President's Report

Enrollment

Interim President Tim Miller introduced Jim Vaughan, Assistant Vice President for Enrollment Management, who gave a report on enrollment.

Mr. Vaughan gave a report on Fall 2005/2006 Final Enrollment Comparison which included: All Enrollments; By State, All Enrollments; By State, First-Time Freshmen Enrollments; By State, First-Time Transfer Enrollments; African-American; Special Market Areas, All Students; and, Special Market Areas, First-Time Freshmen.

The good news is that we continue to have an increase in enrollment. The final Fall 2005/2006 enrollment is:

Health Insurance

On behalf of the faculty and staff at Murray State University, Dr. Miller expressed appreciation to the Board of Regents for the fringe benefits that are offered. One important thing is health insurance and the University contributes a significant portion of our health insurance costs.

Dr. Miller introduced Ms. Joyce Gordon, Associate Vice President for Human Resources, who gave a report on health insurance.

Ms. Gordon stated that three years ago she told the Board that the health cost was \$1.4 million for the following year. There were drastic changes including the wellness piece. Two years later we had cut our health care costs to \$430,000. We've got another good year. Our projections are that our cost will increase, total plan, by 4 percent which is about \$264,000. As Dr. Miller indicated, the benefit package here at the University is something that is a very important piece of our compensation package because we subsidize families in our healthcare plan. This past year we passed all of the \$430,000 in savings along to the employee and decreased their premium. This year they are going back up a very small amount in real dollars which is more telling than the percentages, it's from 0 to no increase on employee only basic plan up to \$14 on the richest full family plan and that is at \$273. The cost of a top PPO full family plan is around \$900. One of the points that Ms. Gordon made was that it is an institutional commitment and certainly supported by the Board of Regents for a number of years that the University continue to make health care very affordable for faculty and staff. Of the \$264,000, the University pays 75 percent leaving 25 percent for the employee. That's where we get the rates established. Again, we are still less than they were back to 2004. The University will be covering about 81 percent of the health care cost. Murray State is self insured. Anthem is the administrator that processes the claims and the University reinsures in a stop-loss capacity for anything over \$100,000.

Ms. Gordon further added that the University has ramped up the wellness effort across campus. That even includes the students because it is an issue of lifestyle. While the students are not on our health care plan, with the new Recreation and Wellness Center that is something that we have been able to do. We have a Health 189 wellness class taught by Dr. Corky Broughton. We also have a Wellness Coordinator who is taking us to the next level. We have health fairs and health screenings that are of no cost to the individual. We have about 250 faculty and staff who are taking the Health 189 class for 1 hour credit. It is growing by leaps and bounds and we are thrilled with that many individuals taking the class.

General Studies

Dr. Miller indicated that Dr. Strieter had asked for an update on the University Studies Commission. Dr. Miller introduced Provost Gary Brockway to give the report.

In 2002 the University passed the Strategic Plan and a part of that plan was an affirmation of the Characteristics of a Murray State Graduate which are clearly delineated and posted throughout the campus on posters and in all of our publications. We use those characteristics as a major part of our Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) accreditation process, specifically in the quality enhancement plan. We did that in 2004 and were successful in having that accepted and having our SACS accreditation reaffirmed as well. We must demonstrate to the SACS accrediting body that we are meeting the Characteristics of the Murray State Graduate and we have a full plan in place. A major way these characteristics are accomplished is through the curriculum. Last fall a commission for university studies was appointed which determines the general education courses that every undergraduate student must complete along with their major and minor. These are often referred to as the liberal arts. This Commission is broadbased, 25 plus members, made up of faculty, alumni, students throughout the University and

some community people as well, to make sure that we are addressing what students need to know today.

The Commission has done a wonderful job of looking at what other universities are doing, what the trends are, what the needs are within the university, how we articulate with our community and technical colleges, and they have brought forward this proposal which now will go to the Academic Council. This is a proposal for a Bachelor of Science degree and a Bachelor of Arts degree. Most notably what you will see is that first these align very nicely with the Characteristics of a Murray State Graduate to address things like our oral written communications, etc. Specifically, some changes that are going forward from what we now have is that every student at Murray State University will be required to take basic public speaking. Students now will be required to take a course in global awareness, cultural diversity, which has not been a part of the requirements. Students will be required to take a course in ethics, social responsibility, and/or civic engagement, which has not been required. These are some very significant changes as we look at what students will be exposed to in their curriculum. In addition, students will also be required to have a writing intensive course and a technology intensive course.

