and there is little hope that Jefferson County will receive additional revenue as a result of the re-appraisal program, Tax Commissioner George Trager.

A FEW YEARS AGO, our own Marshall County Fiscal Court decided to launch a property reduction program. The decision apparently was not so much a matter of principle as it was of necessity. The county was in a bind. It was a simple matter of fact, why should a property owner continue to pay high taxes on holdings that have decreased in value, and also, why should one pay low taxes on property that has increased in value?

HE SYSTEM of government is at fault, and it should be corrected by the people through the ballot box. The job of assessing property collecting taxes should be centralized in one office (tax assessor and collector) and not two offices as is now the case. Why should a sheriff collect taxes? A sheriff hasn't the time or energy to do the job. Why should a tax assessor collect taxes? He is not a collector. Why should a collector collect taxes? He is not an assessor. The duties of such an office should be separated. The assessor should be responsible for continuous surveys of property values and for listing property values on the tax rolls. The collector should be responsible for collecting taxes and for enforcing the law.

TAX ASSESSOR-COLLECTOR office should be an important post, and with pay enough to attract capable executives. The duties of such an office would require the assessor to know property values, to make continuous surveys of property values and to list property values on the tax rolls. International Day Observed By Homemakers

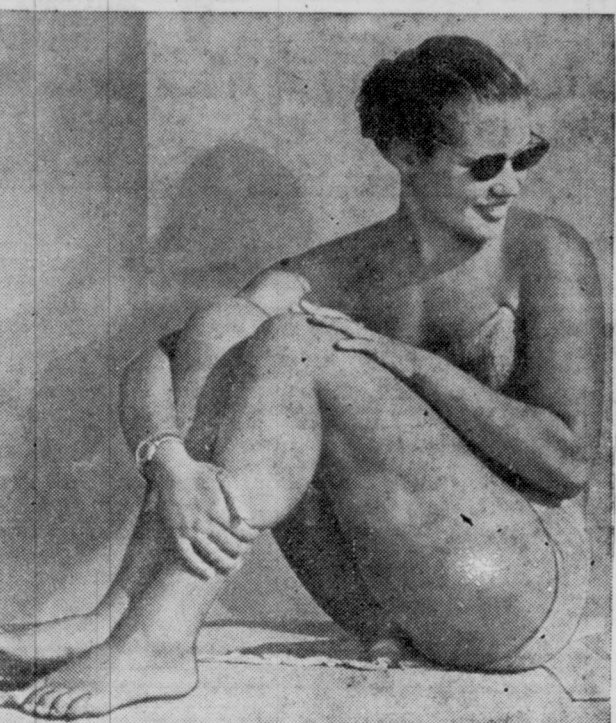
Marshall County Homemakers observed International Day last Friday, Feb. 15, with a meeting at the Community Building. Mrs. Anna Brandon presided.

Chamber Meeting Monday Night to Discuss Quarters

After many months of organization work and planning on the part of a number of people from different parts of the county who feel the importance of setting up a county-wide Chamber of Commerce, the program is moving forward now to the establishing of a permanent office and campaign for membership.

The executive committee has called a meeting of everyone who is interested in this program to meet at the Gift Shop building next to Kings' U-Tote-Em grocery at the intersection of U.S. highways 68 and 641 on Monday night at 7 o'clock.

The committee expects to recommend that this building be leased from Mr. King as full time headquarters for the Chamber, and that after some alterations are made, possibly portions of the building be sub-leased to a full time secretary be employed for the office; that space be available to industry and individuals for display and advertising materials; that this headquarters office be a complete information center for all businesses in Marshall County.

In addition to plans for the opening of a permanent office, and membership campaign, it is expected that the highway committee will have a report of efforts to prepare a large map of Marshall County on which all businesses, all roads and all places of interest will be shown. 12-Minute Parking to Be Started

The Benton-Reidland game was marred when a Reidland player swung on Phillip Morgan. Benton led easily all during the game. Bear Stone was high man with 16 points. It was Benton's 24th victory against only two losses.

