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# Minutes of the Quarterly Meeting of the Board of Regents Murray State University February 27, 2004

The Board of Regents of Murray State University met on February 27, 2004, in quarterly session in the Jesse Stuart Room of Pogue Library on the main campus of Murray State University. The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m. by Chair Sid Easley. Regent Mike Miller gave the invocation.

#### Minutes of the Board of Regents Quarterly Meeting on December 5, 2003, approved

Mr. Miller moved, seconded by Mrs. Ford, that the Minutes of the Board of Regents meeting held on December 5, 2003, be approved. Motion carried.

#### President's Report

#### Budget Update

The University has taken a mid-year nonrecurring cut of \$2.9 million, which is 6 percent of all our state appropriations. To handle this, in 2003 some resources were held back in anticipation of the bad budget cycle. Roughly about \$769,000 of those dollars were applied to this one time cut. To make up this difference, we had excess tuition dollars because of student enrollment changes as well as student enrollment growth, and we did some bond refinancing to get us to the point of the nonrecurring cuts.

We have also had a \$1.3 million recurring cut, roughly 2.6 percent. A hiring freeze was immediately imposed. Specific positions are being justified for security and other reasons. The greatest concern on the freeze is that we have 168 classes in the fall that are not being filled which means we will have higher student/teacher ratios.

Specific programmatic cuts include instruction related programs, such as Japanese instruction, some social work, education with some adjunct instruction, Provost summer programs, community college instruction, and adjunct instruction resulting in a total savings of \$158,000.

There will be about a half million dollars in non-instruction related cuts. To give you an idea as to what this amounts to, there will be a \$200,000 cut in athletics, 15 percent of their budget; our Washington Research Office, a cut of \$25,000; Wickliffe Mounds \$73,000; our organic pasteurization plant here in Murray, a cut of about \$31,000; and, the Small Business Development Centers. These cuts have been spread out both outside Murray as well as inside Murray.

This leaves some across the board cuts to adjust in our administrative units of roughly about \$600,000 or about 1.3 percent. The specific cuts have allowed us to reduce the amount of across the board cuts which have helped many of the areas on our campus.

#### Enrollment Update

Our spring comparison enrollment is up 42 or ½ percent from where we were last spring. The bulk of these are undergraduate students on our campuses in Madisonville, Hopkinsville, Henderson and Paducah.

Our graduate enrollment is down 3.9 percent from where we were last spring. Of the 68 graduate students that we are down, 55 are international students. Quite simply, between the loss of students at Fort Campbell and the international graduate students, this constitutes the vast majority of graduate student decline, but undergraduate enrollment has held up and has actually been growing.

#### **Endowment Fundraising Update**

Vice President for Institutional Advancement Jimmy Carter and Associate Vice President for Institutional Advancement Mark Hutchins have done an outstanding job with reforming our Development Office. For the first time in Murray State's history, the MSU Foundation will exceed \$50 million probably within the next four to six months. This is up 10 percent since June which is a combination of the bucks for brains resources that we have received and matched and the efforts of Mark Hutchins and Jimmy Carter. With relation to our development efforts, compared to last year at this time our annual fund has raised over a half million dollars, which is up \$104,000 from where it was last year at this time. Major gifts are up \$188,000 from where they were last year at this time. Bequests are up \$325,000 from where they were at this time last year. Special projects are down a little bit \$6,000 but these are small numbers compared to our Vision Quest dollars. We are in the process of finalizing the Vision Quest collections, we are up \$50,000 from where we were last year at this time. Athletics, we are up \$41,000 with a lot of donations that we will be approving today. Overall, we are up roughly about three quarters of a million dollars, 37 percent more than we were last year. It could not have come at a better time. Our interest rates are starting to rebound a little bit in our Foundation so we will be better off this year than we were last year on interest rates as well with our Foundation. This is very pleasing particularly because of the uncertainty of the current fiscal environment. The Bucks for Brains program has helped build our endowment, but we will not have Bucks for Brains next year.

#### Facilities Update

First phase of the Science Complex - will be opened at the end of April

The Recreation and Wellness Center - roughly two months ahead of schedule

Equine Classroom Facility (trust resources provided by the state, which is a completely separate trust fund and pool) - scheduled for completion around June 2005

Business Incubator - scheduled for opening around June 2005

Many of you know that Phase II of the Science Complex is in the Governor's budget request. We have \$15 million built into the Governor's budget request and we certainly would like to see this happen.

#### Economic Impact Study of Murray State University

President Alexander introduced Dr. Gilbert L. Mathis, Professor of Economics and Finance, who gave a report on the Economic Impact Study.