We have had open forums and excellent feedback and we think that this will be approved by the Academic Council.

Dr. Miller recognized Dr. Russ Wall and complimented him on the great results from graduates in Education on the Quality Performance Index. This year Murray State ranked the highest in the state of all the public institutions as well as last year.

Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE)

Dr. Miller added that next week the CPE is going to set tuition rates that Universities can charge. Although regional universities can go up to a maximum of 9.5 percent, most regional universities aren't doing that much in need-based aid so the CPE is saying that we can go up to 9.5 percent, but you need to set a certain percentage of that aside for need-based aid. That is something the Board will consider at its next meeting.

Regional Stewardship Plan

Dr. Miller emphasized that past presidents, Drs. Kern and King Alexander, have done a wonderful job in increasing enrollment, retaining students, and improving graduation rates. That is really important, but we need to move a step further. The next step after that is to make sure that our graduates have employment. We are the only four-year institution in this region and we need to be the leaders in regional stewardship. We need to be proactive and not reactive. If something happens in this part of the region, we need to help them. It's good to help development, bring jobs into Kentucky. We need to be active out in the region.

Dr. Miller expressed appreciation for being asked to serve as Interim President, stating that this is a great Board that will continue to do good things.

Report of the Chair

Mrs. Buchanon expressed appreciation to Dr. Miller for serving as Interim President until Dr. Randy Dunn arrives on campus.

She introduced one of the new Board members, Mr. Jeff Taylor of Owensboro. He received his Bachelor of Science degree at Murray State University, went on to get his degree in public administration at Memphis State University, and his law degree at the University of Louisville. We are proud to have you with us.

Mrs. Buchanon also introduced Gina Winchester, the new Staff Regent. She was sworn in this summer and we are glad to have you representing the staff.

Dr. Randy Dunn, we are thrilled to have you with us and we are anxious for the thirty-

four days to pass.

Scott Ellison has been r-eelected by the students to serve for a second term as President of the Student Government Association, as well as a second term on the Board of Regents.

Note 1. Financial Report Presentation

The University prepares its financial statements as a business-type activity in conformity with applicable pronouncements of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. Quarterly interim financial reports reflect unaudited summarized financial data for the year to date.

Note 2. Basis of Revenue Recognition

Accrual basis accounting is used to recognize interest earnings on the Investment Report.

Note 3. Investment Policies and Procedures

POLICIES

<u>Scope</u>: This investment policy applies to activities of the University with regard to investing the financial assets of all funds, including those maintained by:

- I. the Commonwealth of Kentucky's treasury,
- II. local depositories, and
- III. external trustees and investment managers.

Written procedures will indicate which funds are covered under each of the previously mentioned investment structures.

Goals: Consistent with state statutes and administrative regulations, the goals of the University's investment program are:

- preservation and maintenance of the real purchasing power of the principal in the portfolios,
- maintenance of sufficient liquidity to meet normal and foreseeable expenditures, and
- attainment of the greatest possible dollar return to the University while observing statutory and policy constraints.

<u>Investment Objective</u>: The investment objective is to produce a yield that when compared to the current marketplace, would be described as competitive by investment managers.

Strategy: The University's investment strategy is designed to match the life of the assets with the date liability occurs.

Note 3. Investment Policies and Procedures (Continued)

Delegation of Authority:

General: The Treasurer is responsible for investment decisions and activities, under the direction of the Board of Regents. The Treasurer shall develop and maintain written administrative procedures for the operation of the investment program, consistent with these policies. Such procedures shall include explicit delegation of authority to persons responsible for investment transactions. No person shall engage in an investment transaction except as provided under the terms of this policy and the procedures established by the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be responsible for all transactions undertaken and shall establish a system of controls to regulate the activities of subordinate investment personnel.

<u>Bond Funds</u>: With regard to bond funds, the investment/reinvestment (on instruments authorized by the bond indenture and resolutions) by the trustee(s) shall be directed from time to time by the Treasurer.

Minimal Non-Cash Investment Transactions: In order to correct stock transfer errors or dispose of small non-cash investments, the Treasurer is authorized to sell or otherwise dispose of items less than \$25,000.

<u>Reporting</u>: The Treasurer and the Vice President for Finance and Administrative Services shall submit quarterly investment reports to the President and Board of Regents. These reports will include investment data for investment securities held at the end of the reporting period.

PROCEDURES

Specific investment procedures are contained within the full "Investment Policies and Procedures" as approved by the Board of Regents on May 14, 1994, and last revised on June 18, 2004.

