Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at the C. B. Donohoe Funeral Home for Waller Vaughn, 60, who died unexpectedly Dec. 11 near Baton Rouge, La., of a heart attack.

Rev. J. Frank Young and Rev. Paul Bailey conducted the funeral. Burial was in Benton Cemetery. Pallbearers were J. D. Peterson, Luther Thompson, Guy Tibbs, Thomas Morgan, Bob Cornwell.

Mr. Vaughn, a native of Benton, was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Tom Vaughn. Waller, who was widely known here by his nickname of "Crip", had operated a carnival for several years and traveled with it throughout the South.

He obtained his nickname from an infection which left him with a twisted leg in his youth. He later had the leg straightened.

He is survived by four brothers, Terrell and James Vaughn of Pontiac, Mich., and Joe and Thomas A. (Noots) Vaughn of Akron, Ohio. All of the brothers were here for the funeral and burial services.

C. B. Donohoe has been ill at his home at West Gilbertsville of influenza.

### Griggs Out As Calvert Policeman

The City Council of Calvert City Monday night accepted the resignation of Walter Griggs as chief of police and asked the county sheriff to provide law enforcement temporarily until the city can hire a successor to Griggs.

### Last Rites Held In Calloway For Rudy Edwards, 26

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the L. O. East Grove Nazarene Church in Calloway County for Rudy Edwards, 26, of Kirksey. Burial was in Kirksey Cemetery, with Linn Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

A coroner's jury at Mayfield ruled that Edwards died of "excessive alcohol intake and excessive alcohol poisoning" after a drinking spree last Saturday and Sunday night with two male companions. The two friends took Edwards to a Mayfield hospital early Sunday morning when they were unable to arouse him from an apparent "drunken slumber," the jury was told. Hospital physicians pronounced Edwards dead on arrival.

Edwards is survived by his two sons and three sisters.

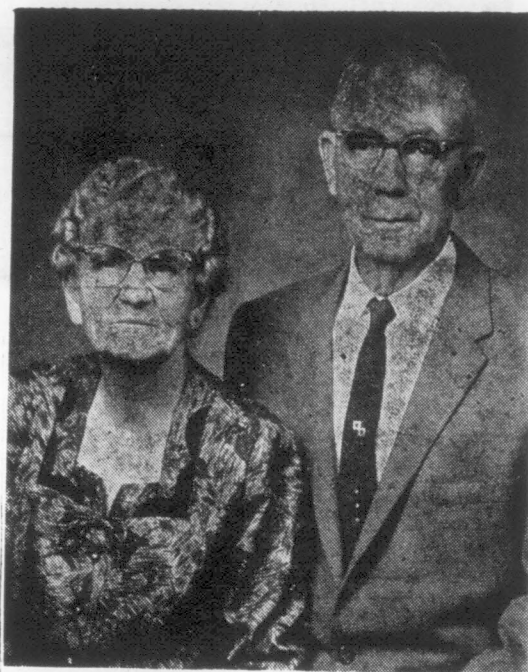

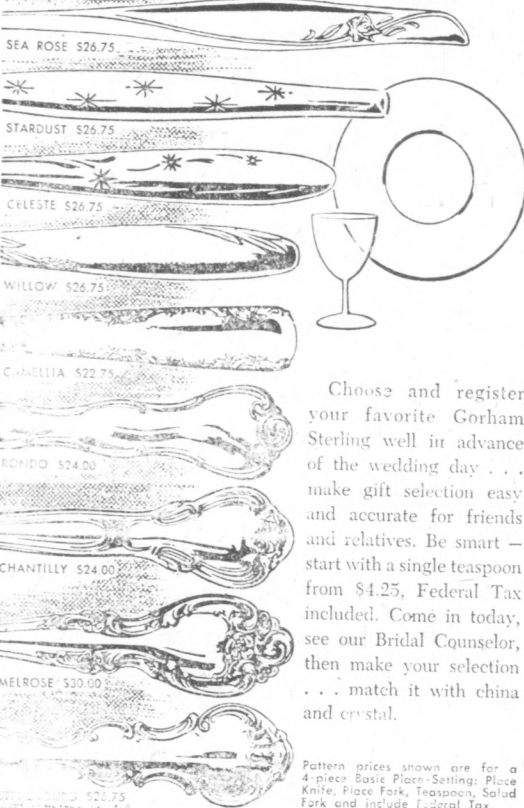

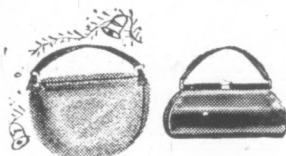
