants designed to meet the requirements of Section 103 of the Code. We express no other opinion as to the federal tax consequences of purchasing, holding or disposing of the Bonds.

6. Interest on the Bonds is exempt from income taxation and the Bonds are exempt from ad valorem taxation by the Commonwealth and any of its political subdivisions.

7. The Issuer has designated the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" pursuant to Section 265 of the Code.

It is to be understood that the rights of the owners of the Bonds and the enforceability of the Bonds, the Indenture and the Series N Supplemental Indenture may be subject to bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization, moratorium and other laws in effect from time to time affecting creditors' rights, and to the exercise of judicial discretion in accordance with general equitable principles.

The amounts referred to in clauses (i) and (ii) of the preceding semence shall be referred to herein collectively as the "Insured Amounts." "Obligations" shall mean:

Upon presentment and surrender of such Obligations or presentment of such other proof of ownership of the Obligations, together with any appropriate instruments of assignment to evidence the assignment of the Insured Amounts due on the Obligations as are paid by the Insurer, and appropriate instruments to effect the appointment of the Insurer as agent for such owners of the Obligations in any legal proceeding related to payment of Insured Amounts on the Obligations, such instruments being in a form satisfactory to State Street Bank and Trust Company, N.A., shall disburse to such owners, or the Paying Agent payment of the Insured Amounts due on such Obligations, less any amount held by the Paying Agent for the payment of such insure Amounts and legally available therefor. This policy does not insure against loss of any prepayment premium which may at any time be payable with respect to any Obligation.

STD-R-6 4/95 RESOLUTION OF OFFICIAL INTENT OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY TO FINANCE THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, INSTALLATION, RENOVATION AND EQUIPPING OF BUILDING PROJECTS FROM PROCEEDS OF A PROPOSED ISSUE OF REVENUE BONDS

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulations § 1.150-2 (the "Reimbursement Regulations"), issued pursuant to §150 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code") prescribes certain requirements by which proceeds of tax-exempt bonds, notes, certificates or other obligations included in the meaning of "bonds" under §150 of the Code ("Obligations") used to reimburse advances made for Capital Expenditures (as hereinafter defined) paid before the issuance of such Obligations may be deemed "spent" for purposes of §§ 103 and 141 to 150 of the Code therefore, not further subject to any other requirements or restrictions under those sections of the Code; and

WHEREAS, such Reimbursement Regulations require that the University (as hereinafter defined) make a Declaration of Official Intent (as hereinafter defined) to reimburse any Capital Expenditure paid prior to the issuance of the Obligations intended to fund such Capital Expenditure and require that such Declaration of Official Intent be made no later than sixty (60) days after payment of the Capital Expenditure and further require that the Allocation (as hereinafter defined) of the proceeds of such Obligations to reimburse such Capital Expenditures paid on the date the property acquired with the Capital Expenditure was placed in service, except that any such Allocation must be made no later than three years after such Capital Expenditure was paid; and

WHEREAS, Murray State University (the "University") wishes to ensure compliance with the Reimbursement Regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows by the Board of Regents of Murray State University as follows:

SECTION 1. Definitions. The following definitions apply to the terms used herein:

"Allocation" means written evidence that proceeds of the Obligations issued subsequent to the payment of a Capital Expenditure are to effect the reimbursement of the University for such payments.

"Capital Expenditures" means any expense for an item that is properly depreciable or amortizable or is otherwise treated as a capital expenditure for purposes of the Code, as well as costs of issuing Reimbursement Bonds.

"Declaration of Official Intent" means a written declaration that the University intends to fund a Capital Expenditure with an issue of Reimbursement Bonds and reasonably expects to be reimbursed from the proceeds of such an issue.

"Reimbursement" means the restoration to the University of money temporarily advanced from other funds of the University to pay for Capital Expenditures before the issuance of Obligations intended to fund such Capital Expenditures. "To reimburse" means to make such a restoration.

"Reimbursement Bonds" means Obligations that are issued to reimburse the University for Capital Expenditures previously paid by or for the University. "Reimbursement Regulations" means Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 and any amendments thereto or superseding regulation, whether in proposed, temporary or final form, as applicable, prescribing conditions under which the proceeds of Obligations when allocated or applied to a reimbursement will be treated as "spent" for purposes of §§103 and 141 to 150 of the Code.

"University" means Murray State University.

SECTION 2. Declaration of Official Intent.

(a) The University declares that it reasonably expects that the Capital Expenditures described in Section (b), which will be paid prior to the issuance of any Obligations intended to fund such Capital Expenditures, will be reimbursed with the proceeds of Obligations, representing a borrowing by the University in the maximum principal amount for such reimbursements, funding of a debt service reserve and payment of costs of issuance of approximately \$11,000,000; and

(b) The Capital Expenditures to be reimbursed are to be used for (i) renovations to the Carr Health Building and the Business Building and (ii) the construction, installation and equipping of additions to the College of Education.

SECTION 3. <u>Reasonable Expectations</u>. The University does not expect any other funds (including the money advanced to make the Capital Expenditures that are to be reimbursed), to be reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside by the University or any other entity affiliated with the University, with respect to the Capital Expenditures described in 2(b).

SECTION 4. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall be effective from and after its date of adoption.

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
