## New Move Begun for Countywide Phone Service

### Retiring Mayor, Councilmen in Final Meeting

Mayor Jim Kinney and members of the City Council last Monday night held their final meeting before leaving office soon after Jan. 1.

Mayor-elect Louis O'Daniel and the new councilmen-elect were guests at the meeting of the retiring mayor and councilmen. They had been invited to attend the meeting by Mayor Kinney so they could familiarize themselves with municipal proceedings.

The new city officials will take office on Jan. 4, which is the first Monday of the new year.

However, O'Daniel and his councilmen will hold a caucus on Dec. 17 at which time they will discuss plans for taking over the reins of the city on Jan. 4.

The group also is expected to discuss any possible new appointments to city jobs at the

caucus.

The retiring City Council mainly discussed routine business at its final meeting. Members of the City Park Board also were present and took before the council some matters of indebtedness.

The retiring and incoming council both discussed matters that were brought up for consideration.

Members of the retiring council are Bill Butler, Milton Hawkins, Dale Leneave, Macon Hutchens, Morgan Hill and John Slidd.

Members of the Council which will take office on Jan. 4 are Joe Darnall, Joe Clark, W. C. Hutchens, Joe Dunn, Bob Rider and John Slidd. Slidd was the only member of the retiring Council to win re-election of last November's election.

### Funeral is Held for C. W. Lyles

Charlie W. Lyles, 62, died at noon Thursday, Dec. 4, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. C. B. Cox in Benton. Death came at the dining table.

Mr. and Mrs. Lyles were carried to the home of their daughter several weeks ago. They are long time residents of Benton.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon at the Benton Methodist Church, of which he was a member. The Revs. Roy D. Williams of Paducah and W. D. Grissom of the Benton church officiated. Burial, by Linn Funeral Home, was in the Benton Cemetery.

Mr. Lyles was a rural mail carrier in Marshall County for many years. He also was a city mail carrier in Paducah and retired there. They then returned to Benton to live. He was a native of Marshall County.

Mr. Lyles had been in bad health for several years. He fell several months ago and suffered a broken hip.

Besides his widow, Mrs. Flora Manning Lyles, he leaves two sons, Hal B. Lyles of Paducah and C. W. Lyles of Roselle, N. J.; two daughters, Mrs. C. B. Cox of Benton and Mrs. Charles O'Brien of Jacksonville Beach, Fla. Four grandchildren also survive.

Mr. Lyles was the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Lyles.

### Problem to be Taken Before State Officials

A new movement to seek county wide telephone service for Marshall County was started last week.

A round-table discussion of such a project was held last Friday night at the meeting of the Benton Rotary Club. Attending the meeting, besides Rotarians, were representatives of most of Benton's law firms and the head of one insurance firm.

It was pointed out at the meeting that residents of the county and the county seat are isolated from each other because of the lack of countywide service. Where there is telephone service out in the county such as at Gilbertsville, it is necessary now to pay a long distance telephone toll in order to talk from Gilbertsville to Benton, or vice versa.

The round-table discussion centered mainly on ways and means to get free countywide telephone service, without to service through Paducah or Murray.

It was the consensus of the meeting that the first step should be to form a countywide committee to map a course of action.

It was agreed that after the committee has mapped a course, that a countywide mass meeting should be held and the problem taken before the general public.

The proper course, many of the speakers at the meeting felt, is to employ an expert in matters of this type and gather the data possible to show that countywide service is needed and present this data to the Public Service Commission.

Several of the speakers felt that if the problem were taken before the Commission in a proper manner that the commission might act favorably. There were some speakers, however, who felt that the Public Service Commission would be of little help and that a fight for countywide free service would be long, expensive and almost hopeless.

Some speakers pointed out that many counties in Kentucky do have free countywide service under operation of Southern Bell and that this county is entitled to such service as much as any other county.

These speakers also pointed out that it would be wise, in gathering data, to investigate what other counties did to obtain countywide service.

The matter will be taken before all civic groups in the county and they will be asked to help in obtaining countywide service. With united opinion over the county, it was felt the project would have a good chance of getting an OK from the Public Service Commission.

This is a project that every citizen in Marshall County should be interested in. Certainly, the families that do not have phone service and have to get in a car and drive to town in the middle of the night to get a doctor should be extremely interested.

And with the proper countywide interest, the proposed service could become a reality. It is a project that is worth every ounce of energy and every dollar that the public can muster.

