Little support seen for Patton's tax proposal

State Rep. Buddy Buckingham, D-Murray, is very blunt when assessing Kentucky Gov. Paul Patton's chances of getting the state legislature to go along with his proposal of a \$570 million tax hike in the state's next budget.

"I see no support for his tax plan at this point," he said Friday. "I can't imagine some of the things he came out with."

Patton is scheduled to deliver a budget address to the General Assembly Wednesday, but he revealed his plan is to ask for the tax increase this week. The legislature is scheduled to reconvene Tuesday,

while organizational meetings will be held Monday.

Sen. Bob Jackson echoed Buckingham's opinion, stating earlier in the week that he still believes the legislature will be able to make more cuts in order to make up the nearly \$400 million shortfall the state's budget is facing.

"Right now, it's highly unlikely any significant revenue will be raised through tax

increases," Jackson, D-Murray, said. "I think the sentiment right now is to cut government as much as we can. I think we can make up all of the shortfall by being prudent in this manner."

What Patton is actually planning to do is to ask that over \$500 million in tax cuts be restored. Even with that in mind, though, programs such as Medicaid, which has a \$4 billion per year budget, are still being eyed for

cuts.

Buckingham said the tax that is most likely to be raised is the state's cigarette tax, which at 3 cents per pack is the second-lowest in the nation. Other revenue sources that have been mentioned in the past, such as raising the state's gas tax or establishing gambling at Kentucky's horse racing tracks, do not appear to be headed anywhere.

"The cuts we make from here on out will be noticeable," Jackson said. "We can't just focus on one area."

Buckingham said that even though Patton's tax proposal has been met almost universally with scorn, the governor is doing the best he can in a difficult situation.

Group spotlights obesity concerns

Childhood obesity has become a highly discussed subject across the nation and many educators, parents and lawmakers want to find ways to promote healthy eating in children.

That effort has struck on a local level as a local task force was recently organized by representatives from both school districts and local health educators to find ways to effectively promote healthy eating and living a healthy lifestyle to school age children.

"There's been a lot of attention given to obesity," said YMCA director and representative Jean Masthay. "If we start those habits young, it can establish those habits later on."

Lt. Gov. Steve Henry recently released information supporting HB-77, which is a plan to reduce obesity in Kentucky schools. The bill calls for a ban on soft drinks during the school day in elementary and middle schools and limits sales in high school to afternoons. Healthy beverages such as milk and juice will be sold as alternatives.

Sales of chewing gum and candy would also be banned and foods that could be sold after lunch would be limited to foods containing no more than six grams of fat and no more than 40 percent sugar by weight.

Center for Health and Wellness representative Keena Miller said one of the features of the task force is to support HB-77. She also said the group recently held a strategic planning meeting to discuss how they plan to approach the situation and have set about putting together a two-year strategy.

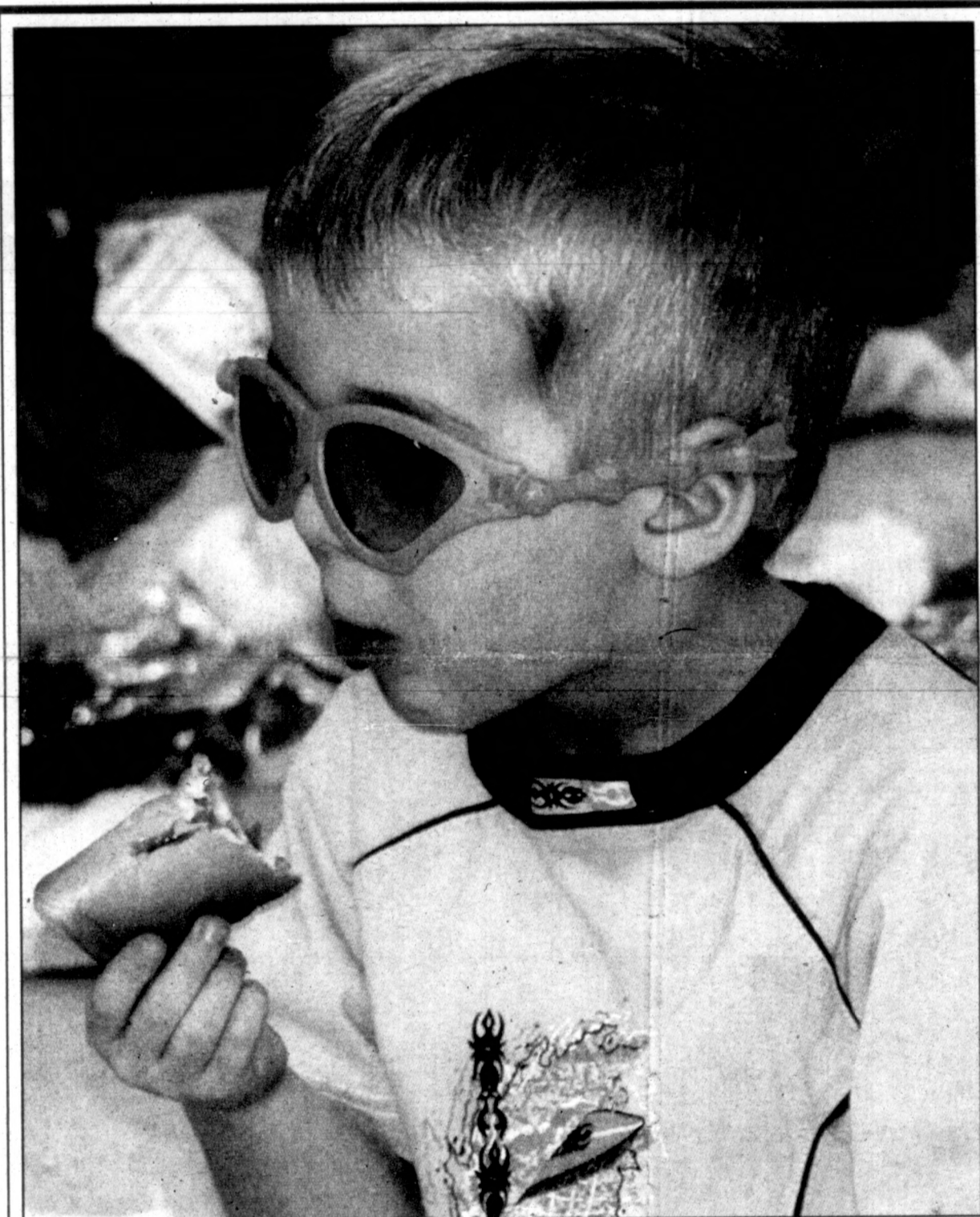
One of the areas the group wants to focus on is determining alternative rewards programs for teachers instead of using food or parties to reward achievement. The task force is also focusing on student influence and is choosing student representatives to sit on the task force.

