A Country Boy Visits Little Old New York

Dr. and Mrs. T. W. Haymes of Benton are visiting their son and family in Connecticut. In a letter to the Courier, he tells of his trip. Here is his letter:

Dear Woodson:
According to promise, I'm writing you about my trip. Junior and his wife came to Benton after us and we drove through to Connecticut.

From Benton, we took Highway 48 for 500 or 600 miles. We stopped first at Fort Harrod and inspected it and saw where the women saved the fort by ignoring the Indians by bringing water from the spring while the men defended the place.

We got on one of the super-highways through Ohio and the gooseneck of West Virginia, crossing the river at Wheeling into Pennsylvania, then on the super-duper highway over, under and around mountains. These Yankees make monkeys out of the mountains. Tunnels a mile long are not unusual.

We crossed Pennsylvania into New Jersey, seeing very little farming country anywhere, and then went into New York City and finally into Connecticut, where we rested.

If you haven't been to New York recently, you wouldn't recognize it. At least I wouldn't. On our first sight-seeing trip we drove for two or three hours, seeing things we had read about in history—the Hudson River,

mazing. More than 8 million people live in the city and its surrounding towns and commute to work a distance of 30 and more miles.

The road system is like a spider web. I'm constantly amazed how the drivers can find their way round. Subways, overpasses, four and six lane roads all crowded. If you can visualize Jackson Purchase completely covered with buildings and Marshall and Calloway Counties completely blanketed with hotels, you can get an idea of Big Town. Buildings 20, 30,

40 stories and up. It's incredible, vast, large, gigantic, huge, etc. We entered Grand Central Station under ground, and had to go up several floors to reach the lobby, where millions pass through every week. The station is lined with stores, as are all the skyscrapers. Some of the stores are as big as my farm.

We went to meet our son who had been to Baltimore, Washington and Boston—at La Guardia Field. We also went to International Airport, where all the international planes come in. Such a conglomeration of

humans I've never dreamed of came in—from Hong Kong, Berlin, Brazil. Just any place on the map.

I'd say if you don't have a strong heart and the family savings in your sock, just don't visit New York City. You and I have been around in Texas and Kentucky, but all the population of both states could be deposited in the area of New York City; that is, if they could replace those already here. It doesn't seem real to me.

The Sunday Times had about 500 pages, or more. Would require a week to read it. Hope you are well and happy where you are.

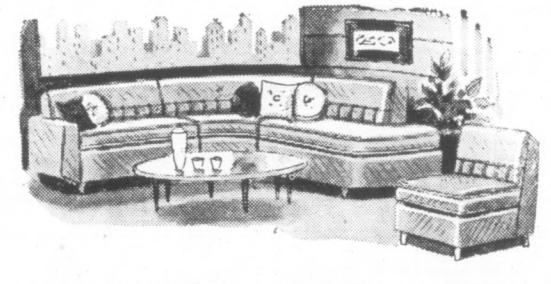

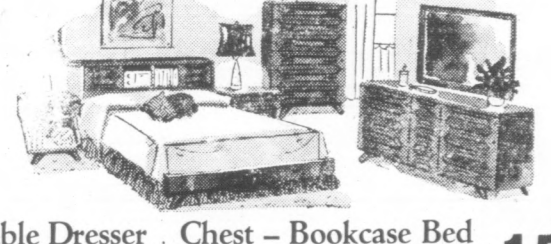

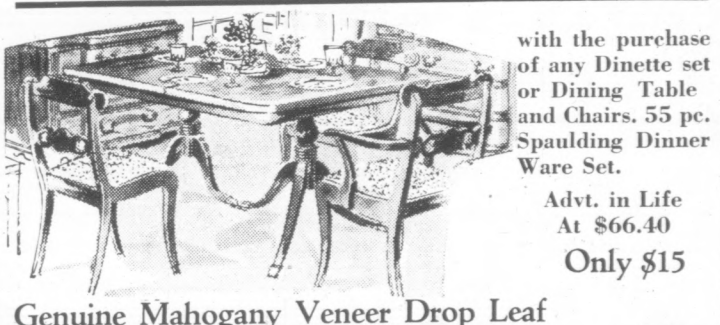

Texas Firm Is Low Bidder on Barkley Dam Lock Project

The opening of bids for construction of the navigation lock for Barkley project on the lower Cumberland River was announced last week by Col. Eugene J. Stann, engineer of the U. S. Army Engineer District, Nashville.

Stan said that the apparent low bid, in the amount of \$16,379, was submitted by Tecon Corporation of Dallas, Texas. Eight other bids were received which ranged from \$17,894,660 to \$20,997,147. Award will be made as soon as all bids can be properly evaluated and the invitation for bids provides that all work will be completed within

in 830 calendar days after receipt of notice to proceed.

Colonel Stann stated that the Barkley Lock will have clear dimensions of 110'x800' and that its normal life between the Barkley Lake and open river below the dam will be 57 feet. This modern structure when completed will speed navigation through elimination of five obsolete locks and dams.

The lock will be located in Livingston County approximately 30 miles above the mouth of the Cumberland River.

This is the second large contract scheduled, the first being one for a section of earth fill dam, construction of the lock cofferdam and lock excavation. L. G. Wasson Coal Mining Corporation is now more than 89 percent complete on the 3.5 million dollar initial contract.

