## ATF finds explosive devices at Main Street residence

The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, along with the Murray and Paducah police departments, are continuing to investigate the discovery of several explosive items in a Murray residence.

Members of the Paducah Police

Department's Explosive Ordinance Disposal Unit, with the assistance of ATF agents and Murray Police officers, discovered the explosives during a search of a residence at 1405 W. Main St. here after a complaint was filed with the ATF in Louisville, Ky.

According to a release from the Paducah Police Department, the search began at 4:30 p.m. Thursday and did not end until 7 yes-

terday morning. Explosive items seized during the search included grenades, a rocket launcher and a detonator device.

The rocket launcher and all but two of the grenades were found to be inactive, according to the Paducah Police release.

Several volatile chemicals used in the manufacture of explosives were also found during the search. Those chemicals included

antimony sulfide, mercury metal, silver nitrate and sulfuric acid. Survivalist books, including some dealing with explosives and booby traps, were also located.

ATF spokesperson Laura Volk said Friday that no names are being released at the present time. No one was present at the residence at the time of the search and no arrests have been made.

Volk said the determination of whether or not federal charges would come from the incident would depend on results from lab testing on the items that were recovered.

The items will be sent to Beltsville, Md., for testing. Volk was unsure when the results might be available.

The Murray State University Dance Company consists of 27 dancers. Twenty-three of those performed at Murray High Friday.

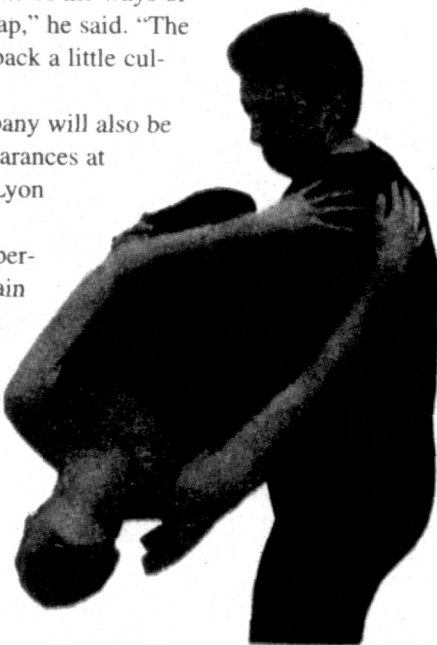

## Students to return to East classes Monday

The boil water advisory for people affected by last Saturday's water main break has been lifted.

City officials announced Friday afternoon that water has been restored east of Clark's River and customers no longer need to boil their water before using it.

Water was restored to the main Wednesday, however residents were advised to continue boiling their water and those who had reconnected to well water were advised to connected back to the water main line.

The advisory was lifted after receiving the results of an analysis from McCoy and McCoy Laboratory, who tested the water to ensure it was safe to drink.

With the advisory being lifted, students from East Elementary School will return to classes on the East campus Monday morning.

According to a release from the Calloway County School System, maintenance crews began moving furniture back to the school Friday afternoon from Southwest and North Elementary schools where East students had been attending during the water advisory.

## New faces ready to help with ERV mission

When it comes to handling disasters for the American Red Cross, Ray Clark knows a thing or two.

So, Friday morning, when the time was getting closer for Calloway County Chapter volunteers Ray Farrell and Jim Jones to make their first mission with the chapter's Emergency Response Vehicle, Clark was more than willing to offer assistance.

"You're going to Louisville today, so you're going to take the West Kentucky Parkway to I-65 at Elizabethtown which takes you into downtown Louisville," Clark, the Calloway County chapter's disaster

chairman, told his charges Farrell and Jones yesterday.

"Then, you're going to find the Chestnut Street exit, turn right past Jewish Hospital and you'll see the Red Cross on the right. The Red Cross goes for half a block," he added, remembering one of his first ventures into the state's largest city.

"The first time I went was when Bullitt County had those tornadoes go through (in the mid-1990s). Well, I had to go to Louisville then, and they told me to drive two or three blocks after I turned off the first road. Well, I drove 10 blocks and never found it. So, I redrove it

## Engineer warned of possible shuttle danger

WASHINGTON (AP) — A NASA research engineer warned two days before Columbia broke apart that the shuttle might be in "marginal" condition and that others in the space agency weren't adequately considering the danger of a breach near its left wheels, according to internal e-mails NASA disclosed Friday.

"We can't imagine why getting information is being treated like the plague," the engineer wrote in one of a series of messages describing internal concerns about Columbia's safety in the days before its breakup

Feb. 1 over Texas.

The board investigating the accident, which only obtained the e-mails late Friday, believes the shuttle suffered a breach based on its analysis of rising temperatures inside the same wheel compartment that the engineer had cited for concern.

The engineer, Robert Daugherty of NASA's Langley research facility in Hampton, Va., wrote two days before Columbia's breakup that experts on the shuttle's protective heat tiles were concerned that Columbia's condition was "surviv-

able but marginal" after it was struck by debris on liftoff.

Other documents NASA released showed engineers feared that Columbia was struck on liftoff by three pieces of loosened insulating foam, not just the one previously acknowledged. NASA spokesman Allard Beutel said Friday that officials now believe one large foam piece broke into three smaller chunks before at least one struck the spacecraft. The investigating board said it was looking into the matter.

Daugherty did not mention in his e-mails any concern that a breach

might cause Columbia to break apart during its fiery descent, saying that the risks of deadly heat burning into the wheel compartment was "arguably very unlikely."

But Daugherty explicitly warned in a Jan. 29 e-mail that "one of the bigger concerns" was that damage to thermal tiles near the wheel compartment seal could permit a hole there. He appeared worried most about pilots struggling to land Columbia with one or more tires inside damaged from extreme heat.

and still never found it.

"So, I asked a second time for instructions, and somebody else told me, 'You didn't go far enough. It's 20 blocks, not 10.'"

Farrell and Jones' mission will take them into the eastern and central portions of the state for two weeks in order to help residents cope with the effects of both flooding and an ice storm that left most communities without power. Louisville is where the Calloway pair will receive instructions as to where they need to take the ERV.

"They need to be careful up there," Clark said, referring to reports he has received from the eastern counties. "The (ice storm) was four days ago, but nobody could really get into those areas until now. That's why they didn't call the ERV in."

Still, one advantage for Jones and Farrell may be that they are so shortly removed from their training. Mostly, the ERV that Calloway's chapter operates handles food distribution; its supply for the eastern Kentucky mission is enough for 300 meals and 150 more, if necessary. Previously, though, such as in 1999's flooding disasters in Iowa, this vehicle was transformed into a bulk distribution unit that received truckloads of clean-up goods.

In other words, one never knows what will be requested while on ERV duty.

"We'll see what kind of students we are, I guess," said Farrell, a Calloway chapter volunteer for the past two years. "It's going to be interesting; I'm sure we'll be presented challenges up there."

"But it's a matter of helping out your neighbor, you know? It's the right thing to do, too."

For Jones, this is a bit of a homecoming. Born in the western West Virginia town of Glasgow near Charleston, W.Va., he has distant relatives in Boyd and Lewis counties, both heavily affected by this week's problems.

"It would be a miracle if they sent us there. I'd maybe get a chance to help those relatives," said Jones, explaining that just getting the opportunity to help out is enough for

him.

"This is going to be a chance of a lifetime for us, and we're going to get very educated, I've got a feeling," he added.

With the vast area affected,

chances are that education will come quickly. Red Cross shelters have been opened in the counties of Fayette, Anderson, Scott, Spencer, Woodford, Johnson, Carter and

Floyd counties in an effort to meet victims' needs for food, clothing and basic first aid. It was reported that more than 900 people have sought refuge in those shelters.

## Two dead after Staten Island oil fire

NEW YORK (AP) — A gasoline barge exploded with a thunderous blast while it was being unloaded Friday, killing two workers and sending up a fiery column of black smoke so high it could be seen more than 30 miles away.

With the nation on high alert for terrorism, the explosion and raging fire at a Staten Island oil depot, about 20 miles from the World Trade Center attacks unnerved New York and New Jersey residents. Authorities, however, said there was no indication terrorists were involved.