"If peers are involved with something that can make a difference, they get others involved," Masthay said.

Miller said she doesn't necessarily believe all sweet treats should be eliminated from a child's life, but moderation is key.

"I think children need help with moderation," she said. "I think there are some better alternatives to

Deadline extended for foreign student data

MIAMI (AP) — Immigration officials pushed back a deadline on compiling information on foreign college students after schools complained that an Internet database created to collect the data has been working slowly, if at all.

The Immigration and Naturalization Service gave the nation's colleges and universities until Feb. 15 to begin feeding personal and academic information about their foreign students into the database.

The deadline, originally set for Thursday, was delayed to give schools time to make sure their computers can communicate with

INS equipment.

By the new deadline, about 3,000 schools need to be ready to start supplying data to the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System, which is meant to replace the paper-based system the INS has used for years to track foreign students.

Officials at several colleges say they've had difficulties with the database.

"There were certainly indications there were problems that were cropping up. This is a way to afford those schools two more weeks to work through those issues," INS spokesman Chris Bentley said.

Software adjustments at Miami's Florida International University mean it cannot begin submitting information for its 3,300 international students until next week. Georgetown University in Washington and the University of Cincinnati had not been able to access the system until Thursday.

The INS has had a mandate to create a computerized system since 1996, and the long-delayed project was accelerated after the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks. One of the hijackers had entered the United States on a student visa.

Attorney says interview wrecks Conner credibility

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Gov. Paul Patton's lawyer said Friday that a television interview featuring Tina Conner "totally destroys" the credibility of the governor's one-time mistress.

In the interview, Conner contradicts earlier statements about when her extramarital affair with Patton started and who was the pursuer.

The interview took place last November but first aired Thursday night on WHAS-TV, after Patton's attorney requested the tape.

Sheryl Snyder, Patton's lawyer, said he wants to use the taped interview to "nail down her story" when Conner gives a deposition in preparation for a trial on her lawsuit against Patton.

Snyder said the tape is "a great

piece of evidence for us." "It totally destroys her credibility," he said. "It is a graphic, if not profane, admission that she was the pursuer."

Conner has said her two-year affair with Patton began in 1997, and that the governor was the aggressor in the relationship.

Conner and her attorney claim her taped comments were made in jest.

Conner laughed during much of the interview with a WHAS-TV reporter, and is caught on tape saying, "I'm having fun with him."

Her lawyer, Fred Radolovich, said Friday that the interview shouldn't affect the outcome of what remains of her suit against Patton.

North Korea vows to resist U.S. pressure

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — North Korea on Friday launched a nationwide campaign promoting hatred of the United States, while American officials said there were signs the North was preparing to produce nuclear weapons.

An envoy from North Korea said earlier his country will negotiate only with the United States to end the standoff over the communist nation's nuclear program, rejecting the idea of multilateral talks.

Ignoring international pressure to quickly ease the crisis, North Korean leader Kim Jong Il inspected a military unit on Friday.

Kim was "greatly satisfied to see all the servicemen trained as indomitable fighters capable of wiping out the aggressors by resolute and merciless blows," said a report by the North's state-run KCNA news agency. The North's 1.1-million-member military is the world's fifth-largest.

Meanwhile, posters promoting confrontation with the United States went up on the walls of North Korean cities and villages, and writers penned poems to rouse the peo-

ple for a "sacred battle to annihilate the enemies," KCNA said.

"I shout," and "We put the U.S. imperialists to death," were among poems lauding the communist state's Jan. 10 decision to quit the Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty, it said.

In Washington, officials speaking Friday on condition of anonymity said U.S. intelligence has detected substantial activity at North Korea's once-shuttered nuclear facility.

American spy satellites have detected covered trucks apparently taking on cargo at the nuclear storage facility at Yongbyon, where spent nuclear fuel rods are stored, the U.S. officials said. Enough plutonium could be extracted from the 8,000 rods to make four or five nuclear weapons, U.S. officials have said.

North Korea took its first steps to reactivate Yongbyon last fall after Washington and its allies suspended oil shipments to North Korea, which in turn expelled U.N. nuclear inspectors and pulled out of a global nuclear arms control treaty.

Gunman surrenders after Miami mail carrier held hostage

MIAMI (AP) — A gunman seized a mail truck Friday and forced the postal carrier to lead police on a 90-minute low-speed chase through the streets of Miami before he finally released his hostage and surrendered.

Surrounded by heavily armed police, the gunman backed slowly out of the truck with his hands over his head, ending a five-hour drama that was covered by TV helicopters and broadcast nationally.

Miami-Dade County police chief Carlos Alvarez said officials were in constant communication with the gunman, identified as Nevía Abraham.

"He was just rambling, he wasn't making any demands," Alvarez said.

Abraham, 38, released mail carrier Tanya Mitchell about an hour before he gave up, police said. Mitchell, apparently unharmed, climbed out of the truck and ran to police.

The chase began after Abraham seized the mail truck and fled, firing shots at pursuing officers, Miami-Dade County police Detective

Randy Rossman said. Police said Abraham was armed with two guns.