Dr. Mathis stated that the study looked at what the state gives to Murray State in budget allocations. We looked at what the university generates and the impact of those dollars. It turns out that for every dollar of appropriated funds, Murray State University generates \$8.61 in economic activity to all Kentuckians. We looked at the direct benefits in annual figures, and the

figures pretty much tell the story.

#### 1. <u>IMPACT ON WEST KENTUCKY</u>

#### Quality of Life

As one of the state's most important economic engines, Murray State University substantially contributes to the social and economic vitality of the entire Commonwealth. In addition to being ranked as one of the nation's best universities, MSU's contributions to the quality of life and economic well being of all Kentuckians is immense and consistent.

The recent economic impact study conducted by Dr. Gilbert Mathis spells out in dollars and cents the significant and multiple impacts of Murray State on the region of West Kentucky and the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky.

This important study not only shows the investment and economic value of the financial activity generated by MSU, but it also measures the significant earnings contributions derived from improvements in educational attainment of MSU graduates throughout our region.

#### Direct Benefit to West Kentucky

The direct benefit of Murray State to the economy of West Kentucky was estimated at \$178,207,657 annually. This included \$21,881,569 from direct universities expenditures, \$40,025,528 from faculty and staff expenditures, \$106,885,674 from student expenditures, and \$5,163,117 from visitors to the University and its personnel. The University and related personnel paid \$4,251,769 in taxes to local governments.

#### Total Benefit of MSU Spending to West Kentucky

The total benefit of MSU-related expenditures to West Kentucky was estimated at \$338,594,548 annually. This included the \$178,207,657 that was directly injected into the West Kentucky economy by university-related expenditures, plus the multiplier effect of those dollars as they were re-spent in the region.

#### **Employment Benefit to West Kentucky**

The additional employment in West Kentucky resulting from Murray State was estimated at 6,398 full-time jobs. Approximately 1,291 West Kentucky residents (not including student workers) were employed full-time directly by Murray State and approximately 5,107 full-time jobs resulted from induced business activity in the region.

#### Benefit to Bank Credit Bases

The expansion in the credit base of West Kentucky banks and financial institutions resulting from deposits of MSU and related personnel was estimated at \$25,412,077 annually. This estimation was based on their direct deposits of \$33,882,769.

#### **Graduate Earning Power**

Murray State University's impact on West Kentucky also includes its contribution to the earning power of MSU graduates. Based on the earnings differential between college graduates and high school graduates, the potential Murray State contribution to human capital in West Kentucky is estimated at \$391,313,320 annually.

#### 2. <u>IMPACT ON COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY</u>

#### Direct Benefit to Commonwealth of Kentucky

The Direct benefit of Murray State to the economy of Kentucky was estimated at \$240,242,810 annually. This included \$31,348,444 from direct university expenditures,

\$44,020,998 from faculty and staff expenditures, \$152,839,554 from student expenditures, and \$3,329,946 from visitors to the University and its personnel The University and related personnel paid \$8,703,868 in taxes (property, state income, etc.).

#### Total Benefit of MSU Spending to Kentucky

The total benefit of MSU-related expenditures to Kentucky was estimated to \$480,485,620 annually. This included the \$240,242,810 that was directly injected into the state economy by university-related expenditures, plus the multiplier effect of those dollars as they were re-spent in the commonwealth.

#### **Employment Benefit to Kentucky**

The additional employment in Kentucky resulting from Murray State was estimated at 8,625 full-time jobs. Approximately 1,305 Kentucky residents (not including student workers) were employed full-time directly by Murray State and approximately 7,320 full-time jobs resulted from induced business activity in Kentucky.

#### Benefit to Bank Credit Bases

The expansion in the credit base of Kentucky banks and financial institutions resulting from deposits of MSU and related personnel was estimated at \$53,907,717 annually. This estimation was based on their direct deposits of \$71,876,956.

#### **Graduate Earning Power**

Murray State University's impact on the Commonwealth of Kentucky also includes its contribution to the earning power of MSU graduates. Based on the earnings differential between college graduates and high school graduates, the potential Murray State contribution to human capital in Kentucky is estimated at \$549,122,657 annually.

#### 3. <u>IMPACT ON CALLOWAY COUNTY</u>

#### **Direct Benefit to Calloway County**

The direct benefit of Murray Sate to the economy of Calloway County was estimated at \$136,220,313 annually. This included \$18,203,975 from direct university expenditures, \$35,150,674 from faculty and staff expenditures, \$71,705,214 from student expenditures, and \$8,493,745 from visitors to the University and its personnel. The University and related personnel paid \$2,666,705 in taxes to local governments.

