I really think that some of you did cross your fingers for us as it didn't rain for the reception that we gave in honor of the Republican Minority Leader of the Senate and Mrs. Dirksen, and the Republican members of the Senate and their wives.

It was almost miraculous because at 8:30 when we started to light the candles in the garden I could see lightning all around and an ominous rumble of thunder. I finally made the decision to go ahead with the preparations regardless of the weather, and suddenly the skies cleared and we had a lovely summer evening for our party.

LIFE Magazine had heard of our reception and had asked if they could send a photographer to take pictures for "LIFE goes to a party." Being your Senators' wife, I have learned the value of national publicity, and after talking it over with my husband, I agreed to their proposal.

We had asked them not to clutter up the garden with electrical equipment so they had brought flash attachments that worked by hand, which, in the humidity of a Washington evening, failed to go off. It was really terribly funny and pathetic to see them all set to take a glorious picture of Mrs. Nixon, the wife of the Vice President, or Mrs. Herter, the wife of the Secretary of State, and then have nothing happen.

There was one moment when twenty Senators were serenading Mrs. Nicholas Longworth, daughter of President Theodore Roosevelt, with the song that was written for her many years ago, "My Little Alice Blue Gown," and the poor LIFE people were

poised around with expressions of delight turning to despair as again their flashes refused to register. I became so sympathetic with their predicament that I was trying to help them instead of pretending they weren't there at all.

I am going to the Adirondacks for a few days of mountain air. I will try to write you from there

because I hear it is the most beautiful place. If I can't manage to get my letter off from there, I hope to see you in Kentucky as soon as this session is over.

P. S. Forgot to say I saw Chlo Glifford, who is doing such a remarkably fine job as president of the Federation of Women's Clubs, at the Women's Press

Club luncheon. She was wearing a very becoming periwinkle blue linen dress and matching hat, and didn't look a bit tired even after her round-the-world trip. She is off to Alaska next week. Now I must stop. Goodbye.

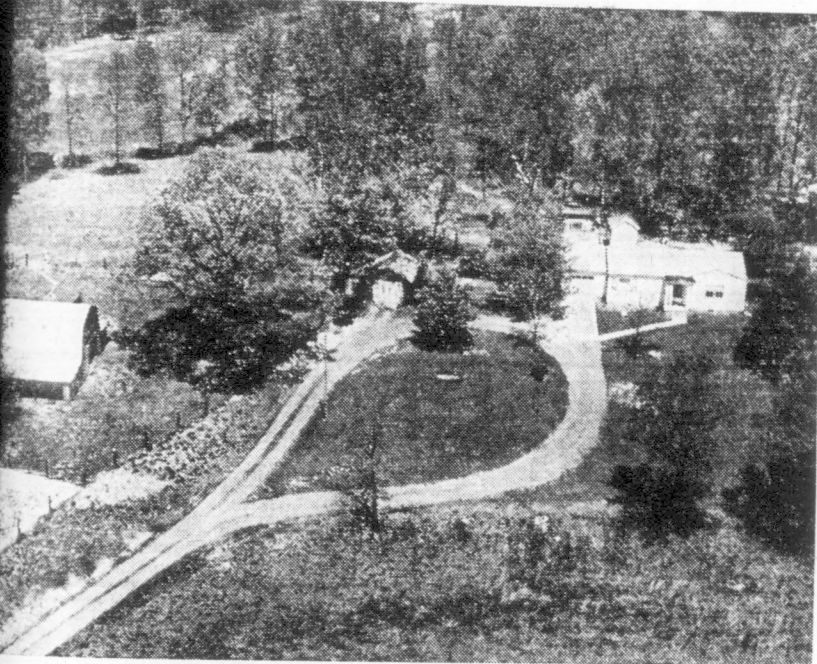

Letter to the Editor

September 8, 1959
 Marshall County Fiscal Court:
 I was very interested in your letter to Mr. Joe Asher on the repair and maintenance of our county road system. Since I live on the east edge of the county, I would like to see some improvement of our area.

Our children ride the school bus to and from school over roads which are over 75 years old, the same width now as these roads were then, thin and narrow wooden bridges on these roads about the same width as the dual wheels on the busses. It is shudder to think what would happen if one of these busses was crowded off one of these bridges with the number of children they are compelled to haul. There are now some 2,000 lots and lot owners between the headwaters of Little Bear and Malcom Creeks. At the beginning of county maintenance is a 3 1/2 foot stump in the center of the road. If you can miss this try the next dip and some narrow cuts on the old Birmingham-Tatumville Road traveled by thousands of tourists and property owners. This road is the same width as it was 100 years ago. If you meet anyone here, you either park or back up to a wide spot. Just what is wrong with doing something for these people that will pay thousands of dollars in taxes in 1959 to our county?

We are very thankful for this tourist business as it has enabled us to make a living for our family the past seven years. Also we are able to write checks to Marshall County people for about \$5,000 a month. Now boys, about \$1,000 per month of this is for gasoline that is taxed that 2c per gallon road tax. We are compelled to spend about \$1,000 per year to maintain and improve the roads in our camp where every cottage is taxed more than the county average. In 1958 I decided to Marshall County a road that cost Moore's Camp \$16,800 to enable other interested land owners to develop their land. I was criticized by some of the Fiscal Court members this year for not replacing a bridge on this road. Since all the roads in this area of the lake have been built by T. V. A., (and private people I feel that the county could at least provide proper maintenance.

Now boys, the lake area cannot develop with no more cooperation than has been shown the people that are working seven days a week to bring out-of-state money to Marshall County

without money getting back to this area.
 The fact that we got one mile of the lake trail completed through the efforts of the Marshall County Chamber and other people interested in lake development, our receipts would have been less in 1959.

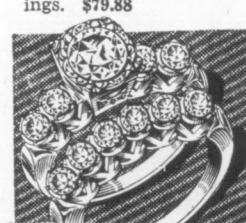
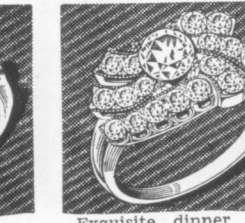