A second man, Jonathan Hamilton, 47, was also arrested.

Officials said Abraham would be charged with attempted murder, kidnapping and armed robbery, while Hamilton is facing armed robbery charges.

As the truck wound its way through the city's streets with the hijacker inside, more than a dozen police cruisers chased it.

Police eventually stopped the truck by placing spikes in the road to flatten its tires.

The truck stopped in a busy intersection, and Mitchell was then moved to the back of the truck. Police said Abraham partially blocked the passenger window with mail.

Police later sent a remote-controlled robot to the gunman a phone.

After a standoff of more than two hours, Mitchell climbed out.

Patton: No more inmate releases

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Gov. Paul Patton said Friday he will end the early release of prison inmates in the expectation that the General Assembly will add to prison funding this year.

If legislators fail to shore up the corrections budget, Patton said he will face no other choice but to resume the early inmate release, implicitly laying the burden on lawmakers.

Nearly 900 inmates were released several months before the end of their sentences starting in December to try to keep the prison budget intact. At least four of those inmates have been arrested for crimes allegedly committed right after their release and the news coverage of those incidents has brought home what Patton said is the pain of budget cuts.

In two noteworthy instances in western Kentucky, one inmate was arrested and charged with robbing several banks, while another inmate this week was charged with a rape that allegedly occurred three days after he was released on Jan. 20.

Patton said he sympathizes with the victims, but noted that a third of all inmates released at the end of their sentences also commit new crimes. While such incidents are regrettable, Patton said they were expected and he had to act to bring the budget in line and he does not regret the early release.

"I believe the General Assembly is now ready to fully fund our prison system no matter what it takes," Patton said during a hastily called news conference.

It will take \$2.25 million more this fiscal year and \$9.5 million more during the year that starts July 1 to pay for prison operations. Patton said he will propose a tax increase of about \$570 million a year to finance all the state's budget

problems. "Everything I've heard so far about that proposal is that it is dead on arrival in the General Assembly," Patton said.

But without new money, there will be widespread incidences of state government shutdowns, from early inmate releases to closed state parks, lack of foster care and teachers not rehired, Patton said.

"Would that be pain enough to cause the legislature to act? I hope so because those are the choices we face," Patton said.

The release of 883 inmates has been roundly criticized by legislators, law enforcement and a number of gubernatorial candidates. Few of them have offered realistic alternatives for finding the money to pay to house the inmates.

Patton said he was taken by surprise with the swirl of publicity about the inmate release and some of the subsequent offenses. He said it will be incumbent on the news

media to give equal treatment when people lose Medicaid benefits because of budget cuts and suffer catastrophic illnesses without treatment.

"This is a difficult problem. It can't be solved based on emotion or by trading sound bites," Patton said.

Attorney General Ben Chandler, one of the gubernatorial hopefuls, filed suit to try to block the second release, even if it was done after the inmates were gone. A hearing is scheduled in that lawsuit next week.

Chandler said he would put the lawsuit on hold unless Patton resumes the early release of prisoners.

Chandler's office released a statement that said Patton agreed with him about stopping inmate releases.

Patton said he anticipated that Chandler would try to take some credit for his decision, but added the attorney general "had nothing to do with it."

Schools must provide information on the academic, personal and financial status of foreign-born students and their dependents. Colleges must also provide data on any disciplinary action, off-campus employment and whether the student has dropped below a full course of study.

The grace period applies only to newly enrolled international students. The deadline for foreign students already enrolled was Aug. 1.

About 583,000 foreign students were enrolled in the United States in 2001-02, according to the Institute of International Education.

The University of Akron has been online with the Web-based system for more than a month, said Mark Rubin, director of international and comparative programs.

"It works OK, the only problem is it's very slow," he said. "Just getting the Web site to do anything —

put in those vending machines."

One of the main concerns about the monitoring of sweets at school is how it will effect student fundraisers. Masthay said almost every school service needs fundraisers and most of those services use food based fundraisers.

She said the schools will have to discuss several alternative fundraising ideas. "It really becomes more complicated. There is no easy solution."

Further task force meetings are open to anyone concerned with childhood obesity.

"It's an open task force," Masthay said. "Anyone that wants to be involved can."

"Obviously, to the governor's people this is a smoking gun," Radolovich said. "To me, it's not even a bullet."

Franklin County Circuit Judge

Roger Crittenden has dismissed most of Conner's allegations that Patton improperly abused his office in helping and harming her business as a result of their affair.

The remaining allegation is that Patton's conduct was outrageous and intentionally inflicted emotional distress upon her.

Radolovich said the remaining claims deal with the conduct of Patton and state agencies under his control after the affair ended.

Conner claims her nursing home was hounded into bankruptcy by state regulators unleashed by Patton after she ended their affair.

Snyder said the tape belies those claims of emotional distress, noting that Conner appears jovial, not stressed.

"The tape shows that she was the aggressor, not him, and she's clearly not suffering from any emotional distress from having had the relationship with him," Snyder said.

Snyder renewed his request Friday for the tape.

"It's really hard to second-guess his thinking on this," Buckingham said. "I think the governor has always been dedicated to improving the quality of life in Kentucky, and I can't fault him for that."

The legislature could have a working budget document prepared by the end of next week, according to Buckingham, though the process will almost certainly be a difficult one, Jackson said.

"It's going to be a very different session. It's probably going to be the hardest one anybody in the legislature's ever had to deal with," he said.

Scott Diener, news director at WHAS-TV, said Friday the station won't voluntarily turn over the tape. If Snyder obtains a subpoena seeking the tape, the station will "make a decision at that time," Diener said.

The tape went unaired for months because "we were not certain what relevance it had at that time," Diener said.

"Once the governor's attorney made a request for it and indicated that there was some significance to it for their case, we went ahead and decided to run the tape," he said.

The impromptu interview occurred in a parking lot across the street from Radolovich's law office in Louisville.