One worker's body was pulled from the water in the early afternoon, and the second was recovered a few hours later, said police spokesman Lt. Elias Nikas.

An employee of Exxon Mobil Corp. — the owner of the depot — was in critical condition with third-degree burns, officials said. The 48-year-old Middletown, N.J., man had burns over 15 percent of his body, hospital officials said.

Police said the investigation remained in its preliminary stages but officials were examining whether a malfunction in a pump might have

caused the explosion.

"I looked up at the sky, and I saw pieces of metal flying all over," said worker Jaime Villa, who was repairing a pump when the barge blew up. "I ran as fast as I could go. I was so scared that I lost my breath and I fell to the ground."

The barge, which contained about 4 million gallons of unleaded gasoline, was being unloaded at the 200-acre petroleum storage facility when the explosion occurred, said Prem Nair, an Exxon Mobil spokeswoman. About half of the cargo had been unloaded.

The barge eventually sank in the Arthur Kill, a waterway between Staten Island and New Jersey. The fire took about three hours to contain.

The company would not speculate on a cause of the explosion. It said no part of the storage terminal was destroyed.

"We are greatly saddened by the injuries and loss of life, and extend our deepest sympathy to the families," said Hank Muller, terminal manager for Exxon Mobil.

Mayor Michael Bloomberg said many poten-

tial hazards are associated with loading and unloading fuel, including the buildup of static electricity, which can trigger an explosion.

"There is absolutely no evidence and no reason to think at this moment that this is anything other than a tragic accident," he said.

The barge was owned by Bouchard Transportation Co. which said it retained several companies to contain any spill and limit environmental damage.

The Coast Guard, which is investigating the explosion, recorded about six seconds of the blast with camera equipment used to monitor the harbor, Petty Officer Matthew Belson said. The blast rattled buildings a few miles away on the island and in New Jersey, and smoke could be seen 35 miles away in Trenton, N.J.

"I could feel the debris hitting the top of my car," said Ernie Camerlingo, a Staten Island electrical contractor driving in the area. "It was like hail coming down."

Exxon Mobil said the accident would not cause significant interruptions in gas supply.

## Brain damage feared for botched transplant victim

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) — Jessica Santillan, the 17-year-old girl who underwent a second heart-lung transplant after the first was botched, was found to have severe and perhaps irreversible brain damage Friday.

The girl's chief benefactor said doctors told Jessica's family the girl may be brain dead, and tests would be performed today to confirm that. But a hospital spokesman said Jessica hadn't been declared brain dead and no tests were planned.

Mack Mahoney blamed the grim turn on Duke University Medical Center, saying image-conscious doctors hesitated to take the blame

for the first, bungled operation and lost precious time in the hunt for a new set of organs.

"If she dies, they murdered her," said Mahoney, a North Carolina building contractor who started a charity in Jessica's name.

In her first transplant Feb. 7, the Mexican teenager was mistakenly given a heart and lungs from a donor with the wrong blood type.

Her body rejected the organs, and she was on life support by the time a matching donor was found and a second transplant performed Thursday morning.

Though the new organs were performing well, tests early Friday

showed Jessica's brain had swelled and was bleeding, said Dr. Karen Frush, the hospital's medical director of children's services. She said Jessica was also hooked up to dialysis machines because of damage to her kidneys.

"Yesterday after the transplant, we were all very hopeful," Frush said. But now, "the swelling in her brain is severe, severe to the point we fear it's irreversible."

Renee McCormick, a spokeswoman for the charity Jessica's Hope Chest, said the Santillan family was told at midday Friday that tests couldn't find any activity in Jessica's brain.

Doctors told Jessica's family they would test her brain-wave function at 7 a.m. and again at 1 p.m. today, Mahoney said.

"If there's no change (in the interval), then Jessica is officially brain dead," he said.

But Duke spokesman Richard Puff said no tests were scheduled.

Mahoney said earlier Friday that doctors told the family to be ready to decide whether to remove Jessica from life support.

But her mother, Magdalena Santillan, refused to think about it.

"She won't even discuss last rites because it's like giving up," Mahoney said.

"It seems to me that if mission operations were to see both tire pressure indicators go to zero during entry, they would sure as hell want to know whether they should land with gear up, try to deploy the gear or go bailout," Daugherty wrote.

The accident board has previously determined Columbia almost certainly suffered a devastating breach along its wing and possibly its wheel compartment that allowed searing air to seep inside during its descent at nearly 12,500 miles per hour.

Earlier this week, board member James Hallock said investigators were "very much interested also in

the landing gear door itself, because once again you have tiles all around the area, but you also have seals."

Unusual temperature readings inside the wing and wheel compartment began within minutes of the shuttle's re-entry, far off the coast of California.

Senior NASA officials have steadfastly supported assurances since the accident by The Boeing Co., a contractor, that Columbia was expected to be able to return safely despite the possible tile damage.

They also have maintained that concerns expressed in e-mails among midlevel engineers — such as Daugherty — were part of a "what-if" analysis, and that even these employees were satisfied with

Boeing's conclusions.

"During the flight, no one involved in the analysis or the management team or the flight team raised any concerns," NASA spokesman James Hartsfield said Friday.

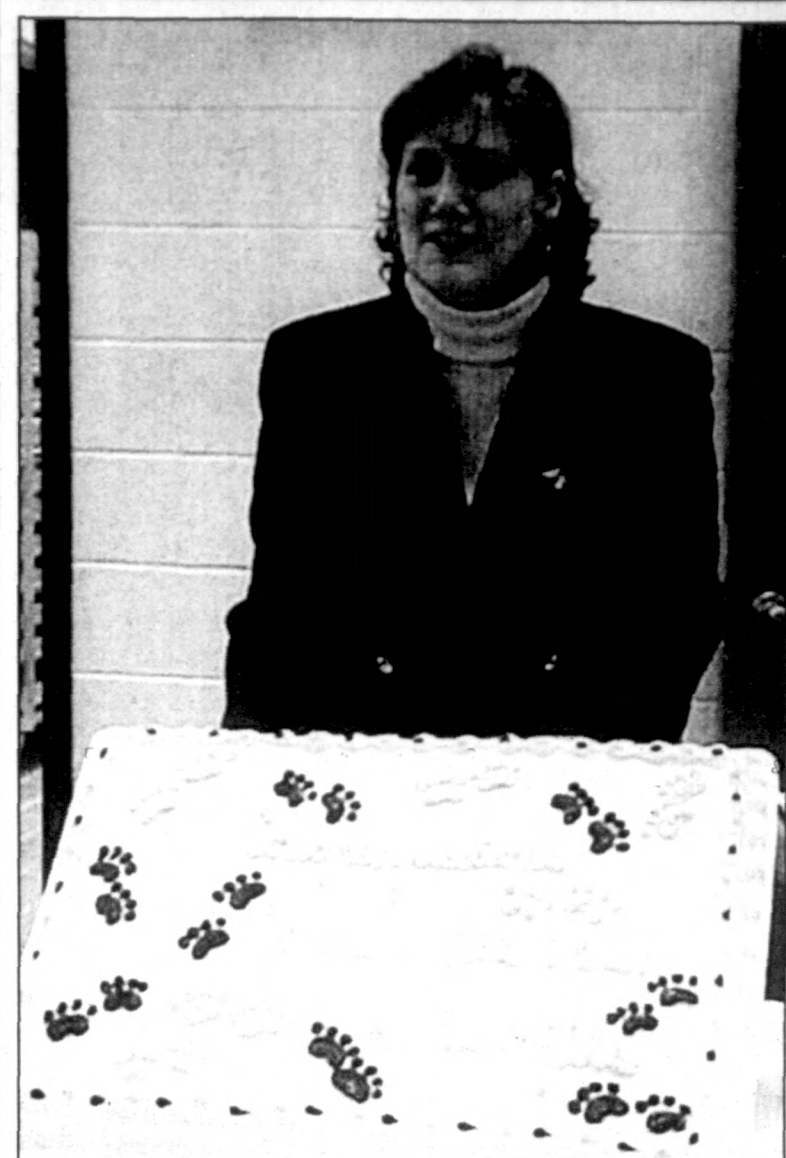
But the e-mails disclosed in Washington questioned some details about those assurances by Boeing, including underlying assumptions about the likelihood of minor damage from a large chunk of break-away foam and whether injury to Columbia might have been caused by falling ice.

