## County Fire Plan Favored

The December meeting of the board of supervisors of the Marshall County Soil Conservation District was held last Monday afternoon. Board members present were Renloe Rudolph, Eura Mathis, Sam Gold, and J. M. Solomon.

Others present were County Judge Leonard Jones, Homer Miller, John Shemwell, "Red" Burroughs, Loyd Collier and Herbert Anderson.

The guest speaker was Ralph Nelson, district forester, from Mayfield. Nelson explained the existing laws on forests fires in the state. Also, he explained how Marshall County could get an organized fire fighting system.

Nelson said the cost of the project would be about six cents per woodland acre. The people who own timber land will have to pay two cents for each acre of timber. The state will pay the remaining four cents.

The people must decide whether they want this help from the state. This decision must then be made known to the magistrates who will then vote for the fire fighting project.

Before adjournment, the board of supervisors went on record as favoring this project and to petition the fiscal court to vote approval of this protection.

The petition follows:  
WHEREAS, approximately two to three thousand acres of valuable woodland were burned in 1952, and

WHEREAS, several farm buildings were destroyed, and

WHEREAS, the leaf litter covering and protecting the soil was burned, leaving the soil bare and subject to erosion, and

WHEREAS, realizing the need for an organized system of fire protection, Therefore, we, the supervisors of the Marshall County Soil Conservation District hereby petition the fiscal court of Marshall County to vote in favor of a fire protection system for the county. Such a system being offered and two-thirds or more financed by the State Division of Forestry.

## Community Bldg. Operation Talked

The City Park Commission and members of civic clubs met Monday night at City Hall and discussed ways and means of raising funds for the upkeep of the Community Building.

Lophus Hiett, Park Commission chairman, presided. H. H. Lovett Sr., retiring chairman, said that upkeep of the Community Building cost \$860 per year and that the Park Commission had no funds to pay the upkeep.

In a round table discussion, it was decided to ask as many civic clubs as possible to hold their dinner meetings at the Community Building. The Park Commission would receive a fee of 10 to 25 cents per person per meal. This charge would be above the price of the meal itself.

Delegates from the Lions and Rotary Clubs agreed to take the proposal before their clubs to pay a fee of 25 cents per meal to the Park Commission. The Junior and Senior Women's Clubs and the Benton home-makers would pay 10 cents per person per meal.

Funds raised in this manner would pay all but about \$200 of

the annual upkeep cost of the Community Building.

The Park Commission will continue to rent the Community Building for private parties, such as singings, square dances and conventions, to raise additional funds. The charge for private parties would be a flat rate.

To rent the building for a private party, it was stressed, the Park Commission chairman must be contacted and reservations made.

This is to avoid conflict in renting the building to more than one party for the same evening. Rent for the building for private parties is payable in advance.

The group decided to meet again on Dec. 22 and report on the progress made toward getting the civic groups to meet at the building.

## Wreck Ties Up Traffic

Two accidents on the Clark's River Bridge early last Saturday night tied up traffic on Highway 68 for more than an hour.

Eight vehicles were involved in the two accidents, which were caused by a coating of ice on the bridge and the lack of caution on the part of drivers, said State Trooper Billy Watkins.

Watkins and State Trooper Duck Erieh halted traffic over the bridge until the wreckage was completely cleared and the State highway department could scatter cinders on the ice and make the road safe for motorists.

The first accident occurred at 5:20 p. m. Involved were three autos and a ton and half dump truck. The dump truck was driven by L. W. Lyons of Murray. The cars were driven by Buin F. Edwards of Paducah, Harold S. Smith of Benton Route 5 and James L. Ford of Benton Route 7.

The second accident was caused by drivers plowing into the wreckage of the first accident because they couldn't stop their vehicles on the ice-coated road.

Involved in the accident were Conrad D. Carr of Murray, Marvin J. Collins of Paducah, John Clement Keeley of Owensboro and Donald L. Rudolph of Schemm, N. Y.

Three of the automobiles in the two accidents were badly damaged and had to be hauled into Benton by wreckers. The other vehicles were damaged to a lesser degree.

The wrecked and damaged cars littered the bridge and Brien Troopers Watkins and Brien worked furiously to clear the highway and get traffic moving.

Traffic piled up for more than a half mile on either side of the bridge waiting to get through.

## BETTER MAIL BOXES

While you are getting things in shape for  
 the long winter months ahead, if you live on a  
 rural route, don't fall to give your mail man  
 a break and fix up that mail box so he can give  
 you prompt service in all kinds of weather.

Most important, be certain to ask your mail  
 carrier what improvements your box needs.  
 After all, he is the fellow who serves your  
 box 365 days a year in good weather and bad  
 and he knows what the problem is. There may  
 be an irritating problem about your box that  
 you have never thought about, but that can be  
 corrected in a few minutes.

Be sure to have a good box to protect your  
 mail from the weather.

Place the box where the postmen can drive  
 up close to it. An arm gets mighty wet reach-  
 ing boxes on rainy days, and there are lots of  
 rainy days in winter.

Top of the box should not be more than 55  
 inches nor less than 48 inches high. You can  
 judge this by the height of your car window.

But, above all, ask your carrier what im-  
 provements your mail box needs before you  
 start!