### Lower Prices for Farm Products are Expected

Prices you receive for the products you sell this year will likely be lower than last. Prices on the average will be about 80 percent of parity. Cost of production will be very little lower between them. That is the profit or labor return.

Soil testing is one way to lower cost of production. Buy fertilizers needed. You should expect \$5 or more for each dollar spent. The average for Kentucky on tobacco is a \$20.00 return for each dollar spent for fertilizers.

Fixed costs remain about the same per acre regardless of yields. Higher yields usually mean lower costs per unit (pounds, bushels, etc.) Wise use of and fertilizer may mean make the difference between profit and loss.

Soil testing should be done now. Get your samples and bring them to me. Tests will cost 65c each. Know what you are doing. Don't guess. Believe it or not I had 47 meetings last month with a total attendance of 167. During the past 2 months I had 198 meetings with an attendance of 14,227. These were all Extension Service meetings and to not include many other meetings of various kinds.

The Farm and Home Development Program still continues to show results of various kinds. Mrs. Charlie Cone, purchased a pasteurized for their home milk supply. This insures a pure source of milk similar to milk bought commercially.

The tobacco market opened good. Clyde Walker reported getting \$67 per 100 for one basket. Proper classing and grading are still important. Mixed tobacco always sells for a lower price. Good tobacco graded properly and handled right brings the best prices.

Total rainfall for last week was 2.15 inches. The livestock water problem should be solved. Clarke River was bank full last Saturday.

### FFA Camp Fund Drive Slated In This County Dec. 16

The Hardinsburg Camp Fund raising campaign will be conducted in Marshall County Wednesday, Dec. 16.

The Future Farmers of America will conduct a drive in this state to raise \$250,000, which will be used to develop a one-hundred acre educational center at Hardinsburg.

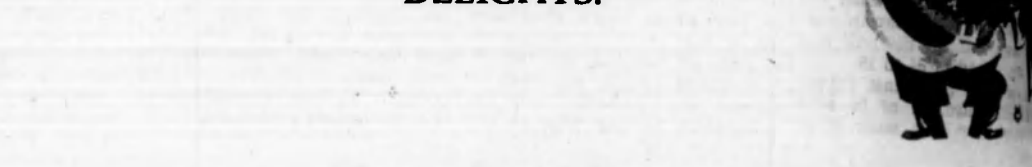

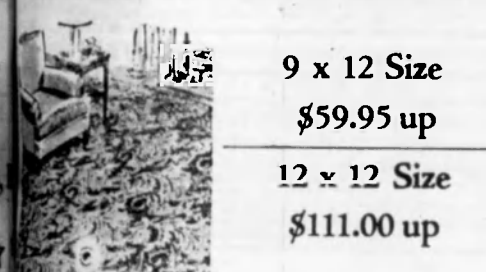

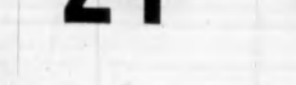

**THE BIBLE SPEAKS**  
 International Union  
 Sunday School Lessons  
 BY DR. KENNETH J. FOREMAN  
 Sermon: Isaiah 21:4-9; 2:1-5  
 Epistle: Matthew 5:1-12  
 Devotional Reading: Luke 1:1-25  
**Prince of Peace**  
 Lesson for December 20, 1933

GOD's will is for a warless world. No one can read the prophets and make anything else out of it. God's will is for peace in this world. Peace among angels, yes, peace beyond death, yes; of course; but that is not the whole of it. God's will is for peace among men, peace on this good green earth. So long as there are wars, we know that God's will and intention for mankind is being resisted. God wants a warless world.

#### Leader To Peace

One of the many names for Christ is "Prince of Peace," a title given by a prophet long before his birth. It will be worth our while to look into that title this week and see what exactly is meant by it, for it is much more than a striking phrase. The word "Prince" has nothing necessarily to do with royalty, though it often does. Its literal meaning is leader, or captain, chief.

As Prince of Peace therefore, our Lord is Leader of Peace. But again, the title may mean more things than one. Let us start with "Leader to Peace." In this sense, Christ is one who points out the road to peace, shows mankind what peace means. As the Bible uses the word, peace does not mean simply the ebbing of a battle-tide, the lull between attacks. It is not a negative word. It is positive. The kind of peace to which Christ points is not mere indifference. It is based on love and good-will. For instance, as these lines are written, the United States is at peace with Canada; it is also at peace with a dozen other countries that could be mentioned. But while it is barely possible that war might break out with any nation, it is probably less likely to break out with Canada than with countries with which we have less in common and for whose people our own people have a much weaker affection. True peace is based on mutual good will. Jesus taught us much more about peace; for example his reference to "peace-makers." But we must pass on.

