Weight-loss competition shifts to new hospital-vs-city battle

The recent weight-loss competition between Murray-Calloway County Hospital executives Jerry Penner and John Wilson is spurring yet another battle ... this time between the hospital and the City of Murray.

Monday, Penner, the hospital's president and CEO learned he had won his contest — kickoff to the hospital's campus-wide Walk It Off initiative — against Wilson, the vice president of human resources, by a narrow margin, losing 7.93 percent of his beginning weight (244 pounds) compared to Wilson's 6.23 percent loss (after starting at 224). Penner's reward was having the opportunity to hit his opponent in the face with a pie, which he did in a ceremony several hospital personnel witnessed.

It is not known if a pie will be involved with the next competition, but a prize of some type will be rewarded to the winner as employees of the hospital and the City of Murray team up in a six-week fight to see which side can lose the most pounds.

"I welcome it," said Mayor Bill Wells Thursday. "We started our own wellness initiative two years ago and I remember that in the first year, our team lost a total of 250 pounds. We went around saying that there are a couple of other people walking around with the weight that we lost. It was amazing. We're glad to participate in this and I applaud (the hospital) for this initiative."

Like Penner and Wilson, though, it appears Wells is also putting himself in a bit of a spotlight for this activity as a way of setting the example as its highest-ranking officer.

"From my standpoint, I need to do this," he said. "This is important. It's awfully difficult to get out and exercise, and I can tell you, I can walk a lot farther than I do. This is my 555th day as mayor and I'm in a lot of meetings and we usually don't walk while we're talking about things."

Penner said he has already seen effects of his competition with Wilson spilling over to hospital staff as far as

Paul: Health care law 'invalid' despite ruling

HOPKINSVILLE, Ky. (AP) — U.S. Sen. Rand Paul says despite the U.S. Supreme Court upholding the constitutionality of the Affordable Care Act, he believes the law is "invalid."

The Kentucky Republican's comments came Thursday in Hopkinsville, just a week after he issued a statement saying "Just because a couple people on the Supreme Court declare something to be 'constitutional' doesn't make it so. The whole thing remains unconstitutional."

"The Supreme Court decided. But my opinion hasn't changed. That doesn't mean I don't consider the court to be invalid," Paul said. "The decision stands. And the only way to change it is through another

election." Paul said that four Supreme Court justices ruled the law was unconstitutional, and even though they were in the minority, their position that the health insurance mandate is unconstitutional probably hasn't changed. Paul said just because the court rules something is constitutional doesn't mean that decision won't be reversed in the future. The high court voted 5-4 to uphold the sweeping health care law, saying that Congress

"It was funny because I saw his Youtube video and went into the office and said, 'We have to interview this guy,' and everyone just laughed. About two weeks later he came out on Animal Planet."

Now, the Turtleman has a connection with the University, according to Clark.

"Basically, what we have been doing is trying to get students on campus to tell us what's on their bucketlist," she said. "One student wanted to meet the Turtleman, so I went online and emailed several people and got in contact with someone from Animal Planet, who said it would be no problem to

interview him (the Turtleman.) So we went to Louisville to The Wave news station and hung out with him for a few hours."

Clark said he is exactly like he appears in his television series, and he also talked about his technique and tips for catching turtles. The next event in the bucketlist series will involve a student who wishes to try noodling, which is fishing with nothing but bare hands.

"These things can be really good for students, because we're working with them, and they're getting involved," Clark said. "We're promoting student involvement, and we want students to know we're trying to help them do something they've always wanted to do."

serving as motivation to participate. He estimated that 450 hospital personnel will be in the six-week program.

"Normally, one of these things will attract between 125-130 for a business of our size. That, to me, is extraordinary," Penner said. "And I'm also seeing it outside the community. When I was at a meeting for (Billy Lane Lauffer American Legion) Post 73 a few days ago, I had a person come up to me who had heard about the competition between me and John, and say, 'You have inspired me to do something about my own health.' That makes you feel good to hear someone say that."

"There were no losers in what John and I did; it was win-win (to prove that point, Penner submitted his face to a pie from Wilson as well). And there won't be with what we're doing with the city, either. I'm really pleased that they're in this with us, and I hope they do really, really well, too."

didn't have the power under the Commerce Clause to force everyone to buy health insurance, but could penalize or tax people for not doing so.

The Kentucky New Era reported that Paul said the Supreme Court's decision lifts the limits on what Congress can tax.

Paul also said that there was no logical way to pay for what he called Obamacare when the country is spending \$1 trillion more than it collects every year.

The following counties, listed by Drought Management Area (DMA), meet the criteria to be included in the water watch:

- Barren River DMA – Monroe, Simpson, Warren
- Buffalo Trace DMA – Fleming, Robertson
- Bluegrass DMA – Anderson, Bourbon, Clark, Estill, Fayette, Franklin, Garrard, Harrison, Jessamine, Lincoln, Madison, Mercer, Nicholas, Scott, Woodford
- Cumberland Valley DMA – Whitley
- Green River DMA – Webster
- Kentucky River DMA – Lee, Owsley
- Northern Kentucky DMA – Owen, Pendleton
- Pennyridge DMA – Crittenden

High temperatures combined with precipitation deficits frequently create surges in the demand for water, often exceeding a water supplier's ability to meet that demand. Many communities in the Water Shortage Watch areas have issued local water advisories in response to unusually high demands and reduced raw water supplies. Citizens in the Water Shortage Watch areas should be prepared to reduce water use upon request by their local water supplier.

In areas not included in this Water Shortage Watch, water supply sources remain at acceptable levels, but capacity issues associated with high temperatures and dry conditions have prompted local water advisories in several counties. Citizens across the Commonwealth should heed local water suppliers' requests for water conservation when local advisories are issued.

In all areas of Kentucky, self-supplied individuals on wells or other small sources should avoid excessive water use and report losses of water supply to

their county health department.

State climatologist Stuart Foster said "the combined impact of dry conditions and extremely hot temperatures at this time is causing a one-two punch."

"An exceptionally dry June throughout the state coupled with some record-high temperatures over the past week have caused drought conditions to intensify and spread eastward to cover most of Kentucky," said Foster. "The current situation is reminiscent of 1988, while there are some indications that persistence of the current hot and dry pattern that would trigger comparisons to droughts from the 1930s."

Agriculture has been particularly hard hit in western Kentucky counties.