#### Total Benefit of MSU Spending to Calloway County

The total benefit of MSU-related expenditures to Calloway County was estimated at \$204,330,470 annually. This included the \$136,220,313 that was directly injected into the Calloway economy by university-related expenditures, plus the multiplier effect of those dollars as they were re-spent in the county.

#### **Employment Benefit to County**

The additional employment in Calloway County resulting from Murray Sate was estimated at 4,890 full-time jobs. Approximately 1,067 Calloway residents (not including student workers) were employed full-time directly by Murray State and approximately 3,823 full-time jobs resulted from induced business activity in the county.

#### Benefit to Bank Credit Bases

The expansion in the credit base of Calloway County banks and financial institutions resulting from deposits of MSU and related personnel was estimated at \$17,913,662 annually. This estimation was based on their direct deposits of \$23,884,883 annually.

#### **Graduate Earning Power**

Murray Sate University's impact on Calloway County also includes its contribution to the earning power of MSU graduates. Based on earnings differential between college graduates and high school graduates, the potential Murray State contribution to human capital in Calloway County is estimated at \$81,387,869 annually.

President Alexander stated that the study is a good tool to remind people of the investment value, not only our students, but also the economic activities that a university of this kind creates throughout West Kentucky and the Commonwealth. He pointed out that the study as a whole shows that there are state expenditures and state investments and we are a pretty good state investment and our students are a pretty good state investment. That in itself tells the story of what a university brings to a region and to the Commonwealth. We just have to convince everybody.

Dr. Alexander expressed appreciation to Professor Mathis because the amount of work was astronomical and it started by surveying our students, faculty and staff and their spending habits last spring to get a very good balance sample size. He worked throughout the summer and fall constructing these numbers and I think it highlights the greatness of our faculty to be able to apply this to what we do.

#### Report of the Chairman

Chair Easley expressed appreciation to faculty and staff on dealing with the budget cuts. The Board wants to be assured that the belt has been tightened as much as possible especially when dealing with tuition.

He also expressed appreciation to President Alexander for all his work and long hours in Frankfort dealing with legislators and trying to get more money for Murray State.

Mr. Easley expressed appreciation to all Board members for the evaluation of the President at the last meeting. Despite the budget situation, the Board's action was the right thing to do.

#### Report of the Treasurer

Treasurer Tom Denton presented and reviewed the financial and investment reports for the period of July 1, 2003, through December 31, 2003. Following a brief discussion, Mrs. Burr moved, seconded by Mr. Sparks, that the Treasurer's Report be accepted. Motion carried.

Mr. Lovett moved, seconded by Mr. Rose, that the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of the President of the University, approve the revision in the Naming of Campus Facilities, Programs, and Activities by replacing the Vice President for Finance and Administrative Services (or designated representative) with the Vice President for Institutional Advancement (or designated representative) as the ex-officio chairman of the Committee. Motion carried.

The Vice President for Finance and Administrative Services recommends this change to the President in order to emphasize the role of development and university relations in the naming process. All University vice presidents will continue to serve on this committee.

## Murray State University's Recognition of 50th Anniversary of Brown v. Board of Education

Dr. Alexander stated that Murray State University will celebrate the historic Supreme Court decision of *Brown v. Board of Education* throughout the Spring 2004 semester. Given the nature of the *Brown* decision, which has been considered "the most important civil rights judicial decision in American history" and the benefits that have accrued to society and our institution, the celebration will involve a campus-wide initiative. Additionally, the University will coordinate events with the city, county, school systems and surrounding areas to make the celebration a total community effort.



#### Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of Accounting and Financial Statement Presentation**

The University prepares its financial statements as a business-type activity in conformity with applicable pronouncements of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB).

For financial reporting purposes, the University is considered a special-purpose government engaged only in business-type activities. Accordingly, the University's financial statements have been presented using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. Under the accrual basis, revenues are recognized when earned, and expenses are recorded when an obligation has been incurred. All significant intra-agency transactions have been eliminated.

Significant accounting changes made during the 2002 fiscal year in order to comply with the reporting requirements include (1) adoption of depreciation on capital assets; and (2) reporting summer school revenues and expenses between fiscal years rather than in one fiscal year.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

The University considers all highly liquid investments that are immediately available to the University to be cash equivalents. Funds held by the Commonwealth of Kentucky are considered cash equivalents.

