"The Democratic State Central Committee, Louisville, March 30th, 1892. The Honorable the Governor, Legislative Committee: We have the pleasure to invite your attention to the requirement of the party voting for nominations for all elective offices, and to request that you will, by such means as you may deem proper, cause to be presented at every primary election or delegate convention, make nominations for members of the Legislature and State Senate not later than the 30th day of May next.