"The timing of the drought on corn has already and will continue to reduce yields significantly," said University of Kentucky Agricultural Meteorologist Tom Priddy. "Doubled-cropped soybeans are having a difficult time with germination. Ponds are running low for irrigation purposes and watering of livestock. Western and central locations may be near the point where rain would provide little benefit for corn and soybean growth, development and yield."

DOW Drought Coordinator Bill Caldwell said public water suppliers play a vital role in helping drought specialists monitor the drought's progression.

"Water suppliers in the 27-county watch area and throughout the state should closely monitor their supply sources and notify the Division of Water if water shortages occur," said Caldwell.

Kentucky News in Brief

Warnings of potential Medicaid impacts

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — House Republican Leader Jeff Hoover is calling on Gov. Steve Beshear to opt out of one of the more expensive provisions of the federal health care reforms — opening the state's Medicaid program to more people.

Senate Republicans said doing so could add \$500 million in costs to the program that traditionally has served the poor, elderly and disabled.

Beshear has said he hasn't yet made a decision. The additional Medicaid costs could jeopardize the state's ability to pay for other government services.

Under the health care reforms, the federal government would initially cover the increased Medicaid costs. But in future years, part of that cost would shift back to the state.

State Police adding 40 new troopers

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Kentucky State Police troopers are about to welcome a few dozen new colleagues into their ranks.

State police say a graduation and commissioning ceremony is set for Friday morning for 40 new state police troopers.

The ceremony will be at the Frankfort Convention Center. Among the dignitaries attending will be state police Commissioner Rodney Brewer, state Justice and Public Safety Secretary J. Michael Brown and state Court of Appeals Judge Sara Combs.

Berea man missing on Laurel Lake

LONDON, Ky. (AP) — Searchers in southeastern Kentucky are trying to find a man last seen on a small lake after his unoccupied pontoon boat turned up without him.

Laurel County Sheriff John Root says 32-year-old Clarence Holmes of Berea had been on Laurel Lake helping people moor houseboats before a storm hit Thursday.

Waves on the lake were reported to be 7 to 8 feet tall. Root says Holmes was last seen around 3 p.m. EDT Thursday and his boat was found around 9 p.m. EDT near Marshes Branch, about 13 miles west of London.

An initial search of the area Thursday night found no sign of Holmes, but his personal belongings were found inside the boat.

Search resumes for missing mom

BRANDENBURG, Ky. (AP) — Searchers have resumed looking for a mother last seen July 4 in Otter Creek Park near Brandenburg.

Kentucky State Police say 37-year-old Carrie Ruffra entered the park around 1 a.m. EDT Wednesday and the park director found her vehicle parked near a boat ramp leading to the Ohio River around 11:30 a.m. EDT that same day.

While Kentucky State Police said they do not believe Ruffra's disappearance is suspicious, family members said this is not like her.

Family member Michelle Ruffra Broderick told WAVE-TV in Louisville that disappearing without contacting her 10- and 4-year-old children is unlike Ruffra.

Crews began searching for Ruffra on Wednesday and took up the third day of searching Friday morning.

Police: Prosecutor's death to remain a mystery

VERSAILLES, Ky. (AP) — Police in central Kentucky say they'll probably never know what caused a fiery crash that killed a Fayette County prosecutor in May.

Versailles Police Lt. Daniel Clark says the department closed the investigation into first assistant county attorney Brian Mattone's death "a couple of weeks ago" after toxicology tests showed he wasn't using drugs or alcohol before the wreck.

Mattone drove his Toyota 4Runner into a tree and through a plank fence where it burst into flames just after 10 p.m. May 2.

For third straight year, job market is slumping

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. employers added only 80,000 jobs in June, a third straight month of weak hiring that shows the economy is still struggling three years after the recession ended.

The unemployment rate was unchanged at 8.2 percent, the Labor Department said Friday.

The economy added an average of just 75,000 jobs a month in the April-June quarter — one-

third of the pace in the first quarter.

For the first six months of 2012, employers added an average of 150,000 jobs a month. That's fewer than the 161,000 average for the first half of 2011.

Weaker job creation has caused consumers to pull back on spending.

Europe's debt crisis is also weighing on U.S. exports. And

the scheduled expiration of tax cuts at year's end has increased uncertainty for U.S. companies, making many hesitant to hire.

Job creation is the fuel for the nation's economic growth.

When more people have jobs, more consumers have money to spend — and consumer spending

drives about 70 of the economy.

Wartime remains of 6 U.S. airmen located in Laos

WASHINGTON (AP) — Six U.S. airmen missing from a combat mission over southern Laos during the Vietnam War will be buried Monday after their remains were located and identified following a 17-year investigation.

The Defense Department said Thursday the six will be buried in a single casket at Arlington National Cemetery.

Their AC-47D aircraft went down Dec. 24, 1965, after sending a mayday signal.

A U.S.-Lao team located the crash site in 1995, and investigators searched the area four times between 1999 and 2001 but found no human remains. The search resumed in 2010 and 2011, when remains were located. They were identified using dental records and other evidence.

More than 300 American personnel are missing from Laos, where the U.S. bombed supply lines of communist guerrillas fighting U.S. forces in neighboring Vietnam.

Pope County Sheriff Jerry Suits says a tow boat pilot found the body of 42-year-old Casey Chavez early Thursday. Officials said Chavez was swimming with two of his children Tuesday off Rondo Island when he dove into the river and didn't resurface.

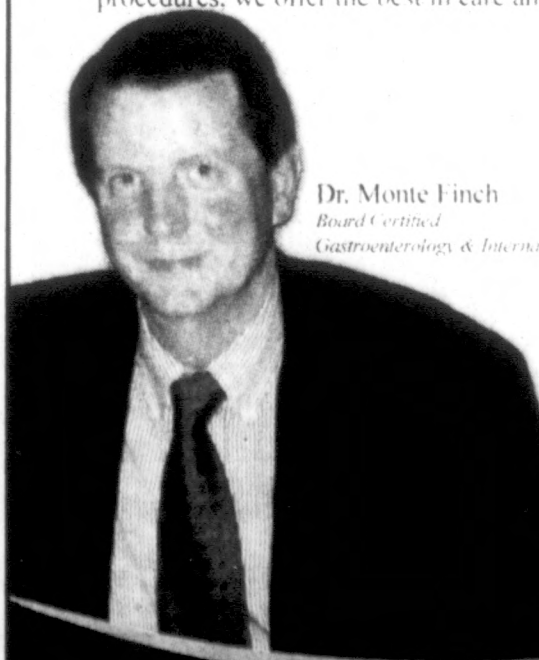

New Greek prime minister lays out plan to Parliament

ATHENS, Greece (AP) — Greece's Prime Minister Antonis Samaras says his new three-party coalition government is ready to carry out a broad series of structural reforms, and acknowledges the country's deficit reduction program has gone off target.