Note 4. Deposits and Investments

The University currently uses commercial banks and the Commonwealth of Kentucky for its depositories. Deposits with commercial banks are covered by Federal depository insurance or collateral held by the bank in the University's name. University funds deposited with the State Treasurer are pooled with funds from other state agencies. These state pooled deposits are substantially covered by federal depository insurance or by the collateral held by the bank in the state's name. The investments of the University not held by the state investment pool are insured, registered, or held by the University or by an agent of the University.

Note 4. Deposits and Investments (Continued)

Beginning July 1, 2002, the University determined that the private donations received by Murray State University Foundation on behalf of the University were not to be recorded as assets of the University. The University will continue to report as assets those private donations received directly by the University and held by the Foundation for investment purposes. The University posts its investment earnings net of investment fees from the Foundation pool on an annual basis, at June 30 each year.

Note 5. Current Funds - Local Bank Account

Effective June 1, 2001, the University entered into a banking contract with Firstar Bank, NA of Bowling Green, Kentucky, currently US Bank. This contract stipulates that interest earnings will be based on the Federal Funds target rate less .25%.

Interest earnings may be expended in the Current Fund.

Information Technology: Acceptable Use

Section I: Access to Information Technology Facilities

Access to Information

Glossary of Terms

Governing Principles

1. In support of its essential mission to enhance educational, economic and cultural opportunities for the people of West Kentucky, Murray State University offers information technology resources to its students, faculty and staff. These resources contribute to the work of all members of the University community. They advance the scholarly pursuit of knowledge and those administrative functions necessary for the operation of the University

 Users of the University's information technology facilities are required to comply with and be subject to the MSU Information Technology Acceptable Use guidelines, University policies, and federal and state statutes. The University reserves the right to amend this document at any time without prior notice.

3. All information technology users are expected to demonstrate respect for the rights of other users and to promote fair use by all, enabling necessary access to all.

4. User access to information technology resources is contingent upon prudent and responsible use.

Authorization and Equity of Access

University information technology resources are provided to faculty, staff, and students for the purposes of study, research, service and other academic and university related activities. Access to information technology resources is granted to an individual by MSU for that individual's sole use in furthering the University's mission and purpose. Information technology resources must be shared among users in an equitable manner. The user may not participate in any behavior that unreasonably interferes with the fair use of information technology resources by another.

Acknowledgement of Receipt Authorization

Signature on an account application form, acceptance of a user ID, or online registration denotes that the applicant has read and understands the guidelines available and also denotes acceptance of this Acceptable Use document.

• Priority for Access and Resource Allocation

The priority guiding information technology access and resource allocation is teaching and learning. Service, research and administrative priorities will be determined as they support teaching and learning.

Section II: Security of University Information Technology Resources

• Protection of Information Technology Resources and Institutional Data

To protect the integrity of the University's information technology facilities and the users thereof against unauthorized or improper use of those facilities, MSU reserves the right, without notice, to temporarily limit or restrict any individual's use and to inspect, copy, remove, or otherwise alter any data, file, or system resource which may undermine the authorized use of any information technology facility.

Investigation and Review of Policy Infractions

- University sanctions are imposed by the appropriate university authority and may include, but are not limited to, limitation or revocation of access rights and/or reimbursement to the university for all costs incurred in detecting and proving the violation of these rules, as well as from the violation itself.
- 2. Users may use only those information technology resources which the University has authorized for their individual use. The unauthorized use of information technology resources or providing false or misleading information for the purpose of obtaining access to information technology facilities is prohibited and may be regarded as a criminal act and will be treated accordingly. Users may not use University information technology facilities to gain unauthorized access to other institutions, organizations, or individuals.
- 3. Failure to comply with one or more of the specific requirements of this policy may jeopardize access to or use of Murray State facilities and services and could result in a review and investigation into the identified violation.
- 4. Supervisors of systems and facilities have the authority to immediately terminate any program or access that is suspected of being inappropriate or detrimental to operations.

Control and Licensing of Software

- o All users are expected to comply with all intellectual property laws including copyright law.
 - 1. Users may not copy, distribute, display, or disclose third party proprietary software without prior authorization from the licenser. Proprietary software may not be installed on systems not properly

licensed for its use. The University does not condone or authorize the copying or possession of illegal software. University students and employees are prohibited from copying software illegally and possessing illegal copies of software, whether for course-related, job-related, or private use. Any violation of this policy is the personal responsibility of the user. The University assumes no liability for such acts.

