Thursday the interest on \$22,000 of the principal of the Caldwell county railroad was paid, reducing it to \$198,000 to \$195,000. At the rate at which payments have been made, increasing in amount each year, it will be about five or six years until the whole debt is paid.

The residence of Mr. W. B. Lander, situated near the L. & N. railroad, just beyond the northern limits of the city, was totally destroyed by fire.

The suit for a receiver of the Caldwell County Fair Association has been compromised, and one man has purchased all the stock. That being the case, the fair will have a fair start this fall. A good many Kentucky fairs have been in hard times for a year or two, and there have been not a few shake-ups in the management of some of them.

There was a great deal of stock of furs for sale at auction Monday, but very little was sold, as money is exceedingly scarce with the farmers at present. Colliott & Co., of Nashville, had two carloads of very fine furs which they offered for sale, and in addition to these there was a great deal of country stock offered.

M. R. H. Perkins, the assignee of the Peoples Bank at Guthrie, has given notice by circular to depositors that the bank will meet them in Guthrie on March 20th when they will be paid in full with interest from Aug. 20, 1933. The assignee says the amount to be received by the stockholders depends upon some uncollected claims, but he expresses the opinion that they will likely receive 50 cents on the dollar.

The bill passed by the Legislature authorizing the purchase of the additional buildings at the Asylum here, will enable the Asylum to prepare room for fully three hundred more patients. With the additional building it will be made here at Lexington and at Altonville there will be accommodations for nearly eight hundred more patients.

The annual report of the Kentucky coal and coke, just issued by Chief Mine Inspector N. W. Clifton, shows that the output of coal in Kentucky for 1933 was 1,100,000 tons, an increase of 25,757 tons over the output of 1,074,243 tons in 1932. The output of bituminous coal alone was 81,162,830 tons.

The store of the St. Bernard County Jail at St. Charles was burglarized Sunday night and about \$500 was secured by the thieves. Part of this \$500 consisted of postage stamps, envelopes and other property, which were the property of the warden, who had his office in the store. All attempts to discover the identity of the thieves have thus far been futile.

It is thought to be a coincidence that the work of professionals, as the manner in which it was done showed the thief to have been an artist in his line.

The negroes of Crittenden county held a convention in Madison, a few days ago for the purpose of compelling the Republican party of that county to recognize the negroes on their ticket. They demand that they be recognized for equal treatment with the white people, and that they be given the same rights as the white people.

The Christian county negroes would also like to have some of the offices, but the Republican party here will see that they don't get them.

Capt. C. Allen, of Princeton, has decided to leave that place and make his home in the new Territory of Oklahoma. Capt. Allen gives as his reason for the change the fact that the practice of law has declined there, and that he is now no longer large enough to go around among the lawyers there and allow all to make a living. The people of Princeton will miss the presence of Capt. Allen, who has lived there for twenty-two years. The New Era hopes that when he shall have settled in Oklahoma he will meet with the success he so greatly deserves.

McClain, also of Henderson, and Dr. J. D. Clardy, of Christian county. Efforts are also being made to get out a Union county candidate in the person of Hon. J. A. Spalding or Hon. H. D. Allen."