Samaras told Parliament Friday that the government will focus on selling state assets, such as the country's railway company, and liberalizing the energy market.

Greece has been lagging in reforms demanded by its international creditors in return for billions of euros (dollars) in rescue loans.

In presenting his government's policy platform, Samaras also said foreign officials must "stop undermining Greek efforts" with comments about the country potentially leaving Europe's joint currency.

U.S. troops score win against IEDs

WASHINGTON (AP) — Almost afraid to say it out loud, lest they jinx their record, U.S. troops in Afghanistan achieved one small but important victory over the past year: They found and avoided more homemade bombs meant to kill them than a year ago, thanks to a surge in training, equipment and intelligence.

Bomb-planters have picked up the pace during the summer, planting improvised explosive devices (IEDs) along roads or footpaths. But the explosives are no longer the leading cause of death and injury in Afghanistan.

In the first three months of this year, only 5 percent of the bombs planted across Afghanistan hit their mark, said Lt. Gen. Michael Barbero, director of the Pentagon's Joint IED Defeat Organization. That's down from 10 to 12 percent over the same three-month period a year ago.

The new figures released to The Associated Press show a decline, from a high of 368 IED deaths in 2010 to 252 in 2011, according to the privately run icasualties.org. That decrease has happened even as the military has begun to withdraw its surge of 30,000 troops, scheduled to be complete by September. Troops are often more vulnerable as they withdraw from an area.

Officials concede that the rate of bombs that cause casualties has risen slightly from April through June, as NATO troops attacked Taliban-held areas in a return to heavy fighting. But the year is on track to be lower still than each of the previous three years, with 77 deaths from IEDs so far out of 162 total troops killed, halfway through 2012, according to icasualties.org.

Barbero credits the slow turnaround to three years of an

increase in intelligence-gathering equipment such as towers and aircraft outfitted with an array of cameras and other detection technology that have given U.S. commanders an edge, enabling them to spot the bombers as they approach often-traveled routes or revealing the signs of freshly dug earth where the explosives have been buried.

They installed "towers and balloons that give you persistent stare" to spot the Taliban trying to bury a bomb or approach a base in a bomb-laden car at fast speed, Barbero said. "Every commander told us (they) love those, because they can see (the threat) and take action."

Training is the second key factor — teaching the troops how to use devices such as a hand-held remote robot with a camera that they can throw over a wall, then wheel around, checking if the coast is clear and trying to see whether the area shows tell-tale signs of being mined with explosives. The IED organization focused last year especially on equipment to help foot patrols, because so many troops were losing limbs, Barbero said. They rushed hundreds of devices into the field that are like a window washer's telescoping pole, repurposed with a hook on the end, to probe for hidden bombs on footpaths.

That welcome trend is tempered by the looming drawdown of troops from Afghanistan by 2014, which will spell tough choices for commanders trying to balance keeping enough combat troops on the ground to challenge the Taliban with keeping enough intelligence support teams on the ground to keep combat troops safe. Then once the troops draw down, the small numbers of special operations forces and intelligence teams left behind will have to rely on smaller numbers still manning the sensors in the sky.

Death certificate: Griffith died of heart attack

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) — The death certificate for Andy Griffith says the actor's death earlier this week was caused by a heart attack.

The certificate says the 86-year-old had suffered the attack 24 hours before he died at 7 a.m. Tuesday. It also says he had suffered for years from other illnesses, including coronary artery disease, hypertension and hyperlipidemia, which can be a form of high cholesterol or high

triglycerides.

Griffith's death certificate was filed Thursday with the vital records office in Dare County. It says he's buried in the Griffith Family Cemetery in Manteo. Dr. Johnny Farrow of Manteo signed the certificate.

Griffith was best known for playing Sheriff Andy Taylor in "The Andy Griffith Show," which aired from 1960 to 1968. He was born in Mount Airy and lived in Manteo.

