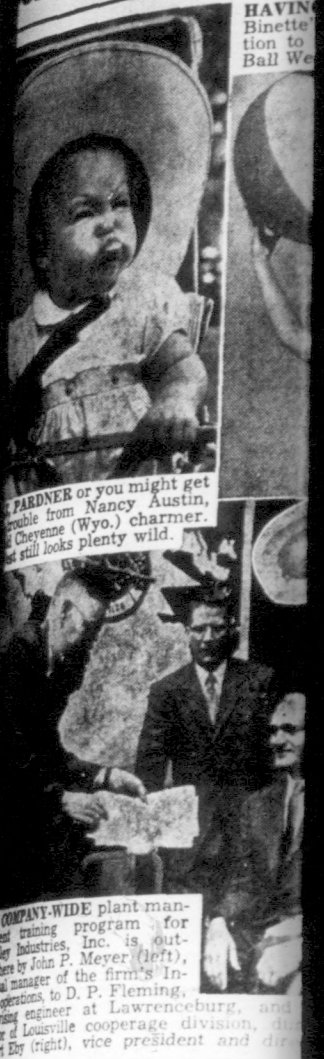

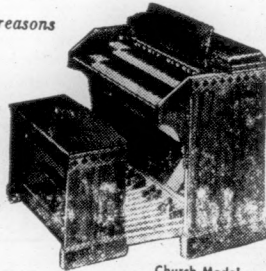

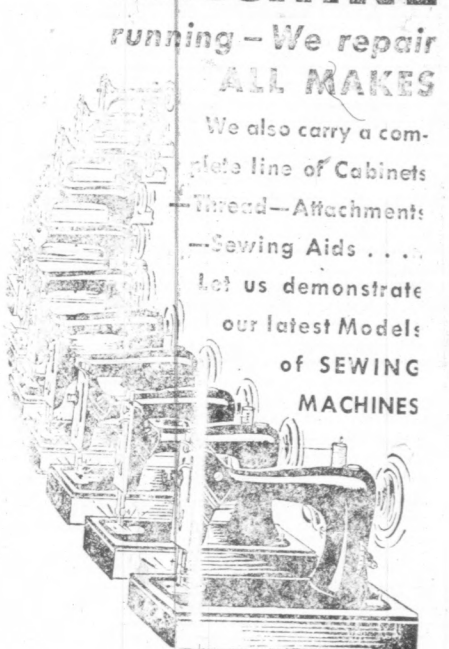

County Soil Notes

BY JAMES O. BURKEEN
Henry Byers, 3 miles east of Hardin, has signed all the cropland on one of his farms in the Conservation Reserve of the Soil Bank.
Henry and I spent a day last week in drawing up a soil conservation plan of his farm.
Henry believes that his farm needs a 55 year rest. Says Byers: "This is a good chance for me to stop the erosion and improve the soil on my farm."
The acreage reserve and the conservation reserve are the two divisions of the Soil Bank. The acreage reserve deal with allotment crops such as tobacco, corn, wheat etc. The conservation reserve applies to all the cropland.
Byers will receive 80 per cent of the cost of sowing his cropland in fescue and ladino clover. On top of this he will receive \$11. per acre yearly for 5 years or \$55 per acre for a 5 year period.
Say it will cost \$30 per acre to sow the land down the government will pay \$24 per acre and Byers would pay \$6.
As you can see Henry will draw about \$79 per acre for a 5 year contract.
The conservation reserve payment applies only to land that has been in cultivation at least one year in the past 5 years. If you cut hay that counts as cropland.
It is thought that it is cheaper to cut the surplus before it is produced rather than paying for storage and spoilage to the grain bin.
The farmer is able to buy an extra pair of shoes with his conservation payment. This of course benefits the man who works in the shoe factory.
The man who owns the grain bins more than likely has all the shoes he needs anyway.
The Conservation Reserve of the Soil Bank offers a great opportunity for farmers to establish soil conservation practices on their farms and cut the surplus at the same time.
The Soil Conservation Service has been assigned the task of counseling with farmers and working the soil bank in their farming program. An SCS Technician is available to come to your farm to see if the conservation reserve of the soil bank will fill your needs.