The e-mails also include references by Daugherty and another Langley employee, Mark J. Stuart, about secrecy over the studies of

risks to Columbia. Stuart wrote Jan. 28 to two other employees, referring to the foam strike. "I am advised that the fact that this incident occurred is not being widely discussed."

The e-mails, which were not passed to senior mission controllers in Houston during Columbia's flight, will be turned over to the board investigating the accident, board spokeswoman Laura Brown said. All seven astronauts died in the accident.

The e-mails had been sought since last week by news organizations under the Freedom of Information Act. Employees at NASA's headquarters here published them Friday.

## In Our Opinion Hands helped each other during 94 East water crisis

It was a scenario that most wished could have been avoided entirely, but with how things played out following last weekend's water main break under Clark's River, what could have been a serious problem was alleviated by the hard work and caring of neighbors.

The water main break last Saturday morning knocked out water service to some 750 customers to the east of Murray. City officials began getting information out to the public immediately regarding the situation and the need to boil water. Meanwhile, crews began the long process of finding out exactly where the break was and how to fix it.

All of this was going on with the backdrop of cold and wet weather that has seemed to hover over western Kentucky for weeks now. So, the hard work being done by these workers was doubled — or even tripled — by the environment they had to deal with.

Then came providing water to those residents without, which was made possible through contributions of Turner Dairy in Fulton, Ky., and the use of water at various sites around Murray and the Pottertown area.

School was another matter, too, since nearly 400 students at East Calloway Elementary would have to continue their studies. They couldn't call off that school alone while the other schools within the county's system remained on schedule, not to mention students had already missed days at school due to snow and ice.

The school system devised a plan that was welcomed by all involved, utilizing North and Southwest Elementaries as off campus sites for the East students and teachers while other school staff remained to make sure the water-operated heating units at East did not break down.

This is, of course, a simplified version of the events over the past week but the common thread is that of a community pulling together with a "can-do" attitude.

Each worker, each city official, each teacher, administrator, staff member, student and parent should be commended for the way this scenario was handled. It is a lesson that we hope these students — and all our children — will carry with them throughout their lives.

## New resolution to be presented next week

WASHINGTON (AP)

Bracing for a showdown, the United States and Britain plan to present a new resolution to the U.N. Security Council on Monday in a bid to gain support for using force to disarm Iraq.

The move runs against strong sentiment within the council that force as an option should be set aside at least until U.N. weapons inspectors working in Iraq report their findings in mid-March.

The two allies evidently are willing to risk diplomatic defeat. But President Bush has vowed to disarm Iraqi President Saddam Hussein one way or another — with U.N. support or with the help of a "coalition of the willing."

Finishing touches were being put on the resolution. France, which heads an anti-war bloc, has the power to kill it by veto.

Secretary of State Colin Powell said a headcount of who was for or against a new resolution on the 15-member council would be "academic" because the resolution demanding Iraqi disarmament had not been put forward.

"We won't put a resolution down unless we intend to fight for the resolution, unless we believe we can make the case that it is appropriate," Powell said at a news conference.

## Washington Today

Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld said Thursday evening the buildup of tens of thousands of U.S. and British troops in the Persian Gulf region has reached the point that they could launch an invasion if the president orders one. Asked on PBS' "NewsHour With Jim Lehrer" whether the forces massed in the area were ready to go to war, Rumsfeld replied: "Yes."

Powell, who was due to fly to Japan on Friday for the start of a five-day Asia trip dominated by concern over North Korea's nuclear program, juggled resolution diplomacy with stressful negotiations with Turkey, a potential key ally in a war with Iraq.

The Turkish ambassador to Washington, Faruk Logoglu, told The Associated Press on Thursday that "we are very close to an agreement" on a U.S. economic assistance package that could set the stage for stationing American troops on Turkish soil.

Even if the Security Council does not approve a new resolution it "doesn't necessarily mean that the Turkish parliament will reject the issue," Logoglu said.

Romania, an ally in the event of war, permitted four U.S. military transport planes carrying troops and

equipment to land near its Black Sea coast Thursday night in what appeared to be the start of a new stage of the buildup of forces against Iraq.

The planes, which landed at the international airport in Constanta, carried some 250 troops as well as equipment and food. They were to remain in Romania until Monday, said Alexandru Bazdac, an airport official in Constanta.

Turkey has demanded \$10 billion in aid, while the United States offered some \$6 billion.

Powell said he had told Prime Minister Abdullah Gul on the telephone Wednesday that "our position was firm with respect to the kind of assistance we could provide."

However, Powell said, "there may be some other creative things we can do."

He did not elaborate, but another U.S. official said one approach might be to seek a \$1 billion congressional appropriation that would then permit Turkey to obtain loans at preferential U.S.-government rates for many times that amount.

In Baghdad, meanwhile, Iraq allowed another flight by an American U-2 surveillance plane as Saddam's government sought to convince the world that it is cooper-

ating with the weapons inspectors.

It was the second flight this week by a U-2 in support of the U.N. inspection program. The Iraqi Foreign Ministry said the plane spent six hours and 20 minutes over Iraq's territory, searching for evidence of banned weapons — weapons Iraq insists it does not have.

In New York, a U.N. spokesman said Iraq also had submitted a list of 83 people involved in the destruction of banned weapons — a key demand by chief U.N. weapons inspector Hans Blix.

In an interview published by the Fletcher School at Tufts University in Medford, Mass., Ahmad Chalabi, leader of the exiled opposition group known as the Iraqi National Congress, denounced the United Nations for its "fecklessness" on Iraq.

He said over the years it has been "a false witness" to genocide, repression and deportation "not only in Iraq, but all over the world."

Chalabi said "the principle of noninterference becomes a hypocrisy when confronted with totalitarian regimes that destroy the very fabric of civil society in their own countries. Saddam is the prime example of that. Repression at home is the other side of the coin of aggression abroad."

## The One-Legged Bandit of 1876

With the contested 2000 presidential race between Al Gore and George Bush so recently on our minds, revisiting the 1876 election seems very timely.

To his credit, Roy Morris Jr. makes only a passing allusion to the 2000 race before proceeding to a reconstruction (an appropriate word) of "Fraud of the Century: Rutherford B. Hayes, Samuel Tilden, and the Stolen Election of 1876" (Simon & Schuster, 2003, 311 pages, \$27).

When Republican Hayes and Democrat Tilden went to their separate beds after midnight, both were convinced that Tilden had won the election. They did not reckon on the reckless daring of Republican Daniel Sickles.

Sickles is a character in American history worthy of a book himself. Before the Civil War, while still a Democrat and a protégé of President James Buchanan, Sickles had shot and killed his wife's lover, Philip Barton Key, son of Francis Scott Key, composer of the national anthem.

Defended by attorney Edwin Stanton, who was later Lincoln's controversial Secretary of War, Sickles was acquitted by reason of temporary insanity, the first such successful use of that plea in a court. In the Civil War, Sickles managed to get himself appointed a Union general and made history by disobeying General Meade and sending his troops into the Gettysburg peach orchard out of line with the other Union forces.

The troops suffered heavy casualties and Sickles lost a leg (which he visited each year

thereafter), but he won a Congressional Medal of Honor. In Reconstruction days, Sickles was a bitter opponent of President Andrew Johnson (who removed him from command in the Carolinas), and President Grant later appointed him minister to Spain where he had a notorious affair with deposed Queen Isabella II. He returned to the country in 1876, enlisted in the Republican campaign effort, and successfully urged Hayes to wave "the bloody shirt" to win votes and to tar and feather the Democrats.

Resigned to Tilden's election, Sickles dropped by the depressed Republican headquarters after midnight. Looking closely at returns, he calculated that Hayes could still win (by one vote), by carrying Oregon, Florida, South Carolina and Louisiana, three of which were still under Republican Reconstruction control.