Benton will wind up its regular season play here tonight (Thursday) against Bardwell. Three North Marshall players scored in double figures against Alto in the Calvert City gym Tuesday night. Ford scored 19, Wilson 18 and Hall 17. It was an easy victory for the Jets.

South Marshall journeyed to Heath to defeat the McCracken County team after a close first half. The score was tied 18-18 in the first quarter and Heath was ahead 35-33 at the half, but the Rebels came back strong in the second half to win handily.

Harold Wilkins tallied 33 points for the Rebels. Portis got 12, Miller 12 and Butler 10. Benton will play South Marshall in the opening round Tuesday night at 8 o'clock. 26, of the district tournament at Murray. Alto will play el in the night's other game.

On Wednesday night at 8 p. m., Murray Training will play the winner of the Alto game.

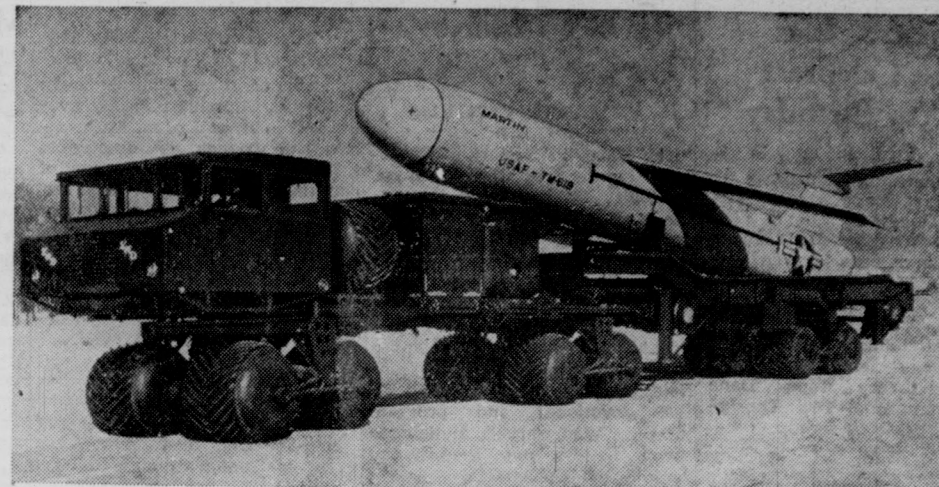
Funeral is Held at Calvert City for Mrs. Mae McMurty