The University currently uses commercial banks and the Commonwealth of Kentucky as depositories. Deposits with commercial banks are covered by Federal depository insurance or collateral held by the banks in the University's name. At the Commonwealth level, the University's accounts are pooled with other agencies of the Commonwealth. These Commonwealth pooled deposits are substantially covered by Federal depository insurance or by collateral held by the bank in the Commonwealth's name.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost, using first-in-first-out valuation, or market.

#### **Investments**

The University accounts for its investments at fair value. Changes in unrealized gain (loss) on the carrying value of investments are reported as a component of investment income in the statement of revenues, expenses, and changes in net assets.

Assets held by the Murray State University Foundation, Inc. (Foundation) represent those gifts and donations made directly to the University, which are held by the Foundation for investment purposes. The net appreciation and income of donor restricted endowments are available to the University for expenditure to the extent permitted by Kentucky law and Foundation spending policy. The recognition of gifts, donations, and endowment pledges are accounted for by the University in accordance with GASB Statement No. 33, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Non-exchange Transactions.

#### Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable consists of tuition and fee charges, other operational activities, and auxiliary enterprise services. Accounts receivable also include amounts due from the Federal government, state and local governments, or private sources, for non-exchange type agreements defined in accordance with GASB No. 33 or in connection with reimbursement of allowable expenditures made pursuant to the University's grant and contracts. Accounts receivable are recorded net of estimated uncollectible amounts.

#### Capital Assets

All capital assets, as defined by University policy, are recorded at cost at the date of acquisition, or, if donated, at fair value at the date of donation. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of the asset and is not allocated to functional expense categories. Outlays for construction in progress are capitalized as incurred. Routine repairs and maintenance are charged to operating expense in the year in which the expense was incurred.

The following estimated useful lives are being used by the University:

The University owns historical collections housed throughout the campus that it does not capitalize, including artifacts in Wrather Museum. These collections adhere to the University's policy to (a) maintain them for public exhibition, education, or research; (b) protect, keep unencumbered, care for, and preserve them; and (c) require proceeds from their sale to be used to acquire other collection items. Generally accepted accounting principles permit collections maintained in this manner to be charged to operations at time of purchase rather than capitalized.

#### **Compensated Absences**

Employee vacation pay is accrued at year-end for financial statement purposes. The liability and expense incurred are included at year-end with accrued payroll, and as a component of compensation and benefit expense. Sick leave benefits expected to be realized as paid time off are recognized as expense when the time off occurs and no liability is accrued for such benefits employees have earned but not yet realized.

#### Restricted Cash and Investments

Cash and investments that are externally restricted are classified as restricted assets. These assets are used to make debt service payments, maintain sinking or reserve funds, purchase or construct capital or other noncurrent assets, or for other restricted purposes.

#### Net Assets

The University's net assets are classified as follows:

Invested in capital assets, net of related debt: This represents the University's total investment in capital assets, net of outstanding debt obligations related to those capital assets. To the extent debt has been incurred but not yet expended for capital assets, such amounts are not included as a component of invested in capital assets, net of related debt.

Restricted net assets – expendable: Restricted expendable net assets include resources in which the University is legally or contractually obligated to spend in accordance with restrictions imposed by external third parties.

Restricted net assets – nonexpendable: Nonexpendable restricted net assets consist of endowment and similar type funds in which donors or other outside sources have stipulated, as a condition of the gift instrument, that the principal is to be maintained inviolate and in perpetuity, and invested for the purpose of producing present and future income, which may either be expended or added to principal.

Unrestricted net assets: Unrestricted net assets represent resources derived from student tuition and fees, state appropriations, sales and services of educational departments, auxiliary enterprises, and other sources. These resources are used for transactions relating to the educational and general operations of the University, and may be used at the discretion of the governing board to meet current expenses or for any purpose. These resources also include auxiliary enterprises, which are substantially self-supporting activities that provide services for students, faculty, and staff.

### Release of Restricted Net Assets

When an expense is incurred for which both restricted and unrestricted net assets are available, the University's policy is to allow each departmental unit the flexibility to determine whether to first apply restricted or unrestricted resources based on the most advantageous application of resources in the particular circumstances.

### Classification of Revenues

The University has classified its revenues as either operating or nonoperating revenues according to the following criteria:

Operating revenues: Operating revenues include activities that have the characteristics of exchange transactions, such as (1) student tuition and fees, net of discounts and allowances, (2) sales and services of auxiliary enterprises, net of discounts and allowances, (3) Federal, state and local grants and contracts, and (4) interest on institutional student loans.

