## Teen-agers Of County To Meet

A county-wide meeting for 4-H teenagers in Marshall County High Schools will be held in Benton High School auditorium on Dec. 3.

The meeting starts at 10:00 o'clock with get-acquainted games. An officers training school will be held after the games. Miss Edith Lacy and Mrs. Conrad Feltner, field agents in 4-H club work from the University of Kentucky, will talk to the group on activities and 4-H projects for older 4-H boys and girls.

The 4-H Teenage clubs have already been organized in Hardin and North Marshall schools. New officers are going to be elected for the North Marshall club on Monday night, November 28, at 7:30 p. m. at the North Marshall school. A 4-H club is to be organized at Benton High School on Dec. 3.

Officers will be elected for an organization of the 4-H Teenagers in the high schools of Marshall County. So if you are a Teenager, boy or girl, and would be interested in recreation, 4-H club activities, 4-H projects, or folk games, then be sure and get enrolled in one of these Teenage 4-H clubs. Luncheon will be served at the noon hour for 50 cents a plate.

A recreation program of folk games and other games will be held after the luncheon.

A fledgling Chamber of Commerce was organized last Friday night at a meeting of business and professional men in the Community Building.

Joe Asher, attorney, was named temporary president of the new organization. Benton Mayor Louis O'Daniel was named vice president in charge of activities and Van Roberts was named vice president in charge of membership. Mark Clayton was chosen as secretary-treasurer.

Setting up of the organization will be made after surveys are conducted at Cadiz and other towns now operating chambers of commerce to find out a suitable method for operating a Marshall County Chamber of Commerce.

It was decided to hold the next meeting on Tuesday night, Nov. 29, at the county courthouse here in Benton. Every business and professional man and woman in Marshall County is invited to take part in this meeting. It is especially urged that civic clubs at Calvert City, Hardin, Gilbertsville, Briensburg, Aurora and other communities send representatives to this meeting.

The Soil Conservation District, the Farm Bureau and the Soil Improvement Association also will be asked to help set up the county-wide chamber of commerce.

The new chamber will be started on a small but solid basis and a gradual but county-wide growth is anticipated.

Employment of an executive secretary will be deferred until the chamber is in actual operation.

A retail merchants group will be operated as one of the committees of the chamber.

The group at the meeting last Friday night discussed the possibilities of obtaining a factory for Benton and also discussed the decorating of the town for the Christmas holidays.

## Christmas Mail Rules Outlined for the Public

With the Christmas rush about to descend upon the postoffice, patrons are reminded that the speed and safety of mail delivery depends on how well mail users will follow these points:

1. Address mail fully and clearly. Write legibly or print plainly. Where applicable, use zone numbers. Avoid using abbreviations which might confuse mail distributors.
2. Always use a return address in the upper left hand corner of both letters and packages.
3. Do not enclose coins or hard objects of any kind in letters, without marking the envelope for hand stamping. High-speed canceling machines can not process such letters, often jam and damage letters.
4. Do not mail cash. For safety's sake, use Postal Money Orders or checks.
5. Make certain parcels are well packed and securely wrapped. Enclose a card with your return address and recipient's address.
6. Double check to make sure your mail has correct amount of postage.
7. To speed letters through canceling machines, be sure stamps are in upper right hand corner.
8. Insure parcels. Register letters of real value.
9. Mail early and often. Earlier mailings mean earlier deliveries because your letters or other mail catch earlier trains, planes or other transporters of mail.
10. Make sure your correspond-

ents have your correct address.

11. Large mailers and everyone who mails several Christmas cards should separate the mail having in one bundle all for Benton and in the other all out of town. THE POST OFFICE WILL GIVE YOU FREE LABELS FOR THESE BUNDLES.
12. Rural patrons—Buy your stamps a few days before you need them for mailing. Have money order applications ready when carrier arrives. Do not delay your carrier. Other patrons are waiting for him.

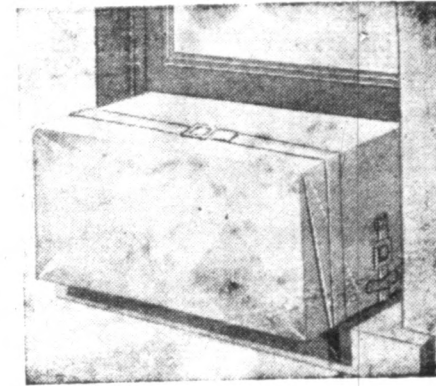

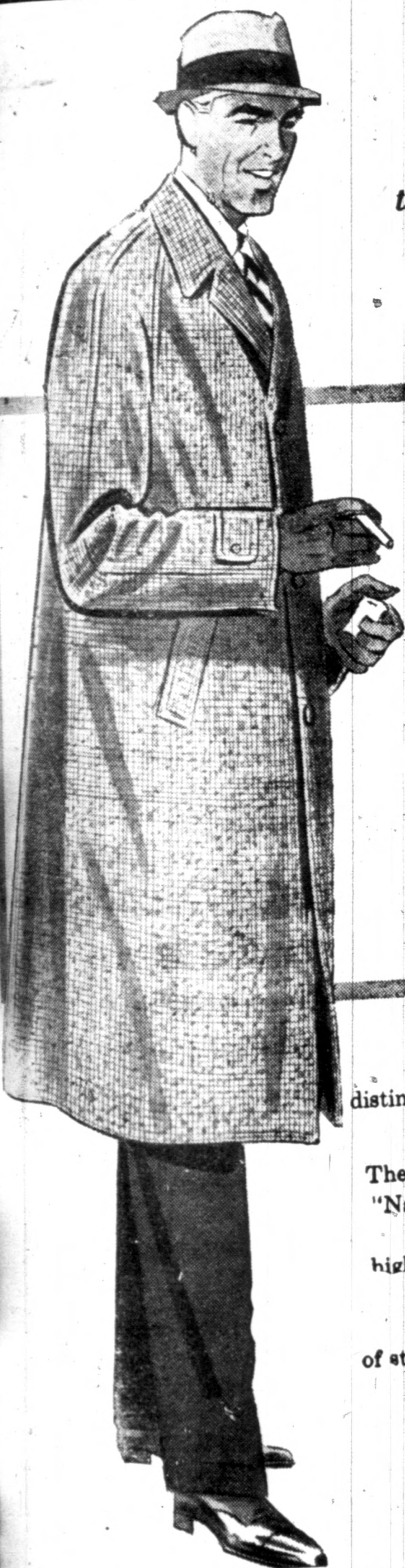

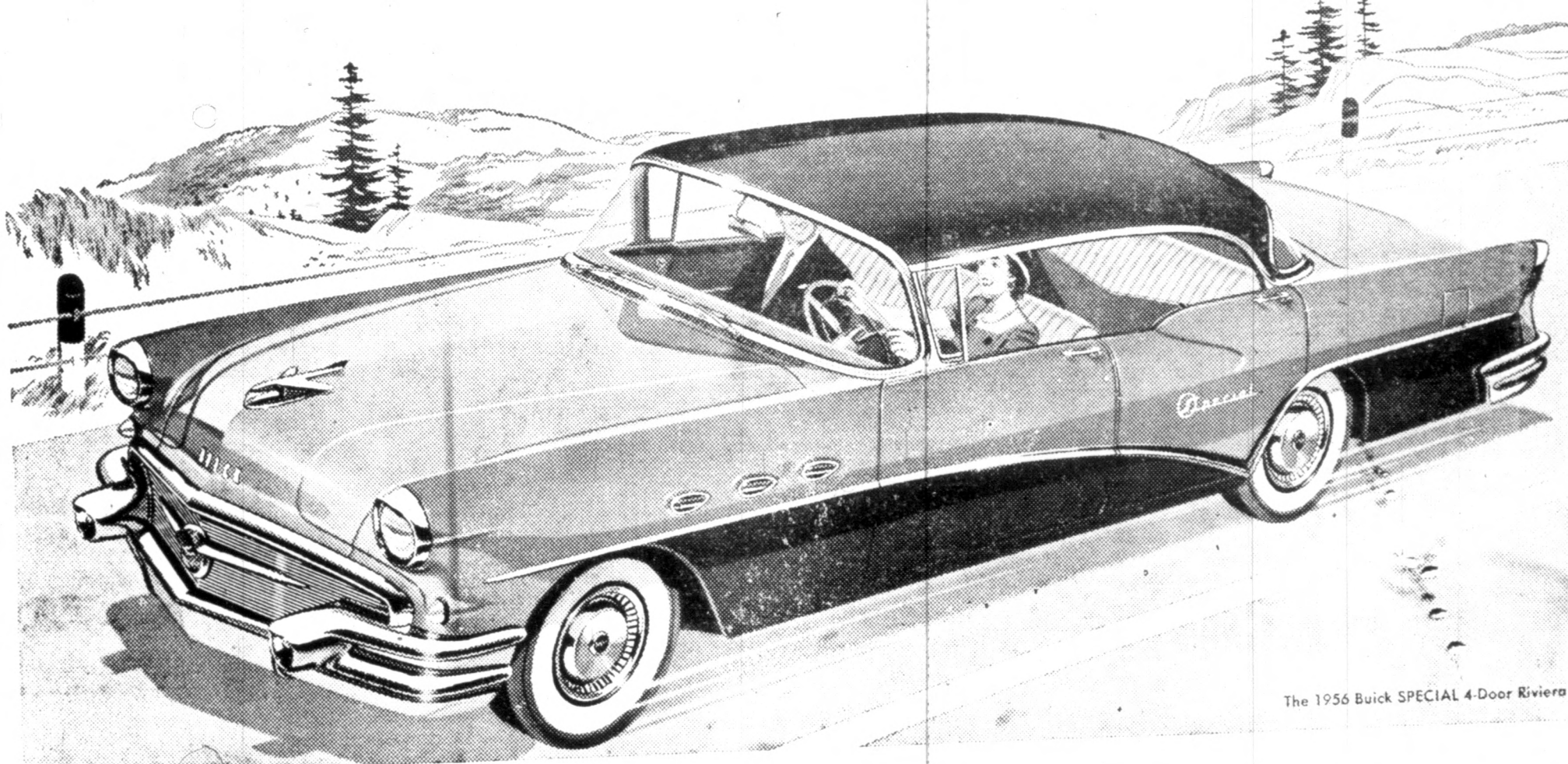

**THE BIBLE SPEAKS**

Background Scriptures: Luke 11:1-13  
Devotional Reading: Psalm 55

**The Good News**

Lesson for November 13, 1955

THERE is no such thing as the Christian religion, except in human beings. There is no such thing as the growth of Christianity, unless it grows in people. So how does Christianity spread? Only by one way: people who are Christians must win people who are not Christians. People who know Jesus Christ must introduce other people to him. The church has a word for this: it is called evangelism. Anybody who thinks he doesn't believe in evangelism is really saying that he doesn't care whether there are any new Christians or not. He is saying (though perhaps without realizing it) that what he calls his "faith" is not worth talking about, or recommending to any one else.

**Preaching and Bringing—**

Our rather technical word "Gospel" means simply "Good News." That is what it is called in the New Testament. Not good advice, or good answers to philosophers' riddles; just good news—about God, about Jesus, about destiny. Luke gives us some interesting and valuable hints about how this Good News was broadcast in Jesus' own time and by his direction. One is in three words (Luke 8:1): Jesus came "preaching and bringing" the good news of the kingdom of God. The Gospel is not something just for talk. A tape-recorder can give out a sermon, but a tape-recorder cannot be a preacher of the Gospel. A minister who preaches on Sunday and disappears the rest of the week (if such there be) may be preaching the Gospel but he is not bringing it. Jesus lived by what he preached. The good news can be told by a clever tongue, but it can be brought only by a consecrated life. What would be thought of a grocery store where, instead of in, you would see only shelves, and a stock of goods who would button-hole you and tell you all about the various groceries—that aren't needed. And