# THE BIBLE SPEAKS

## Government Under God

Lesson for December 6, 1933

EVEN today there are people who feel that religion and politics don't mix. The answer to it is, if your politics is the kind that won't mix with your religion, it's either the wrong kind of religion or the wrong kind of politics, or both. Just as it is not safe for a man to try to reserve a part of his personal life, keeping it for himself and away from God, so it is not right nor safe to reserve any section or social life and suppose that God need have nothing to do with it or about it.

**Government**  
When St. Peter tells his friends to be subject to "every human institution" he does not mean that all human institutions are what they ought to be and what God wants them to be. There are no perfect persons; how can there be perfect institutions? The truth is between two extremes. One extreme view says: Institutions, including governments, are what they are by God's will and ordinance; therefore we must not criticize them, much less revolt. (This is the view of fascism everywhere and always.) The other extreme says: Since no human institution is or can be perfect, let us Christians stick to the one institution of the church, and leave everything else to the realm of sin. But no part of the world, or of human life, can be safely left to the devil. If it is right to try to make a family as nearly Christian as possible, it is right to try to make government as Christian as possible. God's will is that we should have government (in Lincoln's great phrase) "under God." That is to say, government is on the right line when it is in line with the great principles of life God has shown us. Justice and law should go together. All government uses law; but only good government makes just law. Above all human laws is the Law of God. "Under God" means not simply that God's name is used but that his will is really expressed in what the government does and plans.

**The Governor**  
All good government centers in one kind of executive. He may be called Prime Minister, or King, or President. The name does not make much difference. But there has to be some responsible head somewhere, some person who has the right to make decisions and to order them carried out. This is true all the way down from national to village organization. A government where it is possible to "pass the buck" all around in a circle without any one person's being held responsible or having to make a decision, is a bad government. Both in the Old Testament and in the New, the importance of the right man at the center of things is underscored. Under a good king like David or Hezekiah, the country prospered; under a bad one like Jeroboam or Manasseh the country goes to pieces. Times have not changed much.

**The Governed**  
The great difference between government in the days of Saints Paul and Peter and today, is that in the English-speaking countries, where free Bible Christianity has had fullest sway, we have democracy as our form of government. (This is not forgetting other countries where the same is true, such as Holland. It is also not forgetting that in some countries called democratic, there is nothing of democracy but the name.) Both Paul and Peter, when they wrote of kings and other men of authority, did not picture modern democracy at all. In the Roman Empire the monarch were dictators; they were not elected. In our democratic world the governed are also the governors. Power resides no longer in the throne or in the palace; it resides in the people where it belongs. Furthermore, in the modern democratic world, Christian ideals can make themselves felt as they could not in the palace at Rome or Constantinople, in centuries gone by. Everybody who watched Queen Elizabeth's crowning must have been impressed by the fact that it was a religious act, performed in a church by Christian ministers. ## farm facts FOR KENTUCKY FOLKS by Wm. C. Johnstone AGRICULTURAL REPRESENTATIVE KENTUCKY BANKERS ASSOCIATION

PARITY RATIO, the price that farmers receive in relation to what they pay, dropped to 91 in October — the lowest point since May 1941. After paying operating costs in 1953 their net income will be only 38 percent of their gross income, the lowest since 1932.

The experts believe, however, that the worst of the adjustments are over. Farmers, in the meanwhile, should use their utmost care to keep costs to the minimum in 1954 by efficiently using land, labor, machinery and fertilizers.

Harry Young, U. of K. agent in farm management, makes several suggestions as to practices for improving efficiency in 1954, most of them requiring little or no additional cash outlay.

Among these are: (1) plan year's credit needs early, (2) trade work for use of machinery.

or consider joint ownership, (3) return all manure and crop residues to the land, (4) use lime and fertilizer accord with soil tests, (5) use best crop varieties, (6) be on hand at farrowing and calving time, (7) dehorn calves at early age, (8) watch market developments and sell when prices are normally high.

CREDIT is now recognized as an essential farm tool. It is just as difficult to operate a modern farm without credit as to farm without modern machinery. Like other machinery, credit should be used wisely—abused, it deteriorates rapidly—used with care, it returns good profits and increases in value.

Credit may be less available in 1954 than during recent boom years. Farmers themselves will wish to keep their debts to the practical minimum and banks, as well as other credit agencies, will tend to lend with greater caution.

Good machinery advice is to put it in good shape before the new cropping season starts. The same applies to credit. See your credit specialist early, your banker. In this case, and go over your credit needs with him.

Rabbit fever is definitely one of the dangers of the hunting season. Eighteen cases were reported in 1952 in Kentucky. One fatality resulted.

**Cranberry Nut Bread**  
 1 cup cranberries  
 1/4 cup sugar  
 3 cups flour  
 4 teaspoon baking powder  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 1/2 cup chopped nuts  
 Grated rind of one orange  
 1 egg beaten  
 1 cup milk  
 2 tablespoons melted butter  
 Put cranberries through a food chopper. Mix with half the sugar. Sift remaining sugar with dry ingredients. Add nuts and orange rind. Combine beaten eggs, milk and melted butter. Add to flour mixture. Fold in sweetened cranberries. Bake in a buttered bread pan in moderate oven for about one hour.