#### Classification of Revenues (cont'd)

Nonoperating revenues: Nonoperating revenues include activities that have the characteristics of nonexchange transactions, such as gifts and contributions, and other revenue sources that are defined as nonoperating revenues by GASB Statement No. 9, Reporting Cash Flows of Proprietary and Nonexpendable Trust Funds and Governmental Entities That Use Proprietary Fund Accounting, and GASB No. 34, such as state appropriations and investment income.

#### **Tuition Discounts and Allowances**

Student tuition and fee revenues, and certain other revenues from students, are reported net of discounts and allowances. Discounts and allowances are the difference between the stated charge for goods and services provided by the University, and the amount that is payable by students. Certain governmental grants, such as Pell grants, and other Federal, state or nongovernmental programs, are recorded as either operating or nonoperating revenues in the University's financial statements. To the extent that revenues from such programs are used to satisfy tuition and fees and other student charges, the University has recorded a discount and allowance.

#### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to use estimates and assumptions. The accompanying financial statements include estimates for items such as allowances for doubtful accounts and loans receivable, self-insurance liabilities and other accrued liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Recent Accounting Pronouncements

The Governmental Accounting Standards Board recently issued its Statement No. 39, Determining Whether Certain Organizations are Component Units, an amendment of GASB Statement 14. The new statement provides additional guidance to determine whether certain organizations for which the University is not financially accountable should be reported as component units in the University's financial statements based on the nature and significance of their relationship with the University. It generally requires reporting, as component units, organizations that raise and hold economic resources for the direct benefit of the University. The University expects to first apply the new statement during the year of June 30, 2004. The impact of applying the new statement has not yet been determined.

The Governmental Accounting Standards Board recently issued its Statement No. 40, Deposit and Investment Risk Disclosures, and amendment of GASB Statement No. 3. This Statement provides guidance in common deposit and investment risks related to credit risk. The University expects to first apply the new statement for the year ended June 30, 2005. The University does not expect GASB No. 40 to significantly impact its financial statements footnote disclosures.

Investments in U.S. government securities and the collateral for repurchase agreements are registered in the name of Murray State University or held in the University's name by its agents and trustees.

The University may legally invest in direct obligations of and other obligations guaranteed as to principal by the U.S. Treasury and U.S. agencies and instrumentalities and in bank repurchase agreements. It may also invest to a limited extent in equity securities.

Investments held by the Murray State University Foundation are comprised of private donations received directly by the University and consist of expendable restricted funds as well as endowments. Assets held by the Murray State University Foundation, Inc. (Foundation) are invested primarily in an investment pool managed by the Foundation and are carried at fair value. As of June 30, 2003, the assets in the pool are invested as follows: securities of the U.S. government and its agencies, 1%; mutual funds invested in equity securities, 45%; mutual funds invested in fixed income securities, 47%; certificates of deposit, 1% and other 6%.

## Note 3. Prior Year Carryovers and Encumbrances

Budget revisions for prior year carryovers and prior year encumbrance carryovers are based on actual balances brought forward to date from fiscal year 2002-03.



## Note 5. Adjustment applicable to Investments

During 2003, as part of the ongoing evaluation of its application of GASB No. 33 and in preparation for the implementation of GASB No. 39, the University determined that donations received by the Foundation on behalf of the University were not to be recorded as assets of the University. The University will continue to report as assets those private donations received directly by the University and held by the Foundation for investment purposes on behalf of the University. This change in the method of accounting for donations results in the restating the December 31, 2002 investments and net assets.

#### Note 1. BASIS OF REVENUE RECOGNITION

Accrual basis accounting is used to recognize interest earnings on the Investment Report.

#### Note 2. INVESTMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

#### **POLICIES**

Scope: This investment policy applies to activities of the University with regard to investing the financial assets of all funds, including those maintained by:

- I. the Commonwealth of Kentucky's treasury,
- II. local depositories, and
- III. external trustees and investment managers.

Written procedures will indicate which funds are covered under each of the previously mentioned investment structures.

<u>Goals</u>: Consistent with state statutes and administrative regulations, the goals of the University's investment program are:

- preservation and maintenance of the real purchasing power of the principal in the portfolios,
- maintenance of sufficient liquidity to meet normal and foreseeable expenditures, and
- attainment of the greatest possible dollar return to the University while observing statutory and policy constraints.

<u>Investment Objective</u>: The investment objective is to produce a yield that when compared to the current marketplace, would be described as competitive by investment managers.

Strategy: The University's investment strategy is designed to match the life of the assets with the date liability occurs.

## Delegation of Authority:

General: The treasurer is responsible for investment decisions and activities, under the direction of the Board of Regents. The Treasurer shall develop and maintain written administrative procedures for the operation of the investment program, consistent with these policies. Such procedures shall include explicit delegation of authority to persons responsible for investment transactions. No person shall engage in an investment transaction except as provided under the terms of this policy and the procedures established by the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be responsible for all transactions undertaken and shall establish a system of controls to regulate the activities of subordinate investment personnel.