Carrying any one of those states would have made Tilden president. Sickles sent messages to party leaders in all four over the unauthorized signature of national party chairman Zachariah Chandler, ordering them to bring their states into the Republican column.

Eventually, all four states did toe the party line — some by political trade-offs — in close elections for governors (such as Wade Hampton in South Carolina), and in other cases by state and federal legal maneuvers that led eventually to the creation of a Republican-controlled bipartisan congressional committee and to Hayes being elected.

Tilden had 260,000 more votes than Hayes nationally, but machinations of the Electoral College system gave Hayes the victory. Dan Sickles, the "Sickles leg of fate," gave meaning to "cigar-filled rooms."

Tilden refused to get involved in the behind-the-scenes struggles that sometimes seemed to be leading to renewal of the Civil War. He used the

four months of waiting to write a legal brief which never got to court but which clearly would have justified Tilden's election if it had.

Hayes also tried to appear to be above the fray, but seems to have been much more involved out of sight in promise-making and trading. Politics won out over law.

Morris neglects Oregon somewhat and concentrates on the three Republican-occupied states in the South, citing Louisiana especially as deciding the election.

Hayes became a lame-duck president by declaring at the outset that he would serve only one term, and Democrat resentment grew during his four years in office. The nation suffered from a major economic recession his first year, he was roundly criticized for sending federal troops to put down a severe railroad strike, black voters only recently enfranchised became disillusioned with Republicans (a legacy that endures), and Jim Crow laws sprang up across the South that were not repealed until the 1960s.

Despite all that, when Hayes left office he had a great deal of popularity, some of it attributed to Lucy, his wife, who banned alcohol in the White House.

Very likely, Tilden as president would have acted much as Hayes did, with perhaps some shades of difference in pushing harder for civil service and government reform. He was a true gentleman throughout, refusing to contest the election further or to speak publicly about it and refusing to run in 1880 and 1884, in either year of which he would probably have won.

Above his name on his tombstone is a short and sweet line: "I Still Trust the People."

## Weather pattern still right on course

Our predicted weather pattern is still right on course — at least for another week.

Our local lake elevation has climbed two feet, and it has risen to nearly 30 feet below the dam. By the time you read this article, we could possibly be at or above summer pool stage.

coming our way because it's usually as much as five degrees warmer.

However, the enter Tennessee Valley system has been under a lot of snowy and icy situations for several weeks. Our local waters have been lower than usual.

We may not see the immediate changes or responses that we hope for, but some activity will result from a large rise in the overall main lake waters.

Sauger, catfish, bass and stripers seem to respond more to a current than do the crappie, as far as getting out in it and feeding.

Keep in mind that all of the stakebeds you placed for crappie fishing are also havens of sorts for many species of smaller fish.

They continue to hold great schools of crappie nearby during these scenarios. There isn't any reason to leave or move from the area unless it is a creek bed that will have strong currents of water coming through.

In such a case, resort to the attractors in the bays or along the banks that are protected from the currents. Some of you who attended my seminars last month should remember that we discussed the small lures and the fact that there would be a time for them.

This is one of those times before spawning when that small bait should do you well — possibly until the weather breaks into spring. This rise we have now is the trigger that sets the plan of nature into motion. Remember the crappie!

According to weather services, there is quite a bit of rainfall to our south. It will eventually come our way.

Before the rivers rose so much, the sauger were active in several areas. Several limits were taken then. One should choose carefully the days for angling of any type. These cold fronts and high winds can sweep in and cause a boater some serious problems.

We are still several weeks away

from any spawning by the crappie. But keep in mind that they do make a couple of pre-spawn moves. If you have prepared the areas you like to fish, then you're in good shape.

If you haven't started because of the cold weather, then get your stuff ready to move on a moment's notice. These lakes are almost ancient.

Many of the banks that once held great schools of crappie are bare of debris and good stumps or trees.

Making your own attractors is something fairly easy and profitable. The more and better you make will attract and hold throughout the spawning season, and then again in the fall.

We must keep in mind one thing: Even though you plan to catch as many crappie as you can, some will escape your hooks.

These survivors will spawn and reproduce the species for the future by using the attractors or structures you have placed in the lake for another reason.

Some of the shorelines on the main lake will have large areas where wooden debris has accumulated. It will eventually wash away, unless someone anchors it to the bottom!

Some of you boaters and non-fishermen can help keep the lake healthy by sinking these logs, trees, bushes, etc., into some bay. You

can create a fish habitat that you can be proud of!

During the spawning time, everyone catches crappie when they are shallow and easy to find. What one could do to get ahead of the pack is locate the ledges and old creek banks where you used to find stumps and logs.

Replace this cover material at your leisure. It will hold several fish species throughout the seasons, and our population will increase for sure.

I have a co-worker at Murray State whom I plan to take out and show some of the great areas we have to fish. Rick Dail came from North Carolina, where they fish in a very different environment.

Rick said he was reading my column in the Ledger & Times five years ago when friends and family would send the paper in that direction. Rick is more used to the coastal waters, but I think I can convert him!

Kim in mind that our pre-spawn crappie will stage anywhere between six and 20 feet at first. But, as the season progresses and the waters warm, look for them in more shallow areas — not necessarily in closer to the shore or by the bank, but up near the warmer comfort zone.

Many anglers do not realize that female crappie seek the warmer zones of water to help their eggs

mature. Surely you have noticed these undeveloped eggs when you have cleaned early-season crappie.

These warmer temperatures help to allow these females to become more active and catch more food for themselves and their eggs.

In this area, we cast light 1/16-ounce jigs with spinning tackle or dangle tube jigs, solid curtails and sometimes a wet fly on rods — ranging from 10 to 14 feet in length.

These longer poles are more effective when placed in holders that are mounted on a steady bar or platform designed to hold several poles out over the bow.

Casting the jigs toward a bank or target area is a favorite of many anglers. Some choose to attach a small bobber, which is set at a depth where the jig will pass over the target slowly and more effectively.

This is a great way to fish when the crappie are slow to strike. Giving them a better look will work. Fishing with longer poles will allow for easy fights and quick retrieves without any major problems.

Work close to standing timber could cause a problem, because you can't lift the poles up under the tree limbs. Reelfoot Lake and some areas on Lake Barkley have trees close by or standing in good waters. A cast and retrieve method works better in that situation.

Keep in mind that you shouldn't go to the shallow areas too soon. The larger spawners (females) will remain out away from the banks until the males come out to get them!

Some never go to a shallow shoreline because they use the river and creek channels as banks or shorelines to spawn on. Do your homework with a good map, and then you will be a better angler!

Try not to use the real heavy lines — especially if the waters are clear. The crappie can see that heavy mono and dark-braided stuff and will leave you alone.

I'm really excited about a couple of new lines this year. One is the new 8-pound Spiderwire. I think this will really work well around any stakebed or attractor, simply because it is the same color as the algae that is growing on the structures.

There are several other great features in this line. The material is teflon, pressure-treated microfibers. I have mine spooled on reels and fiberglass rods for peak performance.

The 8-pound diameter is 30-pound test line. You can keep a jig head a long time with that!

There is a line that is terrible. It should be taken from the reels and tossed in the trash before you leave the garage. It's last year's line, so change it now!

## Future may be snowy for goose hunters

At first, there appears a dark cloud on the horizon that begins to bend, shape and reshape itself. A pronounced line of black forms then dissipates before forming again.

Soon a barking chatter can be heard as the great cloud morphs into a flock of several thousand large birds — snow geese!

The appearance of vast flocks of snows — actually a conglomeration of "light geese" which include both the white and blue color phase of lesser snow geese and the smaller Ross's geese — is a dark cloud on the horizon not only in the real sense but in the metaphorical sense also.

Areas once home to the much preferred Canada goose are now inundated with what has become a migratory nightmare.

That is why Kentucky and many other states have implemented a special Conservation Order season for snow geese

which runs from the end of the regular goose season on Jan. 31 until the end of March.

