Tobacco Support Price Set

The United States Department of Agriculture has announced an increase of \$1.90 a hundred pounds in support loan rates for the 1956 burley tobacco crop as compared with last year.

The Department said the price-support average this year would be \$48.10 a hundred pounds. Last year the support-average was \$46.20.

The support average for the 1956 crop, however, is \$11.37 a hundred pounds below the all-time high of \$59.47 actually paid for the 1955 crop.

At the same time the U. S. D. A. announced support rates for Kentucky-grown fire-cured tobacco of \$36.10 a hundred pounds this year. The figure is \$1.50 above the 1955 loan-rate average of \$34.60.

Support loan rate for Kentucky's Green River and one-summer tobacco was raised \$1.30 a hundred from last year's \$30.80.

a hundred pounds to \$32.10 for this year's crop.

Last year's burley crop poured a total of about \$164,000,000 into the pockets of Kentucky growers. The 1955 crop totaled a mere 308,700,928 pounds, smallest since the 1943 crop of 276,695,263 pounds.

Last year's reduction came largely from a cut in acreage ordered because of enormous surplus stocks of burley.

The year's crop in Kentucky, however, is slightly larger, apparently. The U. S. D. A. said in its forecast September 11 that the 1956 Kentucky burley crop would total about 315,675,000 pounds, up about 7,000,000 lbs.

Most of the increase has resulted from this summer's excellent weather for tobacco growing.

The U. S. D. A. estimates last Aug. 1, indicated Kentucky's

1956 dark-leaf tobacco crop will be less than last year's from the standpoint of volume.

U. S. D. A. predicted a one-summer tobacco crop of 13,690,000 pounds and a Green River crop of 9,625,000 pounds. No estimates were available on the Eastern and Western fire-cured tobacco crops.

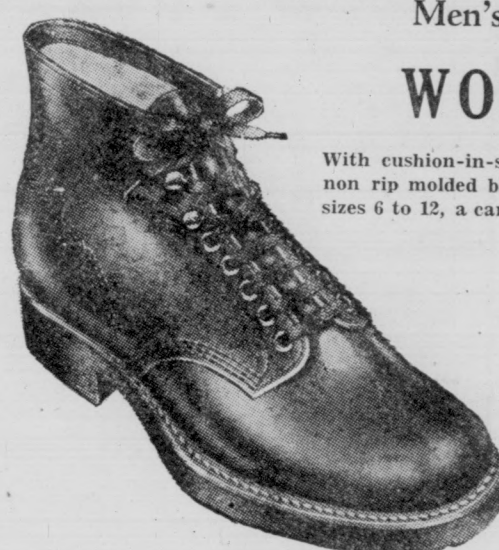

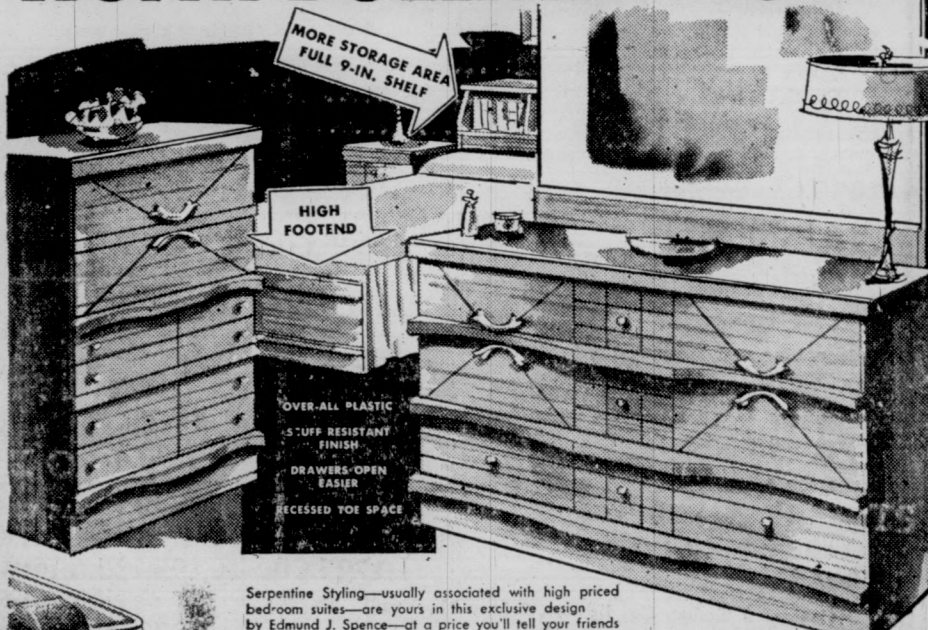
