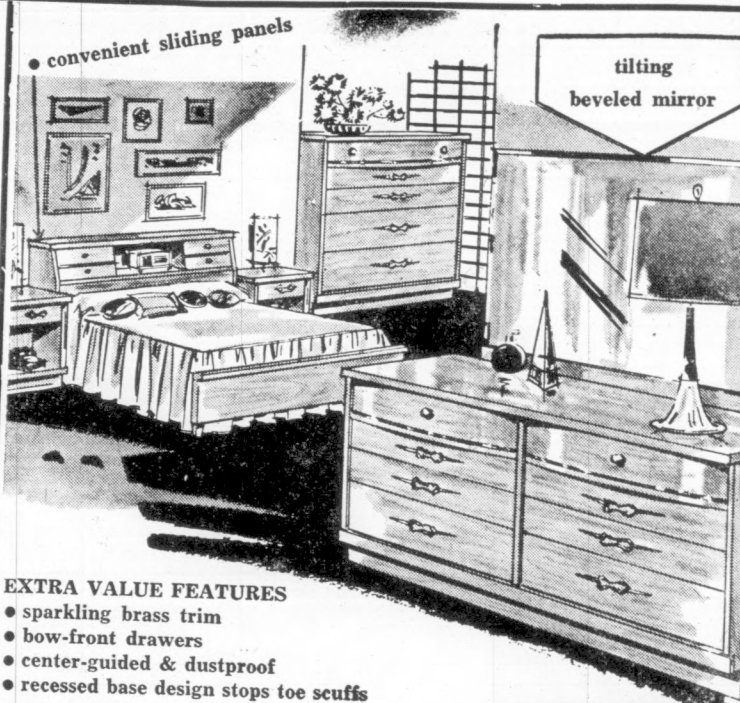

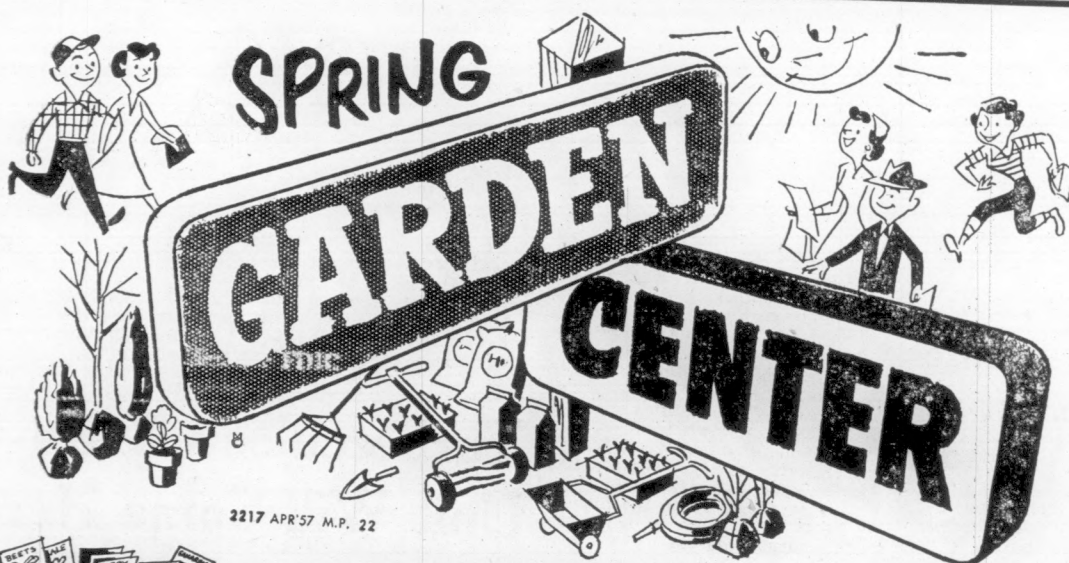

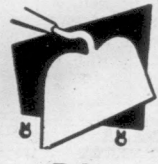

## Annual Leather Care Results in Longer Wear

FALL weather is leather weather and the leather school jackets, handbags and suede jackets that have been stored away come out for use. Most of us tend to neglect leather articles because they are long-wearing and will take much abuse. But leather clothing and handbags will last years longer, according to Marjorie Lehmann of Leathercraft Process of America, if you follow a few simple rules for their care.

Mrs. Lehmann's New York firm is this country's foremost specialist in the care of leather, so she knows whereof she speaks. She suggests some do's and don'ts for the cleaning, preservation and storage of leather.

Let suede and leather garments breathe. Don't store them in airtight plastic bags. Stale air inside the bag will oxidize the color and fading will result. Keep leather away from steam pipes in closets.

Smooth leather garments can be wiped clean with a damp cloth and mild soap. Suede can be brushed with a rubber sponge. But don't use cleaning fluids and spot removers since they'll remove color and leave rings. It's unnecessary to use saddle soap on leather luggage, handbags or golf bags. The intended use of saddle soap is for riding boots only.

Leather should never be stored



Remove surface dirt from suede garments with a rubber sponge. When cleaning is necessary, turn to leather expert.

in a damp cellar or garage. When clothing, gloves and handbags require cleaning, give them to an expert. Ordinary dry cleaning will remove natural oils and damage both color and finish. Proper home care and expert cleaning will make your leather possessions last for years.
