Report of the President

Recognition of Delta Tau Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi Social Fraternity

The Murray State University Delta Tau Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi social fraternity was recently recognized by their national organization with the Grand Senior President's (GSP) Award. This prestigious award, given every two years, encompasses the superior achievements and accomplishments of a particular chapter. This is a prestigious award that brings honor to our University.

Dr. Don Robertson, Vice President for Student Affairs; Ben Gross, President of Alpha Sigma Phi; and Mike Young, Chapter Advisor were present to accept the Resolution.

Michael Thorne, Student Regent and Member of Alpha Sigma Phi read the following resolution:

Murray State University Board of Regents September 8, 2000

WHEREAS, the Delta Tau Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi social fraternity from Murray State University was awarded the Grand Senior President's Award for best chapter in the United States:

WHEREAS, the gentlemen of Alpha Sigma Phi continue to have a positive impact on Murray State University and the community. They have proven their dedication to service by raising hundreds of dollars a year for Canine Companions for Independence, an organization that provides service animals to the physically impaired, and Habitat for Humanity. The chapter has sent members to Texas, North Carolina, and South Dakota to build Habitat houses during spring break, solidifying their commitment to serving their fellow man and bettering themselves. The brothers of Alpha Sigma Phi initiated a partnership with Murray Middle School in which they mentor young men without a positive male influence in their lives. This program has been widely successful and is helping to positively shape the lives of Murray's youth;

WHEREAS, Alpha Sigma Phi promotes high scholarship from its members. Alpha Sigma Phi held the highest grade point average (GPA) of any men's Greek organization for the last two semesters. Their cumulative GPA is considerably higher than that of non-Greek students;

WHEREAS, Alpha Sigma Phi promotes a high standard of leadership from its members. In the past few years, Alpha Sigma Phi members have been awarded honors such as Mr. Murray State University, Outstanding Senior Man, and Greek Man of the Year. They have been elected Student Government Association President in each of the last two years. They have also been elected to Intra-Fraternity Council executive offices. They are respected by their fellow students as individuals and as an organization because of their active role in campus leadership;

NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Board of Regents of Murray State University hereby expresses its deep appreciation and pride in the Delta Tau Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi. Their hard work has not only helped those in need but also improved the image of Greek organizations. The many accomplishments of this organization illustrate the countless benefits of actively participating in extracurricular activities at Murray State University.

Strategic Committee on Postsecondary Education (SCOPE) Meeting

The SCOPE Committee is made up of representatives from the Senate, the House, the Governor's Office and the Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE). At a meeting two weeks ago, Presidents were asked to tell about the good things that have happened at their universities.

President Alexander shared the following information with the members of the SCOPE Committee:

• Murray State's Development Campaign has done well. We have raised about \$19 million of the \$25 million goal. It's a short campaign. Some of the other schools' campaigns run to 2003, 2004, and 2008 to raise funds. This is Murray State's first campaign and we have made great progress. Of particular significance, is the \$3 million anonymous gift that was given to this University unrestricted. We are so appreciative to the persons who have given MSU that foundation of support.

Dr. Alexander shared a letter from Dr. Tom Clark, Professor of History at the University of Kentucky who is so well known throughout the state, congratulating MSU on the receipt of the major gift. The President received letters of congratulations from the CPE, the Governor's Office and others.

- Secondly, Dr. Alexander told the committee that MSU has achieved enrollment growth in the past five years. Most of the other schools have lost enrollment; this year they are spiking up somewhat, but we've had good steady enrollment growth at Murray State for five years. We are growing and getting stronger and we have broken the 9,000 record this year. The CPE has an expectation that Murray State's growth be rather significant in the next few years. In fact, the entire state of Kentucky has a goal of 60,000 students in higher education enrollment over a period of ten years. Our state appropriations will be based on our growth.
- Murray State was ranked as one of the best comprehensive regional universities in the country by the *U.S. News and World Report*. As we met with that SCOPE committee and I heard the other presidents make their presentations they were aspiring to a goal that MSU has reached. They talked about what they would like to do and one of their priorities was to have *U.S. News and World Report* to rank them in the top tier. The latest rankings showed Murray State rising nine spots above last year and marked the 10th consecutive year that the University has appeared in the top tier.

Murray State also reclaimed positions in two categories where it has appeared in previous years. *U. S. News and World Report* ranked MSU in sixth place among Top Public Universities in the South. This is the third time that the University has been ranked in this category since it was created in 1997. It is the only Kentucky university to make the list and shares company with prestigious schools such as James Madison University, Mary Washington College and The Citadel. Murray State was joined by Bellarmine College to represent the state as a Tier I Regional University. Murray State also returns in sixth place this year as one of the Best Values in the South.

