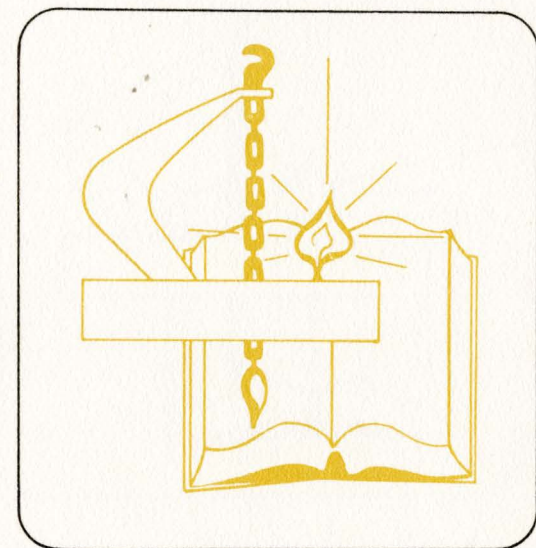

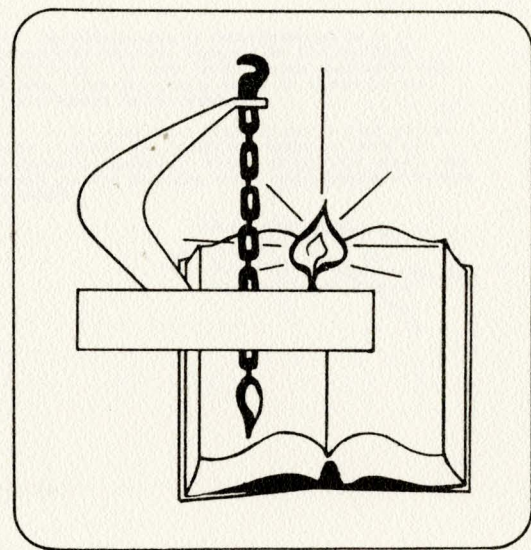


Dear Parents & Friends:
