4-H Clubs Of County Get Award

The 4-H Clubs of Marshall County were one of the 11 groups in the nation that placed in the blue award in the National Recreation-Rural Arts program sponsored by the United States Rubber Company.

Each of the 11 counties placing in this group was awarded \$20 to be used to purchase recreation equipment. This award comes through the National Committee on Boys and Girls Club Work, Chicago. This money is to be used for a payment on a 3-speed automatic portable phonograph. The machine will be used at all the 28 4-H Clubs in Marshall County. At each of the monthly 4-H Club meetings, a part of the program is recreation.

This indeed is the highest honor that has ever been received by the Marshall County 4-H Clubs.

Some of the things that the Marshall County 4-H Clubs have done to receive this honor are:

The 4-H Clubs have held monthly meetings with recreation as part of the program. Four recreational training meetings for leaders were held in Marshall County.

Twelve 4-H members, 4-H leaders and Homemakers attended the Kentucky State Recreational Workshop held at Kentucky Dam Village.

The North Marshall Teenage recreational group, with their adult leaders, are planning on starting a recreation community center sometime in the near future.

The recreational 4-H program is under the supervision of Mrs. Birmah Gamel, associate home agent, and Paul Mills, assistant county agent.

Oil Men Oppose Any New US Road Taxes

Any new Federal road taxes were condemned as unnecessary in a resolution unanimously adopted by the Western District Petroleum Industries Committee at a luncheon meeting on Tuesday at Kentucky Dam Village.

The resolution suggested that the new federal highway program be financed by appropriations without any new or increased taxes until such appropriations exceed federal receipts from special highway user taxes (federal 2 cent gas tax, oil tax, car tax, etc.).

The federal government now collects 2 1/2 billion dollars from automotive excises and spends only 875 million dollars for highways, leaving \$1,650 million available for possible road building purposes.

In addition to this provision the resolution voiced the oil

men's desire that state and national highway deficiencies be corrected as rapidly as possible consistent with proven needs and economic planning.

Enactment of a Kentucky bond issue to be voted by the people was recommended to provide sufficient funds to make needed improvements on Kentucky roads that cannot be paid for from current state revenues.

The fifty officers and leaders from the 14 county petroleum industries committees comprising the western district were in attendance. District Chairman Glenn M. Martin, Gulf Refining Company, presided.

Principal speaker was Herbert L. Clay, executive secretary of the Kentucky Petroleum Industries Committee, whose subject was "Our State and National Highway Problem."

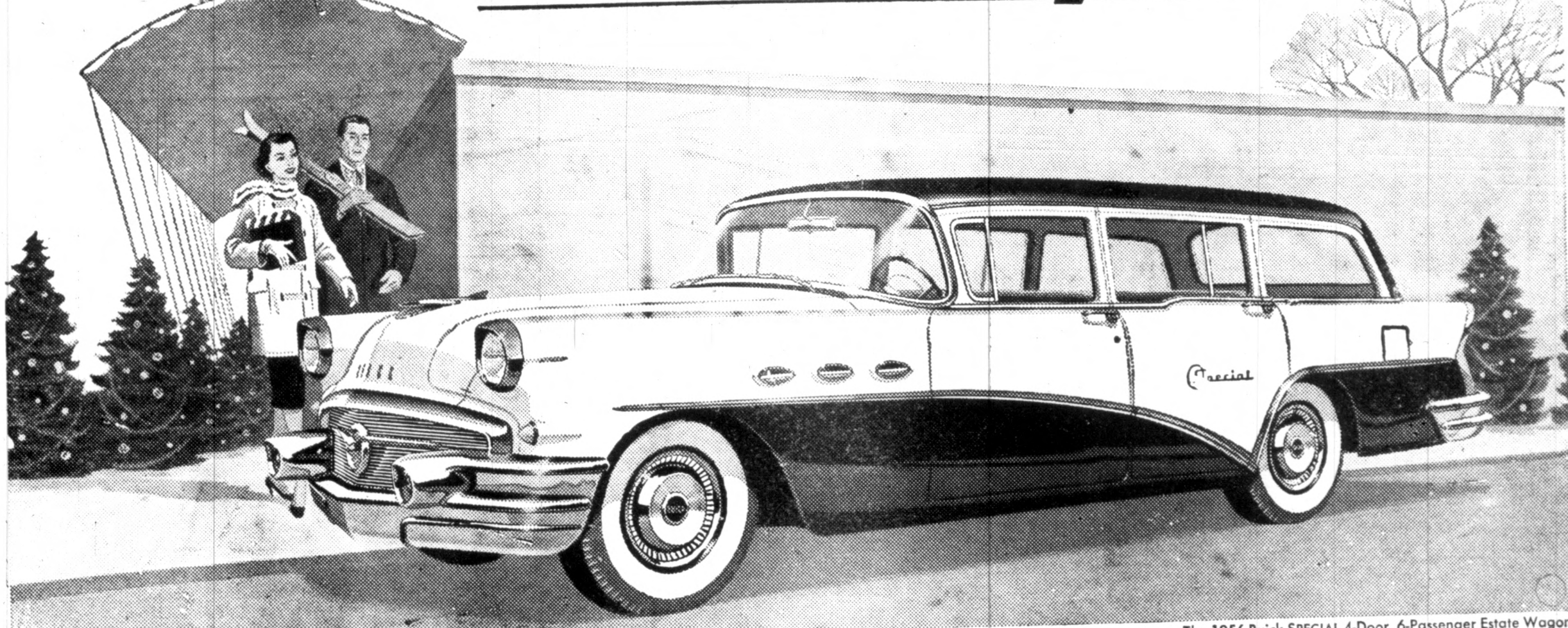

Opening of New Calvert Phone Plant is Delayed

A delay in shipment of cable has postponed the expected cut-over of Calvert City to its new telephone system until February. The new telephone central office building is completed, all poles have been set for the outside plant in the exchange, all rural lines are completed and the dial equipment has been installed. Work has moved on schedule, except for the unavoidable delay due to cable shortage. The final shipment of cable is due to arrive this month. The new Calvert City Telephone system will include all the features possible to make it a model telephone exchange, according to General Manager William Thomason.

Mr. Thomason described the company's program as follows: "Ordinarily a telephone exchange grows little by little, and the adoption of the most recent telephone developments has to be a gradual process," said Mr. Thomason. "Calvert City is fortunate in that our company will be able to provide all subscribers with completely new equipment, from the telephone instrument in the home to the central office dial equipment."

The advantages of the new Calvert City telephone system listed by the general manager were:

1. Latest model instruments with easy to read "sunflower" type dials are being installed.
2. A completely new wire and cable system will provide enough lines that a customer may choose his class of service. Individual, two-party or four-party service will be available to everyone within the base rate area.
3. An entirely new wire network will give excellent local and long distance voice transmission.
4. New central office equipment will give fast automatic service.
5. A new 8 1-2x11 telephone directory has been designed for easy readability and will have a civic section for promotion of Calvert City. A yellow page section is provided to serve merchants in Calvert City, Benton, West Gilbertsville, or Paducah, who wish to advertise.
6. Personal telephone directories will be distributed with the first issue of the directory. These handy directories are used to list frequently called local and long distance numbers.
7. Good long distance service. Long distance calls will be handled by the Paducah long distance operators. Fourteen toll circuits to Paducah will be available. Eight new circuits each, to Gilbertsville and Benton, will be added. There will be no toll charge to the latter two exchanges. Calvert City customers will dial calls directly to Benton and Gilbertsville.

His Demands
Lesson for December 4, 1955

CHRISTIAN living is not a matter of vague general good will. A character in a movie remarked: "I'm not a mean man. If I heard that my neighbor's children had been taken by wolves, I would feel some regret." Well, of course that didn't make him a Christian. (He turned out to be the villain, by the way.) But there seems to be a number of church members and others who think that being a Christian calls for nothing more than being generally at peace with the world, like a turnip. Being a Christian is a far more demanding thing. And the demands are Christ's demands. He is not a trademark, a portrait of a Founder beaming on us benevolently from the wall. He is the living Christ, Son of Man and Son of God. He makes demands on his disciples, and he has a right to make them.

Discipleship
Those who were closest to Jesus in Galilee, those with whom he took the greatest pains, were called Disciples. Now the least that "disciple" can mean is "learner." The first demand that Christ makes on us who would call ourselves Christians, the demand preliminary to all others, is that we learn of him. We never should assume that we know all about Jesus—his character, his teaching, his purpose. It is a sobering question: How much of our behavior, our attitudes, our thinking in various fields, our relationships with other people—how much of this did we learn from Jesus, and how much did we copy from other persons, and how much is our own invention?

Decision
Another demand Christ makes of us is decision. This in three ways: decision for him, decision about him, decision with him. It is especially these last two that are highlighted in last week's passages from Luke. The demand for Christ is the point at which one begins to be a disciple. But besides learning, the Christian disciple has to decide, and act accordingly, about some questions that affect him vitally. One is the question about Christ which Jesus pushed on his disciples. "Who do you say that I am?" Jesus put this question only after they had been disciples for some time. (Why?) But it can be answered at any time, and it must be answered some time. If we have any title to the name "Christian," how seriously do we take Jesus Christ? That depends on what answer we give to this question: What do we think of him? Who and what is he? The more fully we know his importance, the more seriously we shall take him. Is he a dreamer, a poet, an impractical idealist? Is he a child of his age, important then, but now such a man as we can safely neglect? Is he a noble thinker, a stirring leader of men? Or is he, as Peter dared to believe, the Son of the living God? As he came to us with the authority of one man's opinion, or does he speak as an ancient sage, or does he speak with the wisdom of the Ages? He demands a decision.

