OUR ARMY.

(Globe-Democrat.) Florida has 2,851 pensioners. Kentucky has 29,582 pensioners. Texas has 7,758 pensioners of the civil war.

The pay of a West Point cadet is \$540 per year. The United States has three Major-Generals. Georgia has 3,621 pensioners within her bounds.

The "General" of our army has no duties prescribed. The cost of a West Point outfit complete is about \$90. North Carolina has 4,904 pensioners within her limits.

Our Brigadier-Generals receive a salary of \$5,500 each. There are 8,036 United States pensioners residing in Virginia. The salary of a Major-General commanding the army is \$7,500.

Mississippi has 3,987 pensioners on the rolls of the United States. Arkansas has 10,160 pensioners of the United States government. The War Department was established by act of Congress August 7, 1789.

There are 4,361 persons in Louisiana drawing pensions from the United States. Our army is amply provided with Brigadiers, there being no less than sixteen. Pensioners are scarce in Alabama, there being only 3,648 in the limits of that state.

During the civil war the Federal Government enlisted a grand total of 2,772,408 men. Missouri sent 7,016 men to the Mexican war; Illinois, 6,123; Louisiana, 7,947; Texas, 8,018. Tennessee has 16,815 pensioners, most of whom reside in the eastern half of the state.

Our War Department cost in 1865 the most expensive year in its history, \$1,031,323,361. The Inspector-General of the army must visit the military prison from two four times a year. Color blindness, or the slightest deficiency in hearing, is sufficient to exclude a man from the army.

By act of Congress, the enlisted strength of our army, in time of peace, is never to exceed 25,000 men. Flat-footed men are rejected by the examining boards of the army. They cannot stand long marches. At the close of the last fiscal year there were 969,544 pensioners on the rolls of the Pension Bureau.

Men with bunions or with overlying toes from the wearing of tight shoes are not admitted to the army. In the past, more troops to the army than any other state. Great Britain contains 689 pensioners who receive every quarter checks from the United States Treasury.

The age for the admission of cadets to the military academy at West Point is between seventeen and twenty-two. At the present time the United States has 144 garrisoned forts, arsenals or military posts occupied by its troops.

Every West Point cadet signs an obligation to serve four years in the academy and four years in the army after graduation. The pay of a private in our army is from \$13 to \$18 a month, according to length of service, with rations and quarters.

The Aroostock war with the Indians of this name lasted during 1838 and 1839; 1,500 men were required to restore order. Military authorities estimate that in times of public danger we could put into the field a force of 2,500,000 to 3,000,000 men.

South Carolina has not very many pensioners, there being only 1,668 residing within the limits of the Palmetto State. The Colonels of our army have each a salary of \$4,500, while the Lieutenant-Colonels receive \$4,000 the Majors \$3,500.

Olio has the greatest number of pensioners—99,837; New York being second with 89,682; Pennsylvania being third with 89,378. Our War Department cost last year, 1894, \$54,567,930. Our army is the most expensive proposition in numbers in the world.