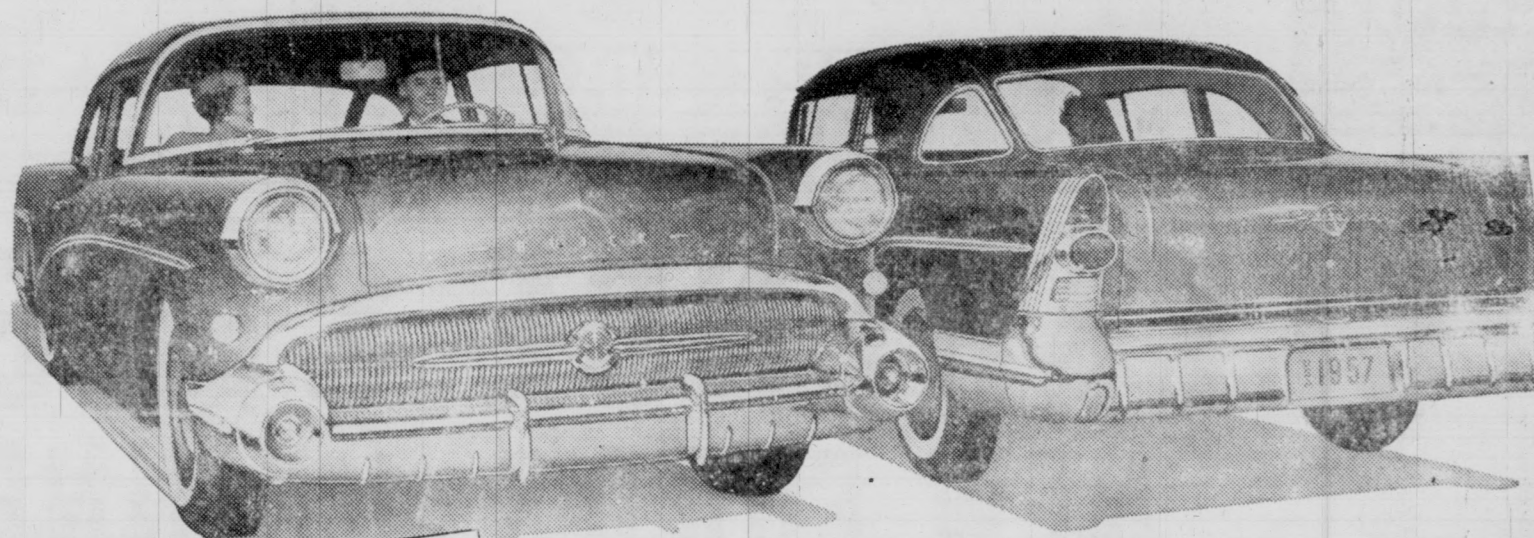

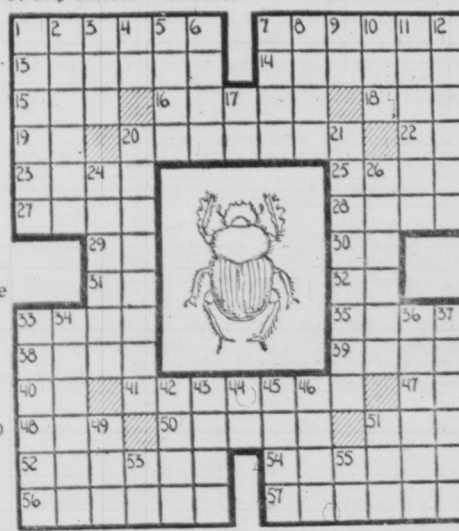

County Soil Notes

BY HERBERT ANDERSON
County Agent Homer Miller's radio program, Farm Facts, on Station WCBL, will carry a series of eight programs on watershed work beginning Friday, Feb. 22, and ending Saturday, March 2. These programs will explain the watershed way of doing soil and water conservation. Also the Watershed Conservancy District type of organization will be explained. Landowners in both East and West Forks of Clarks River Watershed will vote Saturday

afternoon, March 16, whether to form a conservancy District.

Be sure and listen to Farm Facts daily at 12:05 for the facts about future watershed activities.

Last Saturday, I met with about 50 landowners in Clarks River Watershed at the courthouse in Benton. I discussed in detail the proposed conservancy districts on Clarks River.

At the close of the meeting plans were made to hold educational meetings at different places in the watershed. Watch next weeks paper for the schedule on these meetings.

Sonny Rose, conservation aid began working for the Soil Conservation Service last Tuesday.

He will work for those farmers who have asked for financial aid under the Agricultural Conservation Program. Most of these farmers are cooperators of the Marshall County Soil Conservation District.

Under this program farmers receive federal cost-share varying from 50 to 80 per cent of the cost of carrying out soil and water conservation practices. Ponds, diversion channels, drainage, sod waterways, contour planting, pasture seeding, pipelines, and wells are the practices on which Rose will render technical assistance.

