Supervisors of the Marshall County Soil Conservation District held their last meeting of 1956 last Monday night. It was a dinner meeting, held at Trot Inn in Possum Trot. Reports coming in since the meeting indicate that the large amount of food and coffee consumed kept all awake that night.

All five members of the board were present. They are Renlee Rudolph, Homer Chester, Eura Mathis, Sam Gold and J. M. Solomon.

During the business meeting, minutes of previous meetings

were read and the treasurer's report made by Mathis. Also, a report was received on the participation in the Soil Conservation essay contest which closed Dec. 8.

Plans were laid for board members to attend the national association of soil conservation districts meeting in St. Louis in February.

A determination was made and signed that the operation of the Cypress Creek Watershed Conservancy District was not administratively practicable and feasible at this time. The reason for this action was the large

number of votes cast against the organization in the referendum of Dec. 1.

Guests present at the meeting included Herbert Anderson and Norman Terry of the U. S. Soil Conservation Service; Homer Miller, county agent; and George W. Lofton, who will be a new member of the board Jan. 1.

Gus Hopkins, Hardin, who will also be a new member the first of the year, was unable to be present. Retiring members of the board are Renlee Rudolph and Eura Mathis. Both of them along with J. M. Solomon and Sam Gold have given 10 years of free service to the cause of soil and water conservation in Marshall County.