 Any user who suspects or has knowledge of copyright or intellectual property law violations must immediately report this activity to the University Chief Information Officer. Failure to report such activity will be considered a violation of the Information Technology Acceptable Use Policy.

Individual Privacy

- O Users are authorized to access, use, copy, modify, delete or grant others access to their personal files or data, as specified in this policy. However, users are not authorized to perform any of these functions on another user's account or a University system unless specifically authorized by the account holder, job description, the Chief Information Officer or designee, or the appropriate system administrator.
 - 1. Users may not monitor other users' data communications.
 - 2. User privacy is not to be violated. However, user privacy is subject to all University policies. As such, authorized individuals may access and disseminate private information in performance of their official job duties. Unauthorized personal use of a user's private information is prohibited.
 - 3. Failure to protect the privacy of others by intentionally or unintentionally permitting access to systems or data is unacceptable. Violations of this requirement include, but are not limited to:
 - Leaving confidential or protected information on a screen where it could be viewed by unauthorized individuals
 - Giving a personal password to someone else
 - Leaving a personal password where it can easily be found
 - Allowing someone to use a system signed on under a personal password
 - Knowingly failing to report a personal password that has been used by another person, with or without permission
 - Leaving a system signed on and accessible while unattended

Confidentiality

- O The unauthorized release of any personal or confidential information may violate state and federal law and will not be tolerated. Failure to protect confidential information is unacceptable.
 - Users are responsible for their information technology accounts; they should maintain secure passwords and take precautions against unauthorized access to their information technology resources. Users may be charged with a violation if someone uses their accounts inappropriately.

General Security

o General security infractions include, but are not limited to:

1. Using information technology resources for unauthorized remote activities

2. Deliberately causing system failure, disruption, or compromising system security

3. Intentionally obscuring, changing, or forging of the date, time, physical source, logical source, or other label or header information on data or electronic communications

4. Unauthorized interception of electronically transmitted information without prior written authorization from the Chief Information Office or designee.

5. Performing an act which will adversely impact the operation of computers, terminals, peripherals, or networks. This includes, but is not limited to, tampering with components of a local area network (LAN), or the high-speed backbone network, otherwise blocking communication lines, or interfering with the operational readiness of a computer.

Section III: Ethical Practices

Expectations

All users are expected to conduct themselves in a legal, professional, fair, considerate, and ethical manner. Each individual should use equipment safely, responsibly and only for its intended function. Users should keep all equipment clean and in good operating condition.

Protection and Maintenance of Equipment

1. Protection and maintenance of equipment includes, but is not limited to:

Having only authorized staff perform installations

 Plugging all equipment into an Underwriter's Laboratory approved surge protector or uninterruptible power supply

Locating equipment according to manufacturer's specifications.
 Equipment should be protected from extreme heat or cold,

excessive humidity, smoke, dust, overloaded circuits, stressed or worn cords, or any other potentially damaging situation

Keeping food and beverages away from equipment

Scheduling routine maintenance

2. Equipment, software, tools, supplies, etc., are not to be removed from their assigned locations without authorization from the administrator responsible for those items.

3. Repair or replacement of any item damaged when used for purposes other than those related to University functions or when used without authorization will be at the user's expense. Unpaid debts incurred in this manner will be handled in accordance with the Accounting and Financial Services procedures.

Harassing, Offensive, Profane, and Abusive Material

University information technology resources may not be used in a harassing, offensive, profane, or abusive manner. The perception or reaction of affected persons is a major factor in determining if a specific action is in violation of this policy.

Commercial Use

University information technology resources may not be used for personal or commercial profit. Individuals may not use information technology resources for any commercial purpose without prior written authorization from the Chief Information Officer, or designee.

Section IV: Violations

Procedure for Reporting Violations

- Violations should be reported to the faculty/immediate supervisor of the individual, the Chief Information Officer, or the administrator responsible for the system that was breached or misused. The notified party will inform the appropriate University official. Violations may result in one or more of the following actions:
 - Verbal or written warning with reference to appropriate policy

2. Suspend access, either temporarily or permanently

3. File a formal Employee Disciplinary Report (EDR), if the individual is an employee

4. Formally submit student infractions to the Vice President for Student Affairs

5. Consult with the University Attorney and/or Public Safety, who may file civil or criminal charges.

6. Refer complaints of harassment or discrimination to the Office of Equal Opportunity.

7. For any individuals outside of the immediate University community, send a written notice of the infraction to the employer, principal, or entity that initiated access for that person

Procedure for Appeal

Appeals may be filed using existing procedures for staff, faculty, and students. All other appeals will go to the Vice President for Administrative Services for disposition.