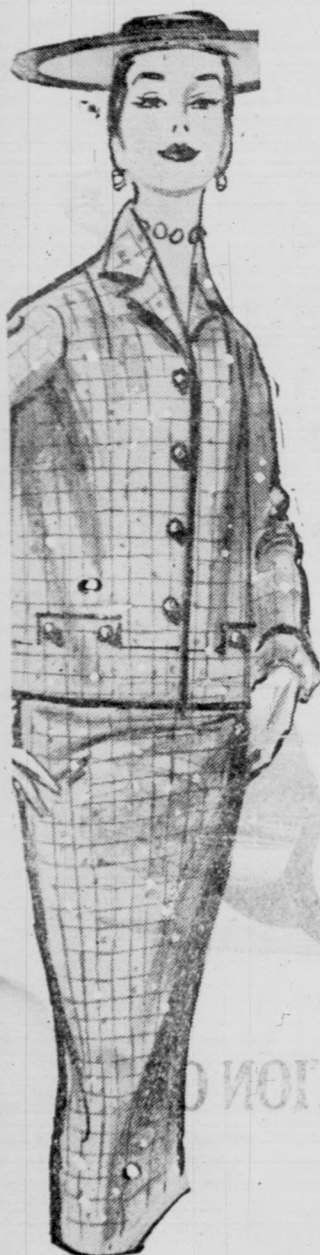

Reading Signs

Lesson for February 24, 1957

human beings, civilized or not, are used to reading signs. Indeed all human communication and life goes by sign-language. Words, printed or spoken, are like the thing it represents. No word on a page means more than a set of marks. The way the marks are arranged makes a difference for all who can read. The expression of people's faces, their moods, their attitudes, we learn to interpret before we can read. The farmer looks for weather signs, the fisherman and the hunter have their own signs to look for. There are few people so stupid that they don't know what they see.

Signs Are Up

When Jesus was teaching and working in Galilee, he was doing without any official authorization from what we would call the church. And yet he claimed to speak and work with the authority of God. The church officials did not take this easily. They kept asking him: "Show us a sign!"

He said: How do we know you are right? How do we know what you say is from God? To this day there are people who are not satisfied with what God has shown them. They want to know: How do we know the Bible is true? How do we know Jesus was the Son of God? If the preacher would himself be bitten by rattlesnakes, without getting hurt; if stars arranged themselves in the sky so as to spell a personal message from heaven; if some day Joshua would make the stand still, such people think they would find it easier to believe.

Signs Are Up

Jesus steadily refused to produce any such "sign from heaven" as was challenged to call down.

He worked miracles, but evidence that the kind of miracle he did were not the kind of "sign" the Pharisees wanted. His works were always simple and quiet, out of sympathy with human suffering. They never done in dramatic fashion. Never in the child-like way: See me do this—don't think I'm wonderful! Jesus the Pharisees that the signs the times were there to be seen. By "times" he did not mean times or dates. He meant what the Old Testament usage, with both Jesus and the Pharisees, were familiar, the "times of visitation," the special era of God's visiting the earth and for special purposes. In all Jesus' work and words was the same, made outright or implied. God was in and back of it all. Pharisees wanted some sign this was true, some sign out of Jesus. But Jesus was the sign there was. If they could see God in him they could not see God any other way. So it is that Jesus is still the Sign of God.

Signs Are Up

Kingdom of God is at its height, and the signs of its coming are everywhere. An atheist was once asked to take to make believe in God, and his answer was, "Trot him out and let him do something!" Well, cannot be led around on a name, for those who have eyes see. The beauty and the order of his power and glory. The goodness and the grace that goodness in the lives of men and women speak of the creative power that made such persons. Furthermore, God is at every day, transforming the great miracle is not in stones into bread but in sinners into saints. The great miracle is that men and women who live by the rules and standards of the Kingdom of God, men and women who already in this noisy world have found the melodies of peace. When you read in the Bible, especially in Jesus' teaching, invitation and challenge to a pure, brave living, and to a life beyond human limitations, there are people who actually do live "beyond human limitations" as you say, because they have been touched by the living signs of God.

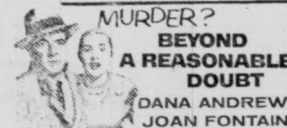

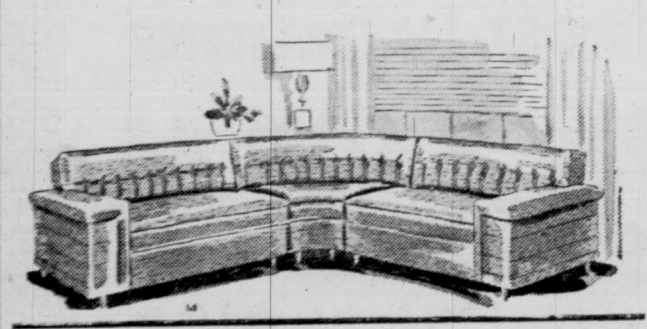