Factors considered in the rankings are reputation, retention rate, graduation rate, class size, student-faculty ratio and SAT/ACT scoring.

MSU is growing and prospering. The campus has never looked better due to the effective leadership of Dr. Dewey Yeatts, Associate Vice President for Facilities Management.

Recruitment and Retention

MSU's enrollment for Fall 2000 is 9100. All universities are modifying enrollment

approaches and marketing of their universities. We are going to make some changes to better organize ourselves.

The President asked Phil Bryan to report on enrollment management. Mr. Bryan pointed out that the Enrollment Management Committee looks at recruitment and retention. Emphasis will be placed on freshmen, the African American Freshmen, transfer students, international students, and off-campus classes. He presented charts on enrollment and retention. The faculty and the Roads Scholars are a very integral part of the team working on recruitment and retention.

President Alexander informed the Regents that Jim Vaughan will be working as a special assistant to coordinate all diverse campus activities on student recruitment. We've done a good job in increasing our enrollment, but we need to make some changes and one of those is better internal coordination within the University. Every faculty member, every college, every department is involved in student recruitment. We are working on a new electronic system that will allow us to interact within the University. If a student writes a faculty member, within minutes our School Relations Office will know about it and they can contact the student. If Murray State is going to get the best and the brightest, we're going to have to make an extraordinary effort. In November we will recommend some discounting of out-of-state tuition, we will move in the next two or three months on precisely setting our tuition so that we are attractive, but not cheap. We are pleased and not complacent and proud of where we are, but we are just now launching into a new initiative.

Report of the Chair

Chair Easley pointed out to the administration that Board members are willing to assist in the recruiting effort.

Mr. Easley reported that the Vision Quest Campaign is moving along and contacts are being made on campus. The campaign has raised approximately \$19 million of the \$25 million goal to be reached by the end of February.

He reported on his meeting with the Faculty Senate Executive Committee. One suggestion was made that perhaps the Board could meet on campus one day during the year by going out and visiting in the different departments allowing us to get a better feel of what goes on from day to day. There was a wonderful attitude and good dialogue with the Committee.

He commended the President and the University for recognition in the *U.S. News and World Report*.

Report of the Treasurer

Treasurer Tom Denton presented and reviewed the financial and investment reports for the period of July 1, 1999 – June 30, 2000. Following a brief discussion, Mrs. McCoy moved, seconded by Mrs. Dial, that the Treasurer's Report be accepted. Motion carried.

Master Lease-Purchase Agreement

Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Accounting Basis

The annual financial statements of Murray State University are prepared on an accrual basis of accounting except for depreciation on physical plant and equipment.

Tuition and fee revenues for a semester are recognized upon recording the receivable, normally before or shortly after the semester begins. Revenues of summer school academic terms are reported in the fiscal year in which the programs predominately fall. Therefore, deferred tuition revenues are recorded for terms which have not begun at year-end. State appropriations revenues are recognized upon receipt.

Expenditures are generally recognized, for interim reporting, in the period expended rather than the period incurred. Some liability accounts on the Balance Sheet are not adjusted until yearend, at which time all expenditures are accrued.

Fund Accounting

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the use of the resources available to the University, the accounts of the University are maintained in accordance with the principles of "fund accounting". This is the procedure by which resources for various activities are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds that are in accordance with activities or objectives specified.

Current funds are used primarily to account for the transactions affecting the general operation of the University. These resources are expendable for performing the primary and support objectives of the University. Restricted gifts, grants, appropriations, and other restricted resources are accounted for in the appropriate restricted funds.

All gains and losses arising from the sale, collection or other disposition of investments and other non-cash assets are accounted for in the funds which owned such assets. Ordinary income derived from investments, receivables, and the like is accounted for in the fund owning such assets.

Note 2. Deposits and Investments

The University currently uses commercial banks and the Commonwealth of Kentucky for its depositories. Deposits with commercial banks are covered by Federal depository insurance or collateral held by the bank in the University's name. At the state, the University's accounts are pooled with other agencies of the state. These state pooled deposits are substantially covered by Federal depository insurance or by collateral held by the state in the state's name. The investments of the University not held in the state investment pool are insured or registered, or are held by the University or by an agent in the University's name. Effective for the quarter ending September 30, 1997, bond sinking fund investments, held by the trustee, will be stated at market value.

Note 3. Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost, using first-in-first-out valuation, or market.

Note 4. Murray State University Foundation, Inc.

Murray State University Foundation, Inc. (the Foundation) is a Kentucky not-for-profit corporation formed to receive, invest, and expend funds for the enhancement and improvement of the University.

