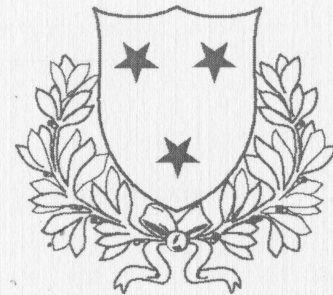

EDWARD L. THOME

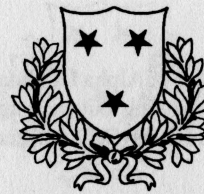
College of Science, Engineering and Technology
