The Paducah News of yesterday has the following to say in regard to the intense excitement over in Caldwell county: "It is a well known fact that prohibition has never prohibited the sale of liquor in Caldwell county (or any where else for that matter) since the passage of the law, although the most strenuous efforts have been used to suppress the illegal trade. Law and order clubs have even failed to accomplish their purpose. In fact the offenders of the prohibition law are so numerous that the county is the scene of the grand jury; and it is only through the instrumentality of one of their number that they are ever 'pulled.' So yesterday, Jesse Dunning, whom it is alleged has been engaged in the 'blind tiger' business himself, gave the names of all the 'blind tiger' men to the grand jury, who are now in session at Paducah. Among the names named were: Tom Scales, M. B. Dudley, 'Kid' Watkins, Tom Woodson and Milton Elson, six more having escaped. All these arrested gave bonds, except Elson, who went to jail. Elson's trial was set for to-day. The trial of those not on bond will occur to-morrow.

These arrests have caused great excitement, as stated, and there may be trouble of a serious nature before the end is reached."
