





How To Buy The Holiday Ham

The modern homemaker knows that the Christmas ham, glazed and garnished to fit the occasion is an important part of the holiday festivities. She wants her dinner to be a memorable one, yet leave her time to enjoy family and friends at this happy time of year.

The amount of ham to buy depends upon the number of servings needed. You'll want to figure on seconds for the big meal itself and sandwiches or encore meals later in the week. Allowing one-half pound per serving of either the regular or the skinless, shankless ham is ample. You can plan on four servings to the pound of the boneless style ham. For the small family, half hams and slices are available. Whatever the size or style of ham purchased however, be sure to follow carefully a reliable baking schedule. For example, the schedules developed in our Martha Logan test kitchen for Swift's Premium Hams are constantly tested and checked to be sure they are accurate.

When it comes to a ham that is tender and flavorful, the dependability of a well-known brand name is your best shopping guide. It assures you of both high quality and eating satisfaction.

The amount of time you have available will help you to decide whether a cook-before-eating ham or a fully-cooked ham best suits your needs. The cook-before-eating ham requires oven baking to an internal temperature of 160° F. to develop flavor and texture. The days of parboiling and soaking hams are long since gone. The ham is ready for the oven when purchased. The fully-cooked ham, as its name implies, may be sliced and served without additional cooking. It also may be heated to 120° F. internal temperature for glazing or serving hot. Fluffy sweet potatoes, pineapple chunks and whole cranberries make an attractive garnish for the Christmas Ham.

Cavity Cures

Photographs of the typical American boy or girl usually show a healthy, handsome set of teeth. Unfortunately, perfect teeth are far from typical. Next to the common cold, the most widespread disease is tooth decay which strikes nine out of ten Americans. Most of this tooth decay can be stopped in its tracks or prevented altogether by regular visits to the dentist, more frequent and more thorough brushing, and avoidance of between-meal snacks and sweets.

New equipment and modern techniques enable dentists to do more than plug cavities or pull teeth. Today's dentist constructs more, extracts less. With new plastics, a skilled dentist can often transform mere stumps into well-shaped teeth. Dentists can make big, horsey teeth look smaller by shading the edges for optical illusion. Poor positioning of teeth can be corrected in adults as well as children. Sometimes a mere dab of cement teases the tongue into pushing a displaced tooth back into line.

You not only have more to gain, you have less to dread from a visit to your dentist these days. New high speed drills cooled by a spray of air or water do necessary drilling in jig time with little discomfort. Yet dentists still find that some patients go rigid with fear merely approaching the office. Many patients suffer more from their fear of anticipated pain than from any actual pain encountered. Some dentists see hypnosis as a possible solution to the fears, but more are using tranquilizers such as the new Vistaril which is taken by the patient in the waiting room. These tranquilizers do a truly effective job of relaxing the patient and bring a trip to the dentist into proper perspective.

Teeth can affect appearance, health and even personality, yet less than one-third of the people in the U. S. receive adequate dental care. Regular visits to your dentist can improve your social and job opportunities and will certainly lead to good healthy teeth and more smiles of self-assurance.