The Foundation prepares and issues its own financial statements.

Note 5. Prior Year Carryovers and Encumbrances

Budget revisions for Prior Year Carryovers and Prior Year Encumbrance Carryovers are based on actual balances brought forward to date from fiscal year 1998/99.

Note 6. Tuition and Fees and Scholarships

Incentive Grants of \$1,548,952 have been included as both tuition and as scholarship expenditures. The amounts are \$806,452 for Fall 1999 and \$742,500 for Spring 2000.

Note 7. Unrestricted Expenditures

In addition to expenditures, outstanding encumbrances as of June 30, 2000 are \$476,835 for Educational and General and \$97,848 for Auxiliary Enterprises.





Note 1. BASIS OF REVENUE RECOGNITION

Accrual basis accounting is used to recognize interest earnings on the Investment Report.

Note 2. INVESTMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

POLICIES

<u>Scope</u>: This investment policy applies to activities of the University with regard to investing the financial assets of all funds, including those maintained by:

- I. the Commonwealth of Kentucky's treasury,
- II. local depositories, and
- III. external trustees and investment managers.

Written procedures will indicate which funds are covered under each of the previously mentioned investment structures.

<u>Goals</u>: Consistent with state statutes and administrative regulations, the goals of the University's investment program are:

- * preservation and maintenance of the real purchasing power of the principal in the portfolios,
- * maintenance of sufficient liquidity to meet normal and foreseeable expenditures, and
- * attainment of the greatest possible dollar return to the University while observing statutory and policy constraints.

<u>Investment Objective</u>: The investment objective is to produce a yield that when compared to the current marketplace, would be described as competitive by investment managers.

Strategy: The University's investment strategy is designed to match the life of the assets with the date liability occurs.

Delegation of Authority:

General: The treasurer is responsible for investment decisions and activities, under the direction of the Board of Regents. The Treasurer shall develop and maintain written administrative procedures for the operation of the investment program, consistent with these policies. Such procedures shall include explicit delegation of authority to persons responsible for investment transactions. No person shall engage in an investment transaction except as provided under the terms of this policy and the procedures established by the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be responsible for all transactions undertaken and shall establish a system of controls to regulate the activities of subordinate investment personnel.

Bond Funds: With regard to bond funds, the investment/reinvestment (on instruments authorized by the bond indenture and resolutions) by the trustee(s) shall be directed from time to time by the Treasurer.

Minimal Non-Cash Investment Transactions: In order to correct stock transfer errors or dispose of small non-cash investments, the Treasurer is authorized to sell or otherwise dispose of items less that \$25,000 without specific resolution from the Board of Regents.

Note 2. INVESTMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES (cont.)

<u>Reporting</u>: The Treasurer and the Vice President for Administrative Services shall submit quarterly investment reports to the President and Board of Regents. These reports will include investment data for investment securities held at the end of the reporting period.

PROCEDURES

Specific investment procedures are contained within the full "Investment Policies and Procedures" as approved by the Board of Regents on May 14, 1994.

Note 3. DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

The University currently uses commercial banks and the Commonwealth of Kentucky for its depositories. Deposits with commercial banks are covered by Federal depository insurance or collateral held by the bank in the University's name. University funds deposited with the State Treasurer are pooled with funds from other state agencies. These state pooled deposits are substantially covered by federal depository insurance or by the collateral held by the bank in the state's name. The investments of the University not held by the state investment pool are insured, registered, or held by the University or by an agent of the University.

Note 4. CURRENT FUNDS - LOCAL BANK ACCOUNT

Effective June 1, 1997, the University entered into a new banking contract with Peoples First of Calloway County. Effective June 1, 1999, this contract was renewed with Union Planters Bank, with interest earnings based on 100% of the daily effective federal funds rate.

Interest earnings may be expended in Current Fund.

Note 5. CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDING AND REVENUE BOND FUND (CEBRB)

This fund was created, as result of the trust indenture established when the first Consolidated Educational Building Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's, as a depository of tuition and fees in order to provide funds to service the principal and interest debt requirements of each series of aforementioned bonds. The fund also supports the Educational and General Funds operations.

Note 5. CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDING AND REVENUE BOND FUND (CEBRB)

The Commonwealth of Kentucky Office of Financial Management and Economic Analysis invests available funds of the CEBRB in the State's university investment pool.

All interest earnings are transferred to Consolidated Educational Renewal and Replacement (CERR) at the end of each quarter according to the Board's approval for renewal and replacement projects.

Note 6. AUXILIARY FUNDS - HOUSING AND DINING REVENUE FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the trust indenture established when the first Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's as a depository of all auxiliary income in order to provide funds to service the principal and interest debt requirement of each series of aforementioned bonds. The fund also supports the Auxiliary Fund operations.

