### FAIRDEALING GOES OVER THE TOP IN DRIVE FOR 4-H FUNDS

One community in Marshall County has "gone over the top" in a big way on their quota for the 4-H Camp at Dawson Springs. Each community was assigned a quota based on \$3.00 for each 4-H club member. The Fairdealing area was assessed \$123.00. Their fund-raising committee was composed of E. T. Inman, Dan Gold, Mrs. Buel Edwards, and Mrs. Loman Dotson. They decided on a Fiddlers' Contest as a method of raising the money. So Saturday night, May 24, they staged the biggest Fiddlers' contest ever held in the Fairdealing community and the chairman of the committee reported that the enterprising and forward-looking community had raised over their quota by several dollars. They turned in a report of \$144.00.

The V. F. W. and the American Legion held a joint meeting at the Community Building Tuesday night to make plans for the Memorial Day Observation Program, which will be held at 2:30 P. M. Sunday at the City Park.

The program will honor 83 Marshall County Service men who lost their lives while serving in the armed forces. Twenty-one lost their lives in World War I and 62 in World War II.

Judge Holland G. Bryan, of Paducah will be principal speaker. Invocation will be by Rev. Eldon R. Byrd.

Music will be furnished by the Benton High School Band, and Burnett Holland will act as Chaplain for the service.

### WRECK VICTIM IS BURIED HERE PAST SATURDAY

Joseph David Tatum, 75, of Wichita, Kansas, a former resident of Marshall County, died at 10 A. M. Thursday May 22 in a Skiston, Mo., hospital as a result of injuries suffered in an automobile accident Wednesday at Gray Ridge, Mo.

Mr. and Mrs. Tatum were enroute to Benton to attend the Big Singing when the accident occurred. They were riding in the car with their pastor Rev. Art Wilson, Wichita, who was on his way to attend graduation exercises in North Carolina for his son. They planned to spend three weeks in the country and Rev. Wilson was to pick them up on the return trip to Wichita.

The accident occurred about 5 P. M. Wednesday at Gray Ridge and Mr. and Mrs. Tatum, and Reverend Wilson were admitted to the Skiston Hospital for treatment. Mrs. Tatum was reported as critically injured and the Reverend Wilson was treated for minor injuries.

Funeral services were held at 2 P. M. Saturday, May 24 at the Filbeck-Cann Chapel here with Reverend Wilson and Rev. P. D. Davis conducting the services. Burial was in the Briensburg Cemetery.

Survivors include the widow Mrs. Dora Shepherd Tatum, of Wichita, three brothers, Julius R. Tatum, Kewell, Ky., Will Tatum, Wichita and Harry Tatum, of Texas; one half sister, Mrs. Clemmie Park of Benton.

### REP. MCCALLUM TO BE HONORED AT A. D. A. DINNER

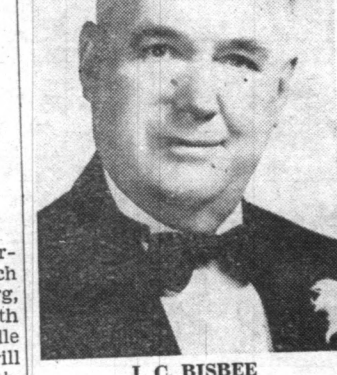

Sec. 1: Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Benton, that the dumping or depositing of trash or rubbish within the city limits of Benton, except at a previously designated dumping area, is hereby prohibited.

Sec. 2: Any party violating the above ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than Two Dollars (\$2) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each offense.

Each act of dumping or depositing such trash or rubbish shall be considered a separate offense and shall be dealt with in accordance thereof.

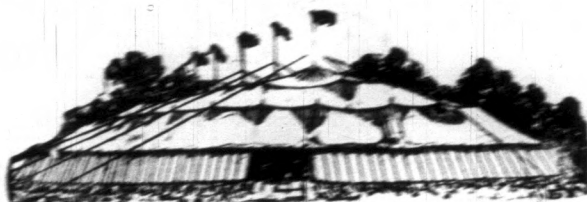


Amos York, Route 4, was a visitor in Benton Friday. While in town, Mr. York dropped by the Courier office and renewed his subscription to the Marshall Courier.

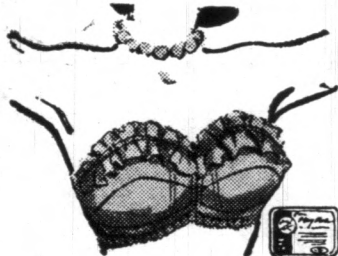
