





The above picture was included in a newspaper feature entitled "Record Attendance of 306 at Fountain Avenue Men's Bible Class"

The feature stated "The Men's Bible Class of the Fountain Avenue Methodist church, of which Rev. John M. Jenkins is pastor, hit a new high last Sunday with a record attendance of 306. The record class is pictured above. Never before in the history of the class, which has been organized for several years, has the class attendance reached that peak. At the beginning of a contest three months ago only 20 men were members of the class. The men are taught by Russell Mills and class officers are Rollie Sullivan, president; Marvin Tucker; vice-

president; and S. R. Morgan, secretary-treasurer. Unusual interest in Sunday school and church work is shown by the men, most of whom are also affiliated with the Wesley Brotherhood, which holds monthly meetings. Officials of the class expect the large attendance to continue and term the increased membership another step in the marked progress of the church."