In it, Conner was asked why she received special Medicaid payments in 1996 for her nursing home. Conner looked around her and laughed before responding. One word of her response was bleeped out when aired, but it was apparent that Conner said she got the money because she was having sex with Patton.

When the reporter noted the con-

tradition about when the affair started, Conner replied, "I was working on it." Then she laughed again.

Radolovich said Conner's remarks were the result of stress and fatigue. She had spent most of the day dealing with the case against Patton and her failing nursing home in Clinton in far western Kentucky.

"When someone is tired, I find they sometimes say and do things that they would not ordinarily say and do," Radolovich said.

Radolovich said he has his own videotape to use against Patton that shows the governor denying the affair. Patton later tearfully confessed to the tryst, but denies using his influence to harm Conner's nursing home.

"I can tell you, those tapes are going to be played again and again, ad nauseum, because that shows his ilk," Radolovich said.

As for Conner, who lost control of her nursing home, she is looking for work as a nurse, Radolovich said.

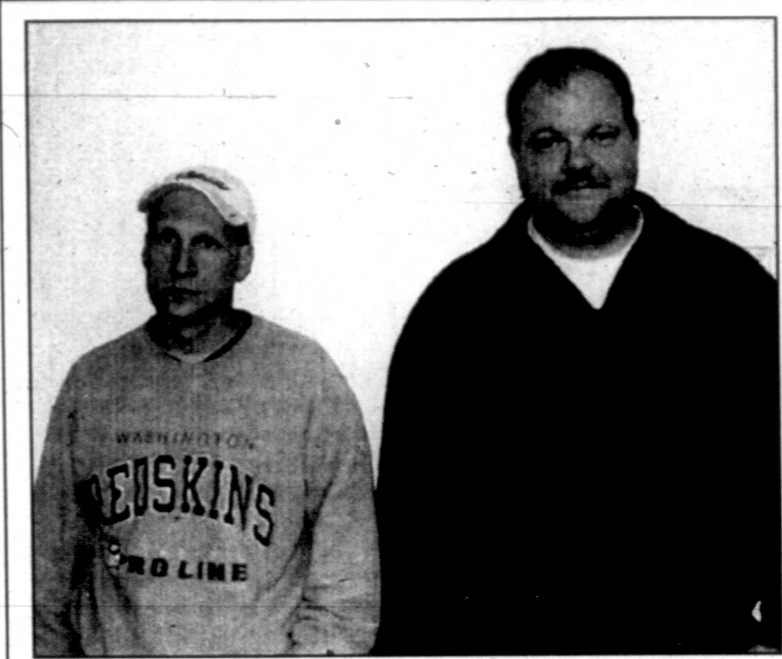

Murray Head Start gets federal grant for classrooms

WASHINGTON — U.S. Rep. Ed Whitfield, R-Ky., announced Thursday that the Murray Board of Education has been awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for \$252,910. The grant money will be used to renovate and improve five Head Start classrooms.

"I am very pleased these funds have been awarded to the Murray Head Start program," Whitfield said. "Early childhood education is one of the key building blocks for a child's development."

Head Start and Early Head Start are comprehensive child development programs that serve children from birth to age 5, pregnant women, and their families. They are

child-focused programs and have the overall goal of increasing the school readiness of young children from lower-income families.

Soldiers killed in Afghanistan crash identified as Fort Campbell elite

FORT CAMPBELL, Ky. (AP) — The four soldiers killed in a helicopter crash in Afghanistan were all members of an elite aviation regiment based at Fort Campbell, military officials said Friday.

The 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment — known as the Night Stalkers — was one of the first units deployed to fight in Operation Enduring Freedom, America's war on terrorism.

"These men gave their lives in the defense of freedom, doing what they loved most, flying with the 160th," Lt. Col. Emmett Shaffer, the regiment's deputy commander, said Friday. "I ask for your prayers, both for those we have lost, and those who continue our mission."

The four soldiers were identified as Chief Warrant Officer Mark S. O'Steen, 43, of Alabama; Chief Warrant Officer Thomas J. Gibbons, 31, of Maryland; Staff Sgt. Daniel L. Kising Jr., 31, Missouri; and Sgt. Gregory M. Frampton, 37, of California. Hometowns were not released, but family members said Kising was originally from Neosho, Mo.

The special operations helicopter went down Thursday night seven miles east of the Bagram Air Base while on a training mission. The cause was under investigation.

It was the deadliest day for the American military in Afghanistan since March 4, when seven soldiers were killed and 11 wounded at the outset of Operation Anaconda against remnant Taliban and al-Qaida forces.

O'Steen and Gibbons were pilots. Kising and Frampton were maintenance crewmen.

Kising, the crew chief, is survived by a wife, Georgie, who is pregnant, and three children ranging in age from 13 to 3. The family lives at Fort Campbell, said Kising's brother-in-law, Jon McNeill, 40, of Windsor.

"He was an excellent husband, father and brother-in-law," McNeill said. "He was well liked by everybody."

McNeill said his sister and Kising began dating in high school in Neosho, Mo. — where Kising's parents, Daniel and Velinda, still live. Kising joined the Army eight

years ago, said Rep. Roy Blunt, R-Mo., in a statement.

"Sadly, we are reminded again of the great cost American families must bear to assure the way of life and the freedoms we enjoy," Blunt said. "My prayers are with the Kising family as they try to cope with their great loss of Daniel."

Kising had been in the United States for Christmas and had returned to Afghanistan less than a month ago for his second assignment to the country since the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks, McNeill said.

As a crew chief, McNeill said Kising was responsible for maintaining the helicopter. McNeill said the family knew only sketchy details about Kising's work and where he was stationed because he was in special operations.

"He loved his job," McNeill said. "He was 200 percent Army."

The 160th, based at Fort Campbell on the Tennessee border, slips special forces commandos behind enemy lines.