To facilitate the special season, guns normally plugged to hold no more than three shells may be unplugged, hunting hours are expanded, bag limits are waived, and electronic callers may be employed. The idea is to kill as many of the big white birds as possible.

The reason for this all-out declared war on the snow goose is because the geese have been too successful at what they do.

They have adapted extremely well to the abundant agriculture along the Central and Mississippi Flyways and have benefitted from the hopscotch of waterfowl refuges along these same routes.

Combined with the fact that they are just plain hard to kill, the population of snows has increased from an estimated winter population of 800,000 in 1969 to more than 2.6 million today. In fact, estimates of the spring breeding population may exceed 5 million.

Therein lies the problem. Snow geese are colonial birds and everything they do is done in large groups — including feeding and nesting.

As a result, they have completely denuded

ed some nesting areas around Hudson Bay displacing many other species in the process.

In a phenomenon known to biologists as Trophic Cascade, the geese are literally

ally eating themselves out of house and home and causing the collapse of an entire ecosystem.

Waterfowl managers agree that only an aggressive program to reduce the population of the problem birds will reverse these devastating effects.

The goal is a 50-percent reduction in snow goose populations by 2005 — a feat that will require the harvest of approximately 1.4 million geese annually. At present, the task falls squarely on waterfowl hunters from Texas to Canada.

Left alone, the snow goose population would soon reach a level that the habitat cannot sustain.

Long before that, however, other species such as ducks of all types and Canada geese would be completely displaced. Eventually the burgeoning population would crash, but nature's way of dealing with overpopulation is not pretty.

As a result, there would be the possibility of rampant disease affecting other species as well as brutal starvation and brood failures among the snows.

That's why the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service along with the various state agencies have cast their lot with hunters through the extended season.

If hunting fails to arrest the growth,

more aggressive methods such as trapping and poisoning will have to be employed. There is already talk of extending the season in Canada year around.

What this means to the waterfowl hunter is a windfall opportunity! Declining numbers of Canada geese have left many waterfowlers disillusioned and disgusted in the past few years.

Now they can dust off the old 10-gauge and break out the triple-B shot to participate in the special season that will run until March 31 in Kentucky and surrounding states.

It may not be as glamorous or as prestigious as hunting the Canada goose, but at least for this year, it's the only game in town.

Don't forget the Calloway County Longbeards Chapter of the National Wild Turkey Federation banquet tonight at the National Guard Armory on Hwy. 121 North.

Doors open at 4:30 p.m. and the meal will be served at 6 p.m. There will be raffles, auctions, and giveaways galore, so make plans to attend. Remember — it's for the birds!

## Skunk rambles bring on the stinky season

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — The striped skunk may be obscure but not heard.

This common Kentucky mammal, while rather quiet, is best known for the repulsive aroma of its primary defense: spraying a powerful musk from glands in its backside when threatened or attacked. Nature's equivalent of tear gas, skunk musk can sicken an attacker to incapacity.

The skunk is probably the only crea-

ture in the commonwealth most identified by odor, the smell often being the only clue that the critter is around.

The nocturnal skunk goes mostly unseen during its nightly rounds. Many people only observe skunks as road-killed animal. The smell is most memorable there.

Skunks are unmistakable in contrasting black and white with a long, bushy tail. Individuals vary in the proportions of black and white fur, but most feature a white stripe extending from the head down the back and onto the tail.

Typically cat-sized, striped skunks range from about five to 10 pounds in weight.

Skunks are beneficial in that they feed on insects, grubs, spiders and even an occasional mouse or vole. They also include frogs, crawfish, bird and reptile eggs and some plant matter in their diet.

Though generally not troublesome, skunks will sometimes make themselves unwelcome around human residences by spraying their repugnant musk in confrontations with dogs, in scrapes with automobiles or disagreements with other

wildlife, even other skunks.

Now is a time of increased skunk confrontations because males of the species travel more during February seeking mates for the annual courting season. The incidence of road-killed skunks goes up accordingly during late winter.

Skunks don't hibernate, although they do sleep in on days of particularly harsh cold, lounging in temporary dens.

Skunks are sometimes problematic if their travels and den-seeking take them to crawl spaces under human homes or

outbuildings. Possible confrontations while in or around homes raise the specter of deplorable, lingering stench that human residents will want to avoid.

Wildlife experts recommend exclusion as the best prevention or remedy for skunk invasion. Any possible entrances under homes or utility buildings should be sealed off first. If a skunk does move in, it's recommended that a homeowner wait until the animal is out for its evening prowling, then close the entrance to prevent the animal's return.

## Racers need wins as season nears end

It's crunch time in the Ohio Valley Conference race, and the Murray State Racers are in desperate need of wins.

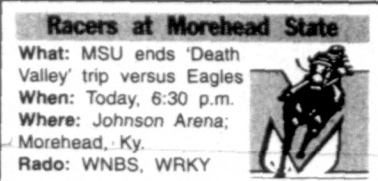
Entering today's 6:30 p.m. (CST) contest at league leader Morehead State, the Racers (14-10, 7-6 OVC) are tied in the loss column with Eastern Illinois (13-13, 8-6) for the all-important fourth spot in the conference standings.

The top four teams at the end of the regular season earn home games for the opening round of next month's OVC Tournament.

By virtue of a season sweep of EIU, Murray currently holds the tiebreaker advantage over the Panthers. However, it must find a way to rebound from Thursday night's disappointing 73-71 loss to upstart Eastern Kentucky to maintain that edge.

Following tonight's matchup with the Eagles, the Racers will return home to face Tennessee State on Monday night before wrapping up its regular-season schedule next Saturday at Tennessee-Martin.

MSU can secure a top-four finish and a postseason home game by winning its remaining three games. Anything less than three straight victories, the Racers would need help from Eastern Illinois, which ends its season on a two-game road swing through TSU and Tennessee Tech.



"Right now, we've put ourselves in a precarious position," said Racer head coach Tevester Anderson after watching his club blow a seven-point lead to EIU in the final four minutes of Thursday's contest. "The teams behind us are winning right now, but we've just got to put this one behind us and try to close out the season on a good note."

Starting a three-game winning streak, however, will likely be easier said than done against a Morehead State squad that has proved its mettle in OVC play with a 12-2 record — its only league losses coming to Austin Peay (66-59) and at EIU (75-69).

The soaring Eagles (16-7) captured their third consecutive win on Thursday by drilling visiting Tennessee-Martin 104-76 at Morehead's Ellis T. Johnson Arena.

The dynamic duo of guard Chez Marks and forward Ricky Minard paced Morehead in its drubbing of the Skyhawks with 26 and 24 points, respectively. Center Ike Lopez (13 points, 11 rebounds) and Marquis Sykes (12 points, 11 assists) also carried their share of the offensive load.

Minard, the OVC's second-lead-

ing scorer (22.0 ppg.) entering Thursday's action, has been the main offensive star for the Eagles while Marks was adding 17.3 and Sykes 8.3 per outing.