Section V: Administration of Policy

Procedure for Development, Review and Modification of this Policy

1. The Policy Review Subcommittee of the Information Technology Advisory Committee will be a body comprised of at least four members of the larger committee in addition to the Chief Information Officer. The Policy Review Subcommittee will meet at the call of the Chief Information Officer.

2. Proposals for new policies and/or modifications to existing policies will be forwarded to the Chief Information Officer. The proposals and comments will be brought before the ITAC Policy Review Subcommittee by the Chief Information Officer.

Communication of Policy

Signature on an account application form, acceptance of a user ID, or online registration denotes that the applicant has read and understands the guidelines available and also denotes acceptance of the Information Technology Acceptable Use Policy.

Other Information Technology Policies

Departments with their own information technology labs will adhere to the same general operating guidelines as established by this policy.

Glossary of Terms

Technical Terms used in the Technology Policy

Access Rights Permission to use an MSU information technology resource according to appropriate limitations, controls, and guidelines.

Commercial purpose A goal or end involving the buying and/or selling of goods

or services for the purpose of making a profit.

Data A representation of facts, concepts, or instructions suitable for communication, interpretation, or processing by human or automatic means.

- **Disk Space Allocation** the amount of disk storage space assigned to a particular user by University Information Systems or the appropriate system administrator.
- Fair Use Use of information technology resources in accordance with this policy, within the rules of an individual MSU facility, and so as not to unreasonably interfere with the use of the same resources by others.
- File A collection of data treated as a unit.
- Inappropriate use of authority or special privilege Use of one's access right(s) or position in a manner that violates the rules of use of those privileges as specified by the Chief Information Officer, or designee, or the appropriate system administrator.
- Information Technology Resource Any information technology/network equipment, facility or service made available to users by Murray State University.
- Password A string of characters that a user must supply to meet security requirements before gaining access to a particular information technology resource.
- Prudent and Responsible Use Use of information technology resources in a manner that promotes the efficient use and security of one's own access right(s), the access rights of other users, and MSU information technology resources.
- Remote Activity Any information technology action or behavior that accesses remote site facilities via an MSU information technology resource.
- Remote Site Any information technology/network equipment, facility, or service not part of, but connected with, MSU information technology resources via a communications network.
- System Administrator Any individual authorized by the Chief Information Officer, the Provost/Vice President, or a designee to administer a particular information technology hardware system and/or its system software.
- Transmission The transfer of a signal, message, or other form of information from one location to another.
- Unauthorized Act With the exception of information technology actions or behaviors permitted in this policy, any act performed without the explicit permission of the Chief Information Officer, or designee, or the appropriate system administrator.
- Usage Record Information or data indicating the level of usage of information technology resources by a particular user.
- User Any individual -- whether student, staff, or individual external to MSU -who uses MSU information technology resources.
- User ID A character string that uniquely identifies a particular user of MSU information technology resources.

MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY ENDOWMENT MATCH PROGRAM \ 2005-06 Summary Report

This report summarizes the programmatic and financial results of the Endowment Match Program at Murray State University. Murray State University received all available State funding for the endowment match program during Fiscal Year 2003-04. No additional private matching funds were received during the reporting period. The amount of pledges outstanding remained at \$110,104 or approximately 1.3% of the required private match.

Endowment Activity

Since the Endowment Match Program's inception in 1998, two endowed chairs and four professorships have been established. During 2005-06, one endowed chair and two professorships were occupied.

The Ashland College of Education Endowed Professorship is occupied by Veronica Russell, an African American elementary school teacher. The Professorship is used to supplement her salary and to support professional development opportunities. Her current focus is facilitating university faculty and public school teachers and administrators to explore collaborative partnerships and relationships to enhance teacher-training quality. She is a Hopkinsville native and has enhanced the 2+2 program with Hopkinsville Community College and surrounding school districts. Additionally, she is involved in the planning and development of programs which will afford teacher education candidates experiences in programs demonstrating current best practices at both the university and the public school levels. Ms. Russell brings current public school experience to students in pre-service education courses in Murray and Hopkinsville. Her expertise in current practices strengthens the knowledge of best practices in reading for education candidates.

