Killing at St. Charles.

New Ferguson shot and killed Arthur Long Saturday afternoon last at St. Charles, Hopkins county. Later in the afternoon Long attacked Ferguson with a club whereupon Ferguson drew a pistol and fired the ball striking Long in the left breast inflicting a mortal wound. As Long was falling he drew his pistol and fired at Ferguson, but without damage. Long died in a few minutes after being shot. It is reported that Ferguson surrendered to the authorities immediately after the killing, but, of this we are not positive. Long was a former resident of Crofton and has a sister living there now.