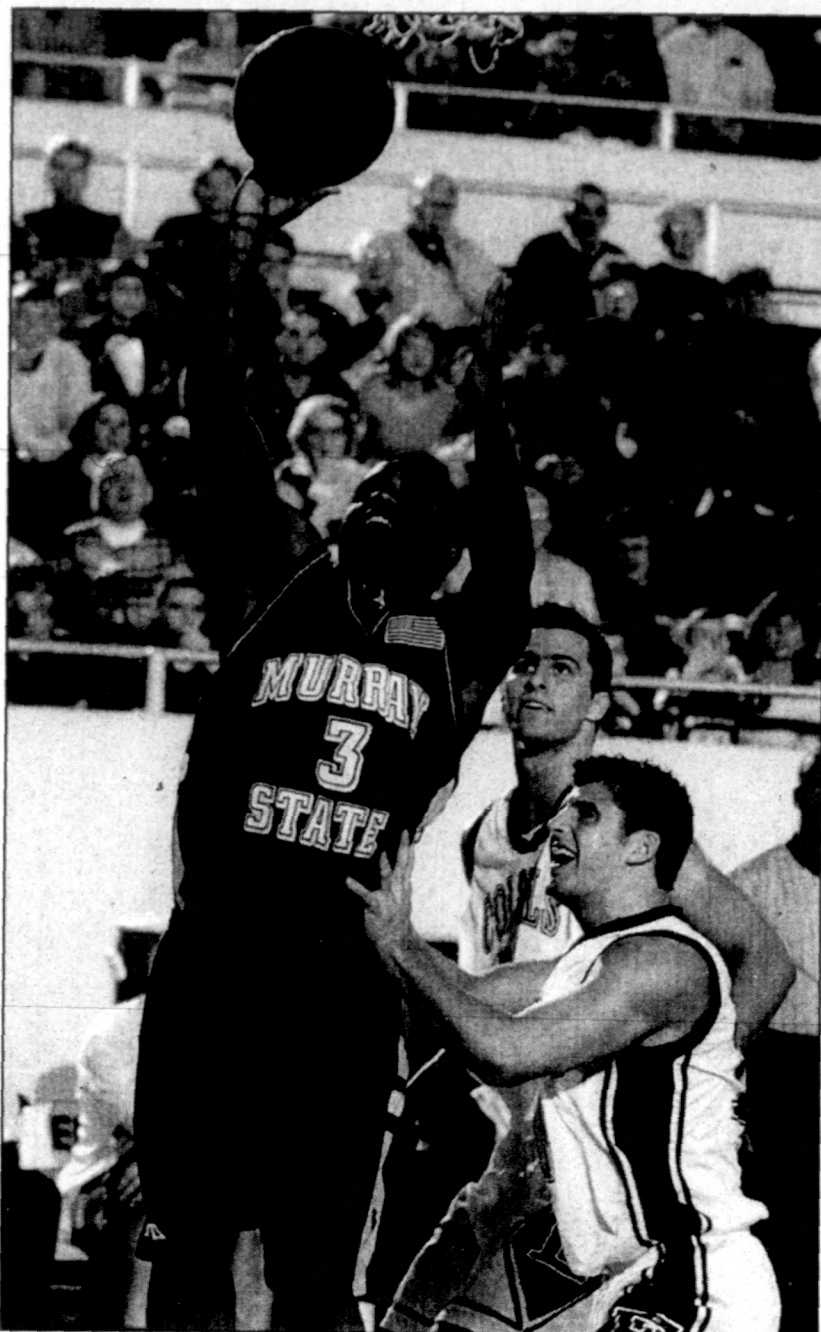
"Those three guys make them a very, very good basketball team," Anderson said during a press conference earlier this week. "With Ricky Minard and Marks, you have to find a way to slow one of them down. You can't have both of them putting up big numbers."

The Racers will try and off-set that one-two scoring punch with the inside combo of center James Singleton and forward Cuthbert Victor.

Victor has been Murray's most consistent offensive force of late, tallying a double-double with 19 points and 11 boards at Eastern Kentucky. Meanwhile, the 6-8 Singleton is 10th in the league in scoring (15.0 ppg.) and leads the conference in rebounding (10.9 rpg).

MSU is 13-7 in the last 10 years on the "Death Valley" road trip, having swept the two-game set six times while dropping both contests on three other occasions — including last year's back-to-back losses to the Colonels and Eagles.

Morehead defeated the Racers 83-76 on Jan. 23 at the Regional Special Events Center and won last year's game at Johnson Arena by a 76-68 count. Murray still leads the all-time series by a wide margin, 94-49.

## CCHS falls to Hickman, 63-49

CLINTON, Ky. — The Calloway County Lady Lakers paid for a lackluster start on Friday night at Hickman County, falling behind the host Lady Falcons early and never recovering in a 63-49 loss.

"We got off to a very bad start," said Calloway head coach Scott Sivills. "We were very flat early in the game. We weren't attacking offensively, and they just took it to us."

Hickman (11-10) jumped out to a 17-8 advantage after one quarter of play and held on for a 26-20 lead at the halftime break despite the shooting of guard Lindsey White.

The 5-5 senior — who paced CCHS with 12 points on the night — kept the Lady Lakers (16-7) close, coming off the bench to hit three of her four 3-pointers in the first half.

"Lindsey White was very good. She gave us a spark off the bench," Sivills noted.

Calloway remained within striking distance to open the second half, but the Lady Falcons quickly extinguished any comeback hopes the Lady Lakers had by winning the quarter 19-9 for a comfortable 45-31 lead heading into the final minutes.

The Lady Lakers matched Hickman's total in the fourth period as both teams scored 18 points, but it wasn't enough as the Lady Falcons coasted to the easy victory.

"We just had too many mental mistakes in the third quarter," Sivills explained. "We didn't do the little things you're supposed to do to win a basketball game ... We just got outplayed in every facet."

Fox joined White in double figures with 10 points while Shameka Dial added nine. CCHS was only 18-of-56 shooting from the floor, including a woeful 6-of-23 from 3-point range.

Tia Brooks led all scorers with 27 points for Hickman while three other Lady Falcons scored eight points apiece. HCHS was 20-of-40 from the field, including 3-of-8 from beyond the 3-point line. The Lady Falcons went to the foul line 24 times, connecting on 20 of those attempts.

The Lady Lakers travel to Graves County on Monday before returning home to end the regular season with games against Ballard Memorial (Tuesday) and Fourth District rival Marshall County (Thursday).

## Coach not worried about Stone, NCAA

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Louisville senior center Marvin Stone will meet with the NCAA on Sunday, but Coach Rick Pitino isn't concerned that his player is in trouble.

"I don't think there is a situation. The NCAA randomly comes in to speak to players from time to time to find out either about his past, to find out about other people," Pitino said Friday. "They've requested to speak to Marvin."

Donald Jackson, a Montgomery, Ala. attorney retained by Stone's family this week, said he believes the NCAA wants to ask Stone about his time with an Alabama-based AAU team coached by Huntsville businessman Mark Komara.

Stone played for the Adidas-sponsored team between his junior and senior years at Grissom High School in Huntsville.

The NCAA has been investigating Komara since last summer. Much of it involves Komara's relationship with Auburn, which recruited many of his former players. One of them, Brandon Robinson, was suspended for the first 13 games of this season, but is now back playing with the Tigers.

Komara has an unlisted home phone number and was not immediately available for comment. His attorney, Bahrouz Rahmati, did not immediately return a phone message left at his office.

Jackson said he has been in contact with Bill Saum, the NCAA's director of agents, amateurism and gambling.

Saum refused to comment on the meeting with Stone.

## Cards' recent struggles no big shock to Pitino

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — It took longer than he expected, but Louisville coach Rick Pitino knew the Cardinals' brutal February schedule would catch up with them.

The fourth-ranked Cardinals (19-3, 9-2 Conference USA) have lost two of their last three games since reeling off 17 straight wins between Dec. 7 and Feb. 12.

"I told them before February came that February was going to bring some very difficult times and probably some good times," Pitino said Friday. "This period is where those bumps lie. I thought they would lie a little earlier, but they haven't."

The next "bump" is Saturday at Cincinnati (14-8, 6-5), where the Cardinals have won only once

in five meetings since 1996.

A road trip might be just what Louisville needs after an 80-73 home loss to Memphis on Wednesday. Pitino said he was "very disappointed" with how the Cardinals were manhandled by the Tigers, outrebounded 47-31.

"Discarded is the word I would use. Pushed out of the way," Pitino said. "They tried hard, they played hard. They were just beat up inside and did nothing about it."

"Rebounding has to be a constant. You can't go where one game you're up and one game you're down. We didn't control our destiny in that game."

A lack of toughness isn't a good trait to have against the traditionally physical Bearcats, although the Cardinals overcame their roughneck style in a 77-71 victory at Freedom Hall on Feb. 5. Louisville was outrebounded 41-39 but forced 22 Cincinnati

turnovers.

Pitino doesn't expect the Bearcats to throw anything different at Louisville on Saturday.

"Cincinnati is nuts and bolts. They're going to do what's made them famous for the last 13 years," he said. "They're going to play great defense, they're going to rebound hard, they're going to play smash-mouth basketball, they're going to play with a lot of hustle and a lot of desire. They're not going to give you any surprises."