what can one think of a church where all you can find is a stock of "good news" that is just talk, and nobody brings the Gospel? The Gospel can't be brought in a little parcel you can tuck under your arm like a prayer-book. It has to be brought in a man-sized package, a live sample. After a few months you can buy a "tape-recorder" for or tractor or a "demonstrator" Chevrolet and price.

**Seed and Soils**

You would think that if we could only get Jesus Christ in person, as he was in Galilee, into our church, we could convert everybody. Well, he didn't. No one ever brought or preached the Gospel better than he, but he did not meet with 100% success. He gave a reason for this that any farmer or gardener can understand. Preaching the Gospel is like sowing seed, he said. Sometimes when you look at two fields you may find it hard to believe that the same seed was sown in both; but so it was. The difference is in the soils. In Hutchinson, Kansas, there is a grain elevator with a capacity of ten million bushels of wheat. Every bushel in the hundreds of bins can be traced back to the area where it grew. On the wall in the testing-laboratory of that elevator there is a map of Kansas, county by county; and the kind of wheat each county is producing; this year, is marked there. The same seed wheat, in different counties or in different parts of the same county, may have different protein content or vary in number of bushels to the acre. So some people are better Gospel-soil than others.

**Preach and to Heal**

When Jesus sent out his disciples to preach, he sent them to heal too. Health is the church's business. Whatever affects man's health of body, mind or soul, that is the church's affair. When she preaches and brings the Gospel, she has no right to say, "What we preach is only for your soul." The good news about God has transformed whole communities. It has changed the world for women, for children, for "aves, for down-trodden minorities. A Gospel which is only for souls is not the Gospel Jesus preached and brought.