It earned the nickname Night Stalkers because of its ability to

strike — often using night vision technology — undetected in darkness and extreme conditions.

"Our mission as soldiers is inherently dangerous," Shaffer said. "It does not make our loss easier, but it is a reality that we face every day."

Nine other Night Stalkers have died in America's war on terrorism since Sept. 11, 2001.

One died in the March 4 battle. The others were killed Feb. 22 when their helicopter crashed during counterterrorism exercises with Philippine troops.

By interpreting instead of merely counting, the better sociologists of religion in America imitate better European scholars such as Max Weber (whose book on the Protestant

combine and continue their earlier interests and studies in "generations" and "congregations.")

The duo-team focuses on three major groups of Americans (with some subtle and sub-category emendations) Pre-Boomers (those of us born before 1946), Boomers (those born between 1946 and 1964) and Generation X-ers (those born from 1965 to 1980). (There is obviously a missing group here: those born since 1980, essentially today's "youth group".)

Studying assorted churches, Carroll and Roof find some churches are dominantly tradition or heritage-oriented and are dominated by pre-boomers and traditional practices, some are oriented to the boomer generation and some are catering to Generation X-ers, and especially that many churches have a mixture of practices and a diversity fostered by sensitivity to two or three generations.

Their taxonomy of generations and congregations is enormously useful for studying any particular religious denomination or any particular congregation. One can use the categories, as do I, for interpreting assorted religions in a college seminar on Religion in America, but a pastor and his or her lay leaders can use them for defining a particular congregation's mission and programs.

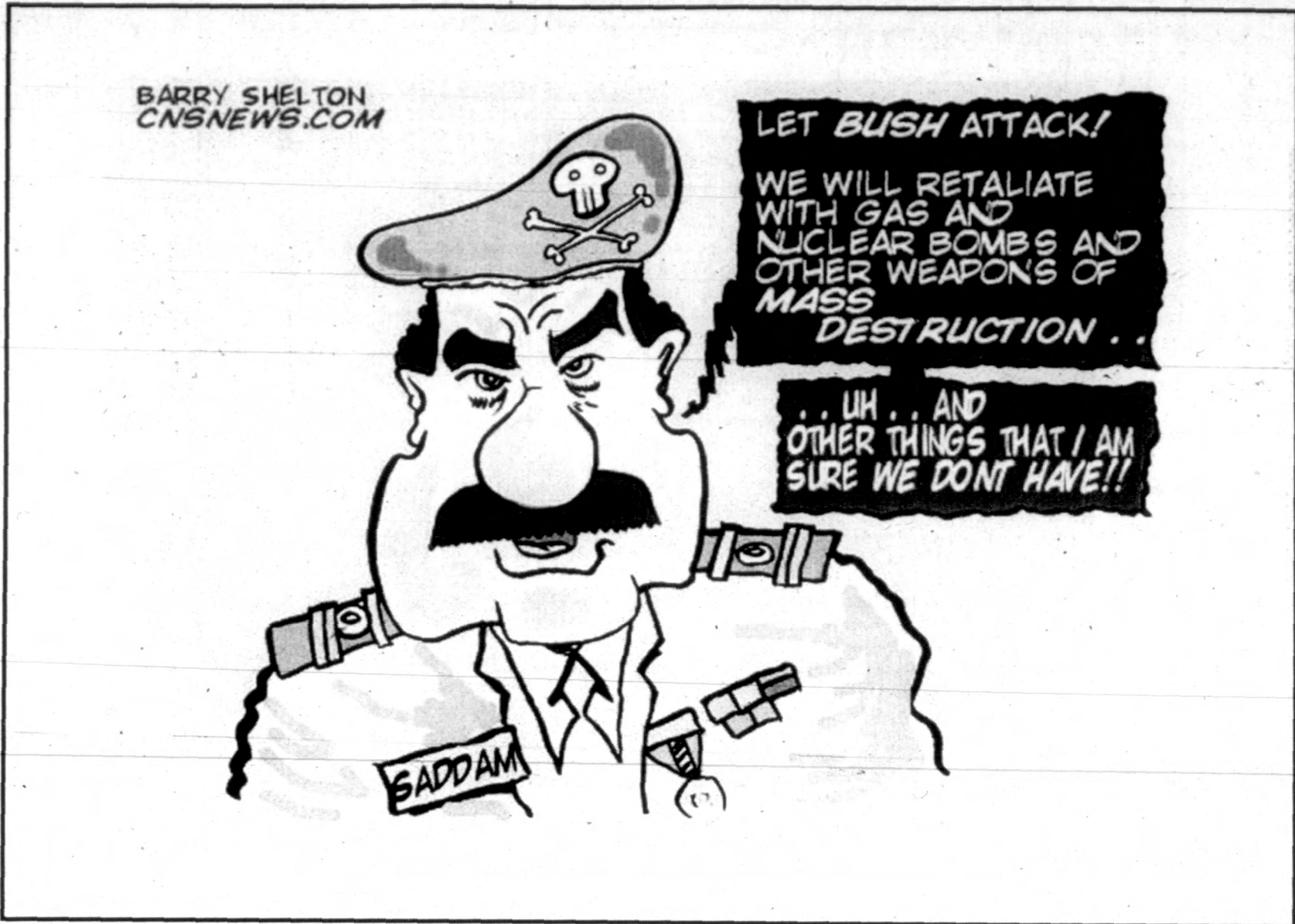
With enormously depressing statistics of declines in church participation among both Boomers and Generation X-ers (especially the younger group), churches must face up to and counter generational differences in beliefs and styles and interests.

That may mean, as it does in case studies in this Carroll-Roof book, that churches move to having several services for several constituencies with radical differences in sermons, music, time, dress codes, and location. Or it may mean that a church elects to direct its attentions to one generation only: accepting the dying out as members die off if that focus is on the pre-boomer generation, or accepting the necessity of unique and different forms of study and worship and service if the focus is on Generation X-ers.

