MGR. EWING

And Hon. Joe Washington Visit Murray In Interest of Association.

General Manager Felix G. Ewing and Hon. Joe Washington were here Monday and both delivered addresses in the afternoon at the court house to a large crowd in the interest of the tobacco association.

Mr. Washington is a splendid speaker and aroused the greatest enthusiasm among his hearers. He pleaded with the growers to remain loyal. He pointed out what the organization had accomplished and declared the dissolution of the association meant ruin to the tobacco producers.

Mr. Ewing spoke for about thirty minutes and reviewed at length the management of the association, giving a full recital in detail. He took up the loose leaf sales question and declared it the greatest fallacy that has arisen in connection with the sale of association tobacco. He was given close attention and his hearers were pleased with his remarks. It was his second visit to Murray and the great crowd here Monday was glad to meet and welcome him.

After the speaking a petition signed by about fifty farmers was presented asking for the privilege of selling through other than the regular association channels. The petition will be presented by Mr. Ewing to a meeting of the board of directors to be held at an early date and the question finally adjusted by that body.

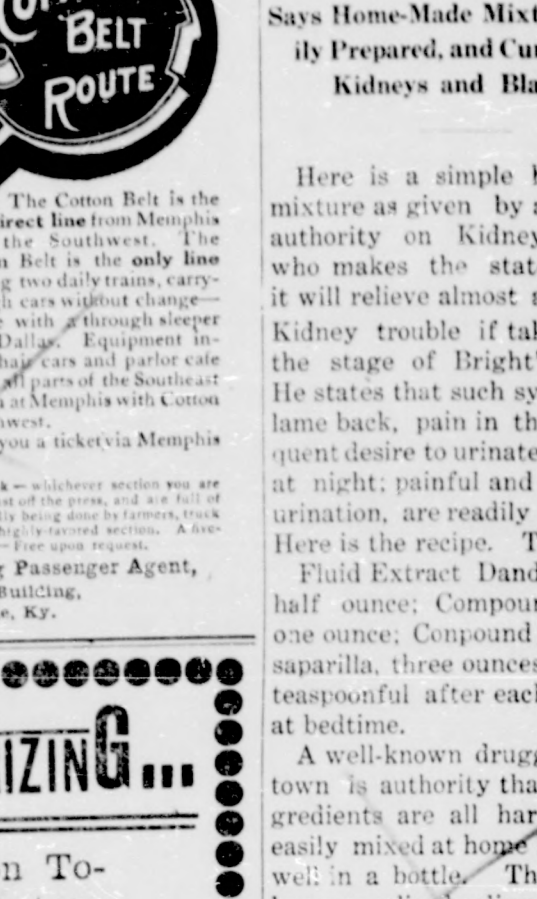