Louisville senior guard Reece Gaines had 17 points and seven assists in the earlier victory. He's averaged 21 points in four games since, but Pitino said he needs to shift his focus to getting his teammates more involved.

"Reece's biggest problem is when you get down, he tries to put everything on his back," Pitino said. "That doesn't make us a better team. The great players make other people better around them."

## Bad weather helps as Blaney claims Subway 400 pole

ROCKINGHAM, N.C. (AP) — Dave Blaney won the first pole of his career Friday when most teams chose not to bother with qualifying on a cold, wet day at North Carolina Speedway.

Practice and qualifying were delayed by rain, and with the possibility of more bad weather before the Subway 400 on Sunday, most teams spent Friday's only practice session working on race setups.

It made for lackluster qualifying runs,

with Blaney taking the top spot by turning a lap in the No. 77 Ford at 154.683 mph.

"That's pretty cool," Blaney said. "But Sunday is when it really counts, and that would be really cool."

It was Blaney's first pole in 113 Winston Cup starts. His previous best starting spot was third, last year in Richmond, Va.

"We were a little bit scared coming in because we had a brand new car that we

had never tested or anything," Blaney said. "We had a lot of different stuff than we're used to running."

Johnny Benson, who scored his only Winston Cup victory here last November, qualified second in a Pontiac by turning a lap of 154.553 around Rockingham's high-banked, 1.017-mile oval.

Mark Martin qualified third in the same Ford that finished second here last year. Sterling Marlin and Bill Elliott qualified

fourth and fifth in Dodges.

Ricky Craven was sixth in a Pontiac, and was followed by rookie Jamie McMurray, Rusty Wallace and Dale Jarrett.

Bobby Labonte was the highest-qualifying Chevrolet at 10th, a dropoff after the Monte Carlos dominated at Daytona.

Martin, admittedly surprised to see the Chevys struggling, said he was confident the Monte Carlos would give his Ford a strong challenge Sunday.

## Focus back in ring after bizarre week

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Eight months after Lennox Lewis gave him a brutal beating, Mike Tyson returns to the same ring Saturday night trying to resurrect his career against a fellow ex-con who has trouble staying upright.

After a silly week that did more to spark interest in the fight than it deserves, the newly tattooed Tyson goes into the ring in desperate need of a spectacular knockout if he wants future fights with Lennox Lewis or Evander Holyfield.

If Tyson can't beat Etienne, it could be the beginning of the end for a tumultuous yet always interesting reign of a man who was once the most feared heavyweight around.

The fight is scheduled for 10 rounds, but if it goes that far, even Tyson's handlers acknowledge they may have to reassess the fighting future of the puncher who once terrorized the division.

"He not only has to win, but he has to win strong," said Showtime executive Jay Larkin, whose network has helped bankroll Tyson's fights since he was released from prison in 1995.

To ensure that he does win, promoters came up with what they believe to be a perfect opponent in Etienne — a raw fighter who stands in front of his opposition and isn't afraid to trade punches.

Even better is that Etienne tends to go down after he's hit with

those punches — seven times in one fight alone against soft-hitting Fres Oquendo.

"Contrary to what people say, he can take a punch," said Les Bonano, Etienne's manager. "He can take one on the chin. It's when he gets off balance and gets hit in the temple, that's a different story."

Etienne shouldn't have much trouble spotting Tyson's temple. On the left side is a tattoo inspired by a Maori tribal design that's supposed to indicate Tyson is a warrior.

No one doubts that, but he's an aging warrior who was beaten and battered before being stopped in the eighth round by Lewis on June 8. Tyson took his beating

like a man, but it raised questions about his future in a division now populated by heavyweights much bigger than he is.

"I know how to fight," Tyson said. "I'm just going in there to do my thing."

The 36-year-old Tyson managed to land only 49 punches against Lewis and seemed unable to throw more than one punch at a time. But Lewis fought on the outside, while Etienne will be right in front of Tyson and ready to be hit.

Still, Tyson didn't train for a week because of various illness and ailments — both real and imagined — and his trainer was concerned he could look bad if he doesn't get an early knockout. He was forced to spar two days

before the fight, making the fight itself more of an extended sparring session than a real bout.

"I'm worried about his conditioning if the fight goes into the later rounds," Freddie Roach said.

Though the public hasn't lost its fascination with the youngest fighter to win the heavyweight title 17 years ago, even Tyson (49-4, 43 knockouts) knows his time may be running out if he can't stop Etienne.

Assuming he does — and oddsmakers make him a 4-1 favorite — Tyson has a guaranteed rematch with Lewis and a potentially lucrative third fight with Evander Holyfield.

The fight is expected to begin about 9:30 p.m. (CST).

## Jordan drops 43 on New Jersey

WASHINGTON (AP) — Even at 40, Michael Jordan can score his age.

Jordan became the first 40-year-old player in NBA history to score 40 or more Friday night, getting 43 points in 43 minutes in the Wash-

ington Wizards game.

"I don't feel like 40," Jordan said. "I feel good. I feel like I can compete, and on certain nights I can compete with the best."

"My effort's always going to be young, no matter how you look at it. My desire to win is always going to be young. My love for the game is always going to be young. My body may say 40, but those other things are going to be young always — and I think that was an example of that tonight."

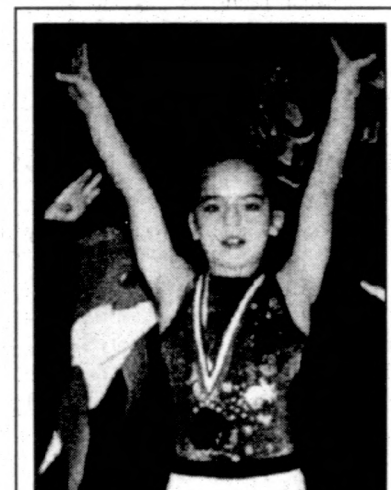
Four days after his 40th birthday, Jordan was 18-of-30 from the field and 7-of-8 from the line. He also had 10 rebounds, four steals and made the hustle move of the night, sprawling on the floor to save the ball after a steal in the first quarter.

And, by the way, he also scored the winning basket, accelerating past the Nets as they attempted to collapse on him with 34 seconds to play. The layup put the Wizards ahead 87-86.

"I'm not sitting there watching — I'm just trying to figure out what we can do to get him out of a groove," New Jersey guard Jason Kidd said. "He's seen everything and been through everything, so once he gets going it's one of the toughest things to get him out of the groove."

The victory came at a crucial time for the Wizards, who had dropped three of four and had just lost their third-leading scorer, Larry Hughes, for three weeks with a sprained ankle. The victory left Washington just percentage points behind Orlando in the race for the eighth and final Eastern Conference playoff spot.

"I told the guys, I've got 28 games left; I'm going down with no bullets," Jordan said. "I'm going all out."

# Abreu thinks about Venezuela

CLEARWATER, Fla. (AP) — Leaving his family behind in troubled Venezuela to go to spring training was difficult for Philadelphia Phillies outfielder Bobby Abreu.

"When I'm on the field, I'll forget about it," he said. "Off the field, I'll think about it because it's my family. I'm always going to be worried."

In recent months, Venezuela has seen dozens of street protests, sporadic political violence and a devastating general strike against President Hugo Chavez that ended Feb. 4. Many of the protests have occurred near Abreu's home in the capital of Caracas.