Holding a church together in the midst of generational differences in background, interests, beliefs and practices is a daunting responsibility for ministers, elders and deacons and lay leaders, denominational bodies and seminaries. Unless we are willing to live with limited churches, trisected into three generational groups, we must tackle the more difficult task of combining and blending traditional and new, old and young, and English-language and multilingual members. The middle-aged and young generations are great challenges.

List remembers vets not on the wall

WASHINGTON (AP) — Christopher Wilkinson held his wife's hand as he died of lung cancer in a Minnesota hospital room, 27 years and 8,000 miles away from the war in Vietnam.

Carl Auel flipped his car in a ditch along a Virginia backroad and died in a coma two weeks later, ending years of nightmares about Vietnam that pushed the retired Navy chaplain to drink.

Frank Nichols hanged himself in 1977, eight years after returning to Kentucky with a Bronze Star and two Purple Hearts.

Despite the years and distance, each man's family considers him a casualty of war. But none of their names appear on the black granite wall in Washington honoring the war's official dead. For these others, there is a little-known remembrance — a roll of names kept inside the park rangers' kiosk near the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

Few visitors see the list. There's no sign; some rangers don't even know it's there. But those who ask the right person are handed a slim, gray binder with 801 names and snapshots of shirtless young soldiers, middle-aged men in business suits, veterans posed somberly before the wall.

Family members will read those names on April 21, the 10th anniversary of what began as a grass-roots movement to publicly recognize deaths that might otherwise go overlooked.

"People see the wall and think that's all the casualties, but it's not. That war really isn't over," said Linda Wilkinson of Inver Grove Heights, Minn. She blames exposure to defoliants for her husband's death in 1998 at age 50.

The American Battle Monuments Commission is finishing plans for a granite marker to be installed near the wall as early as this year honoring, without naming, those "who served in the Vietnam War and later died as a result of their service."

Meanwhile, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, keeper of the wall and the list, is seeking more names from veterans' families for inclusion on the "In Memory" list.

Death certificates and military records must be submitted by Feb. 28 to qualify for this year's ceremony, said Holly Rotondi, who reviews the applications.

It's impossible to say to what degree wartime service should be blamed in deaths years later. If a family makes a reasonable case, the name is accepted, Rotondi said.

Fifty-four names were added last year, the first time the memorial

fund publicized the search. Rotondi said. She hopes for more nominations as word spreads; no one knows how many thousands might be eligible.

Many on the list died from cancers the government presumes are related to Agent Orange, which was used to clear jungle growth that provided cover for the enemy. Others were victims of post-traumatic stress disorder, through suicide, drug abuse or alcoholism.

And there are civilians and soldiers who died during the war but don't meet Defense Department criteria as war casualties. Reflecting those rules, the wall of 58,229 names is reserved for service members who died of wounds sustained in the combat zone or in direct support of combat.

The "In Memory" list tells many other stories:

• Johnny Bower of Costa Mesa, Calif., died in the April 1966 crash of a charter plane transporting soldiers to Fort Benning, Ga., for training before deployment to Vietnam.

—Michael Murphy, a civilian from Seward, Alaska, was killed in a Viet Cong ambush in 1968, while working for the U.S. Agency of International Development. Civilians aren't included on the wall.

• Elmo Zumwalt III, patrol boat

commander and son of the well-known admiral who ordered spraying of Agent Orange along Vietnam waterways, died of lymphoma in August 1988. Zumwalt and his father blamed the cancer on Agent Orange in their joint memoir, "My Father, My Son."

• Lewis B. Puller Jr. lost his legs to a land mine and wrote a Pulitzer Prize-winning account of his long struggle with pain, addiction and despair. The son of legendary Lt. Gen. Lewis "Chesty" Puller, the most decorated soldier in Marine Corps history, shot himself in the head in May 1994.

As for Wilkinson, his decision to enlist in the Army at age 19 caused a lifetime estrangement from his brother Alex, a war protester. They reconciled in the hospital two days before his death.

Auel, a Lutheran minister from Purcellville, Va., comforted scared and dying men in Vietnam. But he couldn't quell the flashbacks that began consuming his own mind two decades after the war. His drunken driving accident came in 1997, when he was 67.

"He helped so many people," said daughter Juliana Auel. "By the time it got to him, he didn't have anything left for himself."

Another Opinion

Let's make sure we know where a "quantum leap" may take us. Gov. Paul Patton recently proposed revenue increases of \$500 million, largely through a "business activity tax" that would replace the current corporate income tax and license fee.

Gov. Patton described his idea of higher business taxes as a chance for Kentucky to "make a quantum leap" past states that decide to retrench in bad economic times, the alternative being to make deep cuts in state government, including health care and possibly education.

Except for those paying these new taxes, the prospect seems attractive, even tempting.

We see both sides of the argument. The maze of provisions in the current corporate income tax statutes makes the system rife with loopholes and inequities.

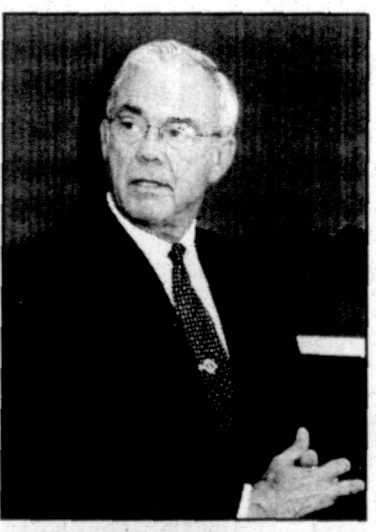
But the economic pulse of this state, however inconsistent and sluggish it may be now, is due in large part by the state's thousands of large and small businesses. Higher corporate taxes even though fair, inevitably will drive some of these firms (and their jobs) from the state and the tax rolls.

Gov. Patton will formally address the tax issue Feb. 5 when the General Assembly returns to Frankfort to resume its 30-day ses-

sion. More details will be massaged between now and then.