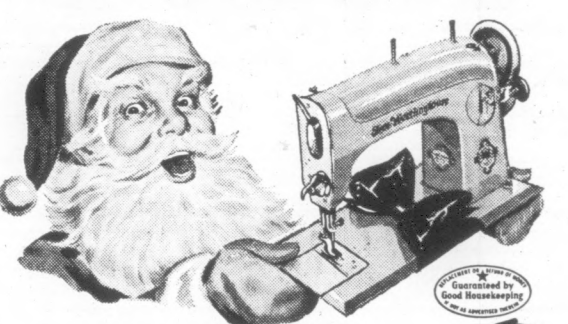

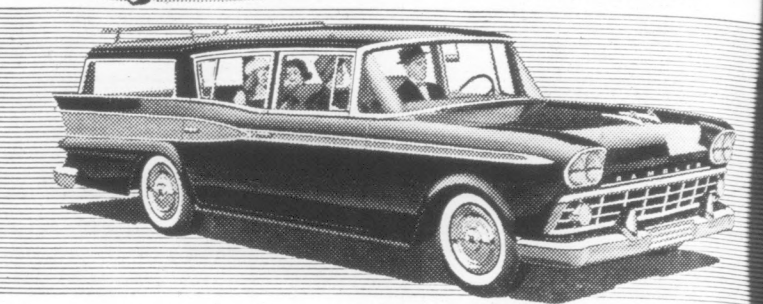

With more time being spent indoors during the winter months, we are closer to the cookie jar, refrigerator, and other sources for all-too-frequent weight-producing nibbling. Christmas Sales
Are Expected to
Set New Record

New York. — Consumers will
play a merry jingle on retail
cash registers this Christmas
season.

Economists predict that this
year's holiday sales will run from
3 to 5 per cent ahead of the re-
cord volume chalked up in 1957.

The annual Christmas buying
spree is expected to push total
retail sales for 1958 slightly
above the record 200 billion dol-
lars recorded a year ago.

It would mark one of the first
times in history that retail sales
managed to advance in the face
of a sharp decline in sales of
durable goods, such as automob-
iles and appliances.

Total retail volume has been
running slightly behind last year
but the Christmas spurt is ex-
pected to close the gap.

The amount of money spent
at retail this year will work out
to around \$1.150 per capita.

Brightening the outlook for re-
tailers is the improvement in
consumer confidence and the
fact that despite the recession,
personal income has remained
at or near record levels. The de-
cline in wages and salaries paid
by recession-hit industries such
as auto and steel was partially
offset by unemployment, com-
pensation.

The third quarter of the year
saw a sharp change for the bet-
ter, with durable-goods sales in-
creasing for the first time in a
year.

The improvement in the econ-
omic climate has been marked
by increased employment, bigger
pay checks, and a rise in con-
sumer optimism.

Sauger May Well
Become a Leading
Sport Fish at Lake

Frankfort—A crack crew of
fisheries experts stood all night
vigils below Kentucky Dam re-
cently prying into the secrets of
the sauger.

A small, battling edition of the
walleye, sauger are becoming an
important sport fish below the
dam and experts feel a need to
know more about them.

For four nights some of the
state's top biological talent went
without sleep to help gain that
information. Among them: Char-
lie Bowers, assistant director of
the Division of Fisheries, and Bi-
ologists Jim Charles, Red Broun-
ghton and Jim Carter.

Working from sundown to
sunrise, they spent the long
hours of the night netting and
tagging sauger moving upstream
in the Tennessee river. Sauger,
it seem, move best at night.

The tagged sauger, when ul-
timately caught or recovered,
will provide a valuable insight
into the movements of the spe-
cies in the Tennessee and pro-
duce important information for
future management below the
dam.


Like walleye, sauger stage a
spring spawning run, but they
also produce an annual fall up-
stream migration with result-
ing outstanding fishing.

Biologists believe that with
enough knowledge and the right
kind of management, the Ken-
tucky Dam area can be made
into one of the top sauger fish-
ing areas in the southeast.

More food handling tricks to boost your rating as a good home-maker. Heat the knife before cutting cheese... the job will be much easier. Bacon will curl and shrink less if it is soaked in cold water for a few minutes before cooking it. And place it in a cool, not hot, skillet. Coffee will stay fresher, even in a tin, if it is kept in the refrigerator.

Do not refrigerate potatoes or sweet potatoes. They keep best at room temperature. Tomatoes, if not ripe, should also be kept at room temperature.

In general, most vegetables should be kept in the refrigerator in plastic bags or closed pans. Before placing greens and salad vegetables in the refrigerator, wash, sprinkle or dip them if they show any signs of dryness.

The wonderful world we live in has given us many new foods. They add the variety to the old favorites such as hominy, a home produced food that can be served in many delicious ways and help greatly in stretching the food budget. Any type of corn may be used to make hominy, but good quality white dent corn is best.

To make hominy, dissolve a can of household lye in 6 1/2 gallons of water. Add 6 quarts of corn. Heat the water keeping it just below the boiling point until the hulls start to loosen. Remove the hulls and scum from the water, adding fresh water occasionally during the heating. Finally, stir up the corn well and transfer to clean, cold water. Rub the corn, changing the water several times until it is thoroughly cleansed and free of hulls. Soak the corn in cold water overnight, then wash 3 or 4 times with hot water.

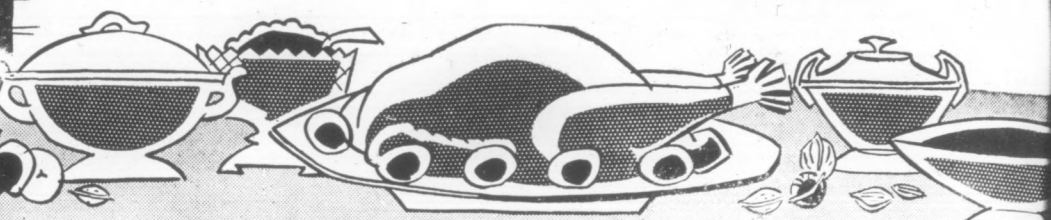
