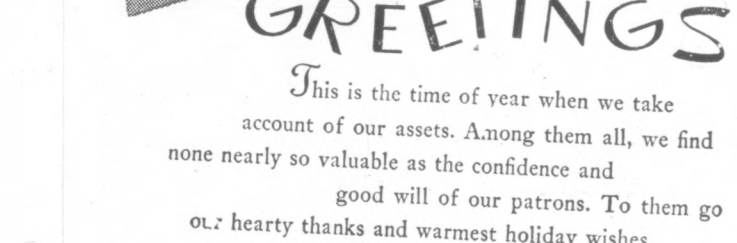
Elmer Brien of Benton has been named an honorary member of the national rehabilitation committee of the national American Legion. Brien, who has been active for many years in local Legion affairs, received

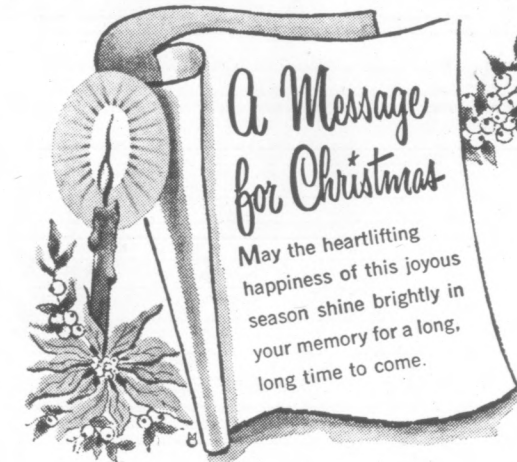
COMBS IS BREAKFAST GUEST OF CHUMBLER

If you warm raisins in the oven before putting them in a batter, they won't sink to the bottom in your cake or pie.

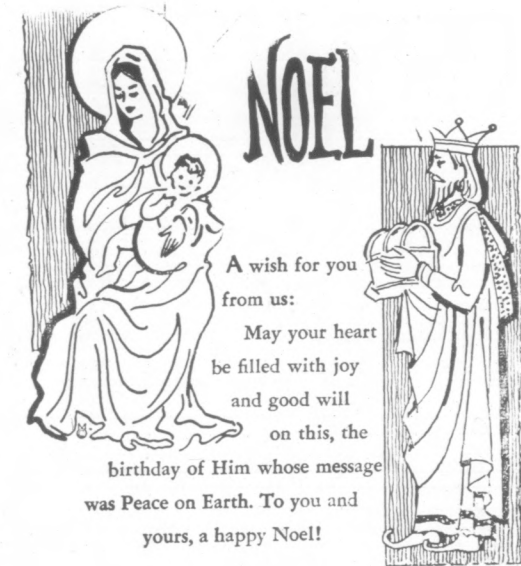

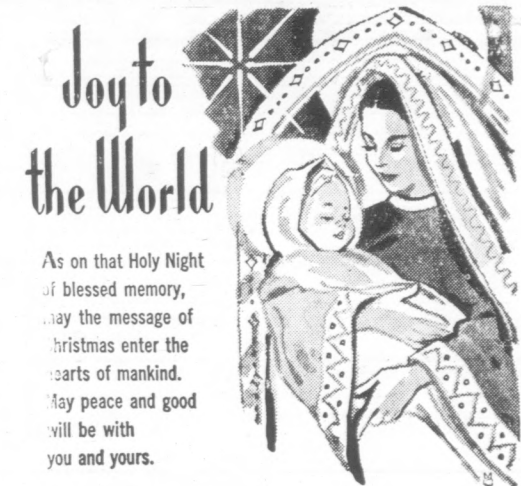

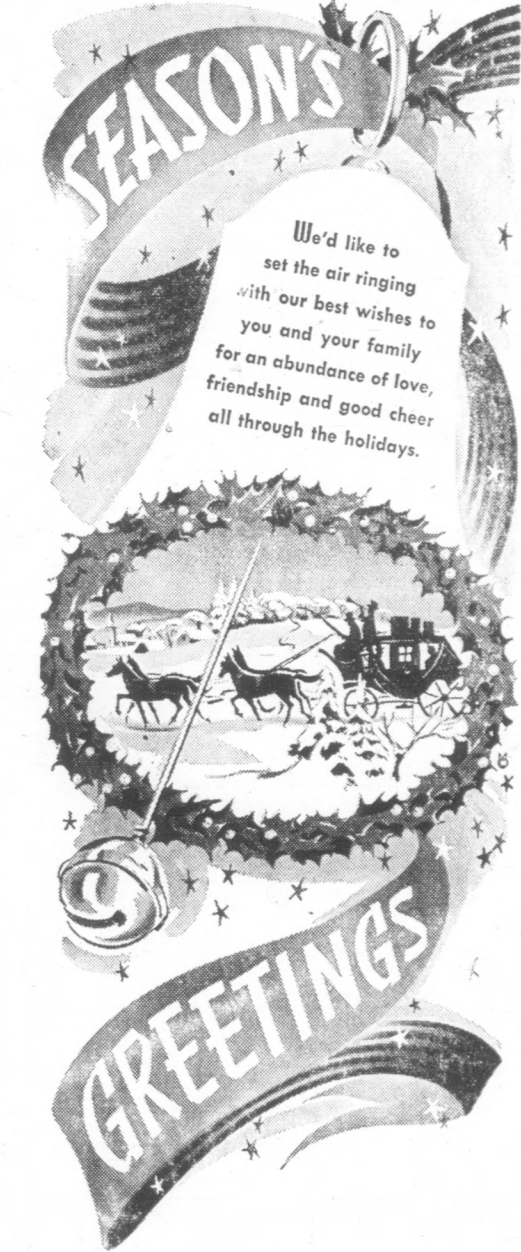