These economic times would benefit from bold, carefully thought-out and diversified plans.

Before we go gnawing on the hand that feeds us, let's be sure it is the best route.

Second, here are some practical suggestions. You may be able to spark your husband's interest in food by preparing meals that you, by experience, know he likes...

I'm sure your husband's physician can give you other, more cogent suggestions — and he should be able to coordinate the services your husband needs...

I can think of only a few diseases (such as Alzheimer's dementia and others) that equal stroke in terms of total disruption, monumental handicap and emotional exhaustion for caregivers...

The bidding: West North East South. Pass Pass Pass 1. 2 Pass 3 Pass 4. Opening lead — king of diamonds.

The ability to deduce how the unseen cards are divided plays an enormous role in the outcome of many deals. Declarer can occasionally perform seemingly miraculous feats by visualizing the kind of hand a particular defender has and in that way land a contract that might otherwise fail.

If he adopts the most obvious line of play, he draws trumps and attempts both a spade finesse and a club finesse. Unfortunately, both lose, and South goes down one.

After drawing trumps, declarer's correct play is to lead a low club from dummy! First, let's examine the effect of this play as the cards lie. If East rises with the king, South no longer needs to risk a spade finesse...

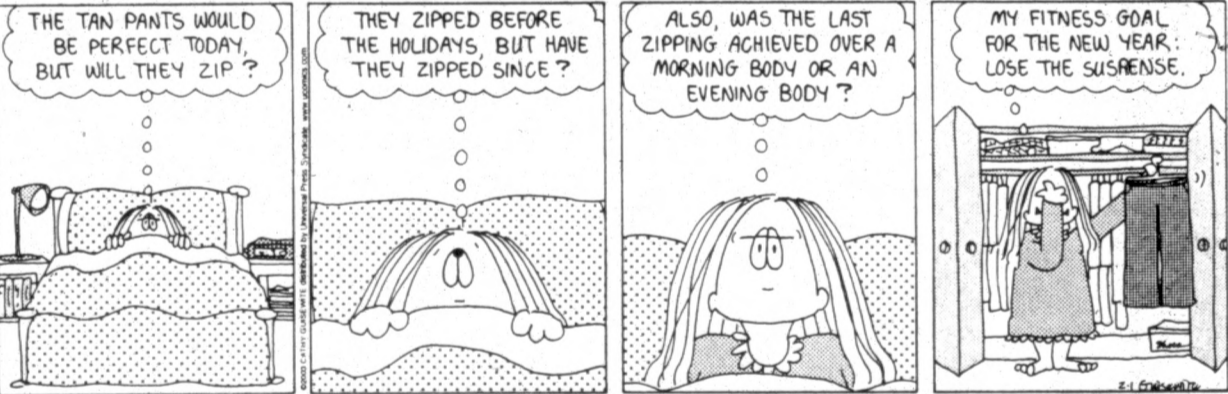
The suggested approach is entirely reasonable, because after West shows up with the A-K of diamonds, he cannot also have both black kings or he would have opened the bidding as dealer.

Methodist bishop part of new anti-war commercial

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — A high-ranking United Methodist official will appear in a 30-second commercial aimed at persuading the nation's policy-makers that a U.S. attack on Iraq would violate "God's law."

Among those Bishop Melvin Talbert hopes to reach: President Bush, a United Methodist.

"Iraq hasn't wronged us," said Talbert, who joined a 13-person delegation of religious leaders on a five-day peace mission to Iraq that ended Jan. 3. "War will only create more terrorists."

Sponsored by the National Council of Churches, the "Why

Rush to War?" commercial was expected to be broadcast beginning yesterday to New York and Washington viewers of the CNN and Fox cable news networks, said Stephen Drachler, a United Methodist spokesman in Nashville.

"It basically raises the issue of letting the inspectors do their work," said Bob Edgar, the National Council of Churches' general secretary and a former Democratic congressman from Pennsylvania.

Edgar said he and Talbert returned from Iraq "convinced more than ever that war is not necessary and that dialogue and negotiation and diplomatic means can deal with the issues of Iraq short of war."

The commercial begins with a

warning that some scenes may not be suitable for children. Actress Janeane Garofalo suggests that up to a half-million people could be killed or wounded if the United States invades Iraq.

"Do we have the right to do that to a country that's done nothing to us?" Garofalo asks.

"No nation under God has that right," Talbert responds. "It violates international law. It violates God's law."

Richard Land, president of the Southern Baptist Convention's Ethics and Religious Liberty Commission, took issue with the commercial.

"No. 1, there are not going to be a half-million killed if we invade

Iraq unless Saddam unleashes weapons of mass destruction, which he denies he has," Land said. "No. 2, if we don't deal with Iraq now, there'll be far more loss of human life later when we have to deal with a nuclear-armed Saddam."

TrueMajority, an advocacy organization started by Ben and Jerry's co-founder Ben Cohen, produced the commercial. Cohen said his organization tried to buy a spot to air the commercial nationally on CNN's "Early King Live" but was told the network wasn't running ads for or against the war.

"We find that absurd because most of their news coverage is Bush promoting the war," Cohen said.

Talbert, former bishop of Seattle

and San Francisco, teaches at Vanderbilt University Divinity School in Nashville. He's the chief ecumenical officer of the United Methodist Church, which has an estimated 8.4 million U.S. members.

At a news conference Tuesday night, Talbert said the denomination "has a position clearly condemning war."

"Because the president is a United Methodist, it's important for us to make it very clear where our church stands on this issue," he said.

"The teachings of Jesus would suggest that the first step to bringing about a resolution ... would be to talk about what we can do to love each other. 'Love your enemies and do good to those who spitefully use

you."

Talbert said he traveled to Iraq to get a human face on the nation.

"Too often, the only image we get about Iraq is Hussein standing with a rifle," he said.