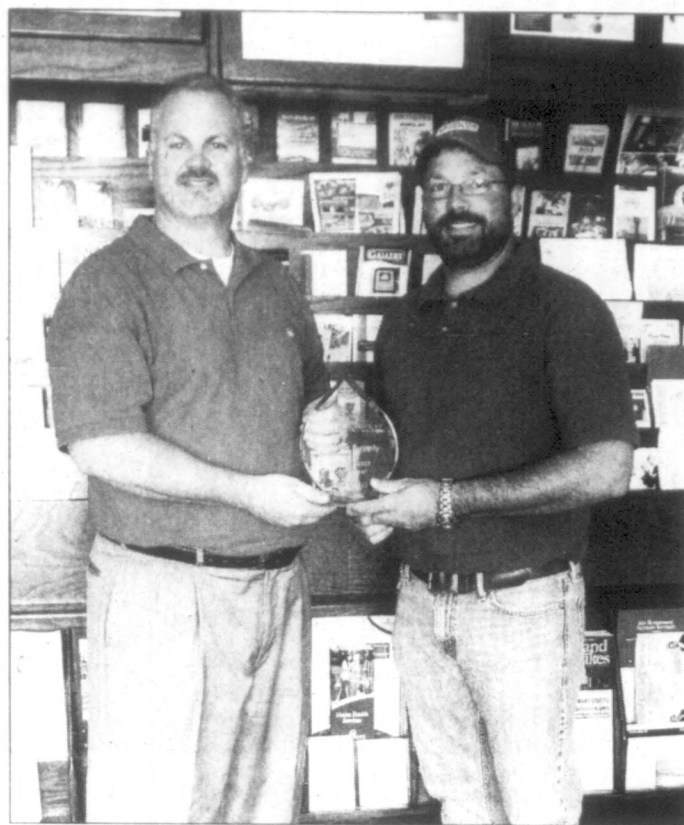

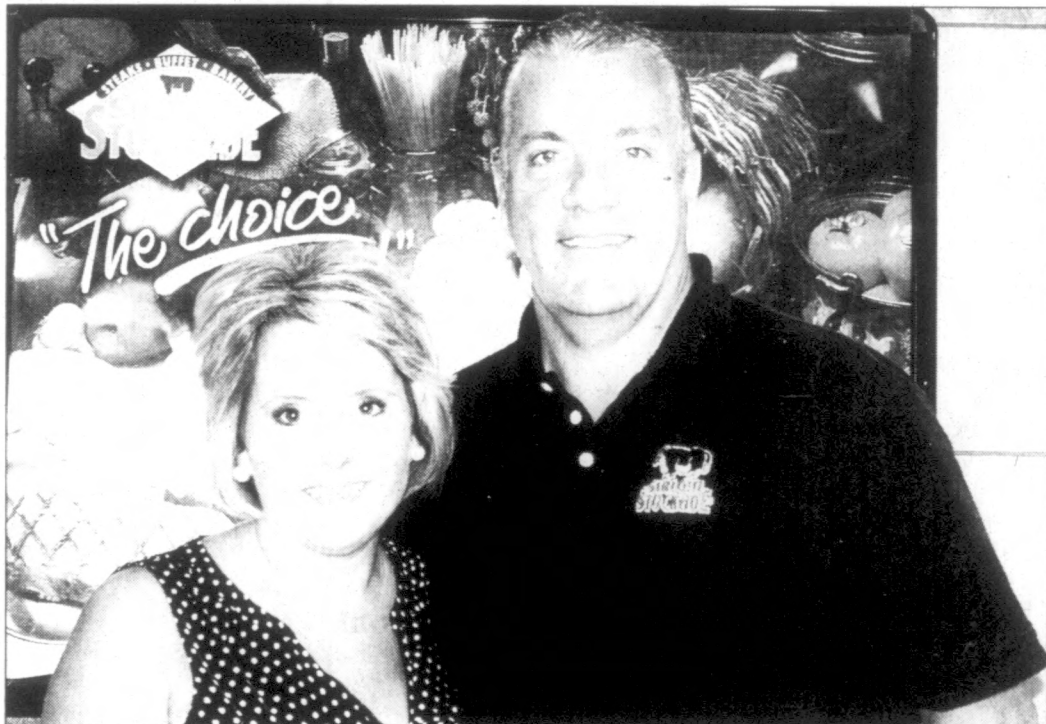

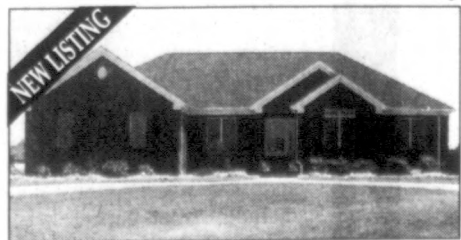
chise meeting held at Lake Tahoe.

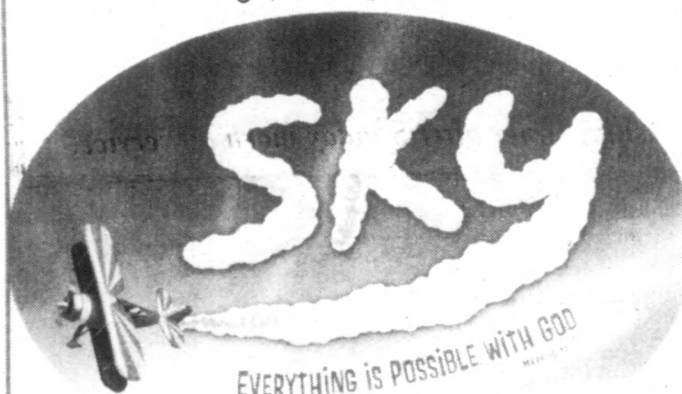

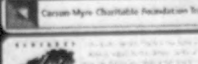

Navigate around stump beds carefully

It is still too hot to fish past noon but we can sure cool off as needed by traveling from place to place.

I have some solid proof of what the Jackson family can do when they start fishing for bluegill and larger shellcrackers. We have several miles of excellent habitat one could fish without being disturbed depending on the force of the winds. Hundreds of coves and pockets with creek channels which provide cover and food for all species during the warm weather even if you only want to see the wild birds nesting.

Yes, we are truly blessed with so much wildlife for all ages to see and admire throughout the year.

I have forgotten the actual count of bird species that we see each year as they come from all directions to build their nests but once these hundreds of thousands arrive and choose a nesting site, it is constant music from daylight until darkness falls. I probably have more bird photos than anything else.

Now that the bridge has been repaired, anglers are on the move looking for bass, bluegill, shellcrackers, catfish, crappie, white and yellow striped bass and three or four species of big fish which have the red stripes down the length of their heads.

The elevation is not as high as normal due to the drought but without any rainfall we may not need to fish the shallow areas of the bays. I'm sure the water temperature is plenty warm in the shallow bays to be sure so you can search for any signs of young baitfish traveling about further out on the flats and around the old brush-piles you placed earlier in the spring.

One of the most dangerous things you can do is run your boat down the old original stump beds from when the lake was being created. They are there by the dozens and they can take your engine and flip it up and over into your boat. Please pay attention to this because it is for real. Some ledges are along the west side of the river channel and the big stumps are still there just barely under the surface. Especially between the mouth of Blood River along the edge of the river the stumps are there and dead.

I cannot understand why the corp. of engineers haven't removed these hazards. The tourists especially, do not know how to navigate through these stumps so beware if you don't know either.

Hopefully the young fry will be out and about soon to help attract the largemouth and smallmouth bass to begin feeding in these shallow areas. There is nothing more fun than locating schools of fish on the surface eating everything in sight. It is always a long time to get the stripers on the surface chasing the shad fingerlings. However, it is some of the most fun to teach your family how to fish this way. Remember dad, if you teach your family how to fish the proper way, you will always have partners to go with you.

