**SPECIFICATIONS.**

The road to be extended from the end of present bridge, or forks of road near R. F. Campbell's to a point one mile and quarter to another half mile from the road to Julian, near C. F. Jarrett's gate.

The road bed must be graded six inches higher in center than on the outside, gradually sloping to either side, and must measure fully twenty feet inside of ditches; the latter to constitute no part of said measurements.

Ditches on either side must be ample for drainage and made suitable for Directors. All water on either side must be led off to make proper drainage for road.

The grade shall not exceed one foot in eighteen lineal feet. The ditches on hillside shall be made in accordance with the plans and specifications in reference to each locality.

A piping shall be put in at foot of hill or lowest point between Campbell's gate and Jarrett's corner (center of road) and extend to either side, with rock walls and proper protection, to carry water to sink hole on left going out, to be well covered and protected above.

The culvert between Campbell and Dr. Smith's (already placed) must be filled up with stone and that part of road partially made, must be made to conform with the new grade. There must be an 18-inch pipe put in at lowest point where water crosses at Jarrett's bridge, water made, or placed so as to lead to drainage with the sink-hole on left side in Jarrett's field.

All piping to be put in as deep as water level and properly protected with stone and same properly covered and protected.