Note 7. ENDOWMENT FUND INVESTMENTS

ENDOWED CHAIR

During 1987, the University was awarded \$500,000 by the Commonwealth of Kentucky for an Endowed Chair for Eco-Systems Studies. University discretion, within the Board Policy, is used to invest these funds. Ten percent of the total earnings are returned to the Endowment investment pool. Ninety percent of the earnings are transferred to the University's Restricted Fund (Endowed Chair Grant) for program expenditures.

SMITH ENDOWMENT

During the fourth quarter of fiscal year 1991-92 and the first three quarters of fiscal year 1992-93, the University received proceeds, in excess of \$750,000, from the Laura Smith estate for the Smith Endowment. The majority of the proceeds were deposited with the Murray State University Foundation for investment in the investment pool.

REGIONAL UNIVERSITY ENDOWMENT TRUST

In March 2000, the University was awarded \$774,250 by the Commonwealth of Kentucky for endowed faculty positions. These funds were awarded based on the University meeting the matching requirement with private funds. The proceeds were deposited with the Murray State University Foundation for investment purposes. Earnings are transferred to the University's Restricted Fund for program expenditures.

Note 8. CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL RENEWAL AND REPLACEMENT (CERR)

As established by the Board of Regents in March 1982, CERR provides a plant fund sub-group so that funds transferred from CEBRB could be accumulated for future projects of repair and renovation.

The University invests the proceeds in the same manner as CEBRB in Note 5.

Interest earnings remain within the fund for future projects.

Note 9. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES G REVENUE BOND

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series G bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$14,785,000 in Series G revenue bonds dated December 1, 1987. The proceeds are to be used to pay costs of repair, renovation, construction or addition to buildings on the campus of Murray State University that are and shall be a part of the Consolidated Educational Building Project. This project was established and created by the Board of Regents on April 20, 1961.

The University invests the proceeds in the same manner as CEBRB in Note 5.

Interest earnings on Series G can be spent on the Industry and Technology Building project or any other Educational and General project the Board and State approves.

Note 10. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES H REVENUE BOND

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series H bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$4,625,000 in Series H revenue bonds dated March 1, 1992. The proceeds are to be used to pay costs of repair, renovation, construction of addition to buildings on the campus of Murray State University that are and shall be a part of the Consolidated Educational Building Project. This project was established and created by the Board of Regents on April 20, 1961.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky invests the proceeds in a pooled account with other state agency bond proceeds.

Interest earnings on Series H can be spent on the renovation of the Old Fine Arts Building and the Underground Steam and Condensate Lines as approved by the Board and State.

Note 11. RETIREMENT OF INDEBTEDNESS - CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL SINKING FUND (CESF)

This fund was created, as a result of the first trust indenture established when the Consolidated Educational Building and Revenue bonds were sold in the 1960's, to provide a sinking fund to pay debt principal and interest expense on all related CEBRB bonds. The amount of interest earned is part of the formula for annual funding of CERR projects. (See Note 5)

Interest earnings are used to reduce the amount of semi-annual debt service transferred from University Unrestricted Educational and General Fund to this sinking fund. Bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$2,698,591.

Note 12. RETIREMENT OF INDEBTEDNESS - HOUSING AND DINING SINKING FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the trust indenture established when the first Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's, to provide a sinking fund to pay debt principal and interest expense on related Housing and Dining Revenue Bonds.

Interest earnings are retained in the fund for future use. Bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$1,222,793.

Note 13. HOUSING AND DINING REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE RESERVE FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the establishment of the trust indenture in Note 5, to provide a fund to pay for extraordinary repairs, not paid from the Auxiliary Fund, to the Housing and Dining System buildings.

Interest earnings are retained in the fund for future use. The use is determined by Board of Regents resolution and the indentures. Current bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$909,750.

Note 14. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES N HOUSING AND DINING REVENUE BOND

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series N bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$6,370,000 in Series N revenue bonds dated April 1, 1999. The proceeds are to be used to pay costs of certain fire safety and maintenance improvements to buildings on the campus of Murray State University that are and shall be a part of the Housing and Dining System. This system was established and created by the Board of Regents on September 1, 1965.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky invests the proceeds in a pooled account with other state agency bond proceeds.

Interest earnings on Series N can be spent on fire safety improvements and maintenance of certain housing facilities as approved by the Board and State.

Effective March 31, 2000, Chase Manhattan Bank (trustee) consolidated the Series N Reserve Sinking Fund into the Housing and Dining Bond Reserve Sinking Fund, eliminating the need for separate reserve accounts.