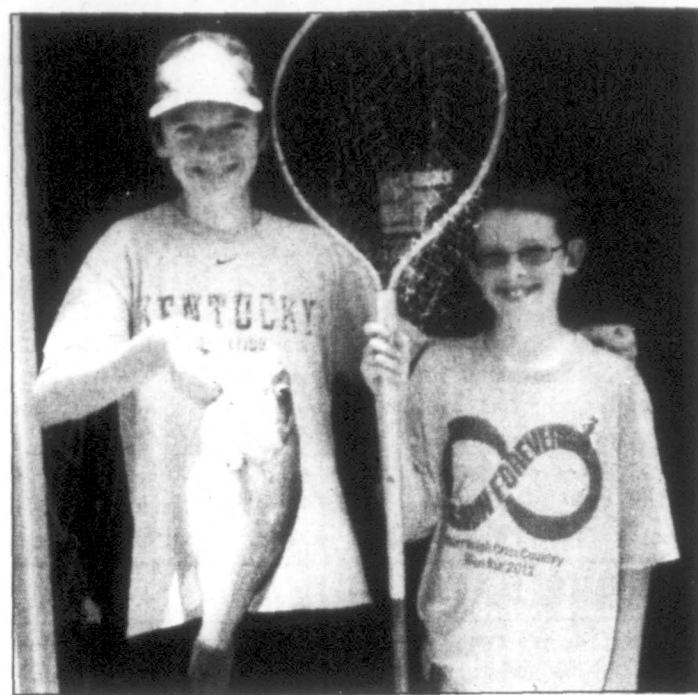

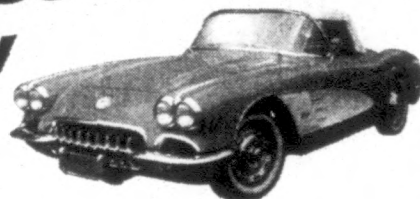

Deer hunting applications now available

GOLDEN POND, Ky.—Applications for the 2012 Quota Deer Hunts at Land Between the Lakes (LBL) National Recreation Area may be submitted July 1-31, either online at www.lbl.org or by phone at (270) 924-2065. The application fee is \$5 online, or \$7 by phone. After applying, applicants can check back in late August to see if they were drawn.

Quota hunts provide unique recreational opportunities within the LBL region and help

maintain a healthy deer population. Deer harvested on LBL are bonus deer and do not count toward statewide bag limits. All quota hunt permits will be either-sex permits and there is an LBL-wide one (1) antlered buck limit.

Both adult and youth hunts will be available, along with a limited quota bow hunt in the Kentucky portion. The youth hunt is for hunters under age 16 in the Kentucky portion, and ages 6-16 in Tennessee. Youth hunters must possess a state-approved hunter safety card, according to state regulations. Youth not required to have a hunter safety card must carry a signed safety verification form available on LBL's website. Each youth must be accompanied by an adult at least 21 years old who meets hunter safety requirements.

Come Outside and Play at LBL National Recreation Area is managed by the Forest Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture. LBL provides outdoor recreation and environmental education for the public to enjoy. Visitors are encouraged to review the website, www.lbl.org for a Calendar of Events, updates on programs and policies, safety information, maps and temporary trail and road closures. Emma Talley makes cut at Kohler in U.S. Open

PRINCETON PRODUCT BESTS LAST YEAR'S RESULTS, WILL PLAY THIS WEEKEND FOR CHAMPIONSHIP

KOHLER, Wis. — Emma Talley was looking to better herself as a golfer before heading to The University of Alabama for her college career, and currently holds an advantage over soon-to-be teammate Stephanie Meadow after a Talley carded a three-over-par 75 in the second round. Yesterday's fall-off has her score at four over for the weekend, which is nine strokes behind the leader, however she still holds the title of low American amateur.

Talley is now tied for 45th

after beginning the day tied for 24th. Talley missed the cut last year at The Broadmoor Golf Course in Colorado, but has had much more success in Kohler, Wis. this week.

The former Caldwell County star, who won three state championships, carded two birdies, a bogey and a double-bogey in Thursday's first round for a one-over-par 73, but started Friday's round with a bogey before getting back to even par on the day with a birdie on the eighth. Talley bogeyed the ninth, 13th and 14th and finished with four straight pars to end the day and

make the cut for the first time in her career.

Talley can be followed in today's and Sunday's rounds on the LPGA website, also NBC will cover the event beginning at 2 p.m. each day.

As Suzann Pettersen climbed into the lead in the second round of the U.S. Women's Open on Friday, she took some time to admire Michelle Wie's big move into contention.

Pettersen, the Norwegian star ranked sixth in the world, shot a 4-under 68 at Blackwolf Run on Friday and moved to 5 under for the tournament. But Wie was even better on the day, carding a 6-under 66 to move to 4 under and put herself in position to break out of a season-long slump.

Wie was tied with Cristie Kerr, the 2007 Open winner, one

stroke off the lead.

Pettersen was playing in the group directly behind Wie, giving her a pretty good view of what turned out to be an impressive display of accurate approach shots and made putts.

"She was fist-pumping, every putt she looked at," Pettersen said.

Wie said she doesn't spend much time thinking about the attention she received as a high-profile child prodigy in the early 2000s, or whether some fans had written her off since then.

"I don't know if anyone gave up on me or not," Wie said. "I'm sure some did and some didn't. But I never gave up on myself, and today was a good reminder to myself that I can do (it) and I still have it."

Kerr, who was tied for the first-round lead at 3 under with

Lizette Salas and Brittany Lincicome, had a 71.

"I always draw on that experience, of course, but it's hard to predict what's an advantage and what's not an advantage," Kerr said of her previous Open win. "You just don't know."

Sandra Gal, Inbee Park and Vicky Hurst shot 70 to reach 3 under.

Salas, a 22-year-old recent Southern California graduate, had a 73 to drop to 2 under. Mika Miyazato also was 2 under after a 71.

Lincicome had a miserable day, shooting an 80 on Friday to fall to 5 over.

"I did nothing right today," Lincicome said. "I couldn't drive the ball. I couldn't do anything right. I couldn't putt."

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Ricky Nolasco allowed an unearned run in six innings and Jose Reyes got the go-ahead RBI with an infield hit in the seventh, leading the Miami Marlins to a 3-2 victory over the St. Louis Cardinals on Friday.

Logan Morrison added his second home run in three games in the eighth for the Marlins, who won their third in a row and beat the Cardinals for just the second time in the last 10 meetings. St. Louis was 2 for 16 with runners in scoring position, stranding five at third base to frustrate a sellout crowd that waited patiently in a game that began in 103-degree heat.

Fans had to settle for a great view of the Fair St. Louis fireworks display on the Mississippi River waterfront — easily visible over the scoreboard in right-center — that began right before Reyes beat out a slow roller down the third-base line to break a 1-all tie.

David Freese had three hits and an RBI for the Cardinals, production that was offset when he committed two errors and nearly had a third in a sloppy sixth that allowed the Marlins to tie it. Freese, picked to his first All-Star Game on Thursday, entered with five errors in 76 games.