In visits to churches, mosques, hospitals and schools in Iraq, Talbert said he heard a "resounding cry from people raising the question, 'Why?' Why would a big nation like this want to pounce on a little nation like that?"

"They are expecting bombs and everything to kill them and they want to know why."

Heather Schroeder gains child care credential

Married couple could soon lead troops

FORT CAMPBELL, Ky. (AP) — Lt. Col. Laura Richardson flies Black Hawk helicopters. Her husband, Lt. Col. Jim Richardson, flies Apaches.

If deployed to Iraq, the two could make Army history as the first husband and wife to command battalions in the same brigade task force. But they say the novelty is lost on them. They've been working together in the Army for 16 years.

Teamwork has been key to their relationship — at home and while flying together on missions, the Richardsons say. They are preparing now, if deployment orders come, to apply it in the Mideast.

"He tells what he knows, and I tell him what I know," said Laura Richardson, 39, standing outside a flight simulator at Fort Campbell where she rehearses flying helicopters under extreme conditions.

"It works," said Jim Richardson, 42. "We pick up on each other's strengths and weaknesses."

Laura Richardson commands the 5th Battalion of the 101st Airborne Division's Aviation Brigade. He commands the brigade's 3rd Battalion.

The 101st, based at Fort Campbell on the Tennessee border, is a rapid-deployment division trained to go anywhere in the world in 36 hours. Shots fired from a 101st Apache helicopter started the 1991 Persian Gulf War.

The Richardsons — she is a native of Denver, he of Myrtle Beach, S.C. — met in a hallway at Fort Rucker, Ala. She was there for flight training. He was taking an advanced flying course. They married about a year later on Nov. 25, 1987.

Their 14-year-old daughter, Lauren, was born while they were stationed in South Korea during the first 4 1/2 years of their marriage.

Wed 16 years, they've only been separated for two six-month stints. The first was while she was an aide to then-Vice President Al Gore. The second was when he flew Apaches in Afghanistan, returning in August.

"The Army has really done a fabulous job of keeping us together," Jim Richardson said.

If the two deploy, Lauren — a varsity basketball player — will go live with Laura's parents in Denver. Over the years, the two have prepared her for the possibility that both her parents could go to war.

"I think she's a little nervous

about it, but she's a pretty independent, flexible-type kid," Laura Richardson said.

Both said they do not worry about the other deploying, partly because they have confidence in the training they have received.

"I'm not really concerned because she has 350 soldiers to take care of her," Jim Richardson said.

While Jim commanded troops in Afghanistan, Laura led a family readiness group at home made up of family members on the homefront.

In that capacity, Laura said she learned then the importance of getting information back home as quickly as possible. She witnessed how much each family member worried at any news report about a helicopter crash or other incident.

She said her presence as a wife and officer helped some family members who thought the military might not have been giving them all the information available.

"I think it added some credibility actually that may not have been there before," Laura Richardson said.

She said as a woman in the Army she's never faced discrimination, that the commanders she's had over the years — all men — were fair.

They both said they are surprised how much attention they have garnered recently because of the possibility of their command positions in Iraq. They are used to flying and working together.

"It's not new to us," Laura Richardson said. "We've done it since we've been in the Army."

Group says teacher shortage misdiagnosed

WASHINGTON (AP) — All the talk about America's short supply of teachers misses the point, says a privately funded group dedicated to improving teaching in the country's schools. The real problem is keeping teachers in the classroom.

Increasingly states are lowering standards, scrapping training and ignoring laws in favor of stopgap hiring, the National Commission on Teaching and America's Future said in a report released Wednesday. Such shortcuts only backfire and drive teachers off, it says.

"We haven't been focusing in the right place," said Jim Hunt, the commission chairman and former four-term governor of North Carolina.

"We get all hot and bothered at the beginning of the school year when we don't have enough good teachers," Hunt said.

"In fact, the year before we should have been focusing on improving working conditions in the school, having greater career opportunities for teachers, having the right pay for them, showing the right kind of appreciation."

Because the teacher staffing

problem has been defined the wrong way, the commission says, the solutions have been wrong, too. The group aims to change the debate as federal and state leaders seek ways to swell teaching ranks and improve academic achievement.

"We like to look for a fix that works, and when we say the problem is a shortage, then the solution is simple: just find more people," said Tom Carroll, the commission's executive director and a former Education Department official.

"What we're saying is the problem is a little more complicated than that."

Department spokesman Dan Langan said he had not reviewed the report and had no comment.

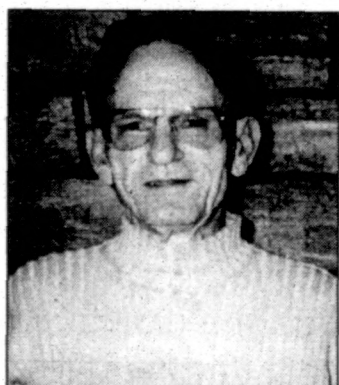
Only select fields, such as math, science and special education, have true teacher supply problems, the report says. Otherwise, America generally produces enough teachers to satisfy demand, even accounting for coming waves of retirements, the report contends.

Yet there is a shortage of bodies because not enough teachers stick with it, as if the country is pouring teachers into a bucket with a hole in it, the report says.

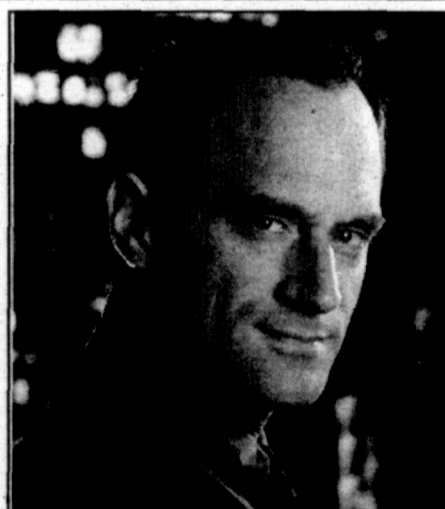