Denial of Self
Now if we have answered the last two demands, for discipleship and for decision, we may be ready for the third demand. (This is the decision with him, spoken of just now.) We shall pay very little attention to this if we have not met the other two. If we are not true learners we shall not hear this, or we shall misunderstand it. If we think less of Christ than we ought to think, then this demand will seem egotistic, unreasonable, suicidal. It is only the Son of God who has the right to make such a demand. It is for nothing less than denial of self. There is a cheap substitute for this which is sometimes mistaken for it. It is called "self-denial" and may mean no more than going without ice cream for a while, doing without some luxury or other. Denial of self is something different entirely. Jesus puts it in terms of a crucifixion. To take up a cross was to be already on the last mile. To deny the self means to cease being one's own center-of-the-universe. It means "love thyself last." It means dying to oneself, as Paul put it, and living to God. It means "Not I, but Christ, liveth in me."

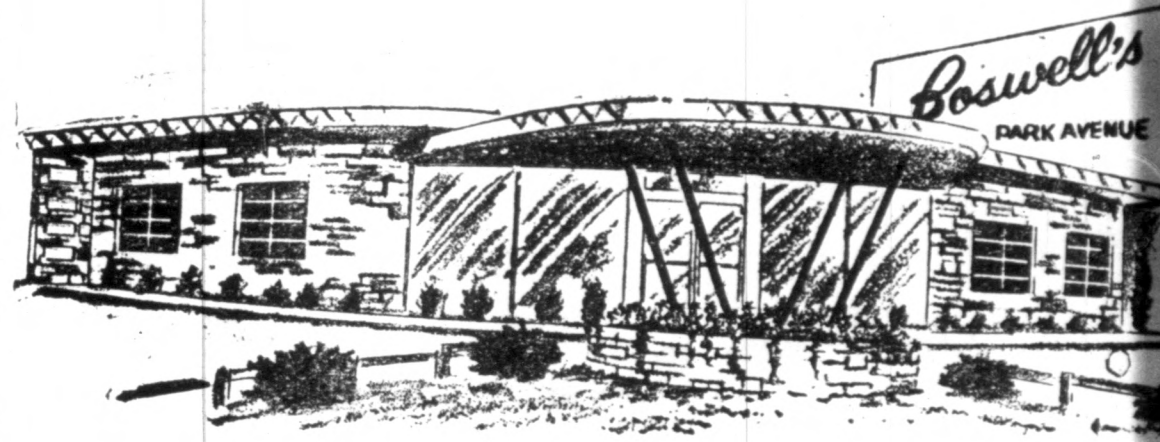

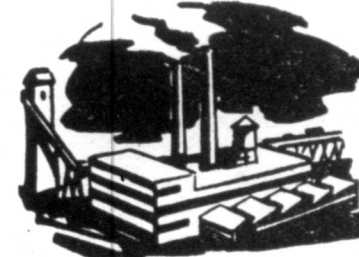

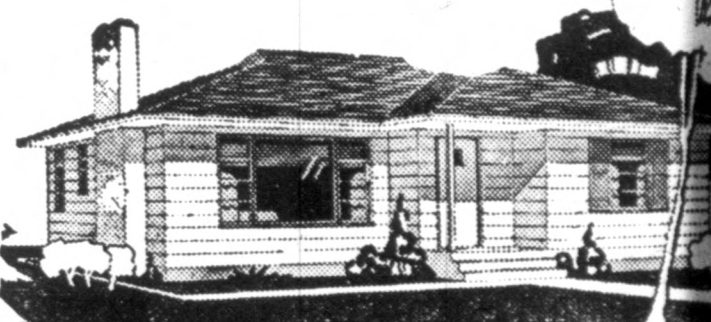

Hunters Warned To Use Care With All Their Firearms

Throughout Kentucky, hunters are once more heading into the woods and fields, hoping to bag squirrels, rabbits, birds, and other form of wildlife.

Unfortunately, according to Dr. Sam L. Henson, county health officer, many of these hunters may become victims of their own or some other hunter's carelessness.

Seventy-seven men, women and children were accidentally shot to death in Kentucky last year. Even more tragic is the fact that almost as many more will suffer a similar fate, not in the field, but in their own homes. Usually, these will be the younger members of the family. In Kentucky last year, there were ten children under the age of 14 who were shot in their own home by themselves or a playmate.

These youngsters would probably be alive today if these guns had been placed out of their reach. Adults are shot accidentally in the home while cleaning guns or showing a supposedly unloaded gun to a friend.

When is a boy or girl old enough to handle firearms? Usually they are ready to start shooting when they have shown a sense of responsibility in other fields. This may be at 12, 13, or 14 years of age.

How do you know when your youngster has a sense of responsibility? Would you trust him to carry the baby across the street, or take a \$20 bill to the grocery store, or look after the house while you are away for a day? This may help you to decide.

Before your child takes a gun out, make sure he knows how to use it safely. If you are not sure about the safe handling of a gun, ask someone who knows to teach your child.
