TOM CHANDLER RECALLS "THE BIG ONE" Walter Darrell Haden

I didn't care for army life.
I didn't care for the infantry.
I'd have much preferred to be home in bed
Than in the thick
Of infantry service overseas.

I walked in front of Patton through France With my sub-machine gun From Utah Beach to east of Paris; I rode a Sherman tank to Belgium, Then walked to meet the Seventh Army Marching up from the south. I made it through the Bulge, but Outside a little town in South France, I caught hot shrapnel from sniper fire; Recuperated in Naples for four months, Reclassified an M.P., I spent three months on the Isle of Capri, Guarding some of Hitler's stooges.

But my discharge November 30, 1945, I value higher than the Purple Heart, The Bronze Star, and the seven Other medals I keep buried in boxes. I'm glad I was mentally and physically able To serve my country honorably But wouldn't want to do it again. I didn't care for army life. I didn't care for the infantry.