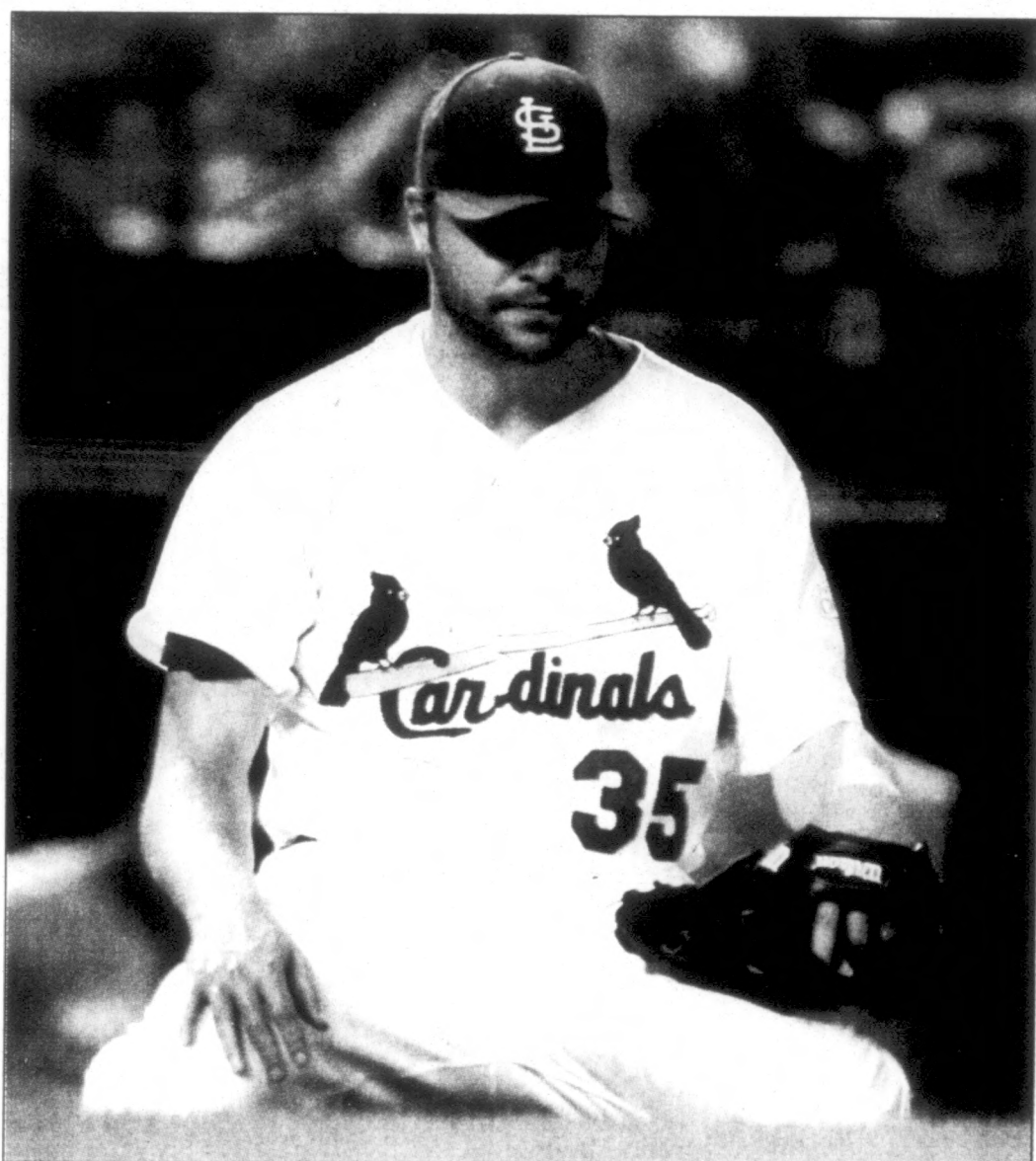

Heath Bell allowed pinch-hitter Skip Schumaker's leadoff double and a one-out, run-scoring infield hit by Rafael Furcal in the ninth before finishing for his 19th save in 24 chances. He entered 0-3 with an 8.83 career ERA against St. Louis, and 0-3 with a 6.23 ERA on the road this season with four blown saves in 11 opportunities.

Jake Westbrook (7-7) allowed two runs, one earned, in 6 2-3 innings. He had the Cardinals' third error with a wild throw on Reyes' soft tapper not far from the plate.

Nolasco gave up nine hits but got the big outs when it counted against the Cardinals, holding them to 1 for 11 with runners in scoring position. The right-hander beat the Cardinals for the first time in five career decisions, two starts after allowing an unearned run in 6 2-3 innings but got no decision in an 8-7 loss to St. Louis in Miami.

Freese made a nice stop on Reyes' smash to start the inning, righted himself and then pulled first baseman Allen Craig off the bag with a high throw. The Cardinals settled for a forceout the next at-bat when Hanley Ramirez and pulled second baseman Daniel Descalso so far off the bag

Mickelson, Woods miss cut at Greenbrier

U.S. OPEN CHAMPION SIMPSON HOLDS 36-HOLE LEAD AT 9 UNDER

WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS, W.Va. (AP) — One week after he won for the third time this season, Tiger Woods gets a rare weekend off.

Woods missed the cut in the Greenbrier Classic by a stroke Friday, following an opening 71 with a 69 to finish at even par. He missed a cut for only the ninth time in his PGA Tour career, and for the third time in a tournament following a victory.

After winning Sunday at Congressional, Woods was on a course he'd never seen before.

"I didn't quite have it," Woods said. "I drove it really good today and I just did not have the feel for the distances. The ball was just going forever."

I know we're at altitude, but I just couldn't get the ball hit pin high no matter what I did, and subsequently, I made some bogeys."

Phil Mickelson also failed to advance to weekend play, the first time Woods and Mickelson have missed the cut in the same tournament as professionals.

Mickelson shot his second straight 71.

U.S. Open champion Webb Simpson topped the leaderboard at 9 under when play was suspended because of darkness in the round that was delayed because of rain.

Simpson made a 6-foot birdie putt on the par-3 18th for a 4-under-66.

A dozen players were unable to complete the round.

Woods believes his distance control will be easy to work on

heading to the British Open, which starts July 19 at Royal Lytham and St. Annes.

"Yeah, because it's not going to be this warm and we're not going to be at altitude. We'll be on the beach," he said.

After the rain delay, Woods had bogeys at Nos. 10 and 11 to fall to 3 over, then made three birdies down the stretch but missed two other tries from inside 12 feet.

The other times that Woods followed a win with a missed cut came in 2005 at Disney and in 2009 at the British Open. Both those times he took a week off after his wins.

When Woods was an amateur, he and Mickelson missed the cut in the 1993 Byron Nelson.

