## Governor's Tour Slated For Aug. 9-10

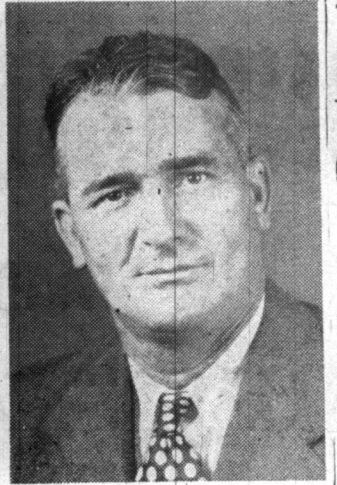

## Atomic Plumbing Helps To Locate Leaks In Pipes

Milwaukee — Atomic plumbing is here.  
Robert P. Honold, secretary of the Wisconsin Master Plumbers Association, said some plumbing contractors are using radioactive isotopes to find leaks in plumbing.  
Honold said radioactive iodine is injected into piping and the plumber uses a Samsom meter — apparently the plumber's version of the Geiger counter — to find any leaks.  
The leak can be pinpointed to a small area by the atomic method, thus saving floors and walls that would have to be ripped up to find leaks by ordinary methods, Honold said.

**RECIPE OF THE WEEK**

**LEMON PUDDING**

1 tablespoon gelatin  
1-4 cup cold water  
1 cup milk  
3 egg yolks  
2-3 cup sugar  
1-4 teaspoon salt  
1-2 teaspoon grated lemon rind  
1-2 cup lemon juice  
3 egg whites  
1 cup vanilla wafer crumbs

Soak the gelatin in cold water. Scald the milk in double boiler. Beat egg yolks and gradually add sugar and salt. Add hot milk to the egg mixture. Return to double boiler and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Pour into a pan lined with vanilla wafer crumbs. Sprinkle crumbs over the top and set in refrigerator to congeal. Makes six to eight servings.