#### Leader Of Peace

As Prince of Peace our Lord is also Leader of Peace. That is to say, where Christ is known and honored (not in name only, but actually known and loved), there peace is far more likely to be than where He is not known. It is sometimes said that civilization breeds wars. No doubt it does; but barbarism breeds even more. Savage tribes are in an almost perpetual state of warfare. It is also pointed out that Christian nations are often warring. On the other hand it may be asked: Where do you find a really Christian nation? Who starts the wars? Are the "Christian" nations the aggressors or do they have to rise to the defense against aggression? One thing is certain. Before the coming of Christ, wars were taken as a matter of course. No nation ever bothered to apologize or explain their fights. Since Christ's coming and more than ever in recent years, nations that go to war have a bad conscience about it. Piles of "white papers" and the like are put out to show why it was necessary to declare war. At least, Christian nations are aware that the road of war is never the right road except as a last resort.

#### Leader By Peace

Another meaning that may fairly be given to "Prince of Peace" is "Leader by Peace." That is to say, the leadership and Lordship of Christ is never one of coercion. There have been leaders by the sword; there have been leaders by lies; for the human race is all too easily misled; there is one and only one Leader of men who will reign only through love. At Christmas time men often wonder why it is that the angel's song has never been fulfilled. Peace has not come on earth to stay. Peace is always pictured as a bird poised for flight. The full reign of the Prince of Peace seems to be so slowly coming. The reason is that unlike all earthly leaders, Christ will have none in his kingdom who is not there by his own free will. God could no doubt beat the world into silent submission in a very short time. It is not beyond the power of the Almighty to bring every human war to an end.

## Here's Very Good Recipe For Making Holiday Candies

From now till Dec. 25, kitchens are going to be filled with the tantalizing aroma of festive dishes in the making. In many homes, one of these will be the rich fragrance of homemade candy.

If you're in the candy making group, here are two recipes for you to try. They're simple, fun to make and a treat to eat. You'll be proud to serve them or give them as gifts.

The first is quick fondant and serves as a base for several types of candies. Here's how you make it.

Blend 2/3 cup sweetened condensed milk with 1 teaspoon vanilla. Gradually add 4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar, mixing till smooth and creamy.

Now for variations. Combine one batch of fondant with chopped pecans. Cut into tiny cubes, and dip in melted dot chocolate.

Form fondant into balls. Roll them in chopped nuts, shredded coconut, chopped cand-

led fruits, grated chocolate or a mixture of cocoa and granulated sugar.

Coat pecan halves with fondant and dip in melted dot chocolate.

Place finished pieces of candy on a tray lined with heavy oiled paper and refrigerate till candy is set.

The second recipe makes a creamy uncooked fudge.

Melt one 6-ounce package of semi-sweet chocolate and 1/2 tablespoons butter or margarine in top of double boiler over hot, not boiling water. Remove from heat. Add 1/4 cup corn syrup, 1/4 cup undiluted evaporated milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla, and 1/4 teaspoon salt, and mix.

Add 4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar, about a cup at a time,

blending well after each addition. Stir in 1/2 cup chopped nuts. Turn mixture into buttered pan and quickly spread 3/4 inch thick with a spatula. When fudge is firm, cut into squares.

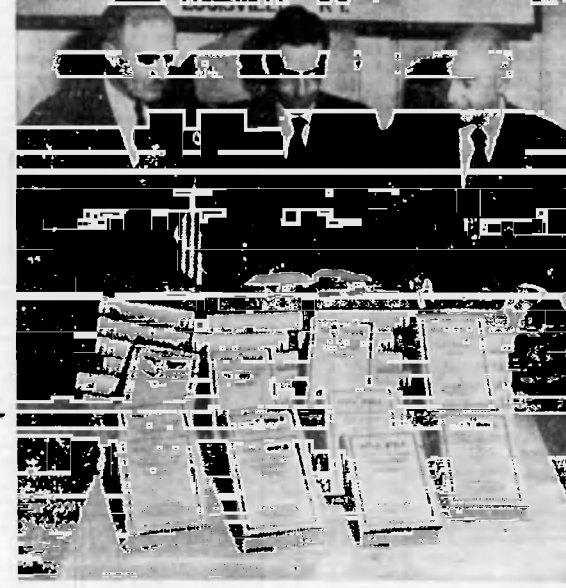