# Driving Day Scheduled Dec. 1

Maybe your first reaction will be: "So what? Doesn't concern me. I'm a good driver." Well, think this over.

Last year in the United States someone like you - or like someone in your family - died in traffic every 15 minutes. Someone like you - or like someone in your family - was injured every 25 seconds. The death total from traffic in Kentucky was 756. 11,061 persons were injured in traffic accidents in Kentucky during 1954.

It was not just the incompetent and the reckless who died or were hurt. A very large percentage were good drivers, innocent passengers and careful pedestrians.

And this doesn't concern you? The Governor of Kentucky thinks so. So do all of Kentucky's County Judges and the Mayors of Kentucky's cities. So does the President of the United States. So do all the governors of our 47 sister states. All have endorsed S-D Day. Nearly 200 national organizations are sponsoring it in cooperation with the President's Committee for Traffic Safety. They make two requests:

First - "Let's try to avoid traffic accidents completely for the 24 hours of December 1: S-D Day."

Second - "Let's learn from S-D Day that traffic safety is a year-round job."

Let's keep on remembering the second point. What S-D Day should give us - in addition to 24 accident-free hours - is lasting realization that permanent safety on our streets and highways requires two elements: (1) sound, comprehensive, official safety program efficiently administered by our public authorities - the year around; (2) public support for those programs - the year around.

If we're going to stop killing and injuring ourselves, and others, in traffic, then everybody - public officials and private citizens, alike - must fulfill his personal responsibility for safety: not just for a day, not just for a year, but every day, every year.

Whereas it has been demonstrated that highway accidents can be reduced when motorists and pedestrians practice safe driving and safe walking;

Whereas the purpose of Safe Driving Day is to demonstrate the necessity for year around public support of sound, proven, year-round traffic safety programs;

Now Therefore, as Mayor of

Benton and County Judge of Marshall County, we designate the first day of December, 1955, "S-D Day" - Safe Driving Day and urge all citizens to practice safe driving, not only on that day - daylight, dusk and darkness - but every day the year around, starting today.

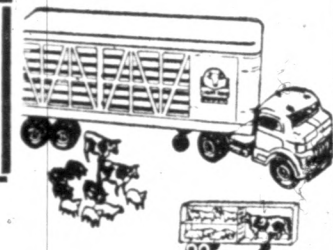

## Social Security Law Explained for Farmers

This is the fourth and last in a series of articles on social security for farm operators.

In my last article I described conditions under which a family arrangement for the operation of a farm could be an actual partnership or joint venture, where husband and wife, or father and child, could each be considered self-employed farmers for social security purposes. There are other family farm enterprises that are also agricultural self-employment. I shall describe two of them widely prevalent in farm areas throughout the country.

From time immemorial, farm wives, and other members of farm households have engaged in farm enterprises on the side. "Egg money" is a term sometimes used to describe the income from such a business because raising chickens and selling eggs is often the source of this special income.

If a special activity like that is really part of the general farm enterprise, and feeding, housing, and tending the chickens or other farm animals are merely part of the overall work of operating the farm, there's no separate business or enterprise. In such case, the member of the family who engages in such work is not self-employed but is merely helping out the actual farm operator.

On the other hand, if farm wife, or other member of the farm family, conducts a separate wholly on her own, pays the expenses involved, and keeps all the income separate from that derived from the other farm operations, she is self-employed in her own right for social security purposes.

However, doing the chores, helping with the harvesting, etc.

doesn't make wife or other member of the family either the farmer's employee or a self-employed person.

By the same token, a farmer's son who engages in some special farm work on a farm otherwise managed and controlled by his parent, this work being his own individual enterprise, is a self-employed farmer. This does not mean that son whose father gives him a calf or other live stock to tend and raise is necessarily engaged in a special farming enterprise.

However, if the son undertakes a 4H or FFA project entirely on his own, keeps separate records, pays the expenses and keeps the profits, he is a self-employed farmer. The fact that his father may give him all kinds of free advice would not change the situation so long as the son has the right to make his own decisions and act on them.

If the son has net earnings of \$400 or more in a year from activity he runs, such earnings will count toward his social security. Under the law, he must file an income tax return and pay the self employment tax regardless of how young he is and even if his earnings are so low that he doesn't have to pay any income tax.

Some may ask what use social security is to a youngster. It has two early values. First, as soon as a young father has worked for two "crop years" under social security, he is insured, which means that in case of his untimely death, a modest lump-sum payment would be made toward burial expenses.

More important, as soon as the young man has a family, his wife and baby would have substantial insurance protection, which would pay monthly cash benefits to the young mother and child if the head of the family were to die.