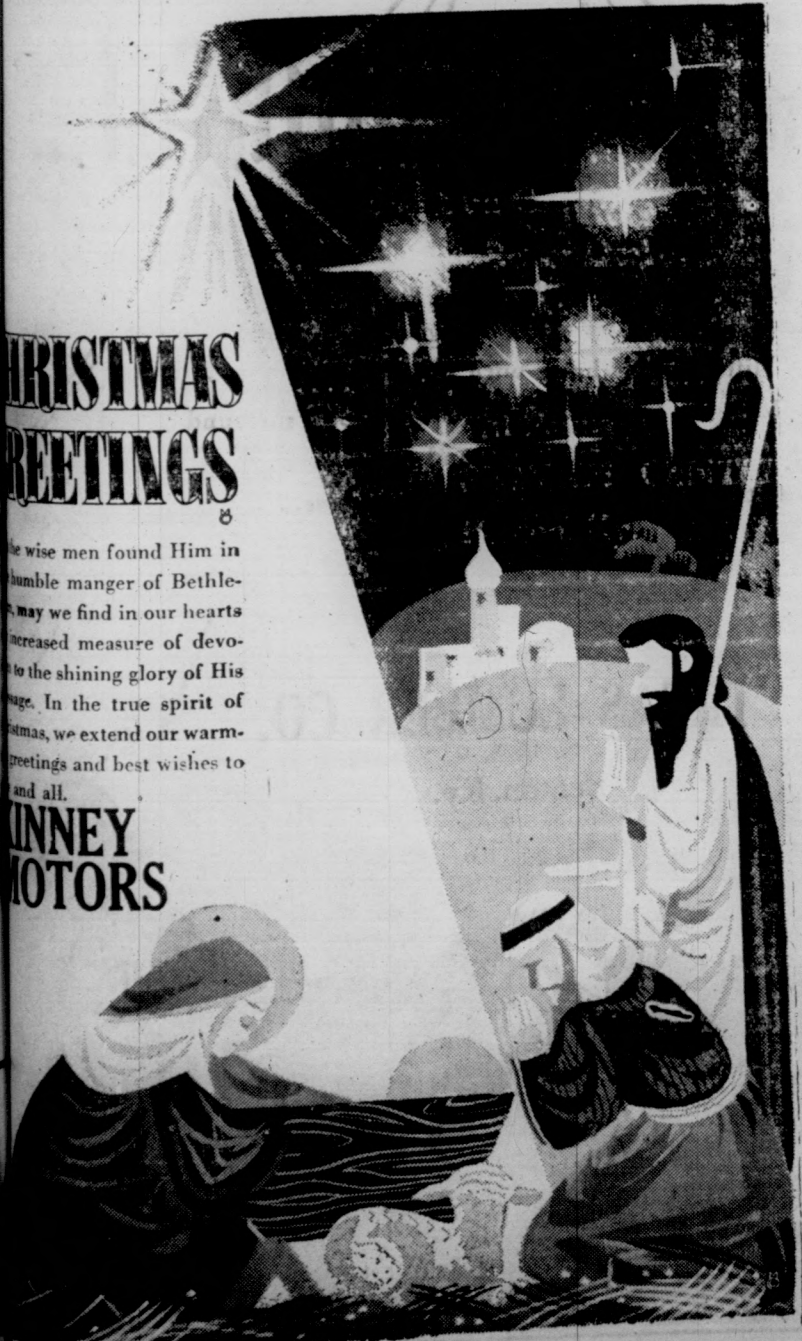

# BIBLE SPEAKS

## All Things New

On the verge of New Year's Eve, our thoughts go forward to the New Year. But what will be about it? We shall mostly have to "make do" with what we have, make the best of it, and make the most of it. We shall be the same as we were, sleeping between Dec. 31 and Jan. 1, not going to change a great deal. We shall live in the same house, with the same neighbors, the same problems, the same temptations, the same bank accounts (if any), the same bills, disbursements and prospects. What we have that is new is a new attitude, to some of us. But that is another thing. What we have to think about is another of the great chapters of the Bible, the one in which the thrilling words, "Behold, I make all things new." What will be like in that "new heaven and new earth" which is described in shining pictures in the very chapter of the Bible?

Behind Us  
In that life wherein all things are made new, not by clumsy man-made power, but by the power of God, what is especially new—if you like, what is new, so new we shall perhaps easily become used to it. First we can see a complete contrast with this present life, in that death will be always in the past, and that is certain about life on earth. In that we shall all die. Death is a certain prediction that is made about every one who enters these lines. (Or, if Christ should come in your lifetime, you would undergo a radical change, as an angel as death itself, in case.) But in that world where all is made new, death is behind you, not in front; a memory, a hope or a fear. The one experience which unites all men in this world is one which they have they would never have kept it. It should be remembered that our gospels were not the only ones written. The early church did good job of sifting, as any one who will take the trouble to read some of the fantastic or productions of the church record. (See The Apocryphal New Testament, in any large library.)

One of the gospels is what in modern times would be called a "biography" of Jesus—a story so complete that no one could ever bother to investigate further. They are not biographies, they are more like portraits. A commercial photograph is a neutral sort of thing. A portrait is an interpretation. Mark interprets Jesus as the mighty Son of God with power. Very little teaching is interpreted by Mark—it is all action, rapid action too. Luke's portrait is of the broad humanity of Jesus, his sympathy with all men, with women and children too. He sees Jesus, the ideal human being. John's portrait interprets Jesus as the divine Son of God, in constant touch and harmony with the Father on high, doing the works of God and teaching the works of God. In other gospels, Jesus' teaching is, so to speak, in his own name. In John the reader is never allowed to forget that it is all the teaching of God. Matthew combines the wonder-worker and the teacher in one portrait; Jesus appears as the One with Authority, from the very beginning, where Jesus is presented as the savior of the world, where he is given all authority in heaven and earth, "he moves with majesty and power."

Not only are the portraits different, but the viewpoints of the four gospels are varied. Two features of Matthew's point of view will be evident all the way along. It is that he tries to interest his readers. He quotes the Old Testament more often than any other gospel; he traces Jesus' family tree back to Abraham through the Hebrew kings (quite a contrast to the family tree given by Luke). On this day it remains one of the most interesting of the four gospels for interesting Jews and Gentiles alike. The other feature is that while Matthew begins, as it were, on the small stage of the Jewish people, he does not remain there. The Christ who comes not only as heir to the throne of David, is at last seen to have the authority of God himself. All authority in the gifts of the wise men. Matthew hints his truth: Christ is the end of all men everywhere.

We have a small supply. The rose can be used to plant a permanent living fence on your farm. The rose will need to be protected from livestock the first three years. After that it can take care of itself. The japonica will need to be permanently protected from livestock.

H. V. Moore, a co-operator of the Marshall County Soil Conservation District, who lives near New Harmony Church, has completed a good pond for livestock water. As soon as the bulldozer had finished, he began fertilizing and seeding the pond dam and the spillway. A good heavy mulch of straw will then be applied to protect the seedlings and prevent erosion this winter.

Thomas Ya'es, S.C.S. Conservation Aid, has been helping me complete our responsibilities of the 1956 Agricultural Conservation Program.