Daniel Anderson occupied the Rayburn and Nancy Spann Watkins Endowed Visiting Professorship during 2005-06. Professor Anderson received his advanced degree at Johns Hopkins University. He has published two books of poetry, January Rain (Story Line Press, 1997) and Drunk in Sunlight (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2006). He has also edited The Selected Poems of Howard Nemerov (a New York Times 2003 "Notable Book"). He has published over thirty poems in literary journals and reviews, including the prestigious Puschcart Prize-winning poem "Thorns. Thistles." and his creative works have been included in five published anthologies. Professor Anderson is considered to be one of America's foremost young poets. His professional accomplishments make him an ideal candidate to achieve the intent of the endowment to augment and support the English and Philosophy Department's Creative Writing Program. During the year Dr. Anderson taught poetry in the Creative Writing Program and also was active in advising Creative Writing students.

The Arthur J. Bauernfeind Endowed Chair in Investment Management was occupied by Dr. David Durr in 2005-2006. Dr. Durr has an excellent record in teaching, research and service and brings significant expertise in the area of financial planning. During 2005-2006 Dr. Durr served as Program Director for the CFP® Board Registered Program in Personal Financial Planning. The program serves as the foundation for "financial planning" tracks in both the finance and accounting programs. Successful completion of the program enables Murray State students to sit for the Certified Financial Planner examination.

Dr. Durr continues to promote and support the financial planning profession. He co-authored an article that was published in the <u>Journal of Financial Service Professionals</u> in 2005. He also organized and conducted an on-campus comprehensive review (72 classroom hours) for the CFP Examination. The purpose of the review was to encourage MSU faculty members, as well as Murray-area finance and accounting professionals to pursue the CFP certification, and to assist them in their pursuit. During the past year Dr. Durr also conducted financial planning weekend reviews/seminars throughout the United States (including Chicago, Memphis, New York, Pittsburgh, Dallas, Houston, Kansas City, Washington D.C., and Louisville. His involvement with investment professionals increases public awareness of Murray State University. In addition, Dr. Durr continues to develop relationships with successful, motivated individuals who may be able to help our students in the future.

Dr. Durr also served as faculty adviser for the TVA Investment Challenge portfolio. The student-managed portfolio placed first (out of the twenty-five competing schools in the TVA service region) in the three-year competition. Murray State University was awarded \$20,000 in prize money.

Dr. Durr serves the local community as well. He was a guest speaker for Community Education's Leadership Tomorrow program. During the past year he was elected Treasurer of the Murray Calloway County United Way Board.

In 2006 Dr. Durr was a recipient of the Regents Award for Teaching Excellence.

The other endowed chair and the professorships will be advertised on a case by case basis as soon as sufficient earnings have accumulated.

A total of twenty-one endowed scholarships and three mission support endowments have also been established. These results are summarized in Table 1.

Demographic Information

As Murray State attempts to fill its Chairs and Professorships with qualified candidates, it continues to make every effort to assure that qualified female and minority candidates are given due consideration for these positions once adequate earnings have accumulated. A highly focused plan has been implemented to assure that qualified minorities are aware of the opportunity to fill these positions once they are advertised. The filling of the Ashland Professorship by an African American female demonstrates the early success of these efforts. Major elements of this plan include the following.

- A member of the MSU Affirmative Action Office serves on search committees.
- African Americans are actively recruited through the Southern Regional Educational Board Minority Recruiting Office.
- Personal contacts are used to promote the positions at historically Black institutions.
- Advertisements are placed in the African American Register and <u>Black Issues in Higher Education</u>.

The relatively small number of awards given to minority recipients from these scholarship endowments likely resulted from the availability of two other major endowed scholarship funds devoted to minority students. In addition, three new sources of funds for scholarships recently became available. Awards from these other funds totaled \$307,387 and were awarded to 60 males of the following ethnicity; 44 Black, 4 White, 9 Hispanic, and 2 Asian and 1 other; and to 80 females of the following ethnicity; 59 Black, 14 Hispanic, 3 White, 3 Asian and 1 Other totaling 140 awards during 2005-06.

Because there were no new or expanded endowments during 2005-06, Table 5 data are unchanged from 2004-05.

Sources of Funds, Earnings and Expenditures

As of June 30, 2006, the total market value of the 30 endowment accounts established under the Endowment Matching Program was \$19,239,600. (Table 7). Total State Funds received equals \$8,490,787 all of which were received prior to this fiscal year. Total private gifts received as of 2005-06 equals \$8,380,683. This leaves an outstanding

balance of \$110,104 in unpaid pledges on these accounts, or approximately 1.3% of the total amount pledged. Total expenditures for endowment operations for 2004-05 equaled \$497,422.