<u>Bond Funds</u>: With regard to bond funds, the investment/reinvestment (on instruments authorized by the bond indenture and resolutions) by the trustee(s) shall be directed from time to time by the Treasurer.

## Note 2. INVESTMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES (cont'd)

Minimal Non-Cash Investment Transactions: In order to correct stock transfer errors or dispose of small non-cash investments, the Treasurer is authorized to sell or otherwise dispose of items less that \$25,000 without specific resolution from the Board of Regents.

Reporting: The Treasurer and the Vice President for Administrative Services shall submit quarterly investment reports to the President and Board of Regents. These reports will include investment data for investment securities held at the end of the reporting period.

#### **PROCEDURES**

Specific investment procedures are contained within the full "Investment Policies and Procedures" as approved by the Board of Regents on May 14, 1994.

## Note 3. DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

The University currently uses commercial banks and the Commonwealth of Kentucky for its depositories. Deposits with commercial banks are covered by Federal depository insurance or collateral held by the bank in the University's name. University funds deposited with the State Treasurer are pooled with funds from other state agencies. These state pooled deposits are substantially covered by federal depository insurance or by the collateral held by the bank in the state's name. The investments of the University not held by the state investment pool are insured, registered, or held by the University or by an agent of the University.

Beginning July 1, 2002, the University determined that the private donations received by Murray State University Foundation on behalf of the University were not to be recorded as assets of the University. The University will continue to report as assets those private donations received directly by the University and held by the Foundation for investment purposes. The University posts its investment earnings from the Foundation pool on an annual basis, at June 30 each year. Therefore, the MSU Foundation Investment Pool earnings reflected in this report will appear in fourth quarter, June 30, financial reports.

## Note 4. CURRENT FUNDS - LOCAL BANK ACCOUNT

Effective June 1, 2001, the University entered into a banking contract with Firstar Bank, NA of Bowling Green, Kentucky, currently US Bank. This contract stipulates that interest earnings will be based on the Federal Funds target rate less .25%.

Interest earnings may be expended in Current Fund.

## Note 5. CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDING AND REVENUE BOND FUND (CEBRB)

This fund was created, as result of the trust indenture established when the first Consolidated Educational Building Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's, as a depository of tuition and fees in order to provide funds to service the principal and interest debt requirements of each series of aforementioned bonds. The fund also supports the Educational and General Funds operations.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky Office of Financial Management invests available funds of the CEBRB in the State's university investment pool.

All interest earnings are transferred to Consolidated Educational Renewal and Replacement (CERR) at the end of each quarter according to the Board's approval for renewal and replacement projects.

## Note 6. AUXILIARY FUNDS - HOUSING AND DINING REVENUE FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the trust indenture established when the first Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's as a depository of all auxiliary income in order to provide funds to service the principal and interest debt requirement of each series of aforementioned bonds. The fund also supports the Auxiliary Fund operations.

## Note 7. ENDOWMENT FUND INVESTMENTS

## REGIONAL UNIVERSITY ENDOWMENT TRUST (RUETF)

As of June 30, 2002, the University has been awarded a total of \$5,231,787 by the Commonwealth of Kentucky for endowed faculty positions and scholarships. These funds were awarded based on the University meeting the matching requirement with private funds. The proceeds were deposited with the Murray State University Foundation for investment purposes. Earnings are transferred to the University's Restricted Fund for program expenditures.

## Note 7. ENDOWMENT FUND INVESTMENTS (cont'd)

### ENDOWED CHAIR

During 1987, the University was awarded \$500,000 by the Commonwealth of Kentucky for an Endowed Chair for Eco-Systems Studies. University discretion, within the Board Policy, is used to invest these funds. Ten percent of the total earnings are returned to the Endowment investment pool. Ninety percent of the earnings are transferred to the University's Restricted Fund (Endowed Chair Grant) for program expenditures.

## Note 8. CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL RENEWAL AND REPLACEMENT (CERR)

As established by the Board of Regents in March 1982, CERR provides a plant fund sub-group so that funds transferred from CEBRB could be accumulated for future projects of repair and renovation.

The University invests the proceeds in the same manner as CEBRB in Note 5.

Interest earnings remain within the fund for future projects.