He has been helping farmers and equipment operators check ponds for correct construction. Also, he has been checking ponds dug earlier this year to see if they have been properly seeded. This must be done before I can certify the pond as completed and eligible to receive payment.

A pink and white color scheme was carried out in the refreshments of ice cream and cake.

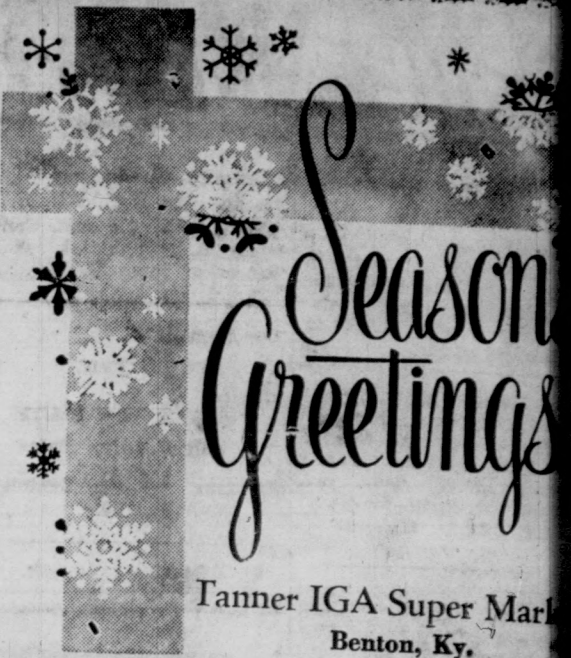

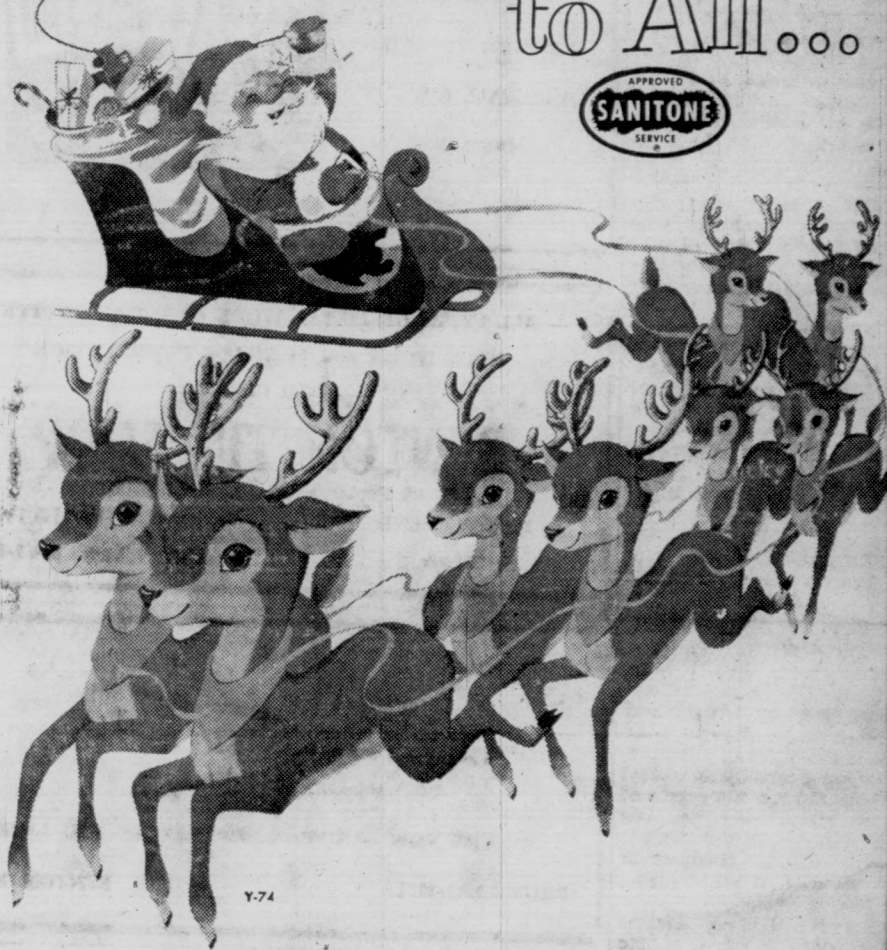