Mickelson had focused more on golf at this year's tournament after taking advantage of the resort's numerous amenities with his family last year. The

Allen to Heat, takes less money for chance at championship

MIAMI (AP) — Ray Allen will take less money for a chance at another NBA championship.

Allen told the Miami Heat on Friday night that he intends to accept their contract offer and leave Boston after five seasons, even though the Celtics could pay him about twice as much as the reigning NBA champions will be able to next season. Miami could only offer Allen the mini mid-level, worth about \$3 million a year.

Heat owner Micky Arison tweeted the news just after 9:30 p.m. — or about 2:30 a.m. Saturday in Europe, where Arison has been for several days.

"I was just woken up with great news," Arison wrote. "Welcome to the family." Arison ended the tweet by making mention of Allen's jersey No. 20, and did not mention the NBA's leading 3-point shooter by name.

A person briefed on details of the decision told The Associated Press that Arison got the word from Heat President Pat Riley, who made Allen the team's top free-agent priority — especially

in recent days. Allen, who will be 37 this month, arrived in Miami on Thursday for a visit, went to dinner with Riley, coach Erik Spoelstra, team executive Alonzo Mourning and others Thursday night, then left Friday to presumably decide his future.

Hours later, the choice was made. Allen's agent, James Tanner, confirmed the decision to The Associated Press not long after Arison's tweet.

Allen cannot officially sign until Wednesday because of the league's moratorium.

Allen becomes the latest player to be sold by Riley on the notion of sacrifice since the blockbuster summer of 2010. The Heat convinced LeBron James, Dwyane Wade and Chris Bosh all to take less money than they could have made elsewhere in that offseason, so there would be enough room left to add players like Udonis Haslem, Mario Chalmers and Mike Miller. Then last summer, Shane Battier accepted a deal that will pay him \$3 million annually.

The approach clearly worked. Next fall, the Heat will raise a championship banner, and Allen will be with them for the title defense.

result was the same.

"I was confident last year, I'm confident this year," Simpson said. "I don't think a whole lot has changed. I learned a lot about myself in the final round last year. I think I was only one back on the final round. So I've got a long ways to go, a bunch of good players right there."

Simpson had four birdies in a bogey-free round. Two of the

birdies came after the rain delay.

Rookie Charlie Beljan (62), Jonathan Byrd (68), Jeff Maggert (68) and Jerry Kelly (66) also were 8 under.

First-round leader Vijah Singh shot 74 to drop six strokes back.

Thompson shot a 73 to top the group at 1 under.

Top-ranked Yani Tseng was 2 over after a 72.

Second-ranked Stacy Lewis recovered from a first-round 77 to shoot a 69 on Friday, putting her 2 over. Third-ranked Ai Miyazato, the winner last week in Arkansas, was even par after a 74.

Defending champion So Yeon Ryu shot a 71 and was 1 over.

Se Ri Pak, the Open winner at Blackwolf Run in 1998, also was 1 over after a 73.

Seeing Wie's name near the top of the leaderboard will ring a bell with casual golf fans, even if they haven't heard from her in a while.

Wie was 12 years old when she qualified for an LPGA Tour event in 2002 — making her at the time the youngest player ever to do so. She went on to

compete in a handful of men's tournaments, but never turned her early stardom into consistent success. She has two career LPGA Tour victories.

Now she's 22 years old, a recent Stanford graduate — and, at least before Friday, struggling on the course.

Wie has missed six of eight cut times this season, although she says she has been feeling better about her game.

"The last couple of weeks it started to feel good," Wie said. "Things were coming. My scores weren't showing up as well. But it's a work in progress. Still a long way to go."

And Wie knows she's a long way from a potential victory Sunday, but is excited to have something to shoot for beyond simply making the cut.

"The fact that you're in contention to have a chance to win the U.S. Open is a big deal," Wie said. "I'm so grateful I have that

chance right now. I'm really looking forward to seeing the crowds tomorrow and experiencing it all again."

Pettersen said Wie should be given some space to find her game at her own pace.

"I think you should give her a break," Pettersen said. "She just graduated, four years in college. That's pretty impressive to do that on the sideline of trying to compete out here. So now it's obviously a little different world for her. Now it's all about golf, and she has to kind of find her schedule, how to kind of work it out the best way for her."

Pettersen, meanwhile, believes her own game is in 'good shape.

"My game is very solid," Pettersen said. "My ball striking is good. My short game is good. And my putting has been really good so far."

Her day got off to a hectic start when she overslept and had

to rush to make her tee time, skipping breakfast.

"For me breakfast is kind of my most important meal," Pettersen said. "I didn't really have time. I thought it was more important to get stretched and loosened up. Even though it's hot. It's fine. Sometimes that's a good thing. You don't have time to think about stuff."

The intense heat and humidity players and fans dealt with in Thursday's first round eased only slightly on Friday. The final two days of the tournament are expected to be more pleasant.

"Hopefully we're done with the two hot days, and they're all calling for a cooler weekend," Pettersen said. "Which I'm all for. It's been two really hot days."