## Note 9. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES G REVENUE BOND

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series G bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$14,785,000 in Series G revenue bonds dated December 1, 1987. The proceeds are to be used to pay costs of repair, renovation, construction or addition to buildings on the campus of Murray State University that are and shall be a part of the Consolidated Educational Building Project. This project was established and created by the Board of Regents on April 20, 1961.

The University invests the proceeds in the same manner as CEBRB in Note 5.

Interest earnings on Series G can be spent on the Industry and Technology Building project or any other Educational and General project the Board and State approves.

# Note 10. RETIREMENT OF INDEBTEDNESS - CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL SINKING FUND (CESF)

This fund was created, as a result of the first trust indenture established when the Consolidated Educational Building and Revenue bonds were sold in the 1960's, to provide a sinking fund to pay debt principal and interest expense on all related CEBRB bonds. The amount of interest earned is part of the formula for annual funding of CERR projects. (See Note 5)

Interest earnings are used to reduce the amount of semi-annual debt service transferred from University Unrestricted Educational and General Fund to this sinking fund. Bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$1,968,193.

## Note 11. RETIREMENT OF INDEBTEDNESS - HOUSING AND DINING SINKING FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the trust indenture established when the first Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds were sold in the 1960's, to provide a sinking fund to pay debt principal and interest expense on related Housing and Dining Revenue Bonds.

Interest earnings are retained in the fund for future use. Bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$1,141,762.

## Note 12. HOUSING AND DINING REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE RESERVE FUND

This fund was created, as a result of the establishment of the trust indenture in Note 6, to provide a fund to pay for extraordinary repairs, not paid from the Auxiliary Fund, to the Housing and Dining System buildings.

Interest earnings are retained in the fund for future use. The use is determined by Board of Regents resolution and the indentures. Current bond requirements mandate a minimum reserve of \$1,233,100.

## Note 13. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES N HOUSING AND DINING REVENUE BOND

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series N bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$6,370,000 in Series N revenue bonds dated April 1, 1999. The proceeds are to be used to pay costs of certain fire safety and maintenance improvements to buildings on the campus of Murray State University that are and shall be a part of the Housing and Dining System. This system was established and created by the Board of Regents on September 1, 1965.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky invests the proceeds in a pooled account with other state agency bond proceeds.

Interest earnings on Series N can be spent on fire safety improvements and maintenance of certain housing facilities as approved by the Board and State.

## Note 14. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES O HOUSING AND DINING REVENUE BOND

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series O bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$1,610,000 in Series O revenue bonds dated June 1, 2001. The proceeds are to be used to pay costs of replacement of water supply lines, replacement of a heating boiler, and installation of electrical tap connections for fire pumps for certain buildings on the campus of Murray State University that are and shall be a part of the Housing and Dining System. This system was established and created by the Board of Regents on September 1, 1965.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky invests the proceeds in a pooled account with other state agency bond proceeds.

Interest earnings on Series O can be spent on improvements and maintenance of certain housing facilities as approved by the Board and State.

## Note 15. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - SERIES P HOUSING AND DINING REVENUE BONDS

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the University's Series P bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The University issued \$2,500,000 in Series P revenue bonds dated June 1, 2003. The proceeds are to be used for the renovation of Winslow Cafeteria on the campus of Murray State University that is and shall be a part of the Housing and Dining System. This system was established and created by the Board of Regents on September 1, 1965.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky invests the proceeds in a pooled account with other state agency bond proceeds.

Interest earnings on Series P can be spent on improvements and maintenance of certain housing facilities as approved by the Board and State.

## Note 16. UNEXPENDED PLANT FUNDS - WELLNESS CENTER

This capital construction clearing account holds the proceeds from the City of Murray's Wellness Center bond sale until such time as they are needed for specific capital construction projects.

The City of Murray issued \$10,000,000 in general obligation bonds on December 1, 2002. On December 30, 2002, the University entered into an agreement with the City of Murray to pay all debt service on this issue from pledged student fees.

The University has invested the funds in a restricted account within the Commonwealth of Kentucky investment pool, which combines the investments of other state agency bond proceeds. Interest earned on this issue can be spent on the Wellness Center facility, as approved by the Board, State, and City.

#### **MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY**

#### BUDGET PREPARATION FY 04/05 February 27, 2004

#### REVENUE INCREASES

#### **Appropriations:**

Murray State University is dealing with a \$2.9 million (5.9%) mid-year state appropriations reduction in the current fiscal year (2003-04). Of that amount, \$1.3 million (2.6%) is a permanent cut reflected in the Governor's Executive Budget and \$1.6 million (3.3%) is a one-time reduction mandated by Executive Order. These actions are designed to balance the State's budget in the current year and build a cushion for balancing next year's state budget. In addition, for the third year in a row, Maintenance and Operations (M&O) funding will not be available. All in all this continues to be the bleakest outlook for state support of public universities operations in a decade. The University will utilize departmental operational savings (carryforwards) and other temporary sources of funds to handle the current year's reduction. Because of the severe budgetary impact of the permanent cuts, however, the University will be making specific programmatic as well as across-the-board cuts.