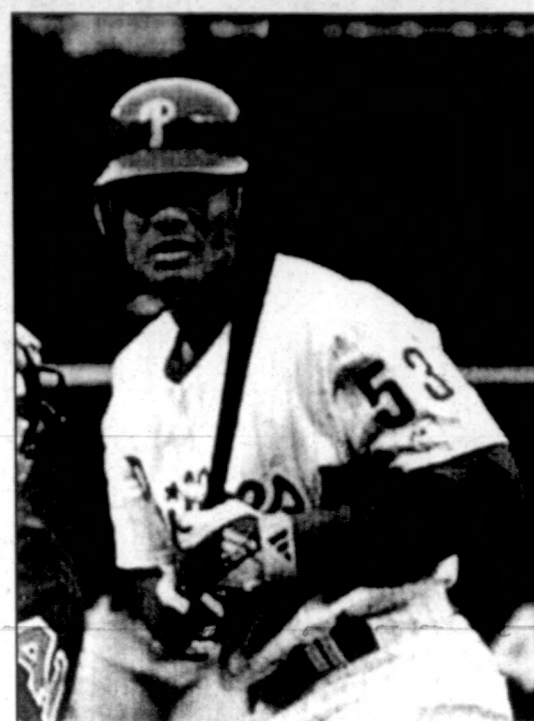
Abreu was scheduled to fly out of the country Tuesday, even after watching violence on television that morning. He even left for the airport, but turned around and drove back home after demonstrators forced a major traffic backup.

"I decided that I shouldn't come," said Abreu, who flew into Florida on Wednesday. "It's very dangerous."

Very popular in his country, Abreu feels it's his duty to play winter baseball. This year, for the first time since reaching the major leagues in 1996, he opted against it.

"I'm always in my house," Abreu said. "I don't go outside. All those (violent) things happen downtown, so I don't leave my house."

Dunn hit 26 homers last season while setting a club record with 170 strikeouts. But he also walked 128 times — third most in the major leagues — and had a .400 on-base percentage.

"I want Adam to be the best hitter he can be, and if he's being selective, it means he's

not chasing bad pitches," Boone said. "You can tell him to expand his strike zone a little bit and hit the ball out of the park if he knows it's a really good pitch to hit, but that's not his style. It's not the way he hits."

KISSIMMEE, Fla. (AP) — Jeff Bagwell feels discomfort whenever he throws.

"I don't care what anybody says or how much money I get paid and all those kind of things, it's not fun going to work at times when you have a problem," Houston's 34-year-old first baseman said.

Screws were inserted into the shoulder before last season.

"Defensively, I'm not able to do all the things I used to be able to do," he said. "That is a little frustrating. I'm getting better and that gives me hope. But, let me tell you, it does get frustrating, there's no question."

Bagwell hit .291 with hitting 31 homers and 98 RBIs.

JUPITER, Fla. (AP) — Carl Pavano could take the No. 3 spot in Florida's starting rotation if he stays healthy.

"Last season was the first in the last four or five years that I finished healthy," the 27-year-old right-hander said. "I want to continue where I left off, work hard and stay healthy and I believe everything will fall into place."

Pavano went 3-2 with a 3.78 ERA for Florida last year after starting 3-8 with a 6.30 ERA for the Expos.

## Selig calling for talks on ephedra

NEW YORK (AP) — Baseball commissioner Bud Selig called Friday for new talks with the players' union to ban ephedra, the nutritional supplement that may have contributed to the death of Baltimore pitcher Steve Bechler.

Bechler died Monday, a day after collapsing at spring training with heatstroke. A Florida medical examiner said the death may have been linked to an ephedra-based diet pill, Xenadrine RFA-1.

While ephedra is banned by the NFL, the NCAA and the International Olympic Committee, use of the substance, which is available without prescription, is allowed in baseball.

During labor bargaining last summer, owners talked about banning ephedra, but they did not include a ban in their proposal after the union told management lawyers that it would not agree to it.

"Selig and the clubs have been consistent in advocating the ban of and testing for all illegal drugs as well as over-the-counter dietary and nutritional supplements that pose a health risk to players," the commissioner's office said in a statement Friday.

"In light of the apparent circumstances surrounding the tragic and untimely death of Baltimore Orioles pitcher Steve Bechler, Major League Baseball and the clubs are prepared to meet with the Major League Baseball Players Association regarding the use or abuse of potentially dangerous dietary and nutritional supplements. Also, we will continue and accelerate our efforts to have Congress ban those substances."

Players have opposed banning any substances that are legal for others to take. The new drug agreement calls for players to be tested for drugs of abuse, such as cocaine, and for illegal anabolic steroids.

Union head Donald Fehr, speaking earlier in the day in Peoria, Ariz., said it was too early to

draw any conclusions on ephedra.

"At some point down the road — I'm not personally familiar with how long it takes — we'll have some scientific reports, which will tell us some things," Fehr said. "We may be able to draw conclusions from that. We may not. We'll just have to wait and see. Obviously, it's something you discuss internally. You take another look at things as circumstances warrant."

Rep. Henry Waxman, the ranking Democrat of the House Committee on Government Reform, sent letters Friday to the heads of the NBA, NHL and Fehr asking why they have not acted to ban ephedra. Waxman sent a similar letter to Selig on Thursday.

Waxman asked Fehr: "What steps have you taken to educate your members about the potential dangers of certain supplements?" and "Will the Major League Baseball Players Association change its policy soon?"

Sandy Alderson, executive vice president for baseball operations in the commissioner's office, said Friday at a conference in Nashville, Tenn., that Congress or the Food and Drug Administration may take action. Alderson said owners initially hoped ephedra would be banned in the new labor deal.

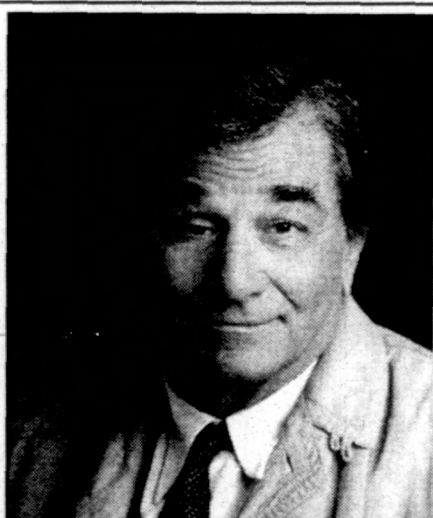

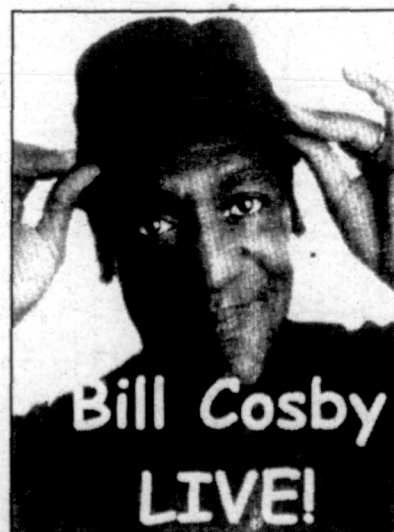

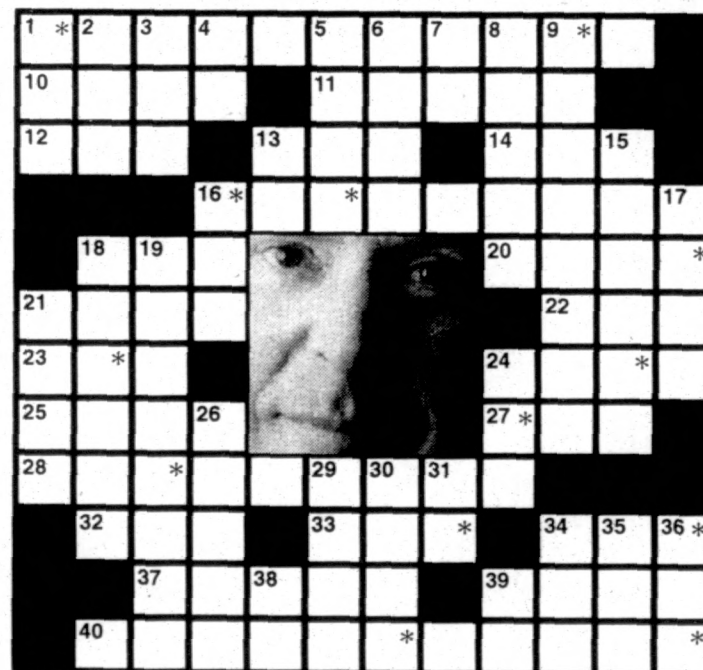
