An Old Negro Woman Secures a Pension From Uncle Sam.  
"Is it a lotter here?"  
The question attracted the attention of a reporter yesterday to a negro woman, old and decrepit, but neatly dressed and with the traditional rag tied around a head silvered over by the frosts of years.  
The look of dejection on her answered in the negative by the clerk at the postoffice window, aroused the sympathy of the reporter and he proceeded to investigate. It was found that she was looking for a pension after five years' notice, notification of the arrival of which she had just received. Going to Maj. Breathitt's office she secured his assistance and after considerable search and questioning he located the letter containing the check had been placed in Judge Landess' box, he being a pension agent. The announcement that the money was here wrought a great change in the old woman's face. Her eyes brightened, her hands trembled and she arose from her chair with much difficulty, forgetting in the excitement of the moment her bonnet and bundles.  
"I know'd it was here; cause Mr. Breathitt said so. I know'd it" and she hobbled off to the bank with the Major, and with her trembling fingers made her mark to the paper which drew \$74 bank pay from the government and a monthly pension of \$12.  
Her name is Ethelinda Leavelle, and her son Alexander was killed in service. She lives at Casey and this sum will enable her to live in comfort of the short span of life allotted to her in comparative ease and comfort.

A short telegraphic announcement merely the fact of the death of Thos. Rice, brother of Mrs. John L. Brasher, of this city, appeared in the New Era last week, but the particulars were not obtainable. The Hartford Herald says of it:  
Thomas J. Rice, of Hixedale, Mulberry county, was hurt by a mule he was shoeing Wednesday evening of last week, and died from the injuries on Thursday morning, the 16th inst., at about 8 o'clock. He lived about fifty hours.  
The mule belonged to the Coal Co., of that place. He had put the shoe on the mule and was holding up one of its legs to shoe the nail, when the mule reared up and threw the man who was holding it and threw Mr. Rice, but not flat down. The beast standing over him, struck him near the right temple, cutting an ugly hole, as large as a man's little finger, in the skull, and strange to say, not only fractured but broke the skull. Strange, because of the fact that he afterwards washed his hands and face and went to Morton's store and saw Dr. Stuart and had his dress wound and the place where he was hurt until 8 o'clock the next morning.  
Mr. Rice became worse about midnight and died at 8 o'clock, in a comatose condition. He did not regain consciousness and never realized his condition.