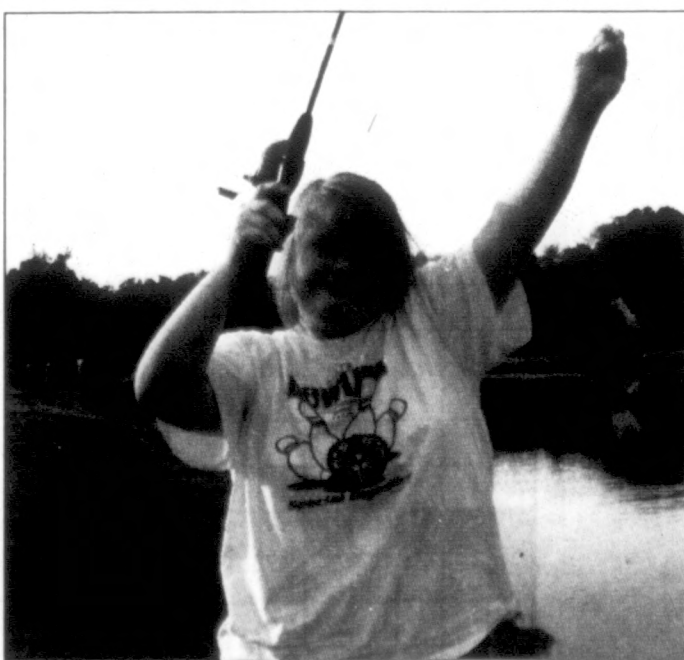
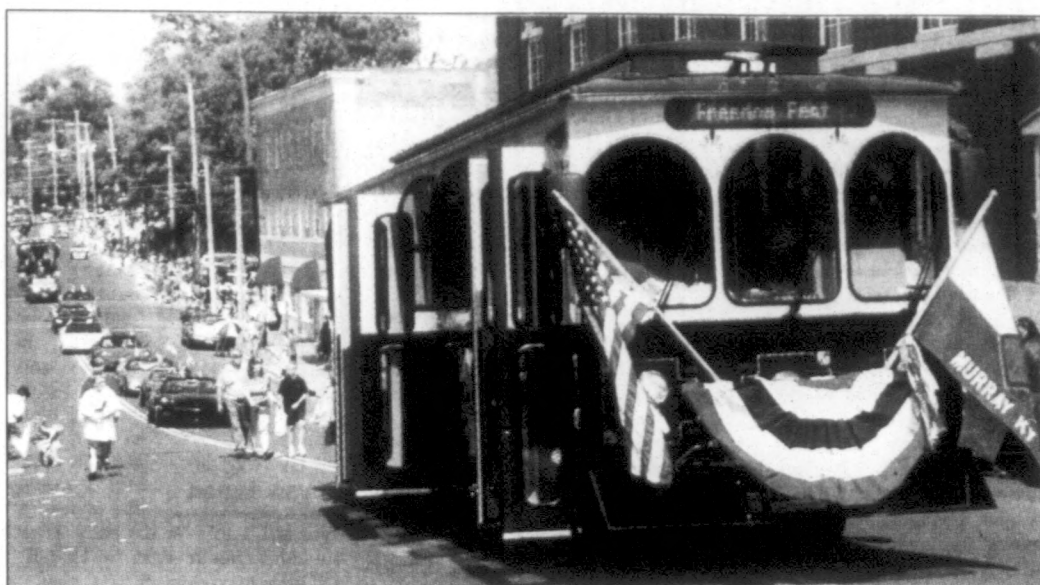

Heal whiplash injury with medication, gentle exercise

DEAR DOCTOR K: Several months ago, a car rear-ended me and I ended up with whiplash. My neck still hurts. What can I do?

DEAR READER: The force of a rear-end collision momentarily jerks your neck into an unnatural position. This can badly strain your neck muscles and can stretch or tear the ligaments in your neck. The bones of the spine in your neck, particularly the facet joints where one bone meets another, can be damaged. The nerves that leave your neck through holes in the spinal bones also may be affected.

Whiplash usually results in neck pain. It may also cause shoulder pain, muscle spasms, stiffness and a decreased range of motion.

Early on, you probably used ice packs and over-the-counter NSAIDs such as ibuprofen (Advil) or naproxen (Aleve) to relieve pain and inflammation.

Now you have to begin the slow process of helping your neck heal. It is fine for most people to use an over-the-counter pain medicine, particularly acetaminophen, to help ease the pain. Also, a muscle-relaxing medicine like cyclobenzaprine, taken at bedtime, can be helpful.

If you haven't already, talk with your doctor or a physical therapist about gentle range-of-motion exercises and then isometric neck-strengthening exercises. Strong neck muscles will help maintain proper head and neck posture. This decreases the stress on muscles, disks and vertebrae. It gives damaged tissue the opportunity to mend.

Massage therapy may also help promote healing. Massage relieves muscle tension and spasms, loosens stiff joints and promotes relaxation.

Most of my orthopedic surgery colleagues recommend that if you are still wearing a cervical collar, stop. Cervical collars don't help recovery; they may even interfere with it by causing neck muscles to waste away. Nevertheless, there may be periods during your healing when the collar provides necessary relief from pain.

Whiplash damage to muscles and ligaments should heal within a few months. Because it has already been several months since your accident, I recommend you talk with your doctor. He or she may check for injuries to your facet joints and disks.

You may get some pain relief from facet joint injections, in which a local anesthetic is injected to numb the nerves that supply that joint. Less commonly, radiofrequency neurotomy may be used, a procedure that uses heat to block nerves from conducting pain signals.

Surgery is rarely used to treat whiplash, but it may be done if you continue to experience severe pain or disability after trying non-surgical treatments.

There are no quick fixes for the kind of muscle, ligament and bone injuries caused by whiplash. But if you are patient and regularly perform the exercises you're given, the likelihood is that your neck (and you) will return to normal.

ferent areas: a wildlife observation room; the discovery room featuring several hands-on exhibits; and the learning room, where park naturalists give talks. The park is open year-round (270.826.2247).

The Abraham Lincoln Birthplace in Hodgenville, although a National Park, is sometimes taken for granted in Kentucky's rich history. Whether it's the actual cabin our sixteenth President of the United States, or pieces from it, was born in makes little difference, because the grounds are hallowed. Lincoln's parents, Thomas and Nancy settled on what was called Sinking Springs Farm in 1808, and two months later on February 12, 1809, he was born in a one-room log cabin. The memorial is on 16 acres and is open year-round. (270.358.3137).

Constitution Square in Danville is considered the birthplace of Kentucky's statehood. Because of Danville's prominent location in relationship to the Wilderness Road, the town became Kentucky's first governmental location. It was here that over several years, a state constitution was prepared in an effort to separate from Virginia

and on June 1, 1792, Kentucky became the fifteenth state.

Constitution Square is located in the heart of downtown. (859.239.7089).

Kentucky Vietnam Veteran Memorial is located in Frankfort, and there's a good chance that many Kentuckians have never visited our state's tribute to those who made the ultimate sacrifice during the Vietnam War.

Recognized as one of the most original memorials in the nation, this beautiful venue lists the names of the 1,103 Kentuckians lost in war, including 23 missing in action.

The names are engraved into a granite plaza, with a design concept formed around a large sundial.

The Memorial was completed in 1988 and allows visitors to follow a graphic history of the war through its duration. It is open year-round from dawn till dusk. (502.875.8687).

Country Music Highway in eastern Kentucky, a 118 mile trek along U.S. 23 is something special for those who enjoy scenic views, challenging golf courses, lively entertainment, a handful of state parks and some

very interesting shopping.

Created to pay tribute to the major country music stars from the mountains, this collection of small towns offers up a little something for everyone. It can be a two or three day getaway.

From Greenup in the north to Jenkins in the south and all points in between, these talented performers such as Billy Ray Cyrus, the Judd's, Tom T. Hall, Ricky Skaggs, Loretta Lynn, Crystal Gayle, and Dwight Yoakum are showcased. For more information call (606.297.1469) or (800.542.5790).
