Jerry Wyatt, Soil Champion, Is Honored by Home Folks

Jerry Lee Wyatt, a senior at North Marshall High School and a member of the school's FFA chapter, is the Boy Soil Judge of Kentucky.

Wyatt won the first State Fair soil-judging contest held last week by scoring 347 points out of a possible 400.

Wyatt, student of Gordon Chester, earlier last week was on a soil-judging team that placed third among FFA chapters in Kentucky. Wyatt himself was fourth high individual judge in that contest.

It was a sweet victory for Wyatt because he defeated two members of the national champion FFA soil-judging team, Chas Covington and Robert Park, members of the Madison Central FFA Chapter which won the national contest at Oklahoma City this year, scored 343 and 335 points respectively for second and third place.

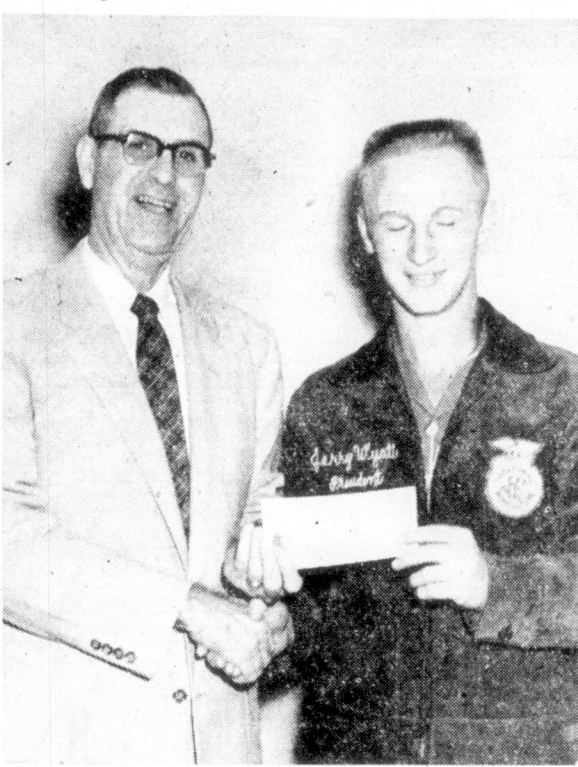
The contest was directed by Lyle B. Leonard, University of Kentucky extension conservationist. There were 53 contestants.

Wyatt is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Wyatt, Benton Route 4.

Wyatt returned home with two bronze plaques and two blue ribbons he won during the soil contest at the fair.

He also returned home to a big welcome at North Marshall High School.

And this week he was honored by the Bank of Benton with a \$25 U. S. Savings Bond for his achievements. Paul Darnall, executive vice president of the bank, presented the bond to Jerry. Mr. Darnall also is chairman of the agricultural committee of the Kentucky Bankers Association.

Full production with a force of 200 will begin again on Jan. 1, if not sooner, Mr. Guess said.

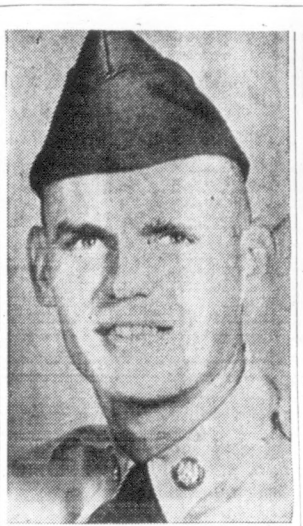
Fulton Man New Manager of The Benton Theatre

Electric System's Report Reveals Growth of Benton

The Electric Plant Board of the City of Benton filed its annual audit with the City Council Monday night. The audit showed a healthy growth for the electric system and also for the town of Benton.

The report showed the system now has 1,247 customers, compared with 1,150 a year ago. This indicates a population growth for Benton.

The system sold 15,119,320 kwh during the year that ended June 30, 1958, compared with sales of 12,085, 465 kwh the previous year.

Total assets of the electric system are listed at \$340,553.34, an increase of \$20,163.44 over the previous year.

The system's debt on June 30 stood at \$42,000 and will be paid off in full in 1962. Annual payments of \$9,000 are made on the debt with the interest rate at 2 1/2 percent.

Net earnings of the system for the year ended June 30, amounted to \$21,718.75.

Members of the Electric Plant Board are Albert Hill, chairman; Pete Gunn, J. I. Linn, Bob Ruler and J. D. Gammel. E. G. Williams is superintendent of the system and Joe Williams is secretary-treasurer.

The city bought the electric system in 1941 and the system has shown a healthy growth each year since then. In fact, it is probably the biggest financial asset of the city government.

Man Riding Stick Horse Arrested, But Not for Speeding

A 45-year-old man riding a stick horse along U. S. Highway 60 near Benton was arrested last week by State Trooper J. E. Brown.

He wasn't breaking the speed limit, however. He was handicapped in that respect by wearing a winter overcoat and carrying another overcoat in 60-degree weather.