Despite the operational decreases, the Governor's Executive Budget includes a \$15 million recommendation for completion of the second phase of the College of Science Building Complex. Although this is less than requested, it will enable the second phase to go forward if it is approved by the General Assembly.

#### Tuition:

At its meeting on May 30, 2003, the Board of Regents approved a tuition increase of 15.9% for 2003-04. The Administration is analyzing the likely impacts of the budget cuts indicated above to determine the extent that tuition will have to be raised for 2004-05 to sustain ongoing operations and to maintain quality academic programs. The proposed increase will be presented at the June Board of Regents meeting. Whatever tuition increase is recommended will be designed to balance the conflicting objectives of sustaining academic quality while continuing to make attendance at Murray State affordable when compared to other state and regional institutions.

#### **EXPENDITURE PRIORITIES**

#### 1. Fixed Costs:

Certain unavoidable or mandated costs will increase and these increased costs will have to be funded. Examples include utilities, maintenance contracts, and property insurance. The cost of Health Insurance is anticipated to rise at a double digit rate. Utilities are a particular area of

concern in light of the recent substantial increases in natural gas rates. The University's contribution rates to the Kentucky Employee Retirement System will likely increase from 5.89% to 10.29%.

#### 2. Salaries for Faculty and Staff:

To maintain and enhance the quality of instruction and service to the region and to be competitive in the market place, salaries for faculty and staff will remain high on the institution's list of priorities. In spite of the grim state revenue picture detailed above, every effort will be made to minimize any reduction in force and to address the steadily increasing fiscal impact of health insurance on all institutional employees.

#### 3. Recruitment and Retention:

The university is committed to improving efforts at recruitment of new students and retention of current students. However, in light of the continuing reduction in funding support from the State, the rate of enrollment growth may be affected.

A major factor in recruitment and retention is the availability of scholarships and tuition waivers. Various initiatives implemented over the past several fiscal years will continue to require increases in scholarship and tuition waiver programs. In addition, annual tuition and fee increases require funding for existing general, minority and athletic scholarships. As the university develops its plans for managing cuts in its appropriations, every effort will be made to diminish the impact on scholarships and tuition waivers.

#### 4. Technology:

In response to increased demand for a wide range of services, Murray State is examining the possibility of implementing three major technology initiatives. These include a proof-of-concept pilot for an online centralized data access (data warehousing), a 100 MB upgrade to the desktop, and the introduction of a Gigabit Ethernet campus backbone and network infrastructure.

Utilization of an enterprise-wide relational database and data warehouse model will provide quick access to current and historical data. Upgrading the network to Fast Ethernet (100MB) will ensure speedy access and exchange of research data with other institutions, enhance the quality of course delivery, and enable the incorporation of video into the university's on-line courses. A Gigabit Ethernet backbone and network infrastructure upgrade will increase network speed, ensure a higher availability of network resources, reduce unscheduled downtime, and address requirements for on-line course delivery.

#### 5. Other Priorities:

Funding requests from Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, Institutional Advancement, Finance and Administrative Services and the President's areas have been identified in the budget priority review process. Many of these items, including expenditures for recruitment and retention of students, library holdings, and accreditation fall into the priority categories previously identified.

Further review will allow for prioritization of the requests to be included for possible funding. Given the current fiscal consideration, only the most essential priorities are likely to receive consideration.

#### **SALARY GUIDELINES:**

#### 1. Maintain Base Salary Support:

Despite the fiscal pressure placed on MSU due to state reductions, we remain committed to ensuring that base salary reductions do not occur.

#### 2. Base/Merit Increases:

The previous Board of Regents policy on allocating salary increases between base salary increments and merit increments was changed at the June 18, 1999 meeting to stipulate that in the future the structure of the allocation will be determined by the Board on a year-by-year basis. In the event that a salary pool allocation were to prove possible, the allocations may include components for base salary and merit increments.

#### 3. Promotions and Reclassifications:

Funds will be allocated for promotion stipends for professors, associate professors, assistant professors and non-exempt position reclassifications for the 2004-05 fiscal year.

#### 4. Equity Increases above Base/Merit Increases:

The university will continue to provide funding to remedy salary inequities or to reflect major changes in responsibilities to the extent possible.
